RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1935.

**REGULATIONS AMENDING THE BUILDING
REGULATIONS 1933.***At Government House, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of March, 1935.*

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1928 (No. 3697), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby amend the Building Regulations 1933, as follows:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Building Regulations 1935, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In Regulation 3 the following definition shall be inserted, viz.:—

“Continuous entertainment” for the purposes of these Regulations means any entertainment where exhibitions or performances are produced several times during the day, and where the proprietor does not cause the auditorium to be completely vacated by the public for a period of not less than thirty minutes between each performance or exhibition.

3. Regulation 79 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

79. The proprietor of every building which is used for continuous cinematograph, vaudeville, or other entertainments, and in which an approved system of mechanical ventilation is not provided shall cause the auditorium thereof to be—

(a) completely vacated by the public from 6.30 p.m. to 7.30 p.m.,
and

(b) thoroughly flushed with fresh air during such period by opening all doors and windows.

4. In the heading to Part IV. the words “in certain cases to” shall be deleted.

5. Regulation 126 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

126. The provisions of this Part shall, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter hereof, be applicable only to theatres and cinematograph halls:

Provided that in the case of any cinematograph hall which is used as such less frequently than once a week, the Commission may exempt the proprietor from compliance with Regulations 145, 147, and 153 to 160 inclusive. Where such exemption has been given the relevant provisions of the Fire Prevention Regulations shall apply to the building.

Compensation in Case of Death.

36. The Board may establish a fund by paying out of its revenue such sum or sums as it may from time to time consider necessary, but not exceeding an aggregate of Two hundred and fifty pounds in any one year, to provide for payment in case of death of any member of a Brigade as hereinafter indicated, such sum to be invested in such manner as the Board may from time to time direct, all interest accruing from investments to be placed to the credit of the fund.

An amount, to be determined by the Board, but not to exceed the sum of Five hundred pounds, may be granted out of the said fund to the wife or other dependants of a member of the service killed in the execution of his duty, at or proceeding to or from a fire or alarm of fire, or in the execution of his duty at a practice, or whilst travelling to or from or competing in or taking part in a demonstration duly authorized in accordance with section 34 of the *Fire Brigades Act* 1928, or when death is proved by medical testimony, and to the satisfaction of the Board, to have been brought about by fire service work. The Board may at its discretion pay the amount decided on as compensation, either in one sum or by periodical payments.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Dried Fruits Act* 1928, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

(1) The Regulations under the above-mentioned Act made on the 22nd May, 1934, are hereby amended to the following extent.

(2) Part 7.—The Maintenance and Good Order of the Industry.

After Regulation 24, insert the following new Regulation:—

24.A.—
(a) No person shall remove any dried tree fruit from any packing shed either for sale or for any other purpose within the State of Victoria or for transport beyond the limits of the said State unless and until a release note in the form contained in Schedule 7 hereto has been issued to the owner occupier or person in charge of such packing shed. Such release note shall be signed by an inspector or some person authorized by the Board and shall contain particulars of the quantities and varieties of dried tree fruit which may be released and all other particulars therein required.

(b) The owner occupier or person in charge of any packing shed from which any dried tree fruits are removed in contravention of paragraph (a) of this regulation shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

- (c) No person shall carry transport or have in his possession any dried tree fruit which has been prepared processed graded stemmed or packed unless the same is fully covered by a release note duly completed as aforesaid.
- (d) Any person carrying transporting or having in his possession any dried tree fruit which has been prepared processed graded stemmed or packed shall when requested so to do by any inspector produce the release note relating to such fruit for inspection and state his name and address.
- (e) If such person fails to produce the release note as aforesaid or refuses to state his name and address or states a false name and address he shall be guilty of a contravention of these Regulations.

Provided that any person failing to produce the release note as aforesaid who gives a reasonable excuse for such failure and within seven days after such failure forwards such release note to the Secretary of the Board by prepaid properly addressed registered letter shall not be guilty of a contravention.

Willmott, of 65 O'Farrell-street, Yarraville, a person who has been bona fide and actually engaged in the trade concerned, namely, the trade of delivering bread for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by the representatives of employees on the Bread Carters Board whose Determination is alleged to have been contravened by the above-mentioned N. Mirabella;

5. No person shall, without the written consent of the Council, use on any road any vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections.

6. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

7. This By-law shall apply to, and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Bannockburn.
