DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 1 (2) (a), do by this my Proclamation fix the first day of June, 1936, as the date upon which the said sections three to six of the said Act shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

PORTS OF VICTORIA. -- ADDITION TO PORT RULES.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Captain the Right Honorable William Charles Arcedeckne, Baron Huntingfield, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the Marine Act 1928 (19 Geo. V. WHEREAS by Part II. of the Marine Act 1928 (19 Geo. V. No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation issued in the Government Gazette, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now, therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following addition to the Port Rules, that is to say:—

NAVIGATION OF OIL TANKERS THROUGH PORT PHILLIP HEADS AND THE SOUTH CHANNEL DREDGED CUT.

After Rule 117A of the Rules and Regulations for the Ports in Victoria, insert-

117B. To avoid the risk of collision and danger due to the 117B. To avoid the risk of collision and danger due to the necessity for passing close to oil tankers in confined waters, masters of vessels shall not attempt the navigation of Port Phillip Heads nor the South Channel Dredged Cut, where the navigable width is only 650 feet for a length of 4,800 feet between Buoys Nos. 10 and 11, whilst an oil tanker is passing

To aid in the observance of this regulation, and as an indication to an oncoming vessel that an oil tanker is about to enter either of the channels mentioned, the precautions represented by the following signals must be strictly adhered to, that is to say:—

Inwards over the ingoing stream by day or by night.—An oil tanker, inward bound, by day or by night, provided the signals representing an ingoing stream are showing at Point Lonsdale, shall, before shaping course for the fairway, signal Point Lonsdale to the effect that she is ready to proceed, whereupon the officer on duty at that station shall, when all traffic likely to be met with has cleared the Heads, immediately hoist the General Commonwealth "Port Closed" or "Channel Blocked" signal, viz., by day, a black cone between two black balls; by night, a green light between two red lights hung in a vertical line; whereupon the entrance fairway will become temporarily closed to all traffic.

On these signals being observed, the tanker will hoist similar signals where they can be best seen and may not be confused with the ordinary regulation signals carried by oil tankers, and proceed inwards. On passing through and shaping course for the South Channel, the "Port Closed" signals from the oil tanker and Point Lonsdale will be hauled down and the entrance fairway will be opened again to all traffic.

Inwards over the outgoing stream by day or by night.—No tanker inward bound whilst the outgoing stream signals are being shown, shall shape a course for the fairway until all traffic in sight from the Signal Station and likely to he met with has cleared the Heads, which clearance will be indicated by the immediate hoist of the "Port Closed" signal at Point Lonsdale, whereupon the entrance fairway will become closed to all traffic, and the tanker; after hoisting a similar signal, may proceed inwards whilst, at the same time, observing the course of the ingoing stream.

On arrival off the South Channel Fort by day or by night, regardless of any phase of the tide, the oil tanker shall again show the "Port Closed" signal, when the channel will become closed to traffic. On clearing the Dredged Cuit to the eastward at No. 13 Buoy, the closed channel signal shall be hauled down, whereupon the channel will be open again to all traffic.

Navigation of Oil Tankers Outward Bound.—The owner, agent, or master of any oil tanker drawing less than 20 feet, which it is intended to see by day or by night, shall notify the Port Officer, Ports and Harbors Branch, Department of Public Works, Melbourne, as early as possible of the anticipated time of arrival of the tanker at the Heads.

To ensure a clear passage through the Dredged Cut, the tanker shall show the "Port Closed" signal from when abreast of the Hovell Pile Light until clear of No. 9 Buoy at the western end of the Dredged Cut, when the signal is to be hauled down and the channel opened again to all traffic.

Passage of the Heads outwards over the ingoing stream by day or by night.—Whilst the signals for the ingoing stream are being shown, an oil tanker shall not proceed beyond Observatory Point nor host the "Port Closed" signal until such signal is first hoisted at Point Lonsdale, as an indication also that shipping traffic sighted is unlikely to be met with during the passage through of the tanker.

During the display of outgoing stream signals, the tanker shall first communicate by signal to Point Lonsdale Signal Station, and the officer in charge thereof shall hoist the "Port Closed" signal as early as safety demands for the outgoing passage of the tanker, which, in turn, will lower her signals immediately on clearing the Heads.

#### BY-LAW No. 68.

#### Sale of Goods.

- A By-law of the City of Mordialloc made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 68, for prohibiting or regulating on, from and after a date specified hersin.
  - (i) the erection or use on any land within the Municipal District of tents or other temporary structures or buildings for the sale of goods therein or therefrom;
  - (ii) the sale of goods in or from such tents, structures, or buildings; and
  - (iii) the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicle, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacies standing or placed on vacant land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Mordialloc order as follows:—

- 1. No person shall on, from and after the 1st day of June, 1936, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council:—
  - (a) erect or use on any land within the Mordialloc Municipal District any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefron
  - (b) sell any goods in or from any such tent, structure, or building.
- 2. No person shall, without the previous consent in writing of the Council, sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the Municipality of the City of Mordialloc or a public place within the meaning of section three of the Police Offences Act 1928) within the municipal district.
- 3. Every person who shall be guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every first offence to a penalty of Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of Five pounds. In the event of any offence being continued after a conviction or order imposed or made on or against such person by any court such person will be liable to a further penalty of One pound for each day the offence is continued.
- 4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Mordialloc.

Remoral and Destruction of Refuse or Rubbish.

A By-law of the City of Mordialloc made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 69 for—.

- (i) Prohibiting the depositing or leaving of refuse or rub-bish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages;
- (ii) prohibiting or regulating the depositing or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land; and
- (iii) requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section thirty-nine of the Health Act 1928).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Mordialloc order as follows:—

- 1. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, lane, or passage within the Mordialloc Municipal District.
- 2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish
- a. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land within the Mordialloc Municipal District.

  3. The owner or occupier of any land upon which any refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left shall remove or destroy the same within seven days after the date of a notice in, writing from the Council over the signature of the Town Clerk so to do.
- so to do.

  4. Should default be made by such owner or occupier in complying with such notice within the time therein stated, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the said Council may, by its Inspector, with a sufficient number of workmen enter upon any land upon which refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left, and for that purpose to break down any fence surrounding the said land on which such refuse or rubbish, has been left, to remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish, and any expenses incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner or occupier of the said land to the Council on demand, and in default such payment may be recovered by the said Council from the owner or occupier in a Court of Petty Sessions.

  5. Every person who shall be guilty of an offence against any

Every person who shall be guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every first offence to a penalty of Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of Five pounds. In the event of any offence being continued after a conviction or order imposed or made on or against such person by any Court, such person will be liable to a further penalty of One pound for each day the offence is continued. the offence is continued,

In this By-law the words "street," "lane," or "passage" shall mean and include any street, road, lane, passage, which actually exists, whether or not the same be set out on private property or dedicated to the public, or made or unmade, or a public highway, or under the care and management of the Council.
- 7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Mordialloc Municipal District.
