#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE CITY OF PORT MELBOURNE KNOWN AS THE "LAGOON LANDS RECREATION RESERVE."

**W**HEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 10th April, 1934, as a site for Public Recreation in the City of Port Melbourne, Parish of Melbourne South, and known as the "Lagoon Lands Recreation Reserve."

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, excepting on such days not exceeding 16 in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, golf, tennis, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, excepting in the places provided for the purpose by the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management may debar any person from bringing into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public meeting, nor shall any band perform in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

10. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, chattels, articles, or provisions of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve, except in the portion set apart for such purpose, and no person shall play cricket or football, or hold organized sports meetings within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. No person, not being a player or official, shall trespass on the playing arena during the progress of any football or cricket match, or any sports gathering, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt, or in any way interfere with, any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work or duty.

13. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket or football match, or sports, show, &c., or during practice at football or cricket when any such crossing or trespassing would be injurious to, or cause undue interference with, the progress of the aforesaid sports, football, or cricket, &c.

14. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or on any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee of Management, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

16. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the Reserve, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use of the Reserve, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of £2 2s. per day.

17. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

18. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and the Committee of Management may charge and take a fee not exceeding One shilling per motor car or other vehicle per day for use of such area on such days as a charge for admission is being made, as provided hereinbefore in clause 1.

19. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "Cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

20. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purposes of any lawful game, or sports, or picnics, and from time to time grant any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

21. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.

22. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations, or any notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

The Council of the City of Port Melbourne has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC RECREATION  
RESERVE AT GERANG GERUNG.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands reserved for Public Recreation in the Parish of Gerang Gerung, and known as Gerang Gerung Recreation Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for races, matches, or sports gatherings, on each of which occasions a fee may be charged and taken for admission as provided hereinafter.

2. No person may enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall destroy any of the trees in the Reserve or light fires therein without permission from the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall damage any of the gates, fences, or buildings erected on the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. All moneys received shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause cattle shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall organize a public entertainment of any sort within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and when a charge is made for admission such Committee reserves the right to claim a percentage of the receipts not exceeding 15 per cent., such amount to be paid to the Committee of Management within the time specified in the permit issued.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized sport or game within the Reserve without first obtaining permission, in writing, from the Committee of Management.

10. All clubs, societies, or persons using the Reserve with the consent of the Committee of Management shall make good any damage done during the time the Reserve is being used by them.

11. The Committee of Management may claim a portion (not exceeding 10 per cent.) of the membership fees collected by clubs or societies which have been granted permission by such Committee to occupy or use the Reserve.

12. The fee which may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person as provided for in clause (1) of these Regulations shall be such a sum to be determined by the Committee of Management—

- (a) For race meetings not exceeding 8s.;
- (b) For all other occasions not exceeding 3s. 6d.,

and for admission of every vehicle not exceeding 1s.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by a member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portions of the reserved Crown lands in the Parish of Phillip Island as are indicated by red colour on plan marked P.23.3.34 with Lands Department Correspondence C.73044, hereinafter referred to as "The Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. "The Reserve" shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.

2. No person shall enter or remain in "The Reserve" who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass or flowers in "The Reserve," nor shall fires be lighted therein except with the written consent of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings, fences or seats in "The Reserve," nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish therein.

5. No person shall put or graze in "The Reserve" any cattle, goats or pigs, horses, sheep, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

6. Any dog considered by the Committee of Management to be a menace to the public on "The Reserve," or to bathers, must be led on a leash, or removed therefrom.

7. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any portion of "The Reserve" except that specially set apart for the purpose, and then only after obtaining a permit, subject to such fees and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

8. No person shall erect any bathing box or boat house of any kind on "The Reserve" without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be deemed advisable and reasonable by such Committee, consistent with these Regulations; but no person shall cause to be used or use any such bathing-box, boat house, or shed for residential purposes.

9. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter, on any part of "The Reserve" except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.

10. No person shall bet publicly on any part of "The Reserve," and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and "Reserve."

11. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in "The Reserve."

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding £10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.



13. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within "The Reserve" unless by consent of the Committee of Management.

14. The Council of the Shire of Phillip Island has been appointed a Committee of Management of "The Reserve" with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £5, and any person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES (SWIMMING POOL) IN THE TOWN OF MANSFIELD.

**W**HEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 13th November, 1934, as a site for Public Purposes (Swimming Pool) in the Parish of Mansfield.

REGULATIONS.

1. On all days, from the 1st January to 30th April and 1st October to 31st December in each year, the swimming pool shall be open to the public from daylight to dusk.

2. No person coming direct from dirty work shall enter the swimming pool without washing himself.

3. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the swimming pool.

4. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the swimming pool or the immediate vicinity thereof.

5. No person shall use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the swimming pool may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

6. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the swimming pool.

7. No person shall deface by writing or otherwise the fencing or any property within the Reserve.

8. No person shall enter the swimming pool unless decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume.

9. Children shall not be permitted to enter the swimming pool except under adequate supervision.

10. The swimming pool may be set apart at stated hours for the use of males, females, or children respectively. Mixed bathing may be permitted on such days and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may at any time determine.

11. No person shall bring any animal within the boundary fence of the Reserve.

12. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for carnivals, matches, &c., on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 1s. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

13. No person resorting to the pool shall after using the swimming pool or any shower loiter or remain without reasonable excuse in any passage-way to or from the swimming pool or any shower. No person shall resort to or use the pool except for the proper purposes thereof.

14. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to him or under his control to enter or remain in the swimming pool. Any dog or other animal found in the pool may be destroyed.

15. Camping in any part of the Reserve shall not be permitted.

16. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

17. This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.
