ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His-Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.

W HEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such fire district and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that

REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE USE OF FISHING NETS IN SHALLOW INLET NEAR WARATAH BAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation provide as follows respecting the waters of Shallow Inlet within or inside an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlet enter the ocean:—

(a) The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited from the fifteenth day of December in each year to the fifteenth day of February in the following year (both days inclusive).

(b) The use of mesh or set nets to be employed in fishing shall be prohibited during the whole of each year.

ENGINEERS AND BRASSWORKERS (UNSKILLED) BOARD—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

(b) in the process, trade or business of a mechanical engineer, including-

(1) a patternmaker, (2) an iron or brass turner, (3) a fitter; (4) a blacksmith,

(4) a blacksmin, (5) a planer, (6) a slotter, (7) a borer, (8) a milling machiner;

(c) in the trade of a maker of scientific instruments, fire-proof safes, strongroom doors, safe locks (four or more levers), or locks of the same quality;

(d) in performing any engineering, fitting, or engineering machining work not already under the jurisdiction of the Board;

(e) in preparing iron or steel material for reinforcing concrete for building or other purposes;

- A By-law of the City of Oakleigh made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 51, for the
 - (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings or erections.
 (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings

Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings or erections.

Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings or erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials, and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings or erections, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Council of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Oakleigh orders as follows:—

- 1. Definition.—" Surveyor" means the building surveyor or other proper officer for the time being of the municipality.
- 2. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-laws Nos. 18, 25, 28, and 46.
 - 3. By-law No. 37 is hereby repealed.
- 3. By-law No. 37 is hereby repeased.

 4. Notwithstanding anything contained in any or all of the By-laws numbered 18, 25, 28, and 46, no building shall be erected or removed to and re-erected on any land fronting to or abutting upon any of the streets or roads, or any of the portions of streets or roads specified in schedule "A" hereto within a distance of 75 feet of the nearest alignment of such street or road, or portion of street or road (as the case may be) to such land unless the exterior walls of such building are constructed of brick, concrete, stone, or other fire-resisting materials to be first approved, in writing, by the surveyor

before the erection of re-erection of such building is comnenced. Provided that these provisions shall not apply to the extension, addition, or alteration of any existing building erected on such land, the external walls of which building are constructed of materials other than brick, concrete, stone, or other fire-resisting materials, provided the area of any such extension, addition, or alteration does not exceed 200 square feet.

5. Clause 22 of By-law No. 25 is hereby amended by inserting after the words "side of each house," where such words appear in such clause, the words "provided, further, that the exterior walls of each such house shall be constructed of brick, concrete, stone, or other fire resisting materials to be first approved, in writing, by the surveyor before the erection of such houses is commenced."

6. Where any building or erection is after the coming into force of this By-law partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed, or re-crected contrary to the provisions of this By-

- (a) the Council may give to the owner or builder, or leave
- (a) the Council may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection, two clear days' notice, in writing (which notice may be signed by the surveyor on behalf of the Council), to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or may require the pulling down or removal of such building or erection; and (b) if default is made in complying with such notice. and notwitstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council, through its surveyor, to enter upon such building or erection, and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit; it may sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit; and
 (c) all expenses incurred by the Council or surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said building or erection, or of any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof, and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council may recover from the owner in any Court of competent jurisdiction the cost incurred in so doing; and
 (d) the Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale on application being made by the person entitled thereto.
