COMMON DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council

of the said State, do hereby diminish the undermentioned common, viz.:—

ARARAT COMMON.

By deducting therefrom 2 roods 11 perches, more or less, of land in the Parish and Town of Ararat, comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 26th April, 1935.

PROCLAMATION

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

ORDERS OF 23RD MAY, 1935, RELATING TO CERTAIN MATTERS ARISING OUT OF AWARD No. 8.

In the matter of the Railways Act and in the matter of references by the Victorian Branch of the Australian Railways Union for interpretation of certain matters arising out of Award No. 8 of the Railways Classification Board.

THESE references having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board, and the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

AWARD No. 8.

Division 8—Overtime.

(1) The overtime payable in respect of the shift from 4.30 p.m. to 4.30 a.m. worked by the stationmaster and the assistant stationmaster at Violet Town, on 19th April, 1934, and 10th April, 1934, respectively, is three hours, unless booked off for part of the shift.

(2) Motormen and conductors (tram) are not entitled to be paid penalty rates in respect of time occupied undergoing instruction in the handling of fire fighting appliances.

Division 10—Holiday Duty.

Division 11—Fog-signalling Duty.

An employee who is recalled to duty on King's Birthday to undertake fog-signalling duty for two hours is entitled to be credited with four hours, and, at his option, an extra day's pay or a day's leave on full pay.

Division 14—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.

(1) The provisions of clause 9 of this division are not applicable in respect of the shift worked by Signal Adjuster J. Meade on 27th October, 1934.

(2) The provisions of clause 9 of this division are not applicable in respect of the shift worked by Electrical Fitter S. White on 18th October, 1934.

2. This Rule and Regulation shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of Malvern.

3. Every person who commits an offence against this Rule and Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Noises in Public Highways.

A By-law of the City of Malvern, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 93, for "Prohibiting or minimizing noises in any public highway and/or for suppressing or minimizing noises which may constitute a nuisance."

- (b) by operating, controlling, sounding, or playing upon any broadcasting set, wireless receiving set, gramophone, piano, piano-player, or other instrument, contrivance, or device.

2. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5, and to a further penalty not exceeding £1 for every day while such offence continues.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Malvern.
