VIIEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 56 of the Forests Act 1928 the Governor in Council is enabled to make Rules and Regulations in regard to the care, protection, and management of any land forming part of any reserved forest, such land being a place of natural beauty or interest. or a health resort, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such land or any specified part or parts thereof, and by such Rules and Regulations to extend and apply for the purposes of such section and the Rules and Regulations thereunder the provisions of sub-sections (2), (3), (4), and (5) of section one hundred and eighty-five of the Land Act 1928 with such alterations, substitutions, additions, omissions, and modifications as are necessary or expedient for the purposes of carrying out the objects structions, additions, omissions, and modifications as are necessary or expedient for the purposes of carrying out the objects of this section. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal (including birds of any description), or any skin, egg. feathers, or nest, or carry any firearms, poison traps, snares or gins within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences in or around the Reserve, or affix any bills or signs to any tree, seat, gate, post, table, fence, pillar, railing, building, or any other erection within or around the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such places and in such manner as may be described by such Committee.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for any purpose whatsoever, or offer for sale therein any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to the payment No. 142.—9020.—2

of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may in its absolute discretion determine. Such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand the production of same.

- 8. No person shall bring into the Reserve or allow to wander therein any horse, cattle, sheep, goat, pig. or other animal without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the owner of any such animal found trespassing in the Reserve shall be liable for breach of these Regulations. these Regulations.
- 9. The Committee of Management shall have full power to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and the Committee of Management shall be the occupier of the Re-Committee of Management shall be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.
- 10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any seed, or portion of any plant without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 11. No person shall park any motor car within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose.
- 12. No person shall conduct or take part in any public meeting or organize entertainments or sports of any kind in any part of the Reserve without the written permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 13. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve unless under control, and all dogs found wandering therein shall be liable to be destroyed and the owners thereof to prosecution.
- 14. No person except those employed in the Reserve and other persons authorized by the Committee of Management shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for planstations of young trees, shrubs or flowers, or for the protection of young native species naturally grown, or remove therefrom any plant or bark, fruit, seed, leaves or flowers, or other part of any plant without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 15. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.
- 16. No person shall break gluss of any kind or deposit broken glass in the Reserve.
- 17. No vehicle with iron tires, carrying a load exceeding one ton on four wheels or half a ton on two wheels shall be allowed within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 18. The Committee of Management shall have power to restrict the load on any vehicle when it is considered that such load will damage any road or roads within the Reserve.
- 19. No person shall commit a nuisance in any part of the Reserve or in or on any building in the Reserve.

 20. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, or at any time behave in such a way as in the opinion of the Committee of Management tends to frighten or disturb the native animals and/or bitles therein
- such a way as in the opinion of the Committee of Management tends to frighten or disturb the native animals and/or birds therein.

2. A fee of Two shillings and sixpence shall be payable to the Council for the transfer of registration of any of the above-named premises or of any person registered in respect

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Sandring-

4. By-law number 57 is hereby repealed.

"Council" means and includes the Council of the Shire of

"Inspector" means and includes the officer appointed by the Council of the Shire of Dimboola to act as Inspector of the Jeparit municipal sale yards, and to

act as collector of stallages, rents, tolls, and dues.

"Cattle" shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats,

and:swine.
"Fat cattle" shall mean cattle fit for slaughtering for

human consumption,
"Store cattle" shall mean cattle not so fit.

I. Duties of Inspector.

2. The inspector's duties shall be as follows:—

(a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of all

Acts and Regulations relating to markets are

duly observed.

(b) To demond

(b) To demand and receive all market stallages, rents, tolls, and dues.

(c) To allot the principal and drafting yards for the use of the parties bringing stock to the cattle market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient.

(d) To preserve order and cleanliness within such cattle market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a disturbance, or using profane, indecent, or obscene language, or being guilty of indecent conduct therein. indecent conduct therein.

II. Market, When Open.

3. The cattle market, hereinafter referred to as the "market," shall be open for the reception and delivery of cattle for the conducting of special stock sales on every day except Sunday, Christmas Day, Anzac Day, and Good Friday,

except Sunday, Christmas Day, Anzac Day, and Good Friday, from sunrise to sunset.

4. The said market shall be open for the sale of cattle on every, Friday from sunrise to sunset, and no cattle shall be received at the said market after the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, except horses and swine, which must be in the market not later than Two o'clock in the afternoon. Provided nevertheless that should any cattle arrive in Jeparit by train on any sale day, such cattle may be admitted after Twelve o'clock noon if notice in writing of such intended arrival shall have been previously given to the inspector.

III. Order of Sales.

5. On every market day the sales of sheep and lambs shall be commenced not later than half-past Two o'clock in the afternoon. The sales of other cattle shall follow.
6. Each agent shall supply to the Shire Secretary prior to starting the sale, a list, in writing, showing the number of fat sheep, fat lambs, and other cattle penned by him for sale by auction that day.

. IV. All Cattle at Risk of Owner or Agent.
7. All cattle brought to the market and/or placed in the yards or pens thereof by the owner of such cattle or his agent shall be at the sole risk of such owner or agent, and neither No. 142.-9020.-3

the Council nor any employee of the Council shall in any circumstances incur any liability or responsibility in connexion therewith.

V. Removing or Releasing Stock.
S. All cattle brought to the market shall be placed in pens. No person shall release any cattle from the market or remove No person shall release any cattle from the market or remove the same from one part to another without the authority of the inspector. In case of any dispute arising as to the over-crowding of pens, or as to priority of occupancy, the inspector shall have authority to decide such disputes, and the dis-putants shall be bound by his decision. The inspector shall have authority to remove or order to be removed cattle from one pen to another, and any orders he may give in that respect

shall be promptly carried out.

9. No cattle which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production of a pass from the auctioneers in whose hands, they

were placed for sale.
10. All cattle not removed from the said market by the hour of Nine o'clock in the afternoon of the day upon which any sale shall have been held in the said market may be removed by the inspector at the expense and risk of the owner of any such cattle.

VI. Offences and Penalties. 11. No person shall sell or offer for sale by auction any cattle in the market before the opening or after the closing of the market. Penalty—Forty shillings.

12. No auctioneer or salesman shall continue to sell cattle, or offer earth for sales after the experience.

provided by this By-law. Penalty—Forty shillings. Provided that the inspector shall give notice of such expiry by the ringing of a bell or otherwise.

13. No person shall (1) obstruct the inspector of the said market in the execution of his duty; or (2) wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market; or (3) cause any disturbance therein; or (4) use any obscene or indeent or offensive language or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market, or upon the approaches thereto. Penalty—Five pounds.

VII. Licences for Yards for Sale of Cattle. 14. Every person desirous of having his yard or premises licensed for the sale of cattle must deliver to the Shire Secre-
