Rate By-law for the year ending 30th September, 1935.

THE Council of the Shire of Creswick, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes other than by measure on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Borough Riding of the Shire of Creswick Water Supply District.

On such lands and tenements, a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding £45, and Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding £45 but not exceeding £99, and Ten pence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding £99.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twelve shillings and sixpence.

Such rates are made and levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said land and tenements for the year commencing 1st October, 1934, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st October, 1934, and the 1st day of April, 1935, at the office of the said Council.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic use by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

The charge for water troughs shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

The charge for water supplied at stand-pipe shall be Nine-pence per load of 180 gallons.

BY-LAWS OF OVENS BENEVOLENT HOME
INCORPORATED, BEECHWORTH.

PURSUANT to section 65 of the *Hospital and Charities Act* 1928, made by the Committee, and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors.

1. All By-Laws in force prior to the date of the coming into operation of these By-Laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.
2. These By-Laws shall come into operation on the 13th day of April, 1935.

DEFINITIONS.

3. In these By-Laws the word "contributor" shall have the same meaning as in the Act.

The words "the Act" shall mean the *Hospitals and Charities Act* 1928, or any amendment thereof, and Regulations made by the Governor in Council under such Acts.

OBJECTS.

4. The objects of Ovens Benevolent Home Incorporated, Beechworth, shall be:—

To relieve destitute persons, being aged, infirm or permanently disabled, who do not require continuous medical or surgical attention. By receiving and maintaining in the Home such as may be most benefited by being inmates thereof. By giving out-door relief to families and individuals in distress.

SEAL.

5. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept by the secretary and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the General Committee at a meeting at which five members at least are present at the time of making such order and in the presence of at least two members of such Committee and of the secretary or such other person as the Committee may appoint for the purpose and those two members and secretary or other person as aforesaid shall sign every document to which such seal is so affixed in their presence.

CONSTITUTION.

6. The incorporated institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and the members of the Committee hereinafter referred to, honorary treasurer, governors, and contributors.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

7. A life governor shall be any person who is a life governor at the date of the coming into operation of these By-laws or being eligible under the By-laws is elected a life governor by the Committee.

Any person may be elected a life governor—

- (a) who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the Home other than by contributing thereto;
- (b) who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the funds of the Home a sum of not less than Twenty pounds in one donation;
- (c) who is nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company, or firm which at any time has contributed to the Home a sum of not less than Twenty pounds in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company, or firm;
- (d) who is nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company, firm, or employer who at any time have contributed to the funds of the Home a sum of not less than Twenty pounds in one donation;
- (e) who is nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any will, who at any time have allocated a sum of not less than Twenty pounds to the Home in one donation out of any moneys of the testator not directed to be paid to the Home under the will.

Provided that any such contribution as aforesaid has been made without any right of relief having accrued or accruing in respect thereof to any person, corporation, firm, executor, or trustee making the same, or to any person nominated in respect of the same.

Every life governor upon election shall forthwith be enrolled as such in the books of the institution, and shall be entitled to a certificate stating that he has been so elected.

MEETING OF CONTRIBUTORS.

8. All Annual Meetings of Contributors shall be advertised by the secretary at least fourteen days, and all Special Meetings at least seven days, before the day on which such meeting is to be held in a newspaper circulating in Beechworth.

9. The Annual General Meeting of Contributors shall be held on such day between the first day of July and the thirty-first day of August in each year as shall be fixed by the Committee for the following purposes:—

- (a) To confirm the minutes of the previous Annual Meeting and Special Meetings, if any, no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.
- (b) To receive the report of the General Committee and audited statements of receipts and expenditure for the year to the 30th June preceding.
- (c) For the election of president, two vice-presidents, honorary treasurer, and auditor for the ensuing year.
- (d) The election of members of the General Committee for the ensuing year in place of those retiring.
- (e) For the transaction of any business of which at least seven days' notice has been given.

10. If required by the Committee, or upon the requisition in writing of six members of the Committee, or of ten contributors, the secretary shall, as provided in By-law No. 8, convene a special meeting of contributors, the occasion for calling such meeting being stated in such requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting excepting that for which it shall have been summoned.

11. At every General Meeting the president or, in his absence, the senior vice-president in attendance shall preside as chairman, but if none of these office-bearers be present, the contributors present shall choose one of their number to be chairman at that meeting.

12. At all meetings of contributors all questions, except questions involving contested elections, shall be decided by a show of hands, unless before or on the declaration of the result a division is demanded by any contributor, in which event it shall be decided by a division. A declaration by the chairman that a resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or otherwise, and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of the fact, provided, however, that where at least seven contributors so demand, any resolution confirming a By-law shall be decided by poll as hereinafter provided.

13. Votes of contributors given through the post shall, on a show of hand, division, or poll, be counted in the same manner as if they had been given in person.

14. At all meetings of contributors, the chairman shall, in the event of there being an equality of votes on any question, have a casting vote only.

15. Contributors shall on all occasions be entitled to one vote only.

16. Where at any meeting of contributors a poll is duly demanded on any resolution confirming a By-law, the chairman of such meeting shall adjourn the meeting to admit of the poll being taken to a day to be fixed by him, but not less than four nor more than ten days after the day of adjournment. On the day preceding that fixed for the adjourned meeting, a poll of all contributors on the resolution in respect of which the poll was demanded shall be taken.

17. Notice of the poll, specifying the By-law or By-laws to be confirmed and the day, place, and time of polling shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in Beechworth not less than three days before the day so fixed. The result of such poll shall be announced by the chairman at the adjourned meeting, and shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.

18. Where, under the By-laws, any election has to be decided by poll, such poll shall be taken on a day to be fixed by the Committee. Notice of the day so fixed, of the time and place of polling, and of the office or offices to be filled, and the names of the candidates duly nominated, shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in Beechworth not less than three days before the day so fixed.

19. Upon a poll being taken, each contributor may give his vote either in person or through the post. The poll shall be kept open from Eight o'clock in the morning to Seven o'clock in the evening on the polling day, and the votes of contributors who vote in person shall be recorded at any time between these hours. Votes recorded by post shall reach the polling office appointed as aforesaid or the secretary before the closing time for the poll. The Committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of the poll and the proper counting of the votes.

20. A minute-book shall be kept in which shall be recorded minutes of all General Meetings. Such minutes, if purporting to be signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the proceedings were held, or by the chairman of the next succeeding General Meeting, shall be evidence of the proceedings, and such meeting shall be deemed to have been duly held and convened, and the resolutions recorded in the minutes duly passed or otherwise as recorded.

OFFICE-BEARERS AND COMMITTEE.

21. The Committee shall consist of nine contributors comprising the president, the two vice-presidents, and the honorary treasurer *ex officio*, and five elected members.

22. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer respectively shall hold office for one year, and shall retire on the day of the Annual General Meeting next succeeding their election, but may be re-elected.

23. No paid officer of the institution shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

24. The advertisement calling the Annual General Meeting shall state the names of the members of the Committee who will retire at such meeting, and the number of vacancies to be filled, and that nominations for the offices of president, vice-president, treasurer, and auditor, and of members of the Committee require to be delivered to the secretary on or before a day named.

25. Where, on or before the day so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates have not been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, the chairman at the Annual General Meeting shall declare the persons so nominated duly elected to the offices for which they have been nominated.

26. Where, on or before the date so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates have been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, a poll shall be taken. Such poll shall be held before the day of the Annual General Meeting, and the results of such poll shall be announced by the chairman at such meeting, and the persons elected by such poll shall be deemed to have been elected at the Annual General Meeting.

MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE.

27. The Committee shall meet on the second Wednesday of each month at such place and at such time as the Committee may determine.

28. Special Meetings of the Committee may be convened by the president or any four members. Notice shall be given to members of such meetings, specifying the general nature of the business to be transacted, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

29. Written notice of each monthly meeting shall be served on each member of the Committee by delivering it to him before the meeting, or by sending it by post in a prepaid letter, addressed to him at his usual or last-known place of abode in time to reach him prior to the meeting being held.

30. No less than five of the members shall form a quorum at any meeting of Committee. No business shall be transacted unless a quorum is present, and if within half an hour of the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned.

31. The president, or, in his absence, the senior vice-president in attendance, shall preside at all meetings of Committee, but if none of these office-bearers is present the members shall choose one of their number to be chairman.

32. If any member of the Committee—

(a) dies,

(b) resigns, by writing, under his hand addressed to the chairman of the Committee,

(c) becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or compounds with his creditors, or makes a deed of arrangement for the benefit of his creditors,

(d) ceases to be a contributor to the Home,

(e) is convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or

(f) is, without the permission of the Committee, absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Committee,

his office shall thereupon become vacant.

33. In the event of any casual vacancy in the Committee, the remaining members of the Committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to the Home. Such contributor may continue to be a member of the Committee until immediately before the next annual meeting for the election of the Committee, when he shall retire therefrom, but may be eligible for re-election.

34. In the event of any vacancy in the office of president, vice-president, or other elective officer (other than a vacancy caused by his retirement at the expiration of his term of office), the Committee may temporarily appoint some person qualified to hold the same, and the person so appointed may continue in office until immediately before the next Annual General Meeting aforesaid.

35. All questions arising at any meeting of the Committee shall be decided by a show of hands, or if demanded by any member, by a division. Each member, including the chairman, shall have one vote. In the event of the members being equal, the chairman shall in addition have a casting vote.

36. Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings at all meetings of the Committee.

37. No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or rescinded for one calendar month after such resolution has been passed, except at a Special Meeting of the Committee called for the purpose, or by an absolute majority of the whole Committee.

38. The Committee shall prepare and lay before the contributors at each Annual General Meeting a general report of the affairs of the Home, together with a balance-sheet, duly audited, exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure for the twelve months ended on the 30th day of June next preceding the day of such meeting.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

39. The Committee shall, at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of the Contributors, appoint from among themselves a House Committee of four members, one of whom shall be the president or a vice-president. Two to form a quorum. The president or vice-president, as the case may be, shall be the chairman.

40. The House Committee shall—

- (a) visit the Home at least once during the month;
- (b) inspect the various parts of the Home;
- (c) examine the condition of the furniture, beds, and bedding in the Home;
- (d) satisfy themselves that all articles for human consumption in the Home are sound and wholesome, and that all food given to inmates and staff is properly cooked and served out in a suitable manner;
- (e) hear and investigate all complaints upon any matter relating to the Home;
- (f) make suggestions for the further good management and discipline of the Home and for the comfort of the inmates;
- (g) perform such other functions as the Committee may from time to time determine;
- (h) report, in writing, to the next Monthly Meeting of the Committee the result of their inspection and examination and otherwise regarding their work.

FINANCE COMMITTEE.

41. A Finance Committee, consisting of the treasurer and three other members, one of whom shall be the president or a vice-president, shall be elected by and from the General Committee at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of Contributors. Two to form a quorum. The president, or vice-president, as the case may be, shall be the chairman.

42. The Finance Committee shall—

- (a) examine the secretary's cash-book and other books of account, and compare same with the bank pass-book;
- (b) give all useful instructions to the secretary and collector with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations.
- (c) examine the abstract of accounts prepared by the treasurer for presentation to the Committee at its monthly meeting, satisfy itself that all services in relation thereto have been duly executed, and that all vouchers connected with the abstract have been correctly acquitted or certified;
- (d) see that vouchers in connexion with previous payments passed by the Committee have been properly receipted;
- (e) examine the returns prepared for the Charities Board of Victoria and other Government Departments, and the annual statement of accounts;
- (f) perform such other duties as may be allotted by the Committee.

43. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the Finance Committee, the signature of some member thereof should be appended with the date of examination.

OTHER SUB-COMMITTEES.

44. The Committee may at any time appoint any other sub-committee (consisting of members of their own body) they may think fit, and may prescribe the functions of or delegate any of its powers to any such sub-committee.

FINANCE.

45. The secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the Home, and issue the official receipt forthwith. Such moneys shall be deposited without delay to the credit of the Home in such bank as the Committee may from time to time determine, and the Treasurer shall satisfy himself that all moneys received are so paid in.

46. All accounts shall be paid by cheque, and no payments shall be made without the authority of the Committee.

47. Cheques shall not be drawn or signed by the treasurer except for moneys the payment whereof has been duly authorized by the Committee.

48. All cheques drawn and signed by the Treasurer shall be countersigned by the secretary.

ALLOCATION OF FUNDS RECEIVED.

49. All pecuniary gifts (*inter vivos* or testamentary) made to the home specifically for endowment purposes shall be placed to the credit of the endowment fund, and shall be invested by the treasurer as the Committee shall from time to time direct, and any income arising from such investment shall be paid to the credit of the maintenance account.

50. All pecuniary gifts (*inter vivos* or testamentary) not exceeding the sum of £100 and not subject to conditions attached shall be paid to the credit of the maintenance account.

51. All pecuniary gifts (*inter vivos* or testamentary) exceeding the sum of £100 and not subject to conditions attached shall be paid to the credit of the reserve fund.

52. Accumulated credits to the maintenance account shall not be applied for endowment purposes, but may be transferred to the reserve fund from time to time as the Committee directs.

53. All amounts placed in the reserve fund may be invested by the treasurer from time to time as the Committee directs, and any income arising from such investments shall be paid to the credit of maintenance or reserve funds at the discretion of the Committee, provided that the Committee may at any time for maintenance, building or equipment purposes authorize the disposal of the whole or any part of the reserve fund investments.

AUDITOR.

54. A duly qualified auditor shall be elected at the annual meeting each year; the remuneration to be paid such auditor shall be then fixed.

55. The auditor shall, during July in each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial statement, compare it with all books and accounts and documents relating thereto and list of contributors and donations. He may make any special report thereon which he may consider necessary to the annual meeting.

GENERAL.

56. Any inmate gambling, smoking in the wards without permission, or behaving in any indecent manner in any part of the Home premises will be liable to immediate discharge by the Committee.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

REGULATIONS (AMENDING).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of June, 1934.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* (hereinafter referred to as the said Act) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make Regulations for all or any of the purposes set forth in the said section, and whereas by paragraph (5) of the said section it is provided that Regulations may be made for the payment of compensation in cases of accidents to members of brigades, or where death ensues therefrom to their wives and families, and for providing for the establishment of a pension or superannuation fund for the members of a brigade contributing to such fund: And whereas Regulations were duly made by the Governor in Council on the 25th day of September, 1916, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of the said month whereby it was provided that a pension or superannuation fund for members of the brigade contributing to such a fund was thereby established, and that like powers and authorities with respect thereto to those contained in the Regulations next hereinafter recited and now appearing hereunder were exercisable by the Board: And whereas by certain further Regulations made by the Governor in Council, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of June, 1930, it was provided that all Regulations theretofore made by the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") were rescinded, but so that anything done under such rescinded Regulations should not be affected by such rescission: And whereas by the said further Regulations a pension or superannuation fund for members of the permanent fire brigade who shall contribute to such fund was established, into which certain payments by such members and the Board were required to be made: And whereas the Board was thereby charged with the control of the said fund, with power to formulate and promote from time to time a scheme or schemes for the management and administration thereof, and for providing benefits, advantages, and payments to such members thereunder: And whereas the scheme set forth in the schedule hereto which had been inaugurated by the permanent staff of the Board on the 1st day of January, 1912, was accordingly adopted, formulated, and promoted by the Board on the 1st day of January, 1917, under and in pursuance of the Regulations for the time being in force: And whereas the said fund has been at all times since its establishment as aforesaid controlled by the Board and has since the said 1st day of January, 1917, been managed and administered by the Board under the said scheme: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is amongst other things enacted that all Regulations as to the metropolitan district shall be prepared by the Board and submitted to the Minister for approval prior to being made by the Governor in Council: And whereas these Regulations have been so prepared, submitted, and approved accordingly: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. The Pension or Superannuation Fund heretofore established by and under the Regulations made from time to time by the Governor in Council as aforesaid shall be controlled by the Board and be managed and administered by it under and in accordance with the scheme set forth in the schedule hereto.

2. The management and administration under these Regulations of the said Pension or Superannuation Fund by the Board, in accordance with the said scheme, shall be deemed to have commenced at the date of the adoption, formulation, and promotion of the said scheme by the Board on the 1st day of January, 1917, and to have continued thereunder up to the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations, and all contributions made to or payments made out of, or rights acquired in such fund under the said scheme prior to such last-mentioned date shall be deemed to have been made and acquired.

3. The Board from time to time may, subject to the provisions of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, recommend the alteration, variation, or modification of the benefits, advantages, and payments provided for by such scheme or substitution therefor of some other scheme or schemes with regard to the said fund, upon giving to each person contributing to the fund at least fourteen days' notice, in writing, of its intention to make such recommendation the substance and effect of which shall be duly set forth in such notice.

4. These Regulations shall apply to that part of the State of Victoria known as the Metropolitan Fire District, and described in the second column in the Second Schedule of the said Act, and to the Township of Thomastown, in the Shire of Whittlesea.

SCHEDULE.

PENSION OR SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Scheme.

1. In this schedule, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Act" means the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, and any Act amending the same.

"The Board" means the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board, Melbourne.

"The fund" means the Superannuation Fund, the capital and revenue of which is acquired from the following sources:—The amount accumulated by voluntary subscriptions from members of the permanent staff, an amount received from the Widows and Orphans and General Benefit Fund, to which members of the permanent staff of the Board contributed prior to 1st January, 1912, and grants by the Board from and after 1st January, 1912.

"Permanent staff" means the persons in the employment of the Board who are engaged in the prevention and extinction of fires, also the persons in such employment who are occupying the following positions:—Managers and foremen of the engineering and electrical workshops, chief and deputy chief inspector of the special service staff, and clerical staff (females excepted), and persons occupying such other position or positions as may be prescribed by regulations under the said Act.

2. All persons who have been employed on the permanent staff for at least five years and are no longer members of the permanent staff, and members of the permanent staff, shall be eligible and entitled to continue to participate in the benefits of the fund. Such first-mentioned persons are hereinafter referred to as "attached members of the fund."

3. From the salary of every member of the permanent staff, and every attached member of the fund, the Board shall, whenever any payment thereof is made, deduct an amount not being less than 4 nor more than 5 per cent. of such salary, which shall be applied to and be used exclusively for the purposes of the said fund in such manner as is hereinafter provided. Such deduction shall be at once paid to the fund to the credit of the member or attached member from whose salary such deduction has been made. The Board, from its own funds, shall pay to the fund at the end of each year such a sum at least as will be equal to the difference between the amount represented by 10 per cent. of the total salaries paid in that year to the permanent staff and the attached members of the fund and the amount deducted from such salaries during that year, and shall also pay to the credit of the fund such further amounts as may from time to time be deemed necessary by an actuary appointed by the Board in order to give full effect to provisions of these Regulations.

4. Any member of the permanent staff, and any attached member of the fund who has been in the service of the Board for a continuous period of at least fifteen years, and who has been certified as medically unfit for further service by a medical practitioner appointed by the Board, shall be entitled to claim a pension payable from the fund. The amount of such pension shall be based on the average annual salary received by such member during the period of five years immediately preceding the date as from which he was medically certified as being unfit for further service with the Board, and shall be equal to one-fortieth of such average annual salary for each completed year of continuous service with the Board. Provided that, in computing the amount of such pension, any years of service beyond twenty shall be disregarded, and that no pension shall exceed an amount equal to twenty of such fortieths.

5. Any member of the permanent staff and any attached member of the fund upon attaining the age of sixty years shall, if he has then completed at least fifteen years' continuous service with the Board, be entitled to claim a pension payable from the fund. The amount of such pension shall be based on the average annual salary received by him during the period of five years immediately preceding the date at which he becomes so entitled, and shall be equal to one-fortieth of such average annual salary for each completed year of continuous service with the Board. Provided that, in computing such amount of pension, any years of service beyond twenty shall be disregarded, and that no pension shall exceed an amount equal to twenty of such fortieths. Upon receipt of such pension such member shall cease to be a member of the permanent staff or an attached member of the fund, as the case may be.

6. In computing the amount of any pension payable to any member of the permanent staff or to any attached member of the fund, as the case may be, the salary of such member shall not include any allowance for stars, extra pay, or any allowance of any kind whatsoever made by the Board to any of its employees.

7. In the case of incapacity, sickness, or permanent disablement of any member of the permanent staff or any attached member of the fund who has not completed fifteen years' service with the Board, and who is certified as medically unfit for further service by a medical practitioner appointed by the Board, such member or attached member, as the case may be, shall retire from such service, and if the Board is satisfied that such incapacity, sickness, or permanent disablement has not been brought about by reason of his own fault or indiscretion, he shall be entitled to receive, and the Board shall pay to him, a gratuity or payment from the fund in respect of each year of service not exceeding an amount equal to one-fortieth of the average annual amount of salary paid to such member during the last five years of his service, or during the term of his service if such service is less than five years, or not exceeding an amount equal to that deducted from his salary and paid to the fund as hereinbefore provided, whichever sum is the greater, but in either such case without interest.

8. Any member of the permanent staff and any attached member of the fund who resigns, or who may be discharged for any offence, shall receive no benefits from, nor be entitled to participate in, the said fund, provided that, should such member have been a contributor to the fund for a period of not less than five years, he shall be entitled to be paid a sum equal to two-thirds of his contributions, without interest, and shall have no further claim on the said fund.

9. If any member of the permanent staff or any attached member of the fund who has not attained the age of sixty years, or who, having attained that age, has not completed fifteen years' service, ceases to hold his position by reason only of a reduction by the Board in the number of employees, he shall be entitled to receive from the fund a sum equal to the amount of the contributions paid by him to the fund, but without the addition of interest, and, on receiving such sum, shall have no further claim on the fund.

10. In the event of the death of a member of the permanent staff or of an attached member of the fund who has been contributing to the fund for at least five years, there shall be paid to his widow, or to his next of kin, or to his legal personal representative if he dies leaving no widow, a sum of money equal to five-thirtieths of the salary received by him during the year immediately preceding his death, with an additional sum equal in amount to one-thirtieth of such salary for each completed year of service in excess of five years of service, but so that the total sum payable in any such case shall not exceed the amount received by him as salary in the year immediately preceding his death. The receipt of the said widow or of the next of kin or of the legal personal representative, as the case may be, shall be a full and complete discharge of the Board and the fund from all actions, claims, and demands against the Board or the fund for or which may be brought in connexion with or in any way incidental to such member or attached member, or to his death.

11. On the death of a pensioner there shall be paid to his widow, or to his next of kin, or to his legal personal representative if he dies leaving no widow, a sum equal to the annual pension he had been receiving reduced by one-tenth of the amount of such annual pension for each completed year which may have elapsed since he commenced to receive the pension, but so that at the death of a pensioner who has received the pension for ten or more years no payment will be made.

12. Pensions, and sums payable at death under these Regulations, shall not be in any way assigned or charged or passed by operation of law to any person other than the pensioner or beneficiary, and any moneys payable out of the fund on the death of a member of the permanent staff, or an attached member of the fund, or a pensioner, shall not be assets for the payment of his debts or liabilities.

13. Wherever an amount is payable under these Regulations to the widow or next of kin, or the legal personal representative of a member of the permanent staff, or of an attached member of the fund, or of a pensioner, the Board may, if it deems advisable, pay the amount so due and payable without production of probate or letters of administration.

14. Upon the termination through any cause whatsoever, of the service with the Board of a member of the permanent staff or of an attached member of the fund, his liability for payment of contributions under these Regulations shall cease.

15. Where any person of an age exceeding thirty years is appointed a member of the permanent staff of the Board he shall, for the purposes of ascertaining the benefits payable to him, under these Regulations, be deemed to have been so appointed on the thirtieth anniversary of his birthday, and there shall be deducted and paid to the fund such percentage of his salary as may be certified by an actuary appointed by the Board to be necessary to meet not less than 40 per cent. nor more than 50 per cent. of the cost of such benefits.

16. The fund shall be vested in and administered by the Board, which shall have control of all moneys and other assets constituting the fund, with full power to invest such part

of the fund as consists of money in Victorian Government securities, securities issued by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, debentures issued by any municipality (including the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong), town, borough, or shire in Victoria, or debentures or inscribed stock issued by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the Melbourne Harbour Trust, and the Victorian State Savings Bank, also on first mortgage or freehold property; but the Board shall not so invest moneys on mortgage of any property if any person directly or indirectly connected with the administration of the fund, or the wife of such person, within five years of giving such mortgage has been entitled to the fee-simple of such property, nor unless in making such investment it is acting on a report as to the value of the property made by a sworn valuer and the amount proposed to be invested does not exceed three-fifths parts of the value of the property as stated in such report.

17. The books and accounts of the fund shall be audited monthly by the Board's auditor.

18. An investigation by an actuary appointed by the Board as to the state and sufficiency of the fund shall be made at the expiration of each period of five years after the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty.

A By-law regulating the use of streets within certain townships within the Shire of Dimboola by street hawkers, or itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs or flowers, and prohibiting any such person during particular hours from using certain streets or portions of streets within the said townships, and numbered 30.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dimboola, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. No person for the purpose of selling, or offering, or exposing for sale flowers, fruit, vegetables, fish, flesh, food or any other foodstuffs, shall linger or loiter, or occupy any fixed stand in or upon any of the streets within the townships of Dimboola, Jeparit and Rainbow, but every such person using any of the said streets for any such purpose shall keep moving along such street, on the side situate on his left hand, at a reasonable walking pace, and shall not use any such streets more than once in the same hour.

2. No person shall, without the consent of the said Shire of Dimboola, carry on the business of a hawker or itinerant trader dealing in foodstuffs or flowers between the hours of Nine a.m. and Six p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday, and between Nine a.m. and Nine p.m. on Friday in each week, in or upon the undermentioned portions of the undermentioned streets within the undermentioned townships of Dimboola, Jeparit, and Rainbow.

3. No child (as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*) shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader, nor be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any street, road, or public place within the Shire of Dimboola.

4. Any person who by wilful act or default contrary thereto shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, for every first offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 17th day of October, 1934, and was confirmed on the 11th day of December, 1934.

SHIRE OF TAMBO.

BY-LAW NO. 31, RELATING TO COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tambo, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Acts and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law No. 31 of the Council of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Commission of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Tambo.

3. That By-law No. 23, made by the Council of the Shire of Tambo in pursuance of the Health Act, be hereby repealed.

4. Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of March, 1935, and on or before the 1st day of March in every subsequent year, register himself with the Council of the Shire of Tambo in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the said shire an application in the form hereunder written.

The fee for registration to be paid with an application to be registered as a person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall be as follows, namely:—

- (a) If the person to be registered keeps cows—a fee of Threepence (3d.) per cow, with a minimum fee of 2s. 6d. and a maximum fee of £1.
- (b) If the person to be registered does not keep cows—a fee of Ten shillings (10s.).

APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION AS

To the Secretary of the Shire of Tambo.

Sir,—

I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

SCHEDULE.

Name in full.

Trade in respect of which registration is desired.

Style or firm under which trade is carried on.

Every place within the said shire at which such trade, or any part of it, is carried on, including a description of all paddocks, grass lands, and enclosures occupied or used or intended to be used by the applicant.

The maximum number of cows to be kept during the ensuing twelve months.

6. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the shire shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it was received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose.

In the interpretation of this By-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender and number is expressly provided, and the word "person" shall include a corporation, co-partnership, firm, and company, unless there be something repugnant to or inconsistent with that interpretation.

7. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law or any of its provisions shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, in the discretion of the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered, or, in the like discretion of such justices, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
