PROCLAMATION

"An Act to vest a certain Deviation of the Wodonga and Tallangatta Railway and certain Lands upon which such Deviation is constructed in The Victorian Railways Commissioners and to vest an unused Portion of the said Railway and the Land upon which the same was constructed in the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission and for other purposes."

PART XXIII. (WIDTH OF TIRES-PROVISIONS) OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1928 APPLIED TO THE SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL.

AWARD No. 28 OF 26TH JUNE, 1936, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932 (No. 4030)*, and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder dated 21st August, 1934, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

Face Jigs.

Where miners are working on face jigs exceeding a distance of 99 feet, the following rates shall be paid for coal extracted:—

From 99 feet to 132 feet—3d. per ton.

From 132 feet to 165 feet—4d. per ton.

In the case of stone, 3d. and 4d. per skip shall be paid for the respective distances specified above.

Additions to Rules and Regulations for the Ports in Victoria.

NAVIGATION OF OIL TANKERS THROUGH PORT PHILLIP HEADS AND THE SOUTH CHANNEL DREDGED CUT.

MARINERS and others concerned are hereby notified of the necessity for strict observance of the additional Port Rule 117B, proclaimed on 19th May, 1936, and published in *Victoria Government Gazette*, page 1238, 22nd May, 1936, which for convenient reference is quoted as hereunder.

Navigation of Oil Tankers through Port Phillip Heads and the South Channel Dredged Cut.

After rule 117A of the Rules and Regulations for the Ports in Victoria, insert—

"117B. To avoid the risk of collision and danger due to the necessity for passing close to oil tankers in confined waters, masters of vessels shall not attempt the navigation of Port Phillip Heads nor the South Channel Dredged Cut, where the navigable width is only 650 feet for a length of 4,800 feet between buoys Nos. 10 and 11, whilst an oil tanker is passing through.

To aid in the observation of this regulation, and as an indication to an oncoming vessel that an oil tanker is about to enter either of the channels mentioned, the precautions represented by the following signals must be strictly adhered to, that is to say:—

Inwards with the ingoing stream by day or by night.—An oil tanker, inward bound, by day or by night, provided the signals representing an ingoing stream are showing at Point Lonsdale, shall, before shaping course for the fairway, signal Point Lonsdale to the effect that she is ready to proceed, whereupon the officer on duty at that station shall, when all traffic likely to be met with has cleared the Heads, immediately hoist the General Commonwealth "Port Closed" or "Channel Blocked" signal, viz., by day a black cone between two black balls; by night a green light between two red lights hung in a vertical line; whereupon the entrance fairway will become temporarily closed to all traffic.

On these signals being observed, the tanker will hoist similar signals where they can be best seen and may not be confused with the ordinary regulation signals carried by oil tankers, and proceed inwards. On passing through and shaping course for the South Channel, the "Port Closed" signals from the oil tanker and Point Lonsdale will be hauled down and the entrance fairway will be opened again to all traffic.

Inwards over the outgoing stream by day or by night.—No tanker inward bound whilst the outgoing stream signals are being shown shall shape a course for the fairway until all traffic in sight from the Signal Station and likely to be met with has cleared the Heads, which clearance will be indicated by the immediate hoist of the "Port Closed" signal at Point Lonsdale, whereupon the entrance fairway will become closed to all traffic, and the tanker, after hoisting a similar signal, may proceed inwards whilst, at the same time, observing the directions already given herein covering a passage during the course of the ingoing stream.

On arrival off the South Channel Fort by day or by night, regardless of any phase of the tide, the oil tanker shall again show the "Port Closed" signal, when the channel will become closed to traffic. On clearing the Dredged Cut to the eastward at No. 13 buoy, the closed channel signal shall be hauled down, whereupon the channel will be open again to all traffic.

Navigation of Oil Tankers outward bound.—The owner, agent, or master of any oil tanker drawing less than 29 feet, which it is intended to send to sea by day or by night, shall notify the Port Officer, Ports and Harbors Branch, Department of Public Works, Melbourne, as early as possible of the anticipated arrival of the tanker at the Heads.

To ensure a clear passage through the Dredged Cut, the tanker shall show the "Port Closed" signal from when abreast of the Hovell Pile Light until clear of No. 9 buoy at the western end of the Dredged Cut, when the signal is to be hauled down and the channel opened again to all traffic.

Passage of the Heads outwards over the ingoing stream by day or by night.—Whilst the signals for the ingoing stream are being shown, an oil tanker shall not proceed beyond Observatory Point nor hoist the "Port Closed" signal until such signal is first hoisted at Point Lonsdale, as an indication also that shipping traffic sighted is unlikely to be met with during the passage through of the tanker.

During the display of outgoing stream signals, the tanker shall first communicate by signal to Point Lonsdale Signal Station, and the officer in charge thereof shall hoist the "Port Closed" signal as early as safety demands for the outgoing passage of the tanker, which, in turn, will lower her signals immediately on clearing the Heads."

CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST THE DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD NO. 16 (HARDWARE).

(3) on the date of receipt of the appeal and during the periods of twenty-one days and a further fourteen days thereafter, no nomination of a person for appointment as a representative of the employees on the Court has been received.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts, that a Court of Industrial Appeals, consisting of the President, His Honour Mr. Justice Martin, sitting alone, be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware) and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond of £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at .. ." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, C.2; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, C.2.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the Forests Commission. Messmate wood will not be accepted.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 6 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, but the contractor must have 48 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne, C.2.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in a bank draft or bank cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, State or Commonwealth Treasury bonds or Government debentures, or references to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days of acceptance of tenders to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount of the preliminary deposit required with each tender must be enclosed, and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque or bank draft, as the case may be.

Security will be required, either in bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), State or Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Fixed Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within seven days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for Firewood at ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, C.2, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. Under these contracts firewood may be ordered by Commonwealth Government Departments and head teachers of State schools within the areas prescribed, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks and wattle, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be of the diameters as specified in the respective schedules. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the Forests Commission.

4. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

5. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the Elizabeth-street (Melbourne) Post Office.

6. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width specified in the schedule, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply.

7. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery. If after the delivery of the firewood has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the firewood so rejected or returned.

8. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department concerned his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable where the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion as to the quality between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

10. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 4.

11. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or the officer authorized to accept delivery will have the power to reject such wood as is deemed of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must supply firewood of satisfactory quality and description in its stead, failing which supplies will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 4.

12. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 4.

It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under the Health Acts, and numbered 229, for prescribing the fees to be charged for the registration of premises and for the renewal and transfer of such registrations pursuant to the said Acts.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne makes the By-law and orders as follows:—

1. By-law No. 158 is hereby repealed.
2. The fees to be charged, received, and taken by the Council of the City of Melbourne for the registration of premises and for annual renewals thereof and for transfers thereof pursuant to the provisions of the Health Acts shall be as set out in the schedule hereto.

3. Such fees shall be paid to the Town Clerk by any person making application for such registration, renewal, or transfer.

- Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) in which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ices, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water.—Five shillings.
- Premises at or in any part of which eggs for sale are received or stored for the purpose of being chilled.—One pound.

(b) For any transfer of registration.—Two shillings and sixpence.

BY-LAW No. 17.

A By-law of the Shire of Whittlesea for prescribing the fees payable for the registration of premises and renewal and transfer of registration of premises with the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1928, and the Health Act 1928, as amended by the Health Act 1935, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Whittlesea doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That from and after the passing of this By-law the fees to be paid for the registration, renewal, or transfer of registration shall be as under:—

- (a) For each offensive trade premises.—Ten shillings.
- (b) For each cattle saleyards.—One pound.
- (c) For each boardinghouse.—Ten shillings.
- (d) For each common lodging house.—Ten shillings.
- (e) For each eating house.—Ten shillings.
- (f) For each premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ices, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water.—Five shillings.
- (g) For each premises at or on any part of which eggs for sale are received or stored for the purpose of being chilled.—One pound.
- (h) For any transfer of registration.—Two shillings and sixpence.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Whittlesea.

3. By-law No. 10 is hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong made under the *Local Government Act 1928*, and particularly under sub-section (a) and (b) of section 750, and sub-section 9 of section 197 of the said *Local Government Act 1928*, No. 67, regulating the market place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held, and for regulating public sales.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong Order as follows:—

1. MARKET DAYS.

That the ordinary day of holding the market shall be on Tuesday in each week; but the market shall also be open for the receipt and/or sale of all such animals, goods, and commodities as the Shire Council shall permit to be sold therein on such days during the year, and for such hours during each day between sunrise and sunset as the Council may from time to time determine, except Sundays, Christmas Days, and Good Fridays, on which days no business shall be transacted therein.

2. STOCK LEFT IN MARKET AFTER CERTAIN HOUR TO BE IMPOUNDED.

Cattle, horses, asses, or mules left in the market after 12 o'clock the day following the sale will be impounded. All implements, vehicles, furniture, or other articles now on or which may be brought on the market must be removed from the market on the same day on which the same is sold or offered for sale, otherwise the same and the owner or respective owners thereof will be charged a rent or fee for such article not so removed of 1s. per day, calculated from the time when such article was first brought into the market; and no such article shall be removed until payment of such rent, and if the same remains unpaid for one calendar month after such first-named day the Council or the Market Inspector may, after having at least one week previously posted a notice in the market of its intention to distrain on such article for all rent accrued up to the time of making such distraint, distrain on and sell the same in the same manner as landlords are entitled to distrain on and sell goods for arrears of rent.

3. INSPECTOR.

There shall be appointed by the Council, if it deems necessary, an inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

- (1) To see that the Market Regulations are duly observed.
- (2) To preserve order and regularity in the market.
- (3) To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as are deemed unfit for use, to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be lawful to prevent the sale thereof.
- (4) To demand, receive, and collect in the name and on behalf of the Council, such sums of money as are for stallages, rents, tolls, and market dues as are for the time being appointed by special order of the Council to be demanded, received, and had in that behalf respectively, and in non-payment thereof, respectively to levy the same by distress or to take proceedings before a justice in respect of the same, or for recovery of any penalty in respect of the selling, offering, or exposing for sale any commodity, article, or thing without payment of dues or tolls.
- (5) To proceed for the recovery of all penalties against any person who sells, offers, or exposes for sale, any unwholesome meat or provisions in the market, and for the destruction or confiscation of the same.
- (6) To appoint the several standing places and places for the deposit of goods, wares, and merchandise in the market, as well as the places for depositing and using utensils or materials requisite for the fixing of stalls, and to order the removal of the same when and in such manner as he shall deem necessary.
- (7) To take charge of the places for weighing the commodities sold in the market, and the weights and scales for weighing such commodities.

4. PAYMENT OF DUES.

All tolls and dues chargeable under the Special Order of the Council for the time being in force shall be payable on the entrance of the articles into the market, or prior to their leaving the market, to the Market Inspector, and no live stock shall be taken out of the market by any person without obtaining written authority from the auctioneer selling the same, and any person wilfully omitting or neglecting to pay any of such tolls or dues, or taking out of the market any such live stock without such written authority, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

5. OBSTRUCTING THOROUGHFARE.

Any person who shall wilfully place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the market, and shall wilfully refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the Inspector or his assistant to do so, or who shall wilfully place any cart, carriage, or wheelbarrow or other article in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Inspector or his assistant, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

6. PLACING OF INSTRUMENTS IN MARKET BUILDING.

No person shall place any nail, hook, or peg in any part of the wood, stone, brick, or ironwork of any standing or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any such standing or stall without the consent of, or contrary to the directions of, the Market Inspector, or neglect or refuse to take down any hook, nail, peg, or fittings, or to remove any obstructions or advertising matter in his or her standing or stall when required to do so by the Market Inspector.

7. INTERFERENCE WITH COUNCIL'S OFFICERS.

Any person wilfully resisting or obstructing or interfering with the Inspector, officers of the Council, or any of their assistants in the discharge of his or their duty shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

8. SALES BEFORE AND AFTER HOUR OF OPENING OR CLOSING.

No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the market any produce, goods, horses, cattle, wares, or merchandise of any kind before the hour of opening or after the hour of closing the said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the Council as a day upon which the market will be open without the sanction, in writing, of the Council or president thereof, or some person authorized by the Council in that behalf.

9. TIME OF OPENING MARKET FOR MILKING COWS AND DRY CATTLE.

The gates of the market will be open for the receiving of animals for sale as follows:—On the day of sale for milking cows and dry cattle, up to 9.45 a.m. All cattle entering the gates of the market after 9.45 a.m. shall be kept separate and apart from the cattle received prior to such respective times herein fixed, and shall not be offered for sale by public auction until after all stock received for sale at or before the appointed time or times aforesaid shall have been submitted for sale, with this exception, however, that milking cows received for sale after the hour of 10.30 a.m. shall be submitted for sale immediately following milking cows received for sale prior to that hour, each auctioneer selling in his turn as originally drawn for milking cows.

10. NAME OF AUCTIONEER TO BE GIVEN.

The owner or drover bringing cattle into the market must give the name of the auctioneer selling, and the number of milking cows or dry cattle, either or both, he has for sale, to the market gatekeeper before entering the market yard therewith.

11. GATES NOT TO BE OPENED, ETC.

No person shall release or remove any cattle or articles from the said Market, or remove any cattle or articles from one part of the said Market to another part of the said Market without the consent of the Market Inspector, nor shall any person wilfully open any gate or lock or fastening of any gate, or open or break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings or appurtenances of the said Market, nor cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent or gross conduct within the said Market or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

12. CATTLE SUBMITTED FOR SALE TO BE YARDED.

Each auctioneer shall yard, or cause to be yarded, all cattle after they have been submitted for sale, whether sold or not, in such yard or yards as shall be directed by the Council or its Inspector, and shall tie up all such cattle as are milking cows.

13. TIMES OF SALE OF VARIOUS STOCK.

The sale of dry cattle shall commence at 10 a.m. the sale of milking cows shall commence at 11 a.m. the sale of calves shall commence at 10.30 a.m., and the sale of pigs shall commence as follows:—Stores 12 noon, Fats 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. All sales must be punctually commenced, and must be continuous and without any breaks or adjournments of such sales until the whole sales or intended sales shall have been fully completed and ended. If and when more than one sale is going on at the same time, each sale shall be conducted in a separate yard, and in each case as and where the Council or the said Inspector shall direct.

14. BULLS MUST BE SOLD IN PENS PROVIDED FOR SAME.

14A. TIME FOR SALE OF POULTRY.

The sale of poultry shall commence at 10.30 a.m., and all poultry coming into the Market for sale after that hour shall not be offered for sale until all poultry arriving in the

Market yard for sale on or before that hour shall have been first submitted to sale, and then the order of sale of such last-mentioned poultry shall be regulated as to precedence of sale as and in accord with the time of such poultry arriving in the Market yard for sale. Each person bringing poultry into the Market for sale shall place same in the coops provided by the Council, and empty crates must be removed from the yard.

15. POULTRY TO BE PLACED IN COUNCIL COOPS.

No poultry shall be offered for sale in the coops or boxes in which they are brought into the yard except there is no room in the coops provided by the Council.

16. LOTS TO BE DRAWN FOR PRIORITY OF SALE.

On each day of sale there shall be a drawing of lot by auctioneers desirous of selling milking cows and dry cattle in the Market for priority of sale, which drawing shall take place at 9.45 a.m.

17. AUCTIONEER TO FURNISH TIME-KEEPER WITH NUMBER OF CATTLE.

Any auctioneer proposing to sell at any market shall, at or before any drawing takes place, furnish the time-keeper with the number of milking cows and dry cattle he intends to offer at auction. The draw for priority of sale shall be conducted by the time-keeper, who shall ring a bell for each drawing and provide ballot balls or papers, which shall be consecutively numbered, and shall represent the order of sale to be observed by the person drawing same, the number of ballot balls or papers to be equal in number to the auctioneers who shall have signified their intention of selling. The time-keeper shall place the ballot balls or papers in a box or other like receptacle from which each auctioneer shall draw one of the ballot papers or balls, the priority of drawing being determined as follows:—That the auctioneer who conducted the first sale on the preceding market day shall on the market day next held be the last one to draw. The auctioneer who was the last one to sell at the preceding market shall be the first entitled to draw, and so on through the whole number, the order in precedence in drawing the ballot ball or paper being reversed from the position held at the preceding sale until the whole ballot shall have been exhausted. In case any auctioneer shall be absent at the time of any draw, the time-keeper shall arrange for some person to draw for him. The time-keeper, immediately at the conclusion of each of the ballots for priority of sale of milking cows and dry cattle, shall post a list in some conspicuous part of the Market showing the name of the auctioneer in the several positions of priority, and the time allotted to each auctioneer for selling.

18. TIME LIMIT ON SALES.

The time-keeper or his assistant shall on each day of sale ring a bell at 10.30 a.m., and again at noon, and the auction sales of milking cows and dry cattle shall then commence in the order and subject to the conditions herein provided. The auctioneer or firm of auctioneers having priority of sale of milking cows shall commence selling the same not later than thirty minutes after 11 o'clock a.m., and the auctioneer or firm of auctioneers having priority of sale of dry cattle shall commence selling the same not later than 10.30 a.m., and, except as hereinafter provided, the time allowed for each auctioneer or firm of auctioneers shall be determined by the number of head of cattle entered for sale, as follows:—

Cattle Entered.	Number to be Sold.
Not exceeding 240 head of dry cattle	60 head per hour.
Not exceeding 100 head of milking cows	30 head per hour.

19. TIME LIMIT ON SALE OF PIGS, CALVES, AND POULTRY.

Where the number of dry cattle entered for sale on any market day exceeds 240 head, or the number of milking cows so entered exceeds 100 head, the time-keeper may in his discretion proportionately increase the number of dry cattle or milking cows to be sold per hour. Provided that the time-keeper shall not have discretion to order that more than 90 head of dry cattle or 45 head of milking cows be sold per hour. As to pigs and calves, any auctioneer selling the same shall do so at the rate of not less than 120 per hour. Provided that the time-keeper shall have discretion to increase the number of pigs and calves to be sold per hour whenever the number of pigs and calves entered for sale is so large as in his opinion to render such an increase necessary. Provided that such discretion shall not extend to increasing the number of pigs and calves to be sold per hour to more than 180 head.

But if such auctioneer or firm of auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale cattle in lots exceeding five head, the number of head to be sold per hour shall be proportionately increased, as such sale in lots exceeding five head shall be treated and counted so far as time limit is affected as a sale of five head. Provided, however, that the above rates shall not apply to milking cows, and each auctioneer shall subject as aforesaid be allowed two minutes for the sale of each and every milking cow submitted by him.

Each auctioneer shall be allotted one hour on the first sale of poultry, and must sell at the rate of 120 pens per hour.

20. AUCTIONEERS NOT PROCEEDING WITH SALE AT ALLOTTED TIME TO BE PLACED AT FOOT OF LIST.

Any auctioneer not present and proceeding with his sale when his time arrives to commence selling shall, besides being guilty of a breach of this By-law as hereinafter mentioned, forfeit his priority of right to sell, and shall be placed at the foot of the list of auctioneers entitled to sell. Any auctioneer upon being informed by the time-keeper that his proportionate time for selling has expired, shall immediately cease to sell, and the next auctioneer on the posted list shall occupy the position vacated. No auctioneer shall offer, or cause to be offered, any cattle a second time at the same market until all other sales are disposed of and completed, and before offering for sale by auction any animal or animals sold on the same day in the Market the auctioneer shall procure from the purchaser instructing him to re-sell the selling agents' pass for the same.

21. TIME-KEEPER'S DECISION FINAL.

Any auctioneer or agent wilfully not proceeding with his sale as and at the time and times provided herein shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law. Any person offering any cattle for sale in the Market which are not sold who shall afterwards sell the same privately, having wilfully neglected to first pay the proper dues, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law. The Market time-keeper shall be appointed by the Council, to whom all disputes with reference to or affecting the time, order, and otherwise of conducting the sales in the Market by the auctioneers shall be referred, and his decision shall be final.

22. FOOD TO BE SOLD BY WEIGHT OR MEASURE.

Commodities for food offered for sale in the Market shall not be sold by bulk, but by Imperial weight or measure, according to their kind; any person offering to purchase may require the vendor or any such commodity to weigh or measure the same, and if any vendor shall refuse to weigh or measure such commodity, or if on reference to the Market Inspector it shall be found that such vendor has made a false representation of the weight or measure thereof, every such vendor shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding 40s. for every such offence.

23. DEFICIENCIES IN WEIGHT.

Any person who may sell or offer for sale by weight or measure any commodity which, when tried by the Market Inspector, may be found deficient in the weight or measure represented, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding 40s. for every such offence.

24. ENTRANCE FOR VEHICLES.

The entrance for vehicles into the Cattle Market shall be by Clow-street, and the exit by King-street, and any person contravening this rule shall on conviction thereof forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding 10s.

25. CARTS NOT TO STAND IN MARKET PLACE.

Except the carts of vendors occupying standings duly appointed for them, no carts or vehicles of any kind shall be permitted to stand in the Market place, except where appointed by the Market Inspector.

No person shall place or keep any cart, carriage, wheelbarrow or other matter or thing in any part of the Market contrary to the direction of the Market Inspector.

26. BELL TO RING AT CLOSING TIME.

The closing of the Market shall be announced by the ringing of a bell.

27. PENALTIES.

Any person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach or non-observance of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

By-law 56 of the Shire of Dandenong is hereby repealed.
