Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE NAILMAKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 28th May, 1936, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warmambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

Note.—On the 19th August, 1913, the powers of the Nailmakers Board were extended to enable it to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed as storeman, packer, or sorter in connexion with the trade or business of making nails."

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—(a) making nails; (b) weaving wire netting and barbed wire; (c) galvanizing," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 28th May, 1936, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
