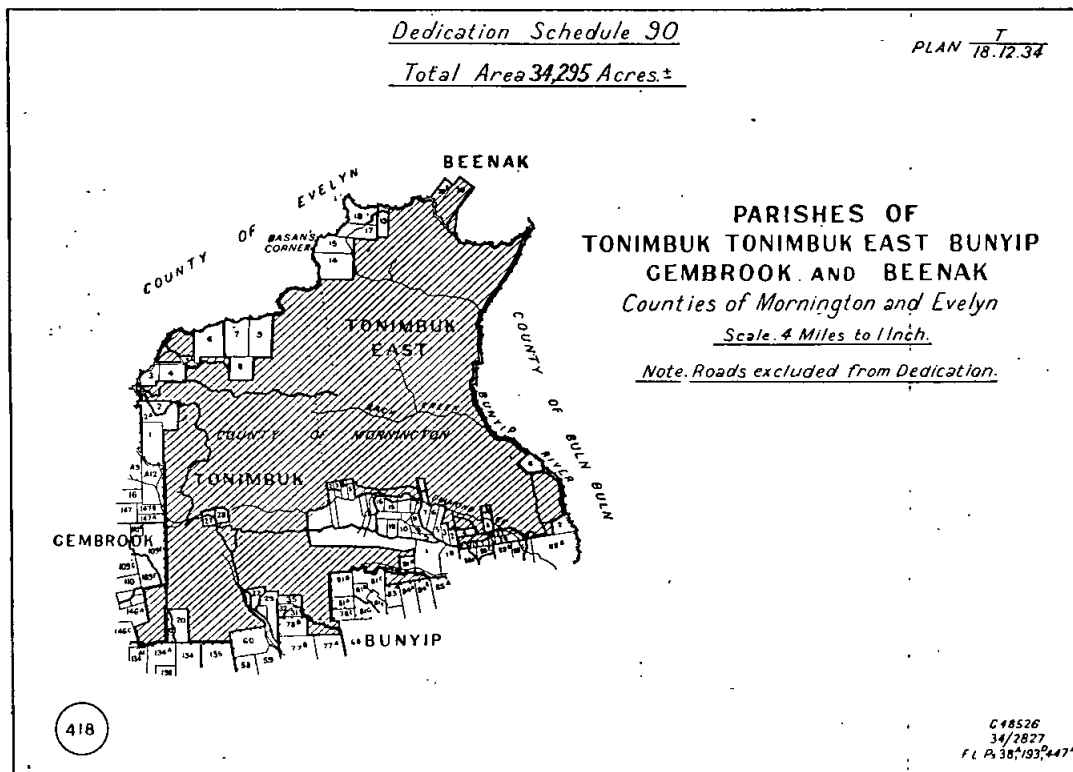

The Ballarat Sewerage District.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following Sewerage Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable sewered properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District:—

1. Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a sewerage rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said District.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1935, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1935, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1935, at the office of the Authority, situate at the Water and Sewerage Offices, Ballarat.

3. If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid rate becomes, during the year 1935, a "sewered property," there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

4. For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

5. Such person or persons as the Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

The resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the twenty-ninth day of November, 1934, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the seventeenth day of December, 1934.

SHIRE OF RIPON WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934-35.

THE Council of the Shire of Ripon, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Shire of Ripon Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twenty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October, 1934, and shall be payable on the 30th day of June, 1935, at the office of the said Council, Shire Offices, Beaufort.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

On every house, tenement, or public building being outside the boundaries of the Township of Beaufort, and which is supplied with water from the pipe line from Mt. Cole to Beaufort, by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall such charge be less than the minimum sum of Sixty shillings. The Council shall let for hire, water meters, the rental for which shall be at the rate of Seven shillings per annum for half-inch meters. Such rental shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water.

CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934-35.

No. 45.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1928* (and whose Water District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the period from the first day of October, 1934, to the thirtieth day of September, 1935, in respect of water supplied by the Council for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, that is to say:—

- On every house, or tenement, or vacant land, whether occupied or not, a rate of Elevenpence (11d.) in each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the minimum amount to be paid on any tenement shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) sterling.
- The before-mentioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, of the said year.
- Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

COLERAINE AND CASTERTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Coleraine and Casterton Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following amendment to By-law No. 2, made on the fourth day of August, 1926.

For clause No. 7 there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"7. Before any person shall affix any service pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipes or service pipes, cocks or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work and the fee for such licence shall be the sum of £1. And before any person so licensed under this by-law shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £5, and in case he shall not proceed with the laying on of such water, or shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £5 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best. The days on which water will be turned off will be on Tuesdays from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., in which time plumbers will be obliged to make tapplings or attach fittings to the mains for service or other connexions. Plumbers will be charged a fee of 2s. 6d. for each inspection of service connexions by Trust Officer, which sum shall be deposited with the notice required to be served under clause 4."

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the fourteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE IN THE BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA KNOWN AS "KALUNA PARK."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and nine, as a site for public park and other purposes of public recreation in the Municipal District of Wangaratta.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Offer any articles of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve.
- (f) Climb, jump, get on or over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve.
- (g) Interfere with, break or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve.
- (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything therein that might injure any person.
- (i) Light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management.
- (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- (l) Spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- (m) Erect any building, tent or structure or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained; and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.
- (n) Bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee of Management.
- (o) Do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such persons may be liable.

3. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person, authorized by the Committee of Management may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.

5. The Committee of Management shall have power to hold football, cricket, hockey, and other matches, sports, fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, or holiday amusements in the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.

6. The Committee of Management shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association or person, for the purpose of holding football, cricket, or other matches, fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports, or for playing football, cricket, lacrosse, hockey,

golf, or other athletic games, or for athletic training or other physical recreation subject to payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.

7. There shall be paid to the Committee of Management or to any caretaker or official appointed by such Committee to receive the same, a fee not exceeding two shillings and six pence upon each occasion for the use of the tennis courts or pavilion, croquet green, or any other sporting improvement in the Reserve, but the Committee of Management may, as a term of the arrangement with any club for use of the Reserve or portion thereof, remit this fee in the case of fully paid-up members of such club.

8. No club, association or person shall hold or take part in any entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve and use the tennis courts, pavilion, croquet green, or other sporting improvement subject to payment of the fee hereinbefore prescribed.

9. No club or association of any kind, having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practise, train or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized by such Committee to play in the Reserve at such time.

10. No person except the Committee of Management or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.

11. No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such Committee, not exceeding one shilling, in respect of any such car or cycle, for the use of such parking area, on such days only as a charge for admission is being made as hereinafter provided for.

12. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or being the owner or having the possession, care, custody, control or supervision thereof, shall suffer or allow such horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals to be in or graze or wander upon the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve; and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition, the Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose hereof cattle shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

14. No person shall train or exercise any horse in the Reserve without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be detached or unharnessed therefrom or left without a person in charge thereof.

16. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management or by a member of the Police Force or Bailiff of Crown Lands.

17. No person except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs or flowers.

18. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days not exceeding six in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for the purpose of cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, carnivals or holiday amusements shall be as follows: For admission of every adult person, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling: Provided that the net amount received by the Committee of Management,

after providing for any necessary expenses in connexion therewith shall be used and appropriated towards the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and an account thereof shall be made annually to the Board of Land and Works.

19. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall, upon demand, produce, and if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.

20. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure, on the occasion of any cricket, football or hockey matches, fêtes, sports, carnivals or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit with the Committee of Management any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds which the Committee of Management may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may repair or make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

21. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee of Management or by the club, association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being to keep order shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

The Council of the Borough of Wangaratta has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 5th December, 1887, and 14th October, 1889, for Public Park and Recreation purposes in the Town of Wunghnu, and known as "Wunghnu Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be at all times open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days (not exceeding sixteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, carnivals, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

4. No person shall light fires in the Reserve except in kitchen fireplaces built and approved by the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, trees, or any other property in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section (3) of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

15. No person shall disturb the surface, or remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Anzac Day.

17. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, football, quoits, hockey, or any other game, or footracing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

18. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst, or to the danger or annoyance of, persons assembled on any part of the ground.

19. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

20. No assemblies, for concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

21. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey, or golf), and than any competitor and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE KNOWN AS "THE RECREATION RESERVE" IN THE PARISH OF INGLEWOOD.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the receipt and collection of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation purposes at Inglewood.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days (not exceeding sixteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports or amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

4. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sunday.

7. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall ride or drive any horse, or any carriage, cart, or other vehicle through the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management.

The Council of the Borough of Inglewood has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 43.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the powers conferred by Part VII. of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 43, for prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house, or any shop, or any dwelling-house and shop combined, may thereafter be erected, and providing that every dwelling-house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land.

WHEREAS a previous By-law (No. 31) has been made by the City of Bendigo dealing with the above matters, and whereas it is desirable to amend such By-law, now the said Council doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1928, order as follows:—

(1) That sub-clause B of clause 5A of Part VII. of By-law No. 31 be and is hereby repealed.

(2) Upon land subdivided into three or more blocks after the coming into operation of this By-law, no side or curtilage of any such house shall have a less superficial area than five thousand (5,000) square feet, or a less frontage than fifty (50) feet to a street or road of not less than sixty (60) feet wide. Where an allotment created prior to these By-laws coming into operation has a frontage of not less than eighty (80) feet to a street or road of not less than sixty (60) feet wide, it may be subdivided into two allotments having frontages of not less than forty (40) feet, and having a depth of not less than one hundred (100) feet.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council on the fifteenth day of November, 1934, and confirmed on the thirteenth day of December, 1934.

BY-LAWS OF THE WARRACKNABEAL DISTRICT HOSPITAL.**INTRODUCTORY.**

1.—All By-laws in force prior to the date of the coming into force of these By-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, save all existing rights. These By-laws shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the "Government Gazette."

DEFINITIONS.

2.—The words "the Act" shall mean the Hospitals and Charities' Act 1928 or any amendment thereto, and Regulations made by the Governor-in-Council under the Act.

The word "Hospital" shall mean "The Warracknabeal District Hospital."

"Contributor" means:—

- (a) A person who pursuant to the By-laws shall have been elected a life governor thereof on the ground that he has conferred a signal benefit on the Hospital other than by contributing thereto or who pursuant to By-laws of the Hospital was a life governor thereof at the commencement of the Act.
- (b) A person who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the Hospital at least twenty pounds in one donation, which entitles him pursuant to these By-laws to be elected a life governor thereof.
- (c) A person who at any time within the twelve months next preceding the date of any meeting or election or any other date in respect of which the question of his being a contributor arises has on his own behalf contributed to the Hospital at least one pound in one donation or produces evidence to the committee that he has on his own behalf contributed to the Hospital at least one pound in donations of a less amount.
- (d) A person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company or firm, which at any time within the twelve months aforesaid has contributed to the Hospital at least one pound in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm.
- (e) A person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company or firm which at any time has contributed at least twenty pounds to the Hospital in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm, which pursuant to the By-laws of the Hospital entitles any person contributing the same to be elected a life governor thereof.
- (f) A person nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company, firm or employer who at any time have contributed at least twenty pounds to the Hospital in one donation or who have at any time within the twelve months aforesaid contributed to the Hospital at least one pound whether in one sum or in donations of a less amount; or
- (g) A person nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any Will who have allocated at least twenty pounds to the Hospital in one donation out of any moneys of the testator not specifically directed to be paid to the Hospital under the Will.

Provided that any such contribution as aforesaid has been made without any right of relief having accrued or accruing in respect thereof to any person, corporation, company, firm, executor or trustee making the same or to any person nominated in respect of same.

Each contributor shall be entitled to one vote only at all meetings of contributors.

"Committee" means the Committee of Management of the Hospital.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females unless the contrary is expressly provided.

OBJECTS.

3.—The Objects of the Hospital shall be:—

To afford relief, including maintenance and the treatment or cure of, or attention to, any disease or ailment, or any injury consequent on any accident, medical and surgical attendance, medicine, nursing assistance to sick persons either gratuitously or in return for such payments as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee.

SEAL.

4.—The Common Seal of the Hospital shall be kept in the bank by the secretary and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument or writing except by order of the Committee. The affixing shall be witnessed by the President and one Vice-president.

CONSTITUTION.

5.—The Incorporated Institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-presidents, Hon. Treasurer, members of Committee hereinafter referred to, Governors and Contributors.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

- 6.—(a) A Life Governor shall be any person who is a Life Governor at the date of the coming into operation of these By-Laws or, being eligible under the Act and under these By-Laws is elected a Life Governor by the Committee.
- (b) Every Life Governor upon election shall forthwith be enrolled as such in the books of the Hospital and shall be entitled to a Certificate stating that he has been so elected.
- (c) Life Governors shall be entitled to one vote at any election or ballot.
- (d) Any Life Governor may resign by notice in writing sent by post in a prepaid letter or delivered to the secretary.

HONORARY LIFE GOVERNORS.

- 7.—(a) Any person who by honorary services shall have in the opinion of the Committee conferred a material benefit on the Hospital by the collection of money or otherwise or who shall be nominated by any organisation or any association of persons which has in the opinion of the Committee conferred such a benefit on the Hospital may be elected an Honorary Life Governor at any meeting of the Committee. Provided that no such organisation or association of persons shall be entitled to nominate more than one person as Honorary Life Governor during the period of twelve months in any calendar year.
- (b) Every Honorary Life Governor upon election shall be forthwith enrolled as such in the books of the Hospital and shall be entitled to a Certificate stating that he has been so elected. He shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a Life Governor except those of voting at any general meeting or at any election or of being elected to any office which can be filled only by a contributor.

ELIGIBILITY FOR OFFICE.

- 8.—No person shall be eligible to hold or be eligible for any office (except that of honorary medical officer), nor have a vote, nor exercise any privilege unless his contribution shall have been paid previously.

MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS.

- 9.—All annual meetings of contributors shall be advertised by the secretary at least fourteen days and all special meetings at least seven days before the day on which such meeting is to be held, in a newspaper circulating in Warracknabeal.

- 10.—The annual general meeting of contributors shall be held on such day between the first day of July and the thirty-first day of August in each year as shall be fixed by the Committee, for the following purposes:—

- (a) To confirm the minutes of the previous annual meeting and special meetings if any, no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.
- (b) To receive the report of the Committee and audited accounts of receipts and expenditure for the year to the 30th June preceding.
- (c) For the election of President, two Vice-presidents, Honorary Treasurer, and Auditors for the ensuing year.
- (d) For the election of members of the Committee for the ensuing year in place of those retiring.
- (e) For the transaction of any business of which seven days' notice has been given.

- 11.—The advertisement calling the annual general meeting shall state the names of the members of the Committee who will retire at such meeting and the number of vacancies to be filled, and that Nominations for the offices of President, Vice-presidents, Treasurer and Auditors and of members of the Committee require to be delivered to the Secretary on or before a day named.

- 12.—No person shall be nominated as a member of the Committee unless a written nomination of such person to such office signed by at least two contributors, and also a written consent of such person to act in such office, has been delivered to the Secretary at least seven days prior to the date of the annual meeting.

- 13.—Where, on or before the day so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates have not been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, the chairman at the annual general meeting shall declare the persons so nominated duly elected to the offices for which they have been nominated.

- 14.—Where, on or before the date so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates are nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, the contributors present at the annual meeting shall thereupon fix a day for taking a ballot and shall appoint a returning officer and such other officers as are necessary for the conduct of the election. The meeting shall then be adjourned without prejudice to the completion of any other

business before it until after such ballot has been taken, and at the adjourned meeting the returning officer shall report the result of the election.

15.—(a) Contributors shall record their votes at the polling booth appointed for the purpose or they may be allowed to vote by post on applying prior to the day of the election to the Secretary, who will issue the necessary ballot papers and special envelope, which must be signed on the inside of the flap by the contributor.

(b) All postal ballot papers must be in hands of returning officer at close of poll.

(c) Contributors shall vote for the full number of candidates to be elected; otherwise the vote shall be declared informal.

16.—If required by the Committee, or upon the requisition in writing of nine members thereof, or of ten or more contributors, the Secretary shall call a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of such meeting to be specified in the requisition. And no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that specified, and every such meeting shall be convened by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in Warracknabeal at least seven days before the day of meeting with intelligible reference to its object.

17.—At all meetings of contributors, all questions except questions involving a contested election shall be decided by a show of hands unless before or on the declaration of the result a division is demanded by any contributor, in which event it shall be decided by a division. A declaration by the chairman that any resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or otherwise, and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive of the facts.

18.—Votes of contributors given through the post shall, on a show of hands, division, or poll, be counted in the same manner as if they had been given in person.

19.—At all meetings of contributors the chairman shall, in the event of there being an equality of votes on any question, have a casting vote only.

20.—At every meeting of contributors the President, or in his absence the senior Vice-president in attendance, shall preside as chairman, but, if none of these office-bearers is present, the contributors shall choose one of their number to be chairman of that meeting.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

21.—There shall be a Committee consisting of (a) a President, two Vice-presidents and a Treasurer (who shall be contributors) elected annually; and (b) eighteen contributors, seven of whom shall be residents of outlying districts (one-third retiring by rotation each year, but who shall be eligible for re-election). The members of the Committee to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election, and any contributor appointed pursuant to By-law 25.

22.—If any member of the Committee—

(a) dies;

(b) resigns by writing under his hand addressed to the Chairman of the Committee;

(c) becomes bankrupt or insolvent or compounds with his creditors or makes a deed of arrangement for the benefit of his creditors;

(d) ceases to be a contributor to such Hospital;

(e) is convicted of any treason, felony or misdemeanor; or

(f) is without the permission of the Committee absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Committee

his office shall thereupon become vacant.

23.—No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the Hospital or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the Committee or in the profit thereof or of any work to be done under the authority of the same shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such Committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership or association consisting of more than twenty persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership or association; but no member of the Committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the Committee in which he shall directly or indirectly have any pecuniary interest.

24.—No paid officer or servant of the Hospital shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

25.—In the event of any casual vacancy in the Committee the remaining members of the Committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such Hospital. Such contributor so appointed may continue to be a member of the Committee until immediately before the next annual meeting for the election of the Committee, when he shall retire therefrom as one of those persons who are required to go out of office.

26.—In the event of any vacancy in the office of President, Vice-president or other elective officer (other than a vacancy caused by his retirement at the expiration of his term of office) the Committee may temporarily appoint to such office some person qualified to hold the same; and the person so appointed may continue in office until immediately before the next annual general meeting aforesaid.

27.—The Committee shall direct the business of the Hospital, shall provide all requisites for its use, shall arrange all contracts and direct the payments thereof, and shall appoint and discharge all officers and servants except the Honorary Auditors, and shall also elect Life Governors and Honorary Life Governors.

28.—The Committee shall meet on the Second Tuesday in each Month at a time to be fixed by the Committee.

29.—Special meetings of the Committee may be convened by the President or any eight members. Notice shall be given to members of such meeting, specifying the general nature of the business to be transacted, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

30.—Written notice of each monthly meeting shall be served on each member of the Committee at least three days prior to such meeting by delivering it to him or by sending it by post in a prepaid letter addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode.

31.—No less than eight of the members shall form a quorum at any meeting of Committee. No business shall be transacted unless a quorum is present, and if within half an hour of the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned.

32.—The President, or, in his absence, the senior Vice-president in attendance, shall preside at all meetings of the Committee, but if none of these office-bearers is present the members shall choose one of their number to be chairman.

33.—All questions arising at any meeting of the Committee shall be decided by a show of hands, or, if demanded by any members, by a division. Each member, including the chairman, shall have one vote. In the event of the numbers being equal, the chairman shall, in addition, have a casting vote.

34.—Proper minutes shall be kept of the proceedings of all meetings of Committee.

35.—No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or rescinded for one calendar month after such resolution has been passed, except at a special meeting of the Committee called for the purpose or by an absolute majority of the whole Committee.

36.—The Committee shall prepare and lay before the contributors at each annual general meeting a general report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with a balance-sheet, duly audited, exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure for the twelve months ended on the 30th day of June next preceding the day of such meeting.

37.—The Committee may, subject to these By-laws and the provisions of the Act, by resolution at any meeting make, alter or rescind rules for the management and regulation of the Hospital in every department provided notice has been given to the members of the Committee prior to such meeting.

FINANCE COMMITTEE.

38.—The Finance Committee shall consist of the President, Treasurer and four other members, who shall be appointed by and from the Committee in rotation—two members to retire each month. Three members shall form a quorum.

39.—Duties of Finance Committee: The Finance Committee shall—

- (a) visit the Hospital once in each week;
- (b) examine the admission form of each patient admitted and fix the amount payable by each patient by way of fee towards the cost of maintenance of the Hospital;
- (c) examine a statement prepared by the Secretary of all outstanding patients' fees and make recommendations to the Committee whether—
 - (i.) the outstanding fees should be written off, and why;
 - (ii.) further action should be taken and by what means;
- (d) examine the Secretary's cash book and other books of accounts and compare the same with the bank pass book;
- (e) give all needful instructions to the Secretary and Collectors with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations;
- (f) cause to be kept separate records and accounts for the intermediate section, and present to the Committee each month a financial statement in respect of that section in the form prescribed by the Committee.
- (g) examine the abstract of accounts prepared by the Secretary for presentation to the Committee at its monthly meeting, satisfy itself that all services in relation thereto have been duly executed, and that all vouchers connected with the abstract have been correctly acquitted or certified;

- (h) see that the vouchers in connection with previous payments passed by the Committee have been properly receipted;
- (i) examine the returns prepared for the Charities Board of Victoria and other Government departments and the annual statement of accounts;
- (j) perform such other duties as may be allotted by the Committee.

In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the Finance Committee the signature of some member thereof should be appended, with the date of examination.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

40.—The Committee shall at its first meeting after the annual meeting of the contributors appoint from among its members a House Committee consisting of the President and four members, three to form a quorum. The President shall be chairman. The office of any member of the House Committee shall become vacant on his ceasing to be a member of the Committee.

41.—Duties of House Committee: The House Committee shall—

- (a) visit the Hospital at least once each month;
- (b) inspect the various parts of the hospital;
- (c) examine the condition of the furniture, beds and bedding in the Hospital;
- (d) see that all articles for human consumption in the Hospital are sound and wholesome, and that all food given to patients and staff is properly cooked and served out in a suitable manner;
- (e) hear and investigate all complaints upon any matter relating to the Hospital;
- (f) make suggestions for the further good management and discipline of the Hospital, and for the comfort of the patients;
- (g) perform such other functions as the Committee may from time to time determine.
- (h) report in writing to the next monthly meeting of the Committee the result of its inspection and examination and otherwise regarding its work.

INTERMEDIATE SECTION.

42.—The House Committee shall—

- (a) manage the intermediate section of the Hospital in accordance with the general directions contained in the instructions of the Committee relating to the accommodation of intermediate patients;
- (b) enquire and report to the Committee on—
 - (i.) any matter of a technical or professional nature arising in conduct and management, and
 - (ii.) the diet standardof the intermediate section of the Hospital. In course of its inquiries the House Committee may consult whenever necessary any medical practitioner attending patients in the intermediate section;
- (c) when required recommend suitable personnel for appointment to the staff establishment for employment in the intermediate section of the Hospital;
- (d) present to the Committee at each monthly meeting a brief report of the results of management, any aspects arising therefrom.

DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVES.

43.—For the assistance of the Committee in the more efficient control of the area served by the Hospital, district representatives may be appointed by the Committee. These representatives shall have the privilege of attending all meetings of the Committee and explaining the financial and other interests in their districts, but shall not have a vote.

OTHER SUB-COMMITTEES.

44.—The Committee may appoint such other sub-committees as it considers necessary from among its own members, and may delegate to such sub-committees such of its powers as it considers necessary.

MEDICAL STAFF.

45.—The Medical Staff shall consist of such legally qualified practitioners as the Committee may from time to time appoint. They shall retain office for such time as the Committee shall determine.

46.—Any legally qualified medical practitioner shall have full rights of treating patients admitted to the intermediate sections of the Hospital, whether he is a member of the honorary medical staff or not.

FINANCE.

47.—Secretary shall receive all money, issue receipts, deposit at least twice in each week in bank all moneys on hand; and the Treasurer shall be responsible that this is done.

48.—All accounts shall be paid by cheque, and no payments shall be made unless authorised by the Committee.

49.—No cheque shall be issued unless authorised by the Committee.

50.—Cheques shall be drawn by the Secretary and signed by the President and Secretary or such persons authorised by the Committee.

AUDITORS.

51.—Two Auditors shall be elected at the annual meeting each year, and remuneration, if any, to be paid to them shall be fixed then. The Auditors shall have access to the books and accounts of the Hospital at all times, and shall, if they consider it necessary, report direct to the Committee.

52.—The Auditors shall, during July in each year, examine the Treasurer's annual financial statement, compare it with all books and accounts and documents relating thereto, and lists of contributions and donations; they may make any special report thereon which they consider necessary to the annual meeting.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

53.—All patients (when able to do so) shall supply the particulars required on the prescribed admission form, and shall sign the appropriate declaration thereon.

54.—The Committee, or a sub-committee duly appointed for the purpose, or an officer of the institution authorised to act on its behalf, will determine the admission of patients.

55.—Except in accident or emergency, all patients to be admitted on the recommendation of the medical officers or other medical practitioner.

FEES.

56.—Fees for accommodation, maintenance and nursing attention in the Hospital, and for service to out-patients, shall be such as are fixed by the Committee from time to time.

VISITORS.

57.—Friends may be allowed to visit patients at such hours as are fixed by the Committee.

MEETINGS.

58.—All meetings in connection with the Hospital, except meetings of sub-committees appointed for special purposes, shall be open to contributors and to the press; but no person present at Committee meetings who is not a member of the Committee shall be permitted to interfere or take part in the proceedings, provided the Committee may consider, in camera, any matter which it so desires.

ALTERATION AND AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

59.—No new By-laws shall be made, nor any of the By-laws rescinded, altered or amended, except with the consent of a majority of the contributors voting at a special meeting convened for the purpose or at the annual general meeting. One month's notice in writing of intention to move such alteration, rescission or amendment shall be given to the Committee, except where such rescission, alteration or amendment shall be proposed by the Committee, when the Committee shall give fourteen days' notice by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in Warracknabeal of intention to move such rescission, alteration or amendment.
