Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CHAFF-CUTTERS BOARD.

Note.—(a) This Determination on the 26th April, 1935, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

- (b) When the Order in Council appointing this Board was passed, the words printed below in italics were not included.

 The Governor in Council, by order dated 3rd August, 1921, added to the Board's powers, and for convenience of reference these powers are printed in this form.
- I N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—
 - (a) employed in the process, trade, or business of chaff-cutting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder; or in the trade of corn cleaning or corn grading;
 - (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the trade or business of chaff-outting corn-crushing, or compressing fodder,"

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 26th day of April, 1935, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and seplaced by this Determination.

- (7) The Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.
