## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS a petition has been forwarded to the Minister praying for the Proclamation of an Additional Victualler's Licence Area and for the granting of a victualler's licence therein, and setting out the boundaries of such area as set out hereunder: And whereas the Minister has referred the said petition to the Licensing Court, and the said Court has reported to the Minister that it has held inquiry as to the requirements of the public with respect to licensed victuallers' premises in the locality and has satisfied itself that in such area there reside not less than five hundred persons enrolled as electors for the Legislative Assembly and that the majority of the persons aforesaid have signed the petition before mentioned, and the said Court has recommended that the prayer of the said petition be granted: And whereas, pursuant to the provisions of section 36 of the *Licensing Act 1928*, the Governor in Council may proclaim the aforesaid area for the purposes of the said section: Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do proclaim an Additional Victualler's Licence Area as set out hereunder for the purposes of the aforesaid section:—

## CHELSEA.

### Boundaries of Area.

Commencing at a point being the south-east corner of the intersection of the Beach front and Franklin-avenue; thence easterly along Franklin-avenue aforesaid and Embankment-grove to Royal-avenue; thence southerly along the west side of Royal-avenue aforesaid and Douglas-parade to Bondi-road; thence westerly along the north side of Bondi-road aforesaid and Harding-avenue to the Beach front; thence northerly along the Beach front aforesaid to the commencing point.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Oakleigh has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making a right-of-way within the said city be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved, used, or acquired for the right-of-way hereinafter named and described, and situated within the City of Oakleigh aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

## SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

## BY-LAW No. 37.

A By-law of the Shire of Hampden made under section 197 and part XXXIII of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and all other powers thereto it enabling and numbered 37 for the care, protection, control, and management of Mount Laura Reserve, Camperdown, and for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such Reserve.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden, hereinafter called the Council, order as follows:—

1. In this By-law the word "Reserve" wherever used herein shall mean and include all that piece of land being that part of portion C, section twelve, and that part of portion A, section seventeen, Parish of Colongulac, County of Hampden, comprised in conveyance number 915, book 403, and that part of Crown portion C, section twelve, and of Crown portion E, section thirteen, Parish and County aforesaid comprised in certificate of title, volume 3910, folio 781959, and known as the Mount Laura Reserve, Camperdown.

2. No person in a state of intoxication or who is in any manner disorderly or who may offend in any way against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter or remain in the Reserve.

3. No person shall commit any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act in the Reserve, nor spit or expectorate on any structure or erection therein.

4. No person shall interfere with, remove, destroy, or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, grass, or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein, nor leave therein any bottles, glass, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

5. No person shall climb on or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve or stick bills, advertisements, posters, or signs of any description thereon or on the trees or on the seats, posts, improvements, erections, or other structures therein, or cut names, letters, or marks thereon, or in any way damage, deface, injure, or write on the same or any of them.

6. No person shall throw, roll, remove, displace, or cause to be thrown, rolled, removed, or displaced in the Reserve any earth, scoria, stones, boulders, or any other like substance or objects of any kind whatsoever.

7. No person shall put nor allow to remain in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, swine, fowls, geese, or other animals or poultry the property of such person without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

9. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any tent, dwelling, shelter, booth, or structure of any kind whatsoever without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

10. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

11. No person unless authorized by the Council, in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the Reserve any article, fruit, wares, or merchandise of any description whatsoever.

12. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, or disturbance, or play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing in the Reserve.

13. No person shall preach or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public or any section of the public in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

14. No person shall distribute, scatter, or throw down any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve.

15. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer or other servant of the Council.

16. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve.

17. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game, athletic sport, or gymnastic exercises within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

18. No person other than labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots or enclosures set apart in the Reserve for trees, shrubs, flowers, or other purposes.

19. No person shall drive or propel or cause to be driven or propelled any cart, motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle or machine in, through, or across the Reserve except at the points and by the roads and paths especially provided for the purpose, and shall not on any such road and/or path exceed a speed limit of ten miles per hour.

20. No person shall park or leave in the Reserve any cart, motor car, motor cycle, or other vehicle or machine whether there is any person in attendance therewith or not at any place in the Reserve other than in the fenced parking enclosure situated on the top of Mount Leura immediately at the end of the road leading thereto, or at such other place or places in the Reserve which the Council may by notice specify as parking areas.

21. Every person wilfully offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for each offence be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

22. In addition to any penalty hereby imposed every person on conviction for an offence hereunder as aforesaid shall pay to the Council any expenses incurred by it in consequence of the breach of this By-law constituting such offence.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the seventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and confirmed by the Council on the sixth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

Under the heading "Fares to be charged," add the following:—"Each deviation, 6d." Under the heading "Maximum number of motor omnibuses to be licensed on route," for the figure "4" substitute the figure "5."

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF RICHARDSON RESERVE IN THE CITY OF GEELONG.

**WHEREAS** by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in Trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipts of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such Crown lands in the City of Geelong as is indicated by red colour on plan marked G./12,929 with Lands Department correspondence C.78626, such lands being portions of Reserves for Public Purposes, and being known as "Richardson Reserve," in lieu of all previous Regulations which are hereby rescinded.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding six in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements or aquatic events on the River Barwon, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding five shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult person to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

3. No society, club, picnic party or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on fences, trees or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve or pollute any water therein or remove from there any soil, sand or manure, or any other property.

5. No person shall place any advertisement, bill, poster or any other like sign in any part of the Reserve, nor give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the Reserve, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

6. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs or other property in the Reserve, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth, tent, table or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without permission in writing of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve, or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.

9. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve shall walk upon any flower bed or enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or used for plantations for young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain, and all dogs, goats and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals.

12. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status), within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.

13. No person shall engage in any organized game or sport or dancing in the Reserve on Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday.

14. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

16. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

17. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown any stone, missile, or any hard substance in the Reserve, and no person shall play cricket, hockey, football, golf, rounders, tennis or any other game in the Reserve, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall ride, drive or bring or cause or suffer to be ridden, driven, or brought into the Reserve any beast of draught or burden.

19. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car on any portion of the Reserve except on the drives specially set apart for that purpose.

"Vehicle" shall mean any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

"Motor car" shall mean any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928 for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The Council of the City of Geelong is the Committee of Management hereinbefore referred to.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR BATHING PLACE AT PENSURST.

**WHEREAS** by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to or vested in Trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved by Order in Council on the 30th day of September, 1935, as a site for Public Purposes (Swimming Pool) in the Town of Penshurst hereinafter referred to as the Reserve.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve and Swimming Pool shall be open to the public from daylight to dusk from the 1st January to 30th April, and from the 1st November to 31st December in each year under such conditions as may be fixed by the Committee of Management.

2. No person or persons suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the Swimming Pool.

3. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the Swimming Pool or in the immediate vicinity thereof.

4. No person shall use soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in the Swimming Pool may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

5. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the Reserve.

6. No person shall by writing or otherwise deface the fencing or any property within the Reserve.

7. No person shall enter the Swimming Pool unless decently clothed in a suitable bathing costume from neck to knee.

8. Children shall not be allowed to enter the Swimming Pool except under adequate supervision of an adult.

9. No person shall bring any animal within the boundary fence of the Reserve unless the animal is tethered by a chain or cord.

10. Camping in any part of the Reserve will not be permitted.

11. Any person committing a nuisance on any portion of the Reserve shall render him or herself liable to prosecution.

The Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten pounds (£10).

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDEN AT PENSHURST, KNOWN AS THE "PENSHURST GARDENS."

**WHEREAS** by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved by Order in Council of the 30th day of September, 1935, as a site for a Public Garden in the Town of Peshurst hereinafter referred to as the Reserve:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall at all times be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

4. No person shall light fires in the Reserve except in kitchen fireplaces built and approved by the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way injure or damage the buildings, gates, fences, seats, trees, or any other property in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "Cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No persons except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

15. No person shall disturb the surface or remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Anzac Day.

17. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, football, quoits, hockey, or any other game or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

18. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle or on horseback without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the ground.

19. No person shall obstruct, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

20. No assemblies for concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

21. No person other than the players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, golf, tennis, bowls, croquet, or hockey), and than any competitor and officials at any sports gathering shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games or sports.

The Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten pounds (£10).

Definition of sky sign, signs on towers, &c.; signboards and signs on buildings; signboards and signs in lanes; position of signs, maintenance; illuminated signs on and under street verandahs; fascia signs; suspended box signs; illuminated signs on buildings, to be placed vertically against walls; double-sided vertical projecting signs; application for licence; construction of signs under cantilever verandahs; writing on signs; box signs under pillar verandahs; construction of signs; construction of double-sided vertical signs; licence to erect signs; cancellation of licence; licence fees; removal of signs under pillar verandahs; illuminated signs in lanes; illuminated signs on cornice or parapets; illuminated signs on flat roofs; design and construction of signs; sky signs.

## CITY OF PRAHRAN.

## BY-LAW No. 190.

## Residential Area.

A By-law of the City of Prahran made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 190 for the purpose of altering By-law No. 170, prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting within such areas the use of any land, or the erection, adaption for use, or the use of any building for the purposes of certain trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

## Shrine of Remembrance Site Act 1933, Land Act 1928.

## REGULATIONS BY TRUSTEES OF LAND UNDER SECTION 182 OF LAND ACT 1928.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SHRINE OF REMEMBRANCE SITE IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by a Crown grant issued in favour of Shrine of Remembrance Trustees (incorporated by the *Shrine of Remembrance Site Act 1933*) in respect of the reserve for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance in the City of Melbourne it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted shall be maintained and used as and for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance and offices and conveniences connected therewith and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 182 of the *Land Act 1928* it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved permanently any Crown land for any public purposes whatsoever and has vested such land in trustees it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land

with the approval of the Governor in Council to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section: Now therefore the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve in the City of Melbourne:—

1. No person being in the Reserve shall at any time, unless he is authorized in writing so to do by the Trustees, sell or offer for sale, or advertise for sale, any article, whether in being or not in being, or carry on any trade or business or offer any services for remuneration.

2. No person shall do anything likely to damage, deface, or impair any property of the Trustees being a building, structure, erection, decoration, or other improvement or fixture, or part of any building, structure, erection, decoration, improvement or fixture on the Reserve. The meaning of this regulation shall not be restricted by any more particular provision or provisions in these Regulations expressed or contained.

3. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, flower, fish or bird in the Reserve; or throw any stone or other missile, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottle, orange peel, paper, or litter of any kind, or light fire anywhere in the Reserve, or engage therein in any sport or game.

4. No vehicle, motor car, motor cycle, or cycle other than perambulators, go-carts, and children's cycles shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.

5. No person shall cause or allow any horse to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, or be ridden or exercised in any part thereof, except on some road (if any) expressly made available by the Trustees for horse traffic.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct; and no person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Reserve. No person shall create or take part in any disturbance in the Reserve.

7. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve after he has been lawfully ordered to keep off or to leave the Reserve by any member of the Police Force, or by any person generally or specially authorized by the Trustees to order or keep persons off the Reserve.

8. No public meeting, assembly for a fête, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, and no public meeting shall take place in the Reserve except within the hours and for the purpose and under the charge of the persons which the Trustees have consented to in writing.

9. No person shall stand on or jump on or over any seat, gate, fence, or other structures, or climb any tree in the Reserve, or lie on any seat, or lie on the grass in an objectionable attitude, or stick bills on anything in the Reserve, or cut names, letters, or marks on any tree, seat, gate, post, or fence, or write thereon or otherwise deface the same or any property of the Trustees.

10. No person shall depasture any cattle, sheep, horse, or other animal in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees, and then only in such portions thereof and at such times as may be specified in such permission. All coats and poultry found in the Reserve may be destroyed by the Trustees.

11. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve by or with the authority of the Trustees, shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs, or for other purposes, without the consent of the person having charge thereof.

12. Children under the age of 12 years shall not be allowed to the Reserve unless accompanied by and in the direct charge of an adult.

13. No person shall offer any chair or seat for hire in the Reserve, or solicit or collect money or other valuable thing therein without permission, in writing, of the Trustees first had and obtained.

14. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the Land Act 1923, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of such Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
