DRAINAGE OF IRRIGATION LANDS.-REGULATIONS

THE First Mildura Irrigation Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Mildura Irrigation Trust (Drainage) Act 1935, doth hereby make the Regulations following:

Trust (Drainage) Act 1935, doth hereby make the Regulations following:—

1. Any person who permits any surface waters, household drainage, or sewerage effluent to be 'discharged into any main subsurface drain of the Trust shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds.

2. Any person who, without the authority of the Trust, interferes in any way with any drain, silt-box, or other work forming part of the main subsurface drain system of the Trust shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds.

3. Blockholders must provide silt-boxes or shafts at the outfall of their internal drainage systems. These shall have internal dimensions not less than 4 ft. 6 in. by 2 ft. 6 in., and, including the bottom, are to be close lined with good quality redgum timber, whose smallest dimension shall not be less than one inch. The shafts or silt-boxes are to be provided with a central ladderway of redgum timber not smaller than three inches by two inches which, in addition to giving access to the bed of the shaft, shall be constructed in such a way as to act as central structuring for the side lining. The top edge of the lining is to be carried at least twelve inches above the average matural surface level in the immediate vicinity. A strong bank of earth is to be placed around and up to the top of that portion of the lining above the surface level entirely preventing the admission of surface waters. The bed of the shaft or silt-boxes is to be not less than four feet below the invert level of the outlet or inlet pipe, whichever is the lower. Secure, well-made covers are to be fitted to all shafts and silt-boxes. The shafts or silt-boxes shall be not less than nine feet from the drains or silt-boxes on the Trust's main system. Penalty for non-compliance, not more than Fifty pounds.

4. All connexions to the main system are to be made by way of the silt-boxes only. Connecting pipes to the main system are to be either glazed or reinforced concrete having an internal to the silt boxes only.

4. All connexions to the main system are to be made by way, of the silt-boxes only. Connecting pipes to the main system are to be either glazed or reinforced concrete having an internal diameter of not less than four inches. All joints are to be cemented and watertight. The inlet end of connecting pipes is to be fitted with an approved screen, the mesh of which shall not exceed one inch in any direction. Penalty for non-compliance, not more than Ten pounds.

5. Any blockholder who permits any silt-box or shaft connected with the subsurface system of the Trust to become obstructed by any accumulation of silt-or other material shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty nounds.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

NDER and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Medical Act 1928, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1935," and shall be read and construed as one with the "Pharmacy Regulations 1930, 1931, 1933, and 1934," which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as "The Pharmacy Regulations."

2. These Regulations shall take effect on publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

3. Election of Members of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria.— Regulation 5 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 is hereby rescinded, and the following regulation shall be substituted

Annual Election.—(a) The Returning Officer or his deputy shall in each year proceed to the election as members of the Board of as many persons as there are vacanies created in each year (not being extraordinary vacancies), and such elections, which shall be concluded before the seventh day of February, shall be styled "Annual Elections."

(b) The persons elected at each annual election shall hold office for a term of three years from the seventh day of February of the year in which they are elected.

4. At the end of regulation 6 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 the following words shall be added, namely:—

Provided that any such extraordinary vacancy occurring at any time between the first day of November and the day fixed for the next following annual election may at the option of the Board be filled at such annual election.

- 5. In regulation 9 of the said 1930 Regulations insert the word "qualified" between the words "other" and "person" in lines two and three of the said regulation so as to read, "nominating any other qualified person", and in the First Schedule to the said Regulations insert the word "qualified" after the word "candidate" where that word first appears in the schedule so as to read "as a candidate qualified for the office."
- 6. Regulations 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14 of the said 1930 Regulations are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations shall be substituted, namely:—

sations are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations shall be substituted, namely:—

(a) Retirement of a Candidate.—If any person after nomination as a candidate, for election is desirous of retiring before the day appointed for the holding of the election, he may, not later than twelve clear days before the said day, give notice to the Returning Officer in the form set out in the Third Schedule to the said 1930 Regulations intimating his retirement, and the Returning Officer or his deputy, on receipt thereof, shall omit the name of such candidate from the ballot-paper. If the number of candidates is, by reason of such retirement, reduced to the number of members required to be elected, the Returning Officer shall, if the time for nominating has elapsed, and without taking a poll, declare the remaining candidates duly elected.

If the number of duly nominated candidates be reduced by death to the number or less than the number to be elected, the Returning Officer or his deputy shall declare the remaining candidates duly elected. If the Returning Officer or his deputy is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate before the voting papers are printed, he shall omit the name of such candidate from the voting papers, or if any of such papers have been printed, but not issued, he shall strike out therefrom the name of the deceased candidate. If the Returning officer or his deputy is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate after the voting papers are issued and before the day of the election, the name of the deceased candidate shall be regarded as having been deleted from all such voting papers.

(b) Election without a Poll.—If there is not a greater

shall be regarded as having been deleted from all such voting papers.

(b) Election without a Poll.—If there is not a greater number of persons nominated than is required to fill the vacancies created, the Returning Officer or his deputy shall make a return to the Registrar, and declare such person or persons duly elected a member or members of the Board.

(c) When a Poll is Required.—If the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken. For this purpose the Registrar shall prepare a roll in alphabetical order of surnames of the registred pharmaceutical chemists resident in Victoria entitled to vote, and shall prefix to each name on the roll the number appearing in the Pharmaceutical Register for the current year. The roll shall be given to the Returning Officer or his deputy, who shall at least seven days before the date of the election forward to each name on the roll at the address therein a voting paper in the form or to the effect set out in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign, mark, or initial each of such papers.

One of such-marked ballot-papers shall be enclosed in an unscaled envelope addressed in print to the Returning Officer or his deputy. Such printed envelope, with a ballot-paper,

shall be posted under a sealed cover to the address of each pharmaceutical chemist on the roll. The voter shall mark the ballot-paper according to the directions thereon, and shall endorse his signature on the back of the perforated slip at the foot of the ballot-paper, and without detaching the perforated slip shall enclose the completed ballot-paper in the addressed envelope, and shall post or deliver the same so that it shall be received by the Returning Officer before Four o'clock of the afternoon of the day fixed for holding the election.

(d) Invalid Voting Papers.—If any voter fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations, or with any of the directions on the ballot-paper, his vote shall be void, and shall not be counted. Provided that the Returning Officer or his deputy may, in his discretion, accept as valid any voting paper enclosed in an envelope other than the aforesaid printed envelope. envelope.

(e) Scrutineers, &c.—Each candidate may be present, or may appoint in writing a scrutineer to be present, on the day of the election when the Returning Officer opens the envelopes

containing the voting papers.

ontaining the voting papers.

(f) Counting Votes.—The Returning Officer or his deputy, in the presence of the scrutineers (if any) and of the Registrar, or in his absence in the presence of any person appointed by the Board who may be present, shall on the day fixed for holding the election open the addressed envelopes received by him, and in respect of each ballot-paper, if the signature of the voter is on the perforated slip thereof, tear off the perforated slip, and place the ballot-paper in a ballot-box. Provided that if, the Returning Officer or his deputy deems it advisable, or if requested so to do by any scrutineer, before he tears off the perforated slip and places any ballot-paper in the ballot-box as aforesaid, he shall compare the signature on the perforated slip-of the ballot-paper with that contained in the signature book kept by the Registrar, and if satisfied the returning officer or his deputy shall reject such slip. When all the ballot-papers have been so inserted, the returning officer or his deputy shall reject such slip. When all the ballot-papers have been so inserted, the returning officer or his deputy shall open the ballot-box, and extract the voting papers therefrom, and count the votes properly given for each candidate.

If two or more candidates receive an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer or his deputy shall have a casting vote.

(g) Declaration of Poll.—As soon as is convenient after the election, the Returning Officer or his deputy shall—(a) give public notice by advertisement in The Australasian Journal of Pharmacy, or in one of the Melbourne daily newspapers, of the result of the election, and the number of votes cast for each candidate, and declare that the candidates who have received the greatest number of votes are duly elected as members of the Board to fill the vacancies, and (b) make a return to the Registrar showing in like manner the result of the election. The Registrar, on receipt of the said feturn of the Returning Officer or his deputy, shall forthwith transmit a copy thereof to the Chief Secretary.

(h) Supplementary Elections.—If any election as aforesaid

(h) Supplementary Elections .- If any election as aforesaid should fail, or partially fail, a supplementary election may be held at any time in the same manner and under the con-ditions hereinbefore provided for elections.

For the purposes of these Regulations an election shall be deemed to have wholly failed if no candidate is nominated or returned as elected, and shall be deemed to have partially failed where one or more candidates are returned as elected. but not the full number required to be elected.

B .- Practical dispensing and prescription reading.

Section III.—A. Written work,
B. Practical work.

In section 1 (b) candidates shall submit a practical note-In section 1 (b) candidates shall submit a practical note-book containing records of 70 dispensing exercises carried out by them during the period of apprenticeship. The preparations shall be selected from the list drawn up by the Board. Candidates shall attach to their note-books a declaration, in the form or to the effect of that contained in the Fourth Schedule hereto, that the experiments have been conducted by them under proper supervision. Certificate forms for this purpose are obtainable at the office of the Board.

In section 3 (b) candidates shall submit to the examiners a note-book containing a complete record of at least 40 quantitative experiments on the estimation of official substances, and at least 40 qualitative experiments on the identification recognition, and official tests of substances in the British Pharmacopocia, 1933. Certificate forms for pasting in students' note-books are obtainable at the office of the Board. The detailed subjects of the Final Qualifying Examination are set out in Appendix C of the said 1930 Regulations; and

The Registrar shall thereupon register the same by entering the name of the apprentice with such other particulars as may be required in the Register of Apprentices, and shall endorse each copy with the word "registered," and the number and date of registration, and shall sign such endorsement. The Registrar shall retain and file one copy of the indentures, and shall give or post one copy to the employer, and the other to the apprentice.

- (d) Cancellation, 'dc.—When indentures are cancelled, assigned, or extended, a signed note thereof must be endorsed on the indentures, and both copies must be produced to the Registrar within three months thereafter. The Registrar shall thereupon endorse the filed copy with particulars thereof, and note same in the register.
- (e) Dispensation.—The Board may accept for registration any indenture which is not in the prescribed form, or produced in the prescribed time; or any cancellation, assignment, or extension which does not comply with the Regulations, or has not been produced within the prescribed time.
- (f) Duty of Employer.—It shall be the duty of every pharmaceutical chemist before entering into indentures to satisfy dimself that the proposed apprentice has attained the age of sixteen years, and has passed the Preliminary Examination. It shall also be his duty to see that the indentures are duly registered, and that the Regulations are complied with if the indentures should be cancelled, assigned; or extended.

(c) Adult male Gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 1s. per day less than the basic wage.

(d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therefor in the Schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in Clause 2 hereof.

(e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed in Clause 2 hereof.

(i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.

(ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, (ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, and of junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest. penny or the nearest pound (as the case may be).
Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage.

(3) (a) The Commissioners may make emergency deductions from the rates of pay of officers and employees, the maximum of which is to be determined by applying to the rates in force on the 3rd October, 1930, the same rate of reduction as is applied by the State Financial Emergency Act or any amendment thereof to similar or substantially similar rates of officers of the Public Service, and subtracting from this result the amount of the decrease in the basic rate subsequent to that date.

(b) The rates in force on the 3rd October, 1930, shall be deemed to include such rates as modified by any subsequent variation of the margins comprised therein now or hereafter

 (a) Should any such rate be reduced by basic wage adjustment to an extent which renders the provisions of this award relating to emergency deductions inapplicable, it shall not thereafter be increased by similar adjustment above the rate payable after the maximum emergency deduction determined as prescribed herein has been made, except to the extent that any such net increase since 3rd October, 1930, may exceed such maximum deduction.

WHEREAS by section 192 of the Land Act 1928, as extended by section 22 of the Land (Residence Areas) Act 1935 (which latter Act is hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), power is given to the Governor in Council to make Rules and Regulations for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following:—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND (RESTDENCE AREAS) ACT 1935.

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CHAPTER I .- PRELIMINARY.

- 1. The provisions of the Acts Interpretation Acts shall apply to these Regulations.
- 2. The forms prescribed hereunder shall be used with such modifications as may be required.
 - 3. In these Regulations-

the words "habitable dwelling," "holder," and "residence area" shall have the respective meanings assigned to them in section 4 of the Act:

section 4 of the Act;
the word "right" shall mean a right to occupy a residence area;
the words "Land Officer" shall mean the Departmental officer
acting as Land Officer for the District within which a
residence area is situate, but for the purpose of the granting
of a right such words shall be limited to a person duly
authorized by the Governor in Council pursuant to section 6
of the Act.

CHAPTER II.—EXTENT OF RESIDENCE AREA.

- 1. The following limitations shall apply with respect to the grant of any right for an area marked out (as herein in Chapter III. provided) on or after the twentieth day of January, 1936, and applied for under section 6 of the Act:—
 - (a) In a city, town, or borough constituted under Local Government Acts, or a town or township proclaimed under Land Acts—not more than a quarter of an acre, with a maximum frontage of 66 feet to any street, road, highway, or thoroughfare.
 - (b) Outside the boundaries of any such city, town, borough, or township—not more than 1 acre, with a maximum frontage of 132 feet to any street, road, highway, or thoroughfare.

CHAPTER III.—Applications, Notification, Marking-out.

Applications for Cases Covered by Section 18.

- 1. The form of application for a person-
 - (a) who on the twentieth day of January, 1936, was, under and in accordance with the provisions of the Mines Act 1928, validly registered as the holder of any Crown land as a residence area under a miner's right;
 - (b) who is a holder in accordance with sub-section (4) of section 48 of the Act,

shall be that set out as Form A herein.

New Applicants.

- 2. Every intending applicant shall give notification, either by letter or in person, to the Land Officer of his intention to mark out a site for a residence area, with sufficient details of the position of such site.
- 3. He shall forthwith mark out the site by creeting at each angle a post at least 3 inches in diameter, and not less than 3 feet above the ground. Where it is not practicable to comply with this requirement, it shall be sufficient to drive an iron peg firmly in the ground at each angle of the site, or to indicate the boundaries by some other method previously approved by the Land Officer.
- 4. At the time of marking out such site, the intending applicant shall post in a conspicuous place upon the site a notice as in Form B herein. Such notice shall be not less in size than 8 inches by 6 inches, and be affixed to a board, or other suitably stout backing, and shall be kept posted until application has been made for a right to occupy.
- 5. Upon the expiration of the seven days referred to in such notice, an application as in Form C herein may be lodged with the Land Officer, accompanied by the occupation fee.
- 6. The Land Officer, upon being satisfied that the applicant is entitled under the Act to occupy the land described in his application, may, if he thinks fit, grant to the applicant a right to occupy such land. The right shall be as in Form D herein. The Land Officer shall notify the Secretary for Lands of the granting of any right under this clause.
- 7. The right shall commence from such date and be for such period (not exceeding one year) as may be determined by the Land Officer.

Sites Validly Registered at the Coming into Operation of the Act.

- 8. Where the Land Officer, or a District Surveyor of the Lands Department, decides that the boundaries of a site are sufficiently defined, it shall not be necessary to mark out as required for new applications.
- 9. In cases where such officer considers that the boundaries are not sufficiently defined, or that the site occupied does not comply with the area permitted to be held under the Act, he may require the applicant to mark out and occupy so much land as will not contravene the provisions of the Δct .
- 10. If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Land Officer that it is impossible or impracticable to obtain an application from a person who is registered as the holder of a residence area, such officer may accept an application for a right under this Act, or for a renewal of such right, from any person who satisfies him that such person is interested in the said area, and/or that it would be inequitable that the registration should be allowed to lapse.

CHAPTER IV.—SURVEY.

- An applicant for a residence area, or the holder of a right, may have the site surveyed.
- The fee for such survey shall be in accordance with clause 15 (e) of Chapter TV, of the Survey Regulations under the Land Act 1928.
- 3. Upon the application of a holder for the exclusive right of purchasing the land held by him as a residence area, a survey (if not already made) shall be necessary, and the boundaries of the area may then be adjusted (subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Act) to make the same straight or rectangular, or to abut on or conform to the boundaries of adjacent land which has been granted by the Crown in fee simple.
- 4. Surveys shall be carried out in conformity with the Survey Regulations under the Land Act 1928.

Chapter V.—Transfers, Encumbrances, Easements. Transfers.

- 1. Every application by a holder for permission to sell or transfer his interest in the occupation of the residence area held by him shall be in the Form E herein, and shall be accompanied by a transfer fee of Five shillings.
- 2. The right shall also be produced in order that the transfer may be recorded thereon, or surrendered so that a new right may be issued in its place.

Encumbrances.

(In the following clauses of this chapter, the word "encumbrance" shall include a lien.)

- 3. The holder of a right may encumber his interest in the occupation of his residence area.
- 4. The holder shall apply to the Land Officer for the registration of the encumbrance in the Form F herein, and shall pay a fee of Five shillings.
- 5. The right shall be produced in order that the registration of the encumbrance may be recorded thereon.
- 6. The encumbrance shall be and remain a charge upon the residence area, or the improvements thereon, until the debt or liability shall have been paid or discharged in full.
- 7. In the event of more than one encumbrance being granted, priority shall be according to the date of the respective registrations by the Land Officer.
- 8. When the sum secured under an encumbrance has been paid or discharged in full, a notification of discharge in the Form G herein shall be signed, and forthwith produced to the Land Officer for registration by him.
- 9. A transfer of a right in respect of which an encumbrance has been granted and remains undischarged shall be effected subject to all encumbrances registered with the Land Officer.

Easements.

- 10. Upon receipt of a notification from the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, or any other corporation or body acting under the authority of any Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, that an easement has been taken over land held or occupied as a residence area, the Secretary for Lands may require the holder of the right to produce such right for indorsement of the description of such easement.

REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Farmers Debts Adjustment Act in that behalf His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. In these Regulations the expression "Act" shall mean the Farmers Relief Acts, the expression "Board" shall mean the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Board, and the expression "section" shall mean section of the Farmers Debts Adjustment Act 1935.
- 2. The forms set out in the Schedule hereto and numbered 1, 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 14 respectively are the forms prescribed by these Regulations pursuant to Sections 12, 13, 17, 18, 19 and 51 respectively and these forms, together with the other forms set out in the said Schedule, and numbered 2, 4, 5, 10, 11, 12, and 13 respectively, or forms to the like effect, may be used for the purposes of the Act so far as they are respectively applicable.
- 3. The common seal of the Board shall be affixed to any document when duly authorized by the Board, and only in the presence of any member of the Board and of the Secretary thereof.
- 4. An application for debt adjustment shall be signed by a farmer and shall be lodged, in duplicate, with the Conciliation Officer whose place of business is nearest to the place of residence of such farmer. A duplicate copy of such application, together with a duplicate copy of the Stay Order issued to such farmer, shall be forthwith forwarded by registered letter by such Conciliation Officer to the Board. Annexed to such application shall be a statement containing the particulars required by Section 12 and Form I in the Schedule hereto.
- 5. Any notice required to be served upon the farmer or upon any creditor for the purposes of the Act may be served by registered letter addressed to the farmer or the creditor at the address given in the farmer's application or in the creditor's proof of debt as the case may be.
- 6. Upon receipt of a notification that a Stay Order has been issued to a farmer, every creditor shall, within fourteen days of the date of such notification, submit in the prescribed form proof of his claim against such farmer and shall upon demand by the Board supply detailed particulars of such claim and shall give every facility for verification thereof.
- 7. Notification to farmers and creditors of all meetings called pursuant to Sections 19, 27, and 30 shall be made by registered letter, and each notification shall specify the place at which the meeting shall be held and the day and hour of such meeting.
- 8. No written notification of the place, day and hour to which any meeting (except the meeting called pursuant to Section 30) held under the Act has been adjourned shall be required to be given.
- 9. Meetings called pursuant to Section 19 shall be held on a day not less than twenty-one days after the day on which the notification of such meeting is lodged in the post, provided that if the farmer and all his creditors agree in writing such meeting may be held at the place, day and hour specified in such writing.
- 10. Meetings called pursuant to Sections 27 or 30 shall be held on a day not less than seven days after the day on which the notification of such meeting is lodged in the post, provided that if the farmer and all his creditors agree in writing such meeting may be held at the place, day and hour specified in such writing.
- 11. If a creditor attends a meeting by proxy, such proxy may attend and vote at all subsequent meetings without further authority.
- 12. Minutes of every meeting held pursuant to Sections 19, 27, and 30, and any adjournment thereof, shall be made by the chairman of the meeting or some person authorized on his behalf and such minutes shall be signed by the chairman as soon as practicable after the conclusion of the meeting. A copy of such minutes, together with a report of the conduct of the meeting, shall be forwarded by the Conciliation Officer to the Board.

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- 13. In taking a vote of the creditors on a plan of debt adjustment at any meeting held under the Act, every creditor qualified to vote, present at the meeting either personally or by proxy, shall record his vote in writing.
- 14. In order that the Board may be able to indicate to a Conciliation Officer what amounts may be paid by the Board to creditors pursuant to the Act in consideration of such creditors agreeing to a plan of debt adjustment or for any other purpose under the Act, the Board shall be entitled to hold from time to time formal or informal conferences with the farmer, and/or all or any of his secured creditors and/or all or any of his unsecured creditors.
- 15. No creditor shall be entitled to receive any money from the Board or a farmer under a plan of debt adjustment unless his claim has been verified and admitted by the Board.
- 16. A copy of every plan of debt adjustment submitted to or formulated by the Board shall be retained by the Board and shall be available for inspection at the Office of the Board between the hours of 9 o'clock in the forenoon and 5 o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and between the hours of 9 o'clock in the forenoon and 12 o'clock noon on Saturdays (public holidays excepted) by creditors of farmers or solicitors of such creditors.
- 17. The Board shall keep a register containing the name and address of every farmer to whom a Stay Order has been issued.
- 18. The Board shall keep a register containing the name and address of every farmer in respect of whom a determination has been issued, the name and address of every secured creditor whose rights and remedies have been suspended under such determination, and the period during which such suspension shall operate.
- 19. The Board shall keep a register containing the name and address of every farmer to whom a certificate of exemption has been issued.
- 20. The Board shall cause true and regular accounts to be kept and shall prepare a statement of all moneys received and expended in respect of/or during each financial year, such statement to be available for audit purposes not later than three months after the close of the financial year.
- 21. If a Conciliation Officer gives a written consent to a farmer to dispose of or encumber property, he shall forthwith forward a copy of such consent to the Board.
- 22. The statement to be furnished by the farmer pursuant to Section 35 shall be verified by statutory declaration.
- 23. A Conciliation Officer shall, if he resigns from his office or if he is removed from such office, forthwith forward to the Board all papers, letters and documents of every description held by him as such Conciliation Officer. A Conciliation Officer, when requested by the Board, shall forward to the Board any specific paper, letter, document or file of papers held by him as Conciliation Officer.
- 24. A Conciliation Officer shall be entitled to receive fees in accordance with the following scale:—

The allowance for each meal and bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate. An allowance for lodging shall not be granted unless a Conciliation Officer is necessarily absent from his headquarters over night. An allowance for breakfast, lunch or tea shall not be granted unless such officer commences travelling earlier than or is absent later than the time or times respectively prescribed hereunder:—

- 27. A valuator shall be entitled to receive a minimum fee of £1 per valuation and a maximum fee of £10 per valuation, as certified to by the Board, provided that in special cases the Board may pay such higher fee as may be agreed upon by the valuator and the Board.
- 28. The fee to be paid to persons other than Conciliation Officers for making a report for the purposes of the Act shall be £1 for every such report, in addition to any travelling expenses approved by the Board in accordance with the scale set out in regulations Nos. 25 and 26 above.

BY-LAW NO. 228, TO AMEND AND ADD TO BY-LAW NO. 188, RELATING TO THE LICENSING AND REGULATING OF MOTOR CARS USED AS HACKNEY CARRIAGES AND THE OWNERS AND Drivers Thereof.

CARS USED AS HACKNEY CARRIAGES AND THE OWNERS AND DRIVERS THEREOF.

NOTICE is hereby given that at meetings of the Council of November. 1935, and on the twentieth day of January, 1936. a By-law intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part I. of the Carriages 1ct 1928, and numbered 228. to amend or add to the provisions of By-law number 188 of the said City." was made and passed by the said Council, and that a copy of the said By-law is open for inspection, free of charge, at the Town Clerk's office. Town Hall, Melbourne, during office hours.

The By-law, which is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 188, and which repeals By-law No. 216, provides that the number of motor taxi-cabs plying for hire within the City of Melbourne and the vicinity within the distance of eight miles from the corporate limits of the said city shall be limited to five hundred and fifty (in lieu of six hundred and thirty, as at present), provided, however, that the licence in respect of any motor taxi-cab licensed at the date of By-law No. 228 coming into operation may from time to time be renewed notwithstanding that by reason of any such renewal the number of motor taxi-cabs licensed by the said Council may be made to exceed five hundred and fifty.

The By-law also amends By-law No. 188 as amended by By-law No. 226 by providing for a charge of Threepence (in lieu of Fourpence as at present) detention for each five minutes or part thereof, and a charge of Threepence (in lieu of Fourpence as at present) seeds additional one-third of a mile or any part thereof beyond the flag-fall charge of 1s. 6d. for the first one-third of a mile.

The schedule to the By-law sets out additional provisions regarding the construction, &c., of every motor taxi-cab which must be compiled with on and after the first day of January, 1937, as a condition of licensing by the said Council.

The amending By-law also provides that, notwithstanding compliance with the above-mentioned additional special provisions, no licence shall be gran

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

(GENERAL FURNITURE SECTION.)

Note.—This Determination on the 23rd January, 1936, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board which has the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to:—

- (1) Any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in repairing any new or second-hand article of furniture, usually made or partly prepared by cabinetmakers, chair and couch makers, upholsterers, wood carvers, frenchpolishers, and wood turners;
- (2) Any person or persons or classes of persons employed in-
 - (a) fixing or repairing new or second-hand furniture or seating in buildings; or (b) french, wax, or lacquer polishing new or second-hand furniture or fittings in or in connexion with buildings,
- (3) Any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the trade of designing, making, painting, or decorating-
- (a) furnishing accessories or novelties, wholly or partly made of wood, such as nut bowls, smokers' or ornamental
 - stands, or fancy boxes;
 (b) domestic woodware, such as bread boards or salt boxes;
 - (c) walking sticks;
- (4) Any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing furniture timbers out to size, veneers, veneered panels, plywood or coreboard, but not including persons subject to the Determination of any other Wages Board heretofore appointed.

(4) PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.—The wages rates set out in clause (3) are based upon the following basic wage rates for adult males and minimum rates for adult females, and, pursuant to the provisions of Section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount and at the same time as such basic wage rates and minimum rates.

The basic wage rates and minimum rates shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (5).

⁽⁵⁾ ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE FOR ADULT MALES AND MINIMUM RATE FOR ADULT FEMALES.—(a) For work done before the beginning of the first pay period to commence in June, 1936, the amounts of the basic wage and the minimum for females prescribed in clause (4) shall be paid.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's Retail Price Index Numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such Index Numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

- 1. Adjustment is to be based upon the equating of Index Number 1,000 with a wage of 81s., the amount assessed upon that number of the declared ordinary basic wage per week of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration.
 - 2. The Index Number set to be applied to a place is that assigned thereto in clause (4).
- 3. The Index Number for the calendar half year next preceding the period of six months for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- 4. The amount assigned in the following table (or any extension thereof) to the Index Number Division comprising that Number is to be ascertained.
 - 5. The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such period of six months.

Provided, however, that if that assigned amount be different by less than 2s. from the last current amount of the basic wage then that last current amount shall continue unchanged during such period.

⁽b) For work done during each future period of six months beginning with the first pay period to commence in a June, or a December, the amounts of the basic wage and minimum for females shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" Retail Price Index Numbers.

The Index Number Divisions in this table are based upon the equating of the Index Number 1,000 with a basic wage of 81s. per week, and any extension of the table must be similarly constituted. Any necessary extension may be made by reference to the table of wages with 1s. divisions authorized by the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration.

(c) The amounts of the weekly rates for Apprentices and Improvers shall be adjusted proportionately to the rate of £3 6s. calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding three

(d) The rates for piece-workers shall be increased or decreased in the same proportion as the rate for the journeymen or journeywomen in the respective classes.

(6) DEFINITIONS.—A chairmaker is an employee who makes any class of chairs other than those in which the woodwork is wholly prepared by machines and set up by assemblers.

A stuffover chair and couch frame maker is a person who makes frames on which the upholsterers cover all the woodwork except the legs or feet and of which the woodwork is prepared by machines.

An assembler (provided that not more than 15 per cent. of his time is occupied in trimming straight square edges or making minor adjustments) is a worker employed in fitting together by nailing, sorewing, gluing, or fixing in any manner machine jointed, moulded, or finished parts of wooden furniture.

A varnisher is a person employed solely coating with a brush or dipping parts of or completed articles of furniture of any class covered by this Determination with any oil or spirit varnish, lacquer, or substitute for such oil or spirit varnish or lacquer.

(7) ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.—The number of hours to constitute a week's work shall be aslfollows:—

44 hours To be worked between the times of beginning and 44 hours To be worked between the times of beginning and Males Times of ending. Times of beginning. 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays. 7.30 a.m. .. 12 noon Saturdays. 7.30 a.m.

(8) OVERTIME.—All time worked before or after the usual times of beginning and ending work, or in excess of eight and three quarter hours per day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter provided that all time worked between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7.30 a.m. shall be paid for at double time.

All work done outside the times of beginning and ending work on any holiday specified in clause (17) shall be paid for at the rate of double ordinary time.

No person under the age of seventeen years shall be permitted to work more than four hours overtime in any week.

- (9) Tea Money.—All employees required to work beyond the usual time of ending work shall be allowed 2s. tea money in addition to overtime rates as prescribed for in this Determination when the usual time of ending work is exceeded by two hours.
- (10) Terms of Engagement.—Except as herein in this Determination provided, all employees shall be employed by the week. Employees to become entitled to the weekly wage prescribed by this Determination must be available and ready and willing to perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employees affected. Where the majority of the employees of any establishment or of any department of such establishment agree to work part time for any period or to close down for any period on days other than the prescribed holidays, the provisions of the weekly wage shall not apply to any employee of such establishment or department during such periods.

Employment for the first two weeks of service at any time shall be from hour to hour at the weekly rate fixed.

(11) TERMINATING EMPLOYMENT.—Employment to be terminated only by a week's notice on either side, and such notice may be given at any time during the week. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct, or to deduct payment for any time the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike, or through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

An employer shall not terminate the employment of an employee for the purpose of evading payment for the holidays prescribed by this Determination.

Where an employee is dismissed within seven days prior to any such holiday the re-engagement of such employee within seven after such holiday shall be prima facie evidence that the employment was terminated for the purpose of evading payment for such

Where the employer terminates the employment within one week of a day on which a holiday occurs, the employee shall be paid for such holiday or holidays prescribed by this Determination, provided that such employee had been employed by the employer for a period of at least one week prior to the termination of the employment.

Should an employee be dismissed during the course of a week, any wages due to him or her shall be paid to him or her forthwith, or shall be posted to him or her within 24 hours.

(12) Special Rates for Sundays and Holidays.—Any employee who is employed on any holiday specified in clause (17) shall be paid for at the rate of the ordinary time in addition to the usual rate.

All work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

- (13) MIDDAY MEAL.—An interval of not less than 30 minutes shall be allowed for the midday meal between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.
- (14) Rest Perion.—When any spell of duty is for more than four hours, an interval of ten minutes, to be selected by the employer, shall be allowed in the third hour to females for refreshment. The interval shall be as part of the time of duty, without deduction of time-work pay. During such rest period the employees may leave their seats, but not the premises.

- (15) MATERIALS TO BE PROVIDED.—Any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in preparing any new or second hand article of furniture shall be paid 6d. per hour in addition to the lowest rate fixed by this Determination, unless the following are provided by the employer if required in the performance of the work:—Benches, wood or iron clamps over 2 ft. 6 in., hand screws (in excess of four), glue pots, and glue brushes and varnish brushes. Any employee engaged at frenchpolishing shall be supplied with all materials, including rags, brushes, and kit-box.
- (16) ALLOWANCES FOR TRAVELLING TIME AND BOARD.—All time reasonably occupied by an employee in travelling to or from work outside the factory and outside ordinary hours and in travelling to and from work in a country district if engaged in the metropolitan district for employment in a country district shall be treated as time of duty and paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight hours for the journey, except on Sundays, when time and a half rates shall be paid up to a maximum of eight hours for the journey. Provided that, where an employee proceeds direct from his or her home to a job outside the factory, he or she shall be paid for all time reasonably occupied in travelling to the job in excess of the time usually taken to go from his or her home to the factory.

All fares and reasonable travelling expenses incurred by an employee in such travelling, including the cost (if any) incurred for meals—together with the reasonable cost of board and lodging if the employee has to be away from his or her home for a night—shall be paid to the employee.

The fares allowed shall be first class where the employee has to travel all night in connexion with his or her employer's business, and in other cases the fares shall be second class.

The foregoing travelling and accommodation allowances shall be paid additional to the usual rates for the time employees are working.

When it is more convenient for the employee to go direct to the job from his or her home, he or she shall do so, and start and sease work at the usual times customary at the factory, provided that any extra expense incurred by him or her in travelling shall be borne by the employer.

- (17) HOLIDAYS.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
- All employees working on piece-work or task-work shall be granted the same holidays as are granted to weekly wage workers, and they shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be paid for such holidays the amount for each holiday based on the minimum weekly wage as set out in this Determination for the class of work performed.
- If any of the above holidays occur on a Sunday or Saturday and are not observed on any other day, then employees shall not be paid for such Sunday, and shall be paid for such Saturday as for a half-day, but not otherwise.
- . All other weekly employees shall be paid for the above holidays an amount for each holiday based on the actual weekly wage paid to them by the employer.

Any employee absenting himself or herself from work on any portion of the working day preceding a holiday provided for herein other than Boxing Day and New Year's Day without permission from the employer or without having reasonable cause for having absented himself or herself from work shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(18) Sickness, Accidents.—Any employee not attending duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time of non-attendance unless he or she produces or forwards within 24 hours of the beginning of his or her absence evidence satisfactory to the management that his or her non-attendance was due to personal accident arising out of or in the course of his or her employment or to personal ill health sufficient to incapacitate him or her for his or her usual work.

An employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of accident or ill health for more than six days in sach year.

For the purpose of this clause a year shall mean a period of twelve months commencing on the 17th day of August in each year,

(19) PAY DAY.—All employees shall be paid weekly on any other day than Saturday.

No employer shall hold more than two days' pay in band.

- ... Any employee kept waiting for his or, her pay on pay day for more than a quarter of an hour after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid overtime rates after that quarter of an hour and as for a quarter of an hour at least.
- (20) PIECE-WORK.—The employer may fix his own piece-work prices or task rates, provided such prices or rates enable an employee of average capacity working under like conditions to earn at least 10 per cent. more than the minimum weekly wage prescribed for the class of work performed. The same piece-work prices shall be paid to all piece-workers doing the same operation in the factory, whether they be apprentices or improvers on piece-work, or otherwise.

All piece-workers who are available and ready and willing to work during the ordinary working hours shall be paid in each week, in the case of males not less than 66s., and in the case of females not less than 44s.

When it is more convenient for the employee to go direct to the job from his or her home he or she shall do so, and start and cease work at the usual times customary at the factory, provided that any extra expense incurred by him or her in travelling shall be borne by the employer.

(16) HOLIDAYS.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay:—The days observed aw Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday,

as New Year's Day, Australia Day (20th January), Good Filday, Easter monday, Labour Day, Alizac Day, Aligs Dictions, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

All employees working on piece-work or task-work shall be granted the same holidays as are granted to weekly wage workers, and they shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be paid for such holidays the amount for each holiday based on the minimum weekly wage as set out in this Determination for the class of work performed.

If any of the above holidays occur on a Sunday or Saturday and are not observed on any other day, then employees shall not be paid for such Sunday, and shall be paid for such Saturday as for a half day, but not otherwise.

All other weekly employees shall be paid for the above holidays an amount for each holiday based on the actual weekly wage paid

to them by the employer.

Any employee absenting himself or herself from work on any portion of the working day preceding a holiday provided for herein other than Boxing Day and New Year's Day without permission from the employer or without having reasonable cause for having absented himself or herself from work shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(17) SICKMESS, ACCIDENTS.—Any employee not attending duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time of non-attendance unless he or she produces or forwards within 24 hours of the beginning of his or her absence evidence satisfactory to the management that his for her non-attendance was due to personal accident arising out of or in the course of his or her employment or to personal ill-health sufficient to incapacitate him or her for his or her usual work.

An employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of accident or ill-health for more than six days in each vert

For the purpose of this clause a year shall mean a period of twelve months commencing on the 17th day of August in each year.

(18) PAY DAY.—All employees shall be paid weekly on any other day than Saturday.

No employer shall hold more than two days pay in hand.

Any employee kept waiting for his or her pay on pay day for more than a quarter of an hour after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid overtime rates after that quarter of an hour and as for a quarter of an hour at least.

(19) Pizoz-work.—The employer may fix his own piece-work prices or task rates, provided such prices or rates enable an employee of average capacity working under like conditions to earn at least 10 per cent. more than the minimum weekly wage prescribed for the class of work performed. The same piece-work prices shall be paid to all piece-workers doing the same operation in the factory whether they be apprentices or improvers on piece-work, or otherwise.

All piece-workers who are available and ready and willing to work during the ordinary working hours shall be paid in each week, in the case of males not less than 66s., and in the case of females not less than 44s.

(7) OVERTIME.—All time worked before or after the usual times of beginning and ending work, or in excess of eight and three quarter hours per day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter provided that all time worked between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7.30 a.m. shall be paid for at double time.

All work done outside the times of beginning and ending work on any holiday specified in clause (16) shall be paid for at the rate of double ordinary time.

- (d) The rates for piece-workers shall be increased or decreased in the same proportion as the rate for the journeymen or journeywomen in the respective classes.
- (6) Definitions.—An assembler (provided that not more than 15 per cent. of his time is occupied in trimming straight square-edges or making minor adjustments) is a worker employed in fitting together by nailing, sorewing, glueing, or fixing in any manner machine jointed, moulded, or finished parts of wooden furniture.

A varnisher is a person employed solely coating with a brush or dipping parts of or completed articles of furniture of any class covered by this Determination with any oil or spirit varnish, lacquer, or substitute for such oil or spirit varnish or lacquer.

(7) ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.—The number of hours to constitute a week's work shall be as follows:—

- (8) OVERTIME.—All time worked before or after the usual times of beginning and ending work, or in excess of eight and three-quarter-hours per day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four hours and double time thereafter, provided that all time worked between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7.30 a.m. shall be paid for at double time.
- All work done outside the times of beginning and ending work on any holiday specified in clause (17) shall be paid for at the rate of double ordinary time.
 - No person under the age of seventeen years shall be permitted to work more than four hours overtime in any week.
- (9) TEA MONEY.—All employees required to work beyond the usual time of ending work shall be allowed 2s. tea money in addition to overtime rates as prescribed for in this Determination when the usual time of ending work is exceeded by two hours.

(10) Terms of Engagement.—Except as herein in this Determination provided, all employees shall be employed by the week. Employees to become entitled to the weekly wage prescribed by this Determination must be available and ready and willing to perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employee affected. Where the majority of the employees of any establishment or of any department of such establishment agree to work part time for any period or to close down for any period on days other than the prescribed holidays, the provisions of the weekly wage shall not apply to any employee of such establishment or department during such periods.

Employment for the first two weeks of service at any time shall be from hour to hour at the weekly rate fixed.

(11) TERMINATING EMPLOYMENT.—Employment to be terminated only by a week's notice on either side, and such notice may be given at any time during the week. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct, or to deduct payment for any time the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike, or through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

An employer shall not terminate the employment of an employee for the purpose of evading payment for the holidays prescribed by this Determination.

Where an employee is dismissed within seven days prior to any such holiday the re-engagement of such employee within seven days after such holiday shall be prima facie evidence that the employment was terminated for the purpose of evading payment for such holiday.

Where the employer terminates the employment within one week of a day on which a holiday occurs, the employee shall be paid for such holiday or holidays prescribed by this Determination, provided that such employee had been employed by the employer for a period of at least one week prior to the termination of the employment.

Should an employee be dismissed during the course of a week any wages due to him or her shall be paid to him or her forthwith or shall be posted to him or her within 24 hours.

- (12) Special Rates for Sundays and Holidays.—Any employee who is employed on any holiday specified in clause (17) shall be paid for at the rate of the ordinary time in addition to the usual rate.
 - All work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (13) MIDDAY MEAL.—An interval of not less than 30 minutes shall be allowed for the midday meal between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.
- (14) REST PERIOD.—When any spell of duty is for more than four hours, an interval of ten minutes, to be selected by the employer, shall be allowed in the third hour to females for refreshment. The interval shall be as part of the time of duty, without deduction of time-work pay. During such rest period the employees may leave their seats, but not the premises.
- (15) MATERIALS TO BE PROVIDED.—Any person employed in wholly or partiy preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in preparing any new or second-hand article of furniture shall be paid 6d. per hour in addition to the lowest rate fixed by this Determination, unless the following are provided by the employer if required in the performance of the work:—Benches, wood or iron clamps over 2 ft. 6 in., hand scrows (in excess of four), glue pots, and glue brushes and varnish-brushes.

 Any employee engaged at frenchpolishing shall be supplied with all materials, including rags, brushes, and kit-box.
- (16) Allowances for Travelling Time and Board.—All time reasonably occupied by an employee in travelling to or from work outside the factory and outside ordinary hours, and in travelling to and from work in a country district if engaged in the Metropolitan district for employment in a country district, shall be treated as time of duty and paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight hours for the journey, except on Sundays, when time and a half rates shall be paid up to a maximum of eight hours for the journey. Provided that, where an employee proceeds direct from his or her home to a job outside the factory, he or she shall be paid for all time reasonably occupied in travelling to the job in excess of the time usually taken to go from his or her home to the factory.
- All fares and reasonable travelling expenses incurred by an employee in such travelling, including the cost, if any, incurred for meals, together with the reasonable cost of board and lodging if the employee has to be away from his or her home for a night, shall be paid to the employee.

The fares allowed shall be first class where the employee has to travel all night in connexion with his or her employer's business, and in other cases the fares shall be second class

The foregoing travelling and accommodation allowances shall be paid additional to the usual rates for the time employees are working.

When it is more convenient for the employee to go direct to the job from his or her home he or she shall do so, and start and work at the usual times customary at the factory, provided that any extra expense incurred by him or her in travelling shall be borne by the employer.

(17) HOLIDAYS.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay: —The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

All employees working on piece-work or task-work shall be granted the same holidays as are granted to weekly wage workers, and they shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be paid for such holidays the amount for each holiday based on the minimum weekly wage as set out in this Determination for the class of work performed.

If any of the above holidays occur on a Sunday or Saturday and are not observed on any other day, then employees shall not be paid for such Sunday, and shall be paid for such Saturday as for a half day, but not otherwise.

All other weekly employees shall be paid for the above holidays an amount for each holiday based on the actual weekly wage paid to them by the employer.

Any employee absenting himself or herself from work on any portion of the working day preceding a holiday provided for herein other than Boxing Day and New Year's Day without permission from the employer, or without having reasonable cause for having absented himself or herself from work, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(18) SIGNMESS, ACCIDENTS.—Any employee not attending duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time of non-attendance unless he or she produces or forwards within 24 hours of the beginning of his or her absence evidence satisfactory to the management that his or her non-attendance was due to personal accident arising out of or in the course of his or her employment or to personal ill-health sufficient to incapacitate him or her for his or her usual work.

An employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of accident or ill-health for more than six days in each year.

For the purpose of this clause a year shall mean a period of twelve months, commencing on the 17th day of August in each year.

(19) PAY DAY .--All employees shall be paid weekly on any other day than Saturday.

No employer shall hold more than two days' pay in hand.

Any employee kept waiting for his or her pay on pay day for more than a quarter of an hour after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid overtime rates after that quarter of an hour and as for a quarter of an hour at least.

(20) PIECE-WORK.—The employer may fix his own piece-work prices or task rates, provided such prices or rates enable an employee of average capacity working under like conditions to earn at least 10 per cent. more than the minimum weekly wage prescribed for the class of work performed. The same piece-work prices shall be paid to all piece-workers doing the same operation in the factory whether they be apprentices or improvers on piece-work, or otherwise.

All piece-workers who are available and ready and willing to work during the ordinary working hours shall be paid in each week, in the case of males not less than 66; and in the case of females not less than 44s.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

(WIRE MATTRESS SECTION.)

Note.-This Determination on the 23rd January, 1936, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board, which has the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the manufacturing of wire-mattresses has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 23rd January, 1936, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (5) ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE FOR ADULT MALES AND MINIMUM RATE FOR ADULT FEMALES.—(a) For work done before the beginning of the first pay period to commence in June, 1936, the amounts of the basic wage and the minimum for females prescribed in clause (4) shall be paid.
- (b) For work done during each future period of six months beginning with the first pay period to commence in a June, or a December, the amounts of the basic wage and minimum for females shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" Retail Price Index Numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's Retail Price Index Numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such Index Numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

- (1) Adjustment is to be based upon the equating of Index Number 1,000 with a wage of 81s., the amount assessed upon that number of the declared ordinary basic wage per week of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration.
 - (2) The Index Number set to be applied to a place is that assigned thereto in clause (4).
- (3) The Index Number for the calendar half year next preceding the period of six months for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (4) The amount assigned in the following table (or any extension thereof) to the Index Number Division comprising that Number is to be ascertained.
 - (5) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such period of six months.

Provided, however, that if that assigned amount be different by less than 2s. from the last current amount of the basic wage, then that last current amount shall continue unchanged during such period.

- All fares and reasonable travelling expenses incurred by an employee in such travelling, including the cost, if any, incurred for meals—together with the reasonable cost of board and lodging if the employee has to be away from his home for a night—shall be paid to the employee.

The fares allowed shall be first class where the employee has to travel all night in connexion with his employer's business and in other cases the fares shall be second class.

The foregoing travelling and accommodation allowances shall be paid additional to the usual rates for the time employees are working.

(16) Sickness, Accidents.—Any employee not attending duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of non-attendance unless the produces or forwards within 24 hours of the beginning of his absence evidence satisfactory to the management that his non-attendance was due to personal accident arising out of or in the course of his employment or to personal ill health sufficient to incapacitate him for his usual work.

An employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of accident or ill health for more than six days in each year.

For the purpose of this clause a year shall mean a period of twelve months commencing on the 17th day of August in each year.

(17) PAY DAY.—All employees shall be paid weekly on any other day than Saturday.

No employer shall hold more than two days pay in hand.

Any employee kept waiting for his pay on pay day for more than a quarter of an hour after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid overtime rates after that quarter of an hour and as for a quarter of an hour at least.

(18) PIECE-WORK.—The employer may fix his own piece-work prices or task rates, provided such prices or rates enable an employee of average capacity working under like conditions to earn at least 10 per cent. more than the minimum weekly wage prescribed for the class of work performed. The same piece-work prices shall be paid to all piece-workers doing the same operation in the factory, whether they be apprentices or improvers on piece-work, or otherwise.

All piece-workers who are available and ready and willing to work during the ordinary working hours shall be paid in each week.
