Forests Act 1928 (No. 3685).

PROCLAMATION OF "PROCLAIMED PERIOD" AND "PROCLAIMED AREA" WHERE SERIOUS DANGER FROM FIRES EXISTS.

WHEREAS by section 69 of the *Forests Act* 1928 (No. 3685), it is enacted that—

Whenever the Commission with respect to any period of twelve months reports to the Minister that, whether owing to climatic conditions or otherwise, there is a serious danger of fire or of the spread of fire in any part or parts of Victoria, the Governor in Council may from time to time, for the purpose of this section, declare by Proclamation:—

(a) any specified portion of such period to be a "proclaimed period"; and

(b) any specified area of Victoria to be a "proclaimed area."

And whereas under this section it is provided that any person who during any proclaimed period within any proclaimed area lights or kindles, or knowingly causes or permits to be lighted or kindled, any fire in the open air except—

(a) in such positions as are prescribed by Regulations under this section, or are indicated by notices in the prescribed form issued under the authority of prescribed persons (including the holders for the time being of any prescribed offices as such), or bodies of persons; and

(b) with such precautions as are prescribed—

shall be liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than two years, or to a penalty of not more than Two hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and penalty.

And whereas the Commission has reported to the Minister that, owing to climatic conditions, a serious danger of fire exists in areas indicated: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare:—

(a) that the "proclaimed period" shall be from the sixteenth day of January, 1935, to the fifteenth day of March, 1935, both days inclusive; and

(b) that the "proclaimed area" shall be the area specified in the Schedule hereunder:—

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

AWARD No. 45 OF 28TH DECEMBER, 1934, RELATING TO SALARIES AND WAGES FOR THE YEAR 1934.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *Railways Act 1928* (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. The rates of salaries and wages to be paid to officers and employees during the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four shall be as set forth hereunder:—

- (a) Adult male employees (except gatekeepers) shall be paid a basic wage of 11s. 7d. per day from the 1st January until the 21st April inclusive, and 10s. 8d. per day thereafter, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 5th May, 1933, and 17th April, 1934 (Railway Award) respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therein in the schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40 and 44 and in the schedule to this Award.
- (b) Adult male officers shall be paid a basic salary of £181 per annum from the 1st January until the 21st April inclusive and £167 per annum thereafter, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 5th May, 1933, and 17th April, 1934 (Railway Award) respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therein in the schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, and 40, and in the schedule to this Award.
- (c) Adult male gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 1s. per day less than the basic wage.
- (d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therein in the schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.
- (e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed therein in the schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

2. The rates prescribed for casual employees, junior employees, and female employees are based on an adult male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day, and those prescribed for junior officers are based on an adult male basic salary of £226 per annum, and the said rates shall on the same dates be increased or decreased in the following manner:—

- (i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.
- (ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, and of junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest penny or the nearest pound (as the case may be).

Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage.

3. Notwithstanding anything hereinafter contained:—

- (a) As from the 1st January until the 21st April inclusive, the adult male basic wage and the adult male basic salary payable under the provisions of this Award shall be subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent.
- (b) The margins over the basic salary or basic wage payable to officers and employees shall be those prescribed in the schedule of rates applicable on 3rd October, 1930, together with the alterations and additions prescribed in the schedules to Awards Nos. 26 of 27th December, 1930, 30 of 31st December, 1931, 35 of 20th December, 1932, 40 of 21st December, 1933, and 44 of 6th September, 1934, and in the schedule to this award, subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent. as from the 1st January until the 30th June inclusive.
- (c) The rates of salary or wage payable to junior officers, junior employees, and female employees, and the rates payable to employees paid at hourly rates, shall be those prescribed in the schedule of rates applicable on 3rd October, 1930, adjusted from time to time in accordance with the method of cost of living adjustment prescribed in this Award, subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent. as from the 1st January until the 21st April inclusive.

(d) Adult male gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 7d. per day below the basic wage from the 1st January until the 21st April, and 6d. per day below the basic wage thereafter.

(e) Any adult male officer or employee shall be remunerated at a rate not lower than the basic salary or basic wage, subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent. from the 1st January until 21st April inclusive.

4. (a) As from the 1st July, 1934, the Commissioners may make emergency deductions from the rates of pay of officers and employees, the maximum of which is to be determined by applying to the rates in force on the 3rd October, 1930, the same rate of reduction as is applied by the State Financial Emergency Act or any amendment thereof to similar or substantially similar rates of officers of the Public Service, and subtracting from this result the amount of the decrease in the basic rate subsequent to that date.

(b) The rates in force on the 9th October, 1930, shall be deemed to include such rates as modified by any subsequent variation of the margins comprised therein now or hereafter in operation.

(c) Provided that no such deduction shall reduce the rate payable below that in operation on the 30th June, 1934, except to the extent of any decrease in the basic rate below that payable on that date.

(d) If such rate is so reduced it shall not be increased owing to any subsequent basic rate adjustment so long as the provisions of this Award relating to emergency deductions are applicable.

(e) Should any such rate be reduced by basic wage adjustment to an extent which renders the provisions of this Award relating to emergency deductions inapplicable, it shall not thereafter be increased by similar adjustment above the rate payable after the maximum emergency deduction determined as prescribed herein has been made, except to the extent that any such net increase since 3rd October, 1930, may exceed such maximum deduction.

5. The amount of the emergency deduction made under the provisions of clauses 3 and 4 hereof shall be calculated to the nearest pound or the nearest penny (as the case may be).

6. The amount of any emergency deduction made by the Commissioners under the provisions of clause 4 hereof shall be deemed to be a deduction made under this Award.

7. If in any period during the currency of this Award the Commissioners are bound to pay to any grade referred to herein the rate provided in respect of such grade in any other Award or in any agreement, undertaking or Act binding upon the Commissioners, then the rate prescribed herein shall not apply during such period, but there shall be payable in lieu thereof a rate not less than that provided in such other Award or in such agreement, undertaking or Act.

8. Any increase prescribed by this Award or as a result of the quarterly cost of living adjustments shall not entitle any officer to a salary exceeding £500 per annum.

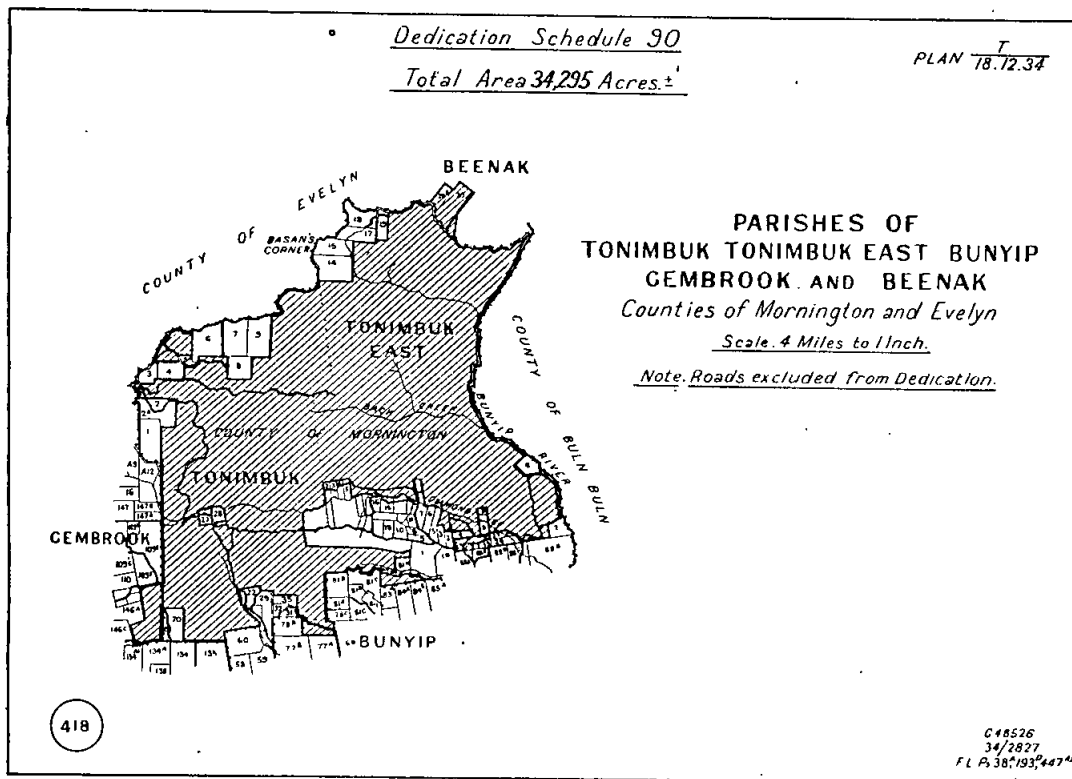

REGULATIONS AMENDED.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the Dried Fruits Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to the purposes therein prescribed and all matters and things necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the said Acts into effect: And whereas it is deemed necessary to exercise the said powers in respect of certain matters and things prescribed by or arising under the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

GRADE STANDARDS FOR DRIED FRUITS.

For Regulation 17 of the "Dried Tree Fruits Regulations" there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

GRADE STANDARDS FOR DRIED FRUITS.**Pear Grades.***Fancy Quality—*

Dried pears describable as "fancy" shall consist of the cleanly-cut, complete halves of sound pear fruit which have been divided longitudinally. The fruit shall be fully ripened and thoroughly cured, of a uniformly clear colour and excellent quality and texture for the grade, and shall be free from blemishes, blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 2 inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 1½ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 1¼ inches in diameter.

Choice Quality—

Dried pears describable as "choice" shall consist of the cleanly-cut, complete halves of sound pear fruit which have been divided longitudinally. The fruit shall be fully ripened and thoroughly cured, and shall be of good quality and texture for the grade. It shall be uniform and clear in colour, and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 2 inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 1½ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 1¼ inches in diameter.
- 1 Crown—consisting of such fruit as will pass through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 1½ inches in diameter.

Standard Quality—

Dried pears describable as "standard" shall consist of the cleanly-cut, complete halves of sound pear fruit which have been divided longitudinally. The fruit shall be fully ripened and thoroughly cured, and shall be of fair and average colour, of fair quality and texture for the grade, and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 2 inches in diameter.

The fruit shall be fully ripened and thoroughly cured, and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever.

Apricot Grades.*Fancy Quality—*

Dried apricots describable as "fancy" shall consist of the cleanly-cut, complete halves of sound apricot fruit which have been fully ripened and thoroughly cured, of a uniformly clear, bright apricot colour, of excellent quality and texture for the grade, and shall be free from blemishes, blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{3}{8}$ inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $\frac{7}{8}$ inch in diameter.

Choice Quality—

Dried apricots describable as "choice" shall consist of cleanly-cut, complete halves of sound apricot fruit which have been fully ripened and thoroughly cured, and of uniformly good apricot colour, of good quality and texture for the grade, and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{3}{8}$ inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $\frac{7}{8}$ inch in diameter.
- 1 Crown—consisting of such fruit as will pass through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $\frac{7}{8}$ inch in diameter.

Standard Quality—

No two varieties in this grade shall be packed in any one container. Each variety shall be of fair and average colour and fair texture. The fruit shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{3}{8}$ inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{8}$ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $\frac{7}{8}$ inch in diameter.

It shall not include whole fruit (pitted or unpitted); and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever.

Whole Unpitted Apricots—

Whole unpitted apricots shall consist of apricots from which the pits have not been removed. The same regulations shall apply, quality for quality, as those set out for apricots in complete halves in the preceding grades.

Whole Pitted Apricots—

Whole pitted apricots shall consist of apricots from which the pits have been removed. The same regulations shall apply, quality for quality, as those set out for apricots in complete halves in the preceding grades.

Nectarine Grades.*Fancy Quality—*

Dried nectarines describable as "fancy" shall consist of the cleanly-cut, complete halves of sound nectarine fruit, fully ripened and thoroughly cured, shall be of excellent colour, quality, and texture for the grade, and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{3}{8}$ inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{8}$ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $\frac{7}{8}$ inch in diameter.

Choice Quality—

Slabs—

Dried nectarines describable as "slabs" shall consist of portions of nectarine fruit irregular in size, shape, and thickness. It shall consist of fruit of fair and average colour, thoroughly cured, and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever.

Peaches (unpeeled).*Fancy Quality—*

Dried peaches describable as "fancy" shall consist of the cleanly-cut, complete halves of sound peach fruit, fully ripened and thoroughly cured, shall be of excellent colour, quality, and texture for the grade, and shall be free from blemishes, blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. Dark or white-coloured peaches shall not be included in this grade. The fruit shall be sized into crown grades as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure 2 inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.

Choice Quality—

- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{3}{4}$ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.
- 1 Crown—consisting of such fruit as will pass through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.

Plain Quality—

Dried peaches describable as "plain" shall consist of complete halves of sound ripe peach fruit thoroughly cured, and shall be free from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever. It shall consist of fruit of fair and average colour thoroughly cured, and shall be free from blackness and other discolouration, from fermentation, mould, deterioration, or foreign substances, and from undue stickiness arising from any cause whatsoever.

Peaches (peeled).

The same regulation shall apply in respect to grades as that set out for unpeeled peaches, except that the meshes of the sieve will be as follows:—

- 4 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{3}{4}$ inches in diameter.
- 3 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.
- 2 Crown—consisting of such fruit, uniform in size, as cannot be passed through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter.
- 1 Crown—consisting of such fruit as will pass through a sieve the circular meshes of which measure $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter.

Prunes (Quality Grades).*Choice Quality or "A" Grade—*

The fruit shall consist of sound, fully-ripened, full-bodied fruit of excellent texture. It shall be thoroughly cured and of a uniformly good dark colour, and shall be free from fermentation, mould, and foreign substances, and graded for size to one of the undermentioned counts; only one variety shall be packed in the one container.

Standard Quality or "B" Grade—

The fruit shall consist of sound, fully-ripened, good-bodied fruit of good texture. It shall be thoroughly cured and of average dark colour, and shall be free from fermentation, mould, and foreign substances, and graded for size to one of the undermentioned counts. Only one variety shall be packed in the one container.

Plain Quality or "C" Grade—

The fruit shall consist of sound fruit not adapted for inclusion in the preceding grades. It shall be thoroughly cured and free from fermentation, mould, and foreign substances, and graded for size to one of the undermentioned counts. Only one variety shall be packed in the one container.

Prunes (Size Grades).

- 20-30.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 20 dried prunes nor more than 30 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 30-40.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 30 dried prunes nor more than 40 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 40-50.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 40 dried prunes nor more than 50 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 50-60.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 50 dried prunes nor more than 60 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 60-70.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 60 dried prunes nor more than 70 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 70-80.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 70 dried prunes nor more than 80 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 80-90.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 80 dried prunes nor more than 90 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 90-100.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 90 dried prunes nor more than 100 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- 100-120.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 100 dried prunes nor more than 120 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.
- Small.—The fruit shall be of such size that not less than 120 dried prunes shall comprise one pound weight avoirdupois.

The word "sound" wherever used in the above Regulations means freedom from disease and from damage or decay.

PURSUANT to section 69, sub-section (5), of the *Forests Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations as set forth hereunder (that is to say):—

Regulations under section 69, sub-section (5) of the *Forests Act 1928* (No. 3685), whereby certain fires may be lighted subject to specified conditions:—

REGULATION 1.—FOR THE PURPOSES OF PREPARING MEALS, AND FOR NO OTHER PURPOSE, FIRES MAY BE LIGHTED.

(a) In specified places provided or allowed by the Forests Commission of Victoria, provided that the area within a radius of 10 feet of such fireplace be cleared of all inflammable material, and that the fire be properly extinguished before being left.

(b) On highways, roads, and recognized camping grounds, in properly constructed stoves, or receptacles or trenches at least 18 inches deep in which the fires will be restricted to the limits of the said stoves or receptacles or trenches, provided that the area within a radius of 10 feet of such stoves or receptacles or trenches be cleared of all inflammable material and that the fire be properly extinguished before being left.

REGULATION 2.—BURNING OF STUBBLE.

Stubble may be burnt only after 4 p.m. on a day when, at the time of burning, not more than a light breeze is prevailing, and only after a firebreak, comprised of one ploughed strip 18 feet in width or alternatively comprised of two ploughed strips, each at least 6 feet wide, and at least 30 feet apart, with such intervening space cleared by burning against the wind at least 24 hours before the main body is lighted, has been made around the said stubble, and all standing trees or timber less than 100 feet within the boundary of the areas to be burnt have had similar breaks formed around them. The provisions of the Police Offences Act are to be fully complied with, and where the stubble is situated within 1 mile of any State forest, notice of intention to burn must either be forwarded, in writing, by registered post or personal service, or telegram to the nearest forest officer and police officer not less than 24 hours before the day on which it is intended to burn.

REGULATION 3.—BURNING OF FIREBREAKS IN GRASS LANDS.

(a) The Forests Commission of Victoria may grant to persons approved by it permits to burn firebreaks in grass lands. Such permits shall be in the form contained in Schedule "A" hereto, shall be issued by a forest officer, and shall authorize the holders thereof to burn such firebreaks between the hours of Three o'clock in the afternoon and Eleven o'clock in the forenoon of the day following, provided that at the time of burning the temperature does not exceed 90 degrees Fahr., and that not more than a light breeze is then prevailing. Provided further that no such fire shall be lighted until at least six men equipped with approved fire fighting appliances under the control of a man experienced in burning firebreaks are in attendance, and a strip of land at least 4 feet wide along either side of the proposed firebreak has been completely cleared of all vegetation and inflammable material, and ploughed. Firebreaks shall be not more than 2 chains wide, inclusive of the ploughed area. All fires shall be properly extinguished before being left. Notice, in writing, of intention to burn shall, not less than 48 hours before the day on which it is intended to burn, be forwarded by registered post, or be served personally upon, the nearest forest officer, the officer in charge of the nearest police station, and the occupier of all land contiguous to that on which the firebreak is intended to be burnt.

(b) Persons approved by the Forest Commission as being fit and proper to burn firebreaks in grass lands shall be issued with a certificate, in the form contained in Schedule "B" hereto, which shall entitle the said person from time to time to apply to a forest officer for a permit as aforesaid.

REGULATION 4.—BURNING OF GRASS.

Grass may be burnt only after sundown on a day when the temperature has not exceeded 90 degrees, and provided that at the time of burning not more than a light breeze is prevailing, and only after a firebreak comprised of two ploughed strips, each at least 4 feet in width and at least 10 feet apart, with such intervening space cleared, has been

made round the said grass, and the provisions of the Police Offences Act have been fully complied with. Where the grass is situated within 1 mile of any State forest, notice of intention to burn must either be forwarded, in writing, by registered post, or by personal service to the nearest forest officer, or police officer, not less than 48 hours before the day on which it is intended to burn.

REGULATION 5.—BURNING OF BRACKEN, SCRUB, TIMBER, ETC.

Bracken, scrub, timber, or herbage may be burnt only with the written permission of the forest officer between the hours of 4 p.m. and sunrise on a day when the temperature has not exceeded 90 degrees, and provided that at the time of burning not more than a light breeze is prevailing: Providing, further, that a break 12 feet wide be cleared of all inflammable material around the area to be burned, and that such number of men as are prescribed by the forest officer, equipped with such fire fighting apparatus as is prescribed, are in attendance at the fire. All fire to be thoroughly extinguished at sunrise, and the provision of the Police Offences Act must be fully complied with.

1. Fires lighted under the authority hereof shall be so lighted between the hours of three o'clock in the afternoon and eleven o'clock in the forenoon of the day following provided that the temperature does not then exceed 90 deg. Fahr. and that not more than a light breeze is then prevailing.

2. No such fire shall be lighted until at least six men equipped with approved fire fighting appliances under the control of a man experienced in burning firebreaks are in attendance and a strip of land at least 4 feet wide along either side of the proposed firebreak has been completely cleared of all vegetation and inflammable material and ploughed.

3. Firebreaks shall be not more than 2 chains wide inclusive of the ploughed area.

4. All fires shall be properly extinguished before being left.

5. Notice in writing of intention to burn shall, not less than 48 hours before the day on which it is intended to burn, be forwarded by registered post, or be served personally upon, the nearest forest officer, the office in charge of the nearest police station, and the occupiers of all land contiguous to that on which the firebreak is intended to be burnt.

6. Water shall be carried to all fires and used to extinguish thoroughly all smouldering debris, &c.

1. The Chairman of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of £13 13s. for each sitting of the Board, provided that the total amount of fees received by the said Chairman shall not exceed £700 for the period of six months ending 31st July, 1935.

1. Regulations 8 and 8A of the Boot Trades Regulations (No. 2) shall be and the same are hereby rescinded as on and from the 1st day of January, 1935.

MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS BOARD.**NUMBER OF MEMBERS REDUCED.**

REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS WITHIN THE CITY OF CHELSEA.

The Fisheries Acts.**ALTERATION OF MINIMUM LEGAL LENGTH FOR YELLOW-EYE MULLET.****PROCLAMATION**

NOTE.—The length of such fish shall be ascertained by measuring overall, that is, from the tip of the snout to the end of the tail.

BY-LAWS OF THE ALFRED HOSPITAL
(INCORPORATED).

PURSUANT to section 65 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1928*, the following By-laws of the institution were adopted by the contributors at a Special Meeting, duly convened for the purpose on the 20th July, 1934:—

After By-law No. 6, the following new by-law is inserted, and numbered 7:—

"Any person who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, other than by contributing thereto, may be elected a Life Governor at any General meeting, on the recommendation of the committee."

By-laws numbered 7 and 8 are altered to read 8 and 9, respectively.

By-law numbered 9 is rescinded and the following new by-law, numbered 10, is inserted:—

He shall be entitled to the rights and privileges of a Life Governor, as set out in the succeeding paragraphs, except those of voting at any general meeting, or at any election, or of being elected to any office which can be filled only by a contributor."

By-law numbered 18 (a) is altered to read:—

"Every contributor who has on his own behalf contributed at any time within the twelve months next preceding the date of any General Meeting or of any recommendation at least:—

(a) The sum of Ten pounds, shall be entitled to three votes at such general meeting, and to recommend four in-patients and twenty out-patients."
