MALLACOOTA INLET.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamations made the twenty-fourth day of August, 1914, and the first day of October, 1918, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the second day of September, 1914, and the ninth day of October, 1918, respectively, regarding the close season for netting in Mallacoota Inlet, and in lieu thereof to provide as follows:—

1. The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited in Mallacoota (sometimes called Mallagoota) Inlet, within an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlet enter the ocean, from the fifteenth day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year.

2. The use of nets, to be employed in fishing, shall be restricted in the abovementioned inlet as follows:—

No person shall—

- (a) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms.
- (b) Use at the same time a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets): provided that, in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be 1,200 fathoms. Provided further that, in case of two or more persons working together in a boat, each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.
- (c) Use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.
- (d) During the period referred to above, use any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, between the hours of Ten a.m. on Thursday in each week and Ten a.m. on the following Friday.
- (e) Use any "mesh" or "set" net between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m. on each day.

2. The use of nets to be used in fishing shall be restricted in the abovementioned inlets as follows:—

No person shall—

- (b) Use at the same time a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets): provided that, in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches or

- (e) Use any "mesh" or "set" net between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m. on each day.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF
LONG LINES AND BOATS WITH LONG LINES ON
BOARD IN PORT PHILLIP BAY (INCLUDING CORIO
AND HOBSON'S BAYS), ETC.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamations made the twenty-third day of October, 1933, and the sixth day of February, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of October, 1933, and the fourteenth day of February, 1934, respectively, regarding the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay and the prohibition of boats with long lines on board in Port Phillip Bay, and in lieu thereof prohibiting—

- (a) The use of long lines and the method of fishing known as "long lining" in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays) during the whole of each year; and
- (b) in respect of the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays), or of any creek or river flowing into such bay, any person from doing any or all of the following things at any time throughout any year:—

Taking a boat with a long line on board or attached thereto on to the said waters; permitting a long line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing any boat with a long line on board to be upon the said waters; or allowing a long line to be in or upon such waters or within one hundred yards thereof: Provided that during the period from the first day of April in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following (both days inclusive) the above provisions shall not apply to any person using a long line for taking ling only in the waters of Port Phillip Bay west of an imaginary line running in a south-easterly direction from the mouth of Little River to Indented Head; thence to the West Channel pile light, and south-westerly to Point Nepean, on condition that such line is made and used in accordance with the following specifications:—

- (1) The line shall consist of the material known as five-ply bagging or sewing twine; the hooks attached thereto shall not exceed size 3/0; and no bait other than raw beef shall be used.
- (2) The snoods on which the hooks are tied shall be attached to the long line at intervals of not more than 12 feet.
- (3) Not more than 800 hooks shall be used on a long line by any one person; but, where two or more persons are employed in the one boat, they shall severally and together use not more than 1,600 hooks.

CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.**BY-LAW No. 296.**

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 296, for the purpose of suppressing nuisances and preserving public decency and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "public place" shall have the meaning assigned to it in section 27 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*.

2. From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation any person who within the City of South Melbourne for the purpose of prostitution—

- (a) Solicits or accosts any person being or passing in or on any public place; or
- (b) Loiters in or about any public place within the view of any person being or passing therein or thereon shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

3. (1) Any person who—

- (a) being the tenant, lessee, or occupier, or person in charge of any premises knowingly permits such premises or any part thereof to be used as a brothel, or for the purposes of habitual prostitution; or
- (b) being the owner or lessee of any premises or the agent of such owner or lessee, lets or sublets the same or any part thereof with the knowledge that such premises or some part thereof are or is to be used as a brothel or for the purposes of habitual prostitution or is wilfully a party to the continued use of such premises or any part thereof as a brothel, or for the purposes of habitual prostitution shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4. For every offence against any provision of this By-law the offender shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD.**BUILDING REGULATION.****By-law No. 51.**

A By-law of the Borough of Daylesford, made under the powers conferred by Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 51, for amending By-law No. 47, and prescribing the class of dwelling house that may thereafter be erected in the Borough of Daylesford, and making provision for the occupancy of such dwelling house.

WHEREAS a previous By-law (No. 47) has been made by the Borough of Daylesford dealing with the above matters, and whereas it is desirable to amend such By-law: Now the Council of the Borough of Daylesford doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, order as follows:—

That clause 23 of the By-law No. 47 of the Borough of Daylesford (relating to Building Regulations) be repealed, and that the following clause be substituted therefor, and that the schedule hereunder referred to shall be added to the said By-laws after the word "affix" occurring in the First Schedule to the said By-law No. 47, and that such schedule shall be intitled "Second Schedule":—

23. (a) No dwelling house shall on any land abutting on any of the streets referred to in the Second Schedule consist of less than four (4) main rooms of a total area of not less than six hundred (600) square

feet, and that the cost of erection, exclusive of out-buildings and architects fees shall not be less than four hundred and fifty pounds (£450), and no buildings or rooms thereof shall be occupied for living purposes, unless at least four (4) main rooms shall have been completed according to plans and specifications submitted to and approved of by the Council.

- (b) In all other parts of the Borough other than those referred to in the Second Schedule hereto, no dwelling house shall consist of less than three main rooms of a total area of not less than four hundred (400) square feet, and no buildings or rooms thereof shall be occupied for living purposes unless at least three main rooms shall have been completed according to the plans and specifications submitted to and approved of by the Council.

SHIRE OF HEYTESBURY.**BY-LAW No. 35.**

A By-law of the Shire of Heytesbury, made under the *Local Government Acts*, acting under the powers conferred by section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and section 26 of the *Local Government Act 1934*, and numbered 35, for prohibiting or regulating the erection or use within the municipal district of tents or other temporary structures or buildings for the sale of goods therein or therefrom, and the sale of goods in or from such tents, structures, or buildings, and prohibiting or regulating the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicles, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacles standing or placed on vacant land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heytesbury order as follows:—

1. No person shall on or after the date of the publication of this By-law in the *Government Gazette* erect or use on any land within the municipal district any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom.

2. No person shall sell or offer or expose for sale any goods in any tent or other temporary structure or building within the municipal district.

3. No person shall sell or offer or expose for sale any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle, or any box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on any vacant land not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act 1928* within the Parishes of Paaratté, Timboon, Elingamite, Tandarook, South Purrumbete, or Pomborneit within the municipal district.

4. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. This By-law shall apply to the whole of the municipal district or to the several areas within the municipal district as above set out.

This By-law shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
