PROHIBITION OF THE TAKING OF OYSTERS FROM CERTAIN AREAS IN WINGAN INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit the taking of oysters or oyster brood from the areas at Wingan Inlet referred to hereunder for the period specified:—

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM PORTION OF THE COLIBAN RIVER UNTIL 31st AUGUST, 1938.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prohibiting all fishing in, or the taking of fish from, the Coliban River from the Coliban Falls upstream to the railway viaduct until the thirty-first day of August, 1938 (inclusive).

STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL ACT 1932.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932*, No. 4030, and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, dated 21st August, 1934, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. *Opening up Bords in No. 20 Shaft.*

In opening up bords, where brushing is involved, in No. 20 shaft from the level course to the rise, such bords shall be deemed ready for the miners where the distance from the nearest rail to the face of the proposed bord does not exceed 11 feet. Where any such distance exceeds 11 feet, Award No. 7 of the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal shall apply.

2. *Wet Places.*

When a miner is working in a wet place within the meaning of clause 12 of the Agreement dated 6th March, 1916, for a shift or part of a shift, he shall be entitled to the allowance

prescribed in such clause unless the wet conditions occur only in the last two hours of the shift.

CLAUSE ADDED TO BY-LAW No. 26 OF THE MINING BY-LAWS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby add to By-law No. 26 of the Mining By-laws the following clause:—

1. (a) *Use of Cyanide*.—Any person using a cyanide plant in carrying on mining shall securely fence such plant by erecting substantial posts not more than 15 feet apart to which shall be attached at least four strands of barbed wire, the top strand of which shall be at least 4 feet above the surface of the adjoining ground. Entrance to the said plant shall be provided by a substantial gate, which shall be kept securely closed at all times when the gateway is not in use.

Such person shall also cause to be posted and to be maintained in a conspicuous place in the vicinity of such plant a notice bearing the word "Poison" in letters not less than 6 inches in length. He shall not permit the escape of any cyanide or cyanide solution into any reservoir, dam, waterhole, stream, water channel, race, or drain.

And the Honorable E. J. Hogan, His Majesty's Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

VARIATION OF ORDER APPOINTING A BOOT BOARD AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE TINSMITHS' BOARD.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board, described as the Boot Board. And whereas it is expedient to vary the said powers in the manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person—

- (a) wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing either inside or outside a factory boots, shoes, or slippers of every description;
 - (b) designing or cutting patterns of boots, shoes, or slippers from metal or any other material.
- (b) Adjust the powers of the Boot Board, and of the Tinsmiths' Board by depriving the said Tinsmiths' Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons cutting patterns of boots, shoes, and slippers from tin plate or other metal, and conferring such power exclusively on the said Boot Board.

ONION MARKETING BOARD REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 43 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337), doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Onion Marketing Board" Regulations 1936.

2. Interpretation of Terms.—In construing these Regulations, the following words, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

"The Act" means the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337).

"Board" means the Onion Marketing Board constituted and appointed under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*.

"Person" includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate, and any firm of partners.

"Producer" means a producer as defined by the Act who produces onions within Victoria.

"Schedule" means the schedule to these Regulations.

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the Onion Marketing Board, and includes any person appointed by the Board to act as Secretary during the absence of the Secretary.

3. At all meetings of the Board at which the Chairman is present, he shall preside. In the absence of the Chairman through any cause whatsoever the Board shall elect from those members in attendance one who shall be Deputy Chairman for that meeting.

4. The Board shall meet on such dates, at such places, and at such time as the Chairman may in his discretion from time to time determine, but the Chairman, if so requested by any two members of the Board, shall call a special meeting of the Board at any time.

5. The Secretary shall cause to be delivered to each member of the Board a notice in writing, or by telegraph, of any ordinary or special meeting, two clear days before the date of such meeting, provided that, if in the opinion of the Chairman it is desirable in the case of an emergency to do so, shorter notice may be given to each member of any special meeting.

6. If at the time appointed for a meeting a quorum is not present, one-half hour from the time so appointed shall be allowed for the formation of a quorum, and, if at the expiration of that period no quorum is present, the meeting shall lapse.

7. If the meeting lapses through the absence of a quorum the business set down for such meeting shall be the business, or included in the business of the next meeting of the Board.

8. At all meetings of the Board, save as herein provided, every member shall vote.

9. The Secretary shall keep proper minutes of all resolutions, business, and proceedings made or transacted at each meeting of the Board, which shall be submitted to the members for confirmation, and, when confirmed, shall be signed by the Chairman. Any entry in the minute book, and signed by the Chairman, that any resolution has been carried or lost at any meeting shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.

10. All correspondence shall be signed by the Chairman, Secretary, Manager, or other person authorized by the Board.

11. The Secretary or any other person authorized by the Board shall receive and account for all moneys paid to the Board, and each day shall bank moneys received by him at a bank selected by the Board. Only the Secretary or such person authorized for that purpose may endorse cheques for collection on behalf of the Board, and all cheques so endorsed shall be passed through the Board's bank account.

12. All accounts due and payable by the Board shall be passed by the Board, provided that the Secretary, with the approval of the Chairman, may make payments not exceeding Fifty pounds in the aggregate in anticipation of and subject to the confirmation of the Board at its next regular meeting following any such payment or payments.

13. (a) All accounts due by the Board which exceed Two pounds shall be paid by cheque signed by any two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary.

(b) All accounts not exceeding Two pounds may be paid from a petty cash account, the standing balance of which shall not at any time exceed Ten pounds.

14. The Secretary to the Board shall have the custody of the common seal of the Board, which shall be kept in such place as the Board directs, and when not in use shall be kept in a place of safe custody secured by lock and key.

15. The common seal shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of a resolution of the Board. In every case where the common seal is authorized to be affixed to any document, such seal shall be affixed only in the presence of at least two members of the Board (one of whom shall be the Chairman or Deputy Chairman), who shall sign every such document, which shall be countersigned by the Secretary.

16. The order of business at any meeting shall be as follows:—

- (i) Reading and confirmation of minutes of previous meeting;
- (ii) Matters arising from the minutes of previous meeting.
- (iii) Correspondence.
- (iv) Statement of receipts and payments since the previous meeting.
- (v) Accounts.
- (vi) Matters relating to servants, agents, and officers of the Board.
- (vii) Such other matters as any member of the Board desires to bring before the Board.

17. A resolution of the Board shall not be revoked or altered unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration is given in writing to each of the members two days at least before the meeting at which the revocation or alteration is to be proposed.

18. There shall be conspicuously displayed at least every twelve months in the Board's public office a full and explicit statement of the Board's receipts and expenditure, stock transactions, and liabilities, for the period since the last preceding statement was so displayed.

19. At least every year there shall be similarly displayed a full and explicit balance-sheet of the Board, audited in accordance with section 11 of the Act.

20. The statement and balance-sheet referred to in Regulations 18 and 19 shall remain displayed until they are replaced by any subsequent statement and balance-sheet, and shall be available for perusal and copying at reasonable hours by any person.

21. The certificate to be issued by the Board in accordance with and subject to section 24 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule.

22. The notice to be given by a producer in accordance with section 28 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 of the Schedule.

23. The notice to be given by any person claiming to be entitled to any bill of sale, mortgage, charge, lien, pledge, interest, trust, or encumbrance whatsoever of or upon or over any of the commodity delivered to the Board, or claiming to be the true owner of such commodity shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule.

24. The Board may replace any lost or damaged certificate issued in accordance with section 24 of the Act, provided that such duplicate certificate shall be clearly stamped across the face thereof with the words "Duplicate only."

25. Every producer or other person delivering onions to the Board shall tender with each consignment of onions intended for delivery to the Board a certificate of merchantable quality from such officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other person as is approved (whether

generally or in any particular case) in that behalf by the Minister of Agriculture, indicating the quality of the onions comprised in the consignment.

26. The certificate of refusal to be given to a producer in accordance with the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 of the Schedule.

27. The Board may, in every sale, or agreement for sale, of onions by the Board to any person, insert conditions, and fix a sum as and by way of liquidated damages for any breach of condition, which damages shall be recoverable accordingly.

28. Applications, under the provisions of paragraph (d) of section 19 of the Act, for exemption from the operation of the said section, shall not be considered by the Board unless:—

- (1) The producer makes application to the Board not later than twenty-eight days after the completion of the harvesting of the onions, such application to be in or to the effect of Form 5 of the Schedule;
- (2) the producer has paid all levies due by him to the Board;
- (3) the producer has complied with all the provisions of the Act and the Regulations made thereunder;
- (4) the terms of any contract entered into or proposed to be entered into by the producer with respect to the onions have been submitted to the Board for consideration.

29. Any exemption granted by the Board from the operation of section 19 shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:—

The producer of onions to which an exemption applies—

- (a) shall permit any member of or person authorized by the Board to enter at any reasonable time any land, building, or premises of the producer for the purpose of inspection thereof, and to inspect any books, accounts, registers, documents, or writings in the custody or control of the producer relating to his business as such producer, and to take notes, copies, or extracts thereof or therefrom, and shall truthfully answer any questions relating to such books or accounts, or to any onions produced by him;
- (b) shall not without the consent of the Board use such onions for any purpose other than that for which the exemption was granted;
- (c) shall pay all levies due to the Board within the time prescribed;
- (d) shall, if required by the Board, deliver to the Board not later than twenty-eight days after the completion of the harvesting of the onions a return in the form of a statutory declaration showing the total number of bags and weight of the onions produced from that harvest, the quantity delivered to the Board, the quantity otherwise disposed of, and the manner of its disposal and the prices obtained for any such onions sold.
