PLUMBERS BOARD.

Norgs.-(1) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) Plumbing and Gastiting were proclaimed on the 10th October, 1928, as Apprenticeship Trades under the Apprenticeship Act 1928, for the Metropolitan District.

The above-mentioned Appeals coming on for hearing by this Court of the 23rd and 24th July, 1936, and this day. Upon Reading the Appeals, and Upon Hearing Mr. F. P. Derham, of Counsel, and witnesses for the employers, and Mr. H. E. Foster, Secretary of the Plumbers and Gasfitters Employees Union, and witnesses for the employees; This Court Doth Onder and Determine:—

(1) That on the first pay-day subsequent to the 5th day of September, 1936, the Determination of the Plumbers Board dated the 6th March, 1936, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination as to the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

(a) employed either inside or outside a factory or workroom in the process, trade, or business of a plumber or gasfitter;

(b) wheresoever employed in any plumbing work (including electrical or gas fittings) in connexion with the erection or repairing of buildings.
