VEGETATION AND VINE DISEASES ACT 1928 (No. 3797).
VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928*, it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* may absolutely prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread any disease in Victoria: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that disease means a disease affecting trees, plants, or vegetables, and which the Governor in Council from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declares to be a disease: And whereas by a Proclamation made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-seventh day of May, 1935, Tomato Leaf mould (*Cladosporium fulvum*) was declared to be a disease within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas the Governor in Council is of the opinion that the said disease is likely to spread in Victoria if any plant (described in the Schedule hereto) affected with such disease is brought into that portion of Victoria comprised in the Shire of Portland from that portion of Victoria outside the boundary of the said shire: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Proclamation absolutely prohibit any person from bringing the said plants into the said Shire of Portland from that portion of Victoria outside the boundary of the said shire.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Any plant or variety or hybrids of the species known as *Lycopersicon esculentum* (Miller) (commonly known as tomato plant) or any portion thereof, including seed which has been produced under glasshouse conditions.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this fourth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1928 (No. 3697) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Cinematograph Operators Regulations 1935," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

2. These Regulations shall apply to and have operation throughout the State of Victoria.

REPEAL.

3. All Regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

DIVISION INTO PARTS.

4. These Regulations are divided into Parts as follows:—

Part I.—Introductory.

Part II.—The Board of Examiners.

Part III.—Training and Examinations.

Part IV.—Registration.

Part V.—Licences and Permits.

Part VI.—Fees.

Part VII.—Offences and Penalties.

Part VIII.—Schedules.

PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

5. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Approved" means approved by the Board.

"Authorized" means authorized by the Commission or the Board as the case may be.

"Board" means the Board of Examiners appointed under these Regulations.

"Cinematograph" means any moving picture projector and the apparatus pertaining thereto, including (where applicable) the sound equipment.

"Commission" means the Commission of Public Health constituted under the *Public Health Act* 1928.

"Licensed operator" means the holder of a cinematograph operator's licence under these Regulations or any previous Regulations of similar purport.

"Minister" means the Minister of Public Health.

"Registered operator" means a person registered in accordance with these Regulations or any previous Regulations of similar purport.

"Registrar" means the officer of the Department of Public Health appointed by the Minister as registrar of the Board.

PART II.—THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

6. (1) For the purposes of these Regulations there shall be appointed by the Minister a Board of Examiners consisting of three members as follows:—

- (a) One member as representing the Commission, who shall be chairman;
- (b) One member as representing the employers of cinematograph operators; and
- (c) one member as representing cinematograph operators.

(2) The members shall be appointed for a period not exceeding three years.

(3) The Board shall meet at such times and places as the Board decides.

(4) A quorum of the Board shall consist of all the members.

(5) On the occurrence of any extraordinary vacancy in the Board the Minister may appoint a person to fill the vacancy, and any person so appointed shall hold office only for the remainder of the period for which his predecessor was appointed.

(6) The Minister may at any time remove any member of the Board.

FUNCTIONS.

7. The functions of the Board shall include—

- (a) the examination of claims for registration without examination under section 349 (2) of the *Health Act 1928*;
- (b) the examination of all persons who are required to sit for any examination prescribed by or under these Regulations;
- (c) the examination of applications for registration from persons who claim to have qualified in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any other part of His Majesty's Dominions;
- (d) the advising of the Commission in respect of registration and licensing of cinematograph operators.

8. The Board shall in the month of February in each year submit to the Commission a report of its activities during the immediately preceding calendar year and make such recommendations as the Board thinks fit.

REMUNERATION.

9. There shall be paid to each member of the Board—

- (a) Five shillings in respect of every candidate who sits for examination under the provisions of Division 1 of Part III;
- (b) One shilling and sixpence for the examination (where such examination does not include a personal examination of the applicant) of each application for registration; or for endorsement of a licence with authority to operate sound equipment or other class of apparatus where such authority is granted under the provisions of clause 16 (1) (b);
- (c) Two shillings and sixpence for the examination of any candidate under the provisions of clauses 13, 16 (i) (a), or 21 (2).

PART III.—TRAINING AND EXAMINATIONS.

DIVISION 1.—PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO CANDIDATES FOR EXAMINATION FOR REGISTRATION.

10. No person shall be eligible to sit for the examination (or any part thereof) under this Division unless he has attained the full age of twenty-one years, has had at least two years' continuous practical training under the direct supervision of a licensed operator in a cinematograph cabin during public exhibitions, and has received instruction from any licensed operator and/or other approved instructor in subjects (c), (d), (e), and (f) hereunder, and in such details of subjects (a) and (b) as are appropriate to the scope of the examination for which he desires to sit—

- (a) *Electricity*.—Knowledge of electrical action in general with regard to direct current and alternating current, motors, generators, transformers, converters, rectifiers, resistances, choke coils, volt and ampere meters, arc lamps, switches, fuses, wires, cables, sound equipment, and the necessary connexions for the various appliances.
- (b) *Plants*.—Petrol, oil and gas engines.

- (c) *Projectors*.—Mechanism, optical system, and sound equipment.
- (d) *Film*.—Care of, handling, joining and re-winding.
- (e) *Practical projection* of pictures and sound.
- (f) *Safety precautions*—especially in relation to prevention and extinction of fire in the cabin and re-winding room.

11. The Board may accept, if it deems fit, any training done by any applicant in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any other part of His Majesty's Dominions as an equivalent part of the prescribed course, provided that such training is of the same standard as that prescribed under these Regulations.

12. (1) The examination shall consist of five Parts as follows:—

Part I.—General knowledge of the principles underlying and the Regulations governing the operation of cinematograph apparatus.

Part II.—General knowledge of direct current apparatus and its applications to cinematograph equipment.

Part III.—General knowledge of alternating current and its applications to electrical equipment used in conjunction with cinematograph apparatus.

Part IV.—General knowledge of the principles underlying the reproduction of sound for cinematograph purposes, and the apparatus ordinarily used in connexion therewith.

Part V.—Personal examination of the candidate in respect of the practical application of his knowledge of the subjects included in the above Parts.

(2) The examination in respect of Parts I. to IV. inclusive shall be written, and Part V. shall be a practical and oral examination.

13. Where a candidate passes in Part I. and fails in not more than two other Parts, he may, with the approval of the Board, be admitted to a supplementary examination in respect of the Part (or Parts) in which he failed.

14. Every candidate who passes all Parts of the examination shall be entitled to be registered and to receive a licence entitling him to operate all classes of cinematograph apparatus.

15. The Board may exempt any candidate from sitting for Part II. (or Part III.) and Part IV., and every candidate so exempted who passes the Parts in respect of which he is not exempted shall be entitled to be registered and to receive a licence entitling him to operate such kinds of cinematograph apparatus as come within the scope of the Parts in which he has passed.

DIVISION 2.—PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO REGISTERED OPERATORS NOT AUTHORIZED TO OPERATE SOUND EQUIPMENT OR OTHER CLASS OF APPARATUS.

16. (1) Any registered operator not duly authorized to operate sound equipment or other class of apparatus shall be entitled to so operate and have his licence endorsed accordingly if he—

(a) satisfies the Board by examination or otherwise demonstrates to the Board his competency to operate such equipment or apparatus; or

(b) produces to the Board within twelve months of the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations evidence satisfactory to the Board that prior to such date he had been employed continuously for at least twelve months in a cinematograph cabin in a public building in handling such equipment or apparatus whilst in operation in conjunction with moving picture projection.

(2) The examination shall consist of written, practical, and oral tests of such nature and scope as the Board considers necessary, having regard to the type of apparatus in relation to which endorsement is desired.

DIVISION 3.—PROVISIONS OF GENERAL APPLICATION.

17. Examinations shall be held at such times and places and under such conditions as the Board decides or as the Commission directs.

18. All candidates for examination and all applications for registration shall be examined by all members of the Board.

PART IV.—REGISTRATION.

19. No person shall be registered unless he has attained the full age of twenty-one years.

20. Every person being of the full age of twenty-one years shall be entitled (subject to these Regulations) to be registered as a cinematograph operator if—

- (a) he had before the twenty-third day of December, 1926, been employed continuously in the State of Victoria as a cinematograph operator for a period of at least two years; or
- (b) he has complied with the provisions of Division 1 of Part III. in respect of training and examination; or
- (c) he has completed a course of training in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any other part of His Majesty's Dominions equivalent to the prescribed course and passed the prescribed examination: Provided that the Board may require the applicant to undergo such supplementary training as it deems fit before being allowed to sit for examination.

21. (1) Any person who produces evidence satisfactory to the Board of having been registered or licensed as a cinematograph operator by any State authority in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any other part of His Majesty's Dominions may be registered under these Regulations provided that the standard of training and examination prescribed by such authority is in the opinion of the Board equivalent to the standard prescribed under these Regulations.

(2) The Board may if it thinks fit require any applicant for registration under this clause to pass such examination as under the circumstances the Board deems appropriate and may in any special case require the applicant to undergo such supplementary training as the Board thinks fit before being allowed to sit for the examination.

22. Every application for registration shall be made in the form prescribed by Schedule I., Schedule II., or Schedule III., as the case may require.

23. Every registered operator shall on payment of the prescribed fee receive a certificate of registration in the form prescribed by Schedule V.

24. The registration of a registered operator shall remain in force for so long as such operator holds a current licence, and if any registered operator fails to renew his licence on or before the 31st day of January immediately following the date of its expiry the registration of such operator shall be suspended, but such suspension may be terminated upon renewal of the licence at any time up to three years from the date of such suspension. If the suspension has not been terminated in the manner aforesaid within three years the registration shall be revoked.

25. When any registered operator changes his address he shall forthwith notify, in writing, or inform the registrar of such change, and supply his new address.

26. The Minister shall appoint a suitable officer of the Department of Public Health as registrar of the Board, and such officer shall be responsible for the safe custody of the register, the keeping of proper records therein, and the issuing of licences, permits, and certificates of registration.

27. The registrar shall keep at the offices of the Department of Public Health the register which shall include the following particulars in respect of every registered operator:—

- (a) number and date of application;
- (b) full name, date of birth and address of the applicant;
- (c) regulation under which application is made;
- (d) date of examination passed by the applicant;
- (e) date of approval of registration;
- (f) number, date and class of licences issued;
- (g) fees paid and dates of payment;
- (h) remarks.

PART V.—LICENCES AND PERMITS.

28. No person other than a registered operator shall be granted a licence to operate a cinematograph, and every licence shall be granted subject to such conditions as the Board may impose.

29. No person shall operate any cinematograph in a public building unless he holds a current licence issued by the Board or a permit granted by the Commission, and no person so licensed or permitted shall operate any cinematograph contrary to the conditions of the licence or permit.

30. Every licence shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year in which it was issued, and may be renewed by the registrar on payment of the prescribed fee.

31. Every application for renewal of licence shall be made in the form prescribed by Schedule VII.

32. Where the Board from any adequate reason is unable to consider any application for registration forthwith the Commission may, on the advice of the Chairman of the Board and on the production of evidence that the applicant fulfils the requirements of the Regulations in respect of training and competency, grant a permit to operate subject to such conditions as to period of currency, place, and apparatus as the Commission may impose.

33. Every application for a permit shall be made in the form prescribed by Schedule VIII.

34. Every operator to whom a licence or permit has been granted shall forthwith on receipt of such licence or permit write his ordinary signature in the space provided therein for such purpose.

35. Every licensed operator and every person to whom a permit has been granted shall while on duty keep his licence or permit (as the case may be) in such a position in the cabin or about his person as to enable him to readily produce it for inspection, and such licence or permit shall be so produced on demand by any authorized officer.

36. Every registered operator not duly authorized to operate sound equipment or any other class of apparatus shall be entitled to have the authority to do so endorsed on his licence if he complies with the provisions of Division 2 of Part III.

37. After the expiry of six months from the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations no licensed operator shall operate sound equipment unless authorized to do so, and such authority shall be in the form of an endorsement on his licence.

PART VI.—FEES.

38. Every candidate for examination and every applicant for registration or a licence or permit shall pay to the Accountant of the Public Health Department the appropriate fees hereunder prescribed:—

(a) For examination under Division 1 of Part III.—One pound.

(b) For the personal examination of a candidate under the provisions of clauses 13, 16 (1) (a) or 21 (2)—Ten shillings.

(c) For the examination of evidence in relation to applications for registration not involving the personal examination of the applicant—Five shillings.

(d) For a certificate of registration in the prescribed form—Two shillings and sixpence.

(e) For the first licence issued to the applicant—Five shillings.

(f) For the renewal of a licence—

(i) not later than one month after its expiry—Two shillings and sixpence;

(ii) later than one month but not later than six months after its expiry—Five shillings;

(iii) later than six months but not later than one year after its expiry—Ten shillings;

(iv) later than one year after its expiry—One pound.

(g) For the endorsement of a licence with authority to operate sound equipment or other class of apparatus where such authority is granted under the provisions of clause 16 (1) (b)—Five shillings.

(h) For the issue of a permit—Two shillings and sixpence.

PART VII.—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES.

39. (1) The licence of any cinematograph operator may be suspended or revoked by order of the Commission if—

- (a) such licence has been obtained by fraud or misrepresentation; or
- (b) he has been convicted of any felony or misdemeanour; or
- (c) he has been convicted of any offence against these Regulations; or
- (d) his physical condition is such as to render him incapable of carrying out the duties of a cinematograph operator in a competent manner.

(2) Before suspending or revoking any licence the Commission shall cause to be sent to the holder thereof by registered letter a statement of the charge, and afford him an opportunity of giving an explanation personally or in writing.

(3) No person whose licence has been suspended shall act as cinematograph operator during the period of such suspension.

(4) Every person whose licence is revoked shall forward to the Board within fourteen days of such revocation his licence and his certificate of registration.

40. Every person who procures or attempts to procure any certificate of registration, licence or permit by making or producing or causing to be made or produced any false or fraudulent declaration, certificate, application or representation, or who impersonates or attempts to impersonate any candidate at any examination, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

41. Every person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done, by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations; and every person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF YARRAM YARRAM, SHIRE OF ALBERTON, AND KNOWN AS THE YARRAM RECREATION RESERVE.

Regulations as to Conduct.

1. No person shall enter the said Reserve without the consent or authority of the Council, or of any person or body to whom the ground is rented, or by whom the ground is being used at the time.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, birds, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in places set apart for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, erections, tennis courts, turf, park, gates, fences, seats, trees, swings, or basket ball courts, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind thereon.

5. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

6. No male person, other than a boy under the age of seven (7) years, shall enter or use any playground oval, place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any playground place, room, or building set apart for the use of males.

7. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulation or notice, and fixed or set up by the Council in the Reserve.

8. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier railing, seat structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Council.

9. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Stock.

10. (a) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

10. (b) Any person who shall be permitted by the Council to graze any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in the said Reserve shall, on the direction of the Council or any officer thereof, forthwith remove such stock from any playing arena to any other portion of the Reserve designated by such officer, or from the said Reserve.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

Sporting Bodies.

12. The Council may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games or sports, and from time to time grant to any club, or association of clubs, the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

13. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, football, bowls, golf, cricket, hockey, or any other game, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and subject to such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.

14. No person other than a licensed bookmaker shall take bets in any part of the Reserve, and no person shall bet in the Reserve save with a licensed bookmaker.

Use of Ground.

15. All applications for the use or hire of the Reserve shall be made in writing on the proper form to the Shire Secretary or other officer appointed by the Council for the purpose of receiving such applications.

16. Each application shall be lodged together with the proper fee not later than Ten o'clock in the forenoon of the day in respect of which application for use or hire of the ground is being made.

17. In the event of two or more applications being made for the use of the ground on the same day preference shall (other things being equal) be given to the first application received by the Council, but the Council shall not necessarily be bound to grant the use or hire of the Reserve to the first or any applicant.

18. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve or any stand, building, erection, or enclosure therein on the occasion of any fête, sports, show, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Council may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee

that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Council in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring (including the removal of debris or rubbish), and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Council.

19. Every person, club, or society renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever shall pay to the Council such fee for the use of the ground as the Council may from time to time determine.

20. No person shall without the consent of the Council erect any stand or booth without having first submitted to the Council particulars of the nature of the said stand or booth, and of the site on which it is proposed to erect the same. No person shall erect any stand or booth, or other erection, without having first obtained the consent of the Council.

21. Every such stand, booth, or erection shall be removed within the period fixed by the Council, and to the satisfaction of the Council.

22. No leasing or hiring of the Reserve, or any portion thereof shall deprive the Council or its employees and officers of right of access or admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof. Any officer of the Council shall be entitled to enter the Reserve, or any building thereon at any time for any purpose authorized by the Council.

Traffic Control.

23. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle into or on the arena, or upon any garden paths, lawns, turf, cycle track, or tennis courts.

24. Every person driving any motor car or other vehicle into the said Reserve shall drive only on the paths or roadways provided for vehicular traffic, and shall when required to do so by any member of the Police Force, Council employee, or any person acting under the authority of any person or body by whom the ground is being used or hired, stop or drive, or park as requested or directed by such member of the Police Force, Council employee, or other person as aforesaid.

Schedule of Charges.

25. The following charges shall be paid to the Council for the use of the said Reserve:—

Cricket clubs and cycle clubs—Ten shillings per afternoon;

Football clubs—10 per cent. of the gross gate receipts with a minimum of £1 per day, and a maximum of £5 per day;

Sports committees—10 per cent. of the gross gate receipts, with a minimum of £3 per day, and a maximum of £10 per day;

Yarram Agricultural Society—£20 per annual show;

or such lesser sums as the Council may from time to time determine, and for all other occasions on which a charge for admission to the Reserve is made the sum of £5 per day, or such lesser sum as the Council may from time to time determine.

Penalty.

26. Any person committing any breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and shall be liable to pay to the Council any expenses incurred by it in consequence of any breach of the said Regulations, or in the execution of work directed by the Regulations to be executed by any such person.

Interpretation.

27. The Council shall mean the Council for the time being of the Shire of Alberton; person shall include corporation; words importing the singular shall include the plural, and words denoting the masculine shall include feminine.

Resolution for passing these Regulations agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Alberton at its meeting held on the 13th day of December, 1934, and confirmed on the 10th day of January, 1935.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CULGOA RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 24th April, 1933, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Kaneira, Township of Culgoa, and known as "Culgoa Recreation Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding twenty-six in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, or other sports, shows, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged for the admission of every adult to the Reserve, and an additional One shilling for the admission of every adult to any stand, pavilion, or enclosure therein.

2. No person who offends, or may offend, against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter, be, or remain in the Reserve.

3. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over any fence or gate, or stick any bills thereon, or cut any name or sign on any fence, gate, tree, or seat, or in any way damage any building, gate, fence, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, or other property.

5. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserve, or give out or distribute any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, or paper.

6. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, or other property in the Reserve, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottle, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, or for any other purpose, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve, or do any act which may cause, or be likely to cause, damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.

9. No person except workmen employed in the Reserve shall walk on any flower-bed, or enter any plot therein which may be enclosed or used for plantations for young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

10. No person without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management shall (i) cause or suffer any dog belonging to him, or in his charge, to enter or remain in any part of the Reserve unless such dog be, or continue to be, under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or (ii) bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing, or other purposes of sport.

10. (a) The Committee of Management may at any time, by notice set up, prohibit the taking of any dog or dogs into any particular portion or portions of the Reserve.

10. (b) Any dog found in the Reserve, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the officers and/or servants of the Committee of Management, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall also make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

11. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal, except with the permission of the Committee of Management.

12. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

13. No person shall play, practise, or engage in an organized game or sport in the Reserve on Anzac Day, or on Good Friday.

14. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management thereof.

15. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take any part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

16. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

17. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, any stone, missile, or any hard substance in the Reserve, and no person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

18. No persons other than players and officials connected with any game, or competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground, oval, court, or rink during the course of such game or sport.

19. Upon application to the Committee of Management, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve, or any portion thereof, for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and shall pay to the Committee of Management such charges as the Committee of Management may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but such charges shall not exceed the sum of £5 5s. per day.

20. No person shall enter the Reserve, or any part thereof specially set apart, on any day fixed for cricket or football matches, cycling, sports, shows, fêtes, or holiday amusements, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, or any club, association, or person authorized to issue such ticket of admission, or by any club, association, or person renting the Reserve, or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced, and, if for one day only, surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.

21. In any part of the Reserve used or set apart for a children's playground—

(a) No child shall use any swing or other appliance except for the purpose for which it is respectively provided.

(b) The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any swing or other appliance.

(c) No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle, or have or bring any animal in or into the same.

22. No person shall drive any motor vehicle or other vehicle, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, or its authorized officer.

23. No person shall park any motor vehicle in the Reserve except at such place or places set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

"(iiiia) Along any part of Little Lonsdale-street lying between Queen-street and Swanston-street."

REGULATIONS.

Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, to amend or add to the Regulations made pursuant thereto by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the 25th day of August, 1930.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby order as follows:—

Regulations.

1. These Regulations shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with the Regulations made pursuant to the said Act by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the 25th day of August, 1930, intituled "Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, to amend and consolidate the Regulations made by the Council for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof," and any regulations amending the same.

2. In sub-paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) of paragraph (a) of sub-clause (1) of clause 17 of the above-mentioned Regulations, for the words "Russell-street" wherever occurring there shall be substituted the words "Spring-street."

3. After sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (a) of sub-clause (1) of clause 17 of the above-mentioned Regulations, there shall be added the following sub-paragraph:—

"(iiia) Along any part of Little Lonsdale-street lying between Queen-street and Swanston-street."

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BY-LAW NO. 66.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong made under the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720) and numbered 66 for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars.

By-law No. 63 is hereby repealed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720) and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

- (a) "Motor Car" means a motor car as defined in section 197 (7) (e) of the *Local Government Act 1928*
- (b) "Parking Area" means any standing place for motor cars appointed under this by-law.
- (c) "Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor car.
- (d) "Parking" means leaving a motor car unattended for a period exceeding 30 minutes.

1. Such parts of Lonsdale-street, Princes Highway, Clow-street, McCrae-street, King-street and the Show Grounds, Dandenong, as are set out in the schedule hereto are hereby appointed and may be used, subject as provided in this By-law, by drivers as parking areas.

2. The Council of the Shire of Dandenong—

- (i) may by resolution from time to time discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any parking areas appointed hereunder;
- (ii) may appoint from time to time such officers as parking area attendants as it thinks proper to supervise the parking areas and remove any such officer or attendant.

3. No driver shall cause or allow or permit his motor car to obstruct or occupy in a parking area any opening prescribed or established under the provisions of this By-law for any purpose prescribed by this By-law or for cross traffic.

4. The driver of any motor car shall in any Parking Area park his motor car—

- (a) as directed by the parking area attendant in charge of the parking area; or
- (b) if no such attendant be present shall take up his position therein in the order of his arrival thereat and in such manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other motor cars already parked and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty and not otherwise.

TRAFFIC PARKING REGULATION.

Schedule.

Lonsdale-street.—On both sides between garden plots from Foster-street to Clow-street and within ten feet of kerb line of footpath on the west side. Within ten feet of kerb line of footpath on the east side, commencing at a point seventy-six feet from intersection of Lonsdale and McCrae-streets. Within ten feet of the east side of the concrete kerbs enclosing western row of garden plots and a line joining tangent points of the said kerbs and not between plots on either side of intersecting streets, and not in openings appointed for cross traffic or other purposes in this By-law.

Clow-street.—Both sides between Main Drain bridge and Walker-street within ten feet of kerb line of the footpath.

McCrae-street.—Both sides within ten feet from the kerb line of the footpath from a point thirty feet from the intersection of Clow-street and McCrae-street on the east side, and sixty feet from the intersection of McCrae-street and Lonsdale-street on the west side to Walker-street.

Princes Highway.—North side within ten feet of the kerb line of footpath excepting opposite the entrance to business premises from a point sixty feet from the intersection of Cleland-street.

South side within ten feet of the kerb line of footpath from a point sixty feet from the intersection of the south and north boundaries of Princes Highway and Clow-street respectively.

King-street.—Both sides between Market-street and Stud-road within ten feet of the kerb line of the footpath.

Show Grounds.—On payment to the attendant by the driver of any motor car or other vehicle of the sum of six pence for each occasion of parking, such driver may park such motor car or other vehicle in such part of the area known as the Show Grounds as is indicated to him by such attendant.

Cleland-street.—On the west side within ten feet of the kerb line of footpath between King-street and a point two hundred feet north of Clow-street.

5. It shall be lawful for the said Council by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Shire Secretary from time to time as may be convenient or necessary to fix or appoint openings through and in such parking areas to permit of cross traffic, and also from time to time to vary

the same or any of them, and also in like manner from time to time to appoint, alter or vary the hours during which such parking areas or any of them shall be available for use.

6. The provisions of this By-law shall not affect any stands already fixed or appointed, or which may hereafter be fixed or appointed by the said Council as stands for vehicles licensed by the Council as hackney carriages.

7. No person not being an officer or employee of the said Council or otherwise authorized by the said Council shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting any such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the said Council upon any street, roadway or building or other public place, or upon any verandah or other building.

8. No person not being an officer or employee of the said Council or otherwise authorized by the said Council, shall affix any notice, sign or other thing on to or in any street or footway, or erect, drive, or fix any post, spike, peg or other erection or thing upon or into any street or footway.

9. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

10. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
