REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE EDENHOPE PARK AND GARDENS.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and rescind Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 6th November, 1907, as a site for Public Park and Gardens in the Town of Edenhope, in lieu of all previous Regulations, which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in number in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or tennis matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
(For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.)
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person or persons shall hold any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. The Committee of Management may set apart portion of the Reserve for the purposes of lawful games, amusements, or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs the use of the grounds so set apart, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

14. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve, or any portion thereof, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of £5 5s. per day.

15. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during the progress of any match, tournament, game, or sports nor use or walk on the tennis courts at any time unless he is a member of the club, or a visitor entitled to play thereon by permission of the Committee of Management, and then only when wearing rubber-soled footwear.

16. There shall be paid to the Committee of Management, or any caretaker appointed by the said Committee to receive the same, a fee not exceeding One shilling, upon each occasion, for the use of the tennis courts or tennis pavilion, or any other sporting improvement in the Reserve, but the Committee of Management may, as a term of the arrangement with any club, remit this fee in the case of any fully paid-up member of the club. Such fee shall be paid to the funds of the Tennis Club during the period that the club remains in full standing as a club.

17. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may may good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or injury from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

18. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

By-law No. 19.

All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Newham and Woodend made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* and every other power thereunto enabling it, and numbered 19, for—

(a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting upon or within 10 feet of any street or road.
