Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD CARTERS BOARD.

Note.—(a) This Determination on the 14th January, 1935, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not within the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Chelsea, Mordialloc, and Warrnambool; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Echuca, Hamilton, Sebastopol, and Wonthaggi; the township of Kangaroo Flat in the shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye; and

(b) The shires or portions of the shires (if any) set forth below in the column opposite the name of the shire:-

(I) wheresoever employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving or in delivering bread in connexion with the business of a baker or a seller of bread;
(2) employed in or in connexion with any stable in which are stabled the horses used in his trade or business by a baker or a seller of bread.
