**AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.; &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*; but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia; by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

**GOBUR COMMON ABOLISHED.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the—

*Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 3797).*

**PROHIBITION OF THE BRINGING OF POTATOES FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF VICTORIA INTO OTHER PORTIONS OF VICTORIA.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928* it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* may either absolutely or subject to any regulations prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in

Council likely to spread any disease in Victoria: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that disease means any disease affecting trees, plants, or vegetables and which the Governor in Council from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declares to be a disease: And whereas by a Proclamation made by the Governor in Council on the thirtieth day of October, 1916, Corky or Powdery Scab of Potato (*Spongospora subterranea*) was declared to be a disease within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas the said disease is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread in Victoria if any potatoes are brought into that portion of Victoria not described in the schedule to this Proclamation from those portions of Victoria set out and described in the said schedule: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof; do by this my Proclamation prohibit, subject to the regulations made on the 28th day of October, 1936, any person from bringing any potatoes into that portion of Victoria not described in the schedule abovementioned from those portions of Victoria set out and described in such schedule.

## THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

3. Regulation 168, section IV., paragraph (4), of the Principal Regulations is repealed and the following paragraph substituted in lieu thereof:—

The master of every vessel having on board inflammable liquid in quantity exceeding 400 gallons shall, on nearing the harbor, and during the time that such vessel remains in the harbor, display—

- (a) by day a red flag not less than 3 feet square with a white circular centre 6 inches in diameter, and by night a red light, at the masthead or where it can be best seen, but not less than 20 feet above the deck, in addition to any navigation flags or lights which may be required by any other regulations: Provided that, if such vessel is a self-propelled vessel which cannot normally comply with this Regulation, the master or owner of such vessel shall display by day in a conspicuous position above the deck a red flag of metal not less than 18 inches square with a white circular centre 6 inches in diameter, and by night an all round red light.

- (b) When such vessel is berthed at any wharf or landing place, a notice-board shall be exhibited at the forward side of gangway with the words "DANGER—NO SMOKING" in conspicuous lettering not less than 6 inches in size, and by night display a red light at the after side of the gangway, and a white light at the forward side over the said notice-board.

4. Regulation 300A of the Principal Regulations is amended by repealing sub-paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (3) and substituting in lieu thereof the following sub-paragraph:—

- (ii) for each additional hour or part thereof during which the vehicle shall be or remain upon the wharf the sum of . . . . . 1s.

## CITY OF BRIGHTON.

## By-LAW No. 95.

A By-law of the City of Brighton made under sections 767 and 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and numbered 95 for imposing, collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon land purchased or rented or otherwise provided by the Council of the Municipality of Brighton, or has been granted or given by any person for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation, and also for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or places, being the land, grounds or places hereinafter mentioned in clause 1 hereof, including any building used in connexion with the said land, and preventing damage to such building or to the furniture or fittings thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

1. In this By-law "Park," wherever used in this By-law, shall mean and include the land, grounds or places set apart or reserved as and for a golf course or golf links situate between Dendy-street and South-road, Brighton East, in the said City of Brighton.

2. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, or as the Council shall from time to time direct.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Park, or any part thereof, or in any building used in connexion with the Park at any time at which the Park is not open to the public.

4. No person shall enter or remain in the Park, or any part thereof, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

5. No person shall climb upon or get over, injure, cut down, destroy, damage, or in any way interfere with the fences in or around the Park, or any part thereof, or in any manner disturb, damage or destroy any property, chattels, effects or things in the Park, or any part thereof.

6. No person shall damage in any way any wall or fence in or enclosing the Park, or any part thereof, or any building, barrier, railing, seat, notice board, or any tree, plant, shrub or flower, or any improvement in the Park, or any part thereof, or kindle or make any fire in the Park, or any part thereof.

7. No person shall throw or deposit any filth, litter, rubbish or refuse whatever, or cause any filth, litter, rubbish or refuse whatever to fall or to be thrown, or deposited upon the Park, or any part thereof.

8. No unauthorized person shall at any time in the Park—

- (a) enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or plants; or
- (b) remove or disturb any soil or flower bed or tree, or plant; or
- (c) walk or run over, or stand or lie upon any flower bed or tree, or plant, or any ground in the course of preparation or cultivation; or
- (d) pluck any bud, blossom, flower or leaf of any tree or plant; or
- (e) turn on water or interfere with the water supply; or
- (f) interfere in any way with any birds.

9. No person shall put in the Park, or any part thereof, any horse, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals, and no person shall bring into the Park any conveyance or vehicle except into such portion of the Park as shall be prescribed or set apart by the Council. Any cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animals found in the Park, without the permission of the Council, in writing, first obtained, may be seized and impounded by any authorized person or employee of the Council, who may place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and the owner of such cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animals, or any persons having the care and/or control of any such cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

10. No person shall camp in the Park, nor erect in the Park any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure.

11. No person shall in the Park, or any part thereof, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, hawk, sell, offer or expose for sale, or let to hire, or offer or expose for letting to hire, any commodity or article.

12. No person shall bring into the Park, or any part thereof, or into any building used in connexion with the Park, any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

13. No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath in the Park, or upon the wall or fence in or enclosing the Park, or to or upon any tree, building, railing, seat, structure or erection in the Park.

14. No person shall throw or discharge in the Park any missile, to the damage, danger, or annoyance of any person, but this clause shall not apply to the driving or hitting of a golf ball by any person while in the act of playing or practising golf upon the said Park.

15. No person shall throw, distribute, deposit, or cause to be thrown, distributed, or deposited in or upon the Park, or any part thereof, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, any hand-bill or other printed matter.

16. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Park, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, any fermented or spiritous liquor.

17. No person or persons shall assemble in the Park, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, for fêtes, picnics or concerts; or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the authority of the Council in writing first obtained.

18. No person shall play any musical instrument, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, without the authority of the Council in writing first obtained.

19. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Park, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, and any person found betting therein shall be liable to expulsion therefrom.

20. No person shall carry on the trade, business or calling of a bookmaker in the Park, or in any building used in connexion with the Park.

21. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Park, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, and any person found in the Park, or in any such building, in a state of intoxication shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom.

22. No person shall dig or remove from the Park any soil, sand or other material.

23. No person shall play or practise cricket or football, or any other game, or engage in any sport in the Park, save and except the playing of golf in the Park.

24. No person shall in the Park, or any part thereof, or in any building used in connexion with the Park, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Park, or any such building, or wilfully obstruct, disturb or interrupt any servant of, or person acting under authority of the Council, in the proper execution of his duty or work in the Park, or in any such building.

25. No person shall damage any furniture or fittings in or upon any building used in connexion with the Park.

26. The following charges or entrance fees are hereby imposed which may be collected and received for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon any such grounds or places:—

For each person per one round of the Golf Course <i>s. d.</i>	
on week days other than on Sundays, Saturdays,	
or public holidays	1 0
For each person per one round of the Golf Course

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the municipal district, that is to say: The land, grounds or places set apart or reserved as and for a golf course or golf links situate between Dendy-street and South-road, Brighton East.

## HENLEY-ON-YARRA.

## Notice to Boatmen and Others.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 28th November, 1936, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have an improved chemical fire extinguisher and a supply of dry sand, with shovel or scoop, also carry a bucket with rope attached for fire extinguishing purposes. No inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed on the boat.

**All non-competing boats must be kept off the course during the racing programme.**

No boats (except racing boats) will be allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Passengers on any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark.

No boat deemed by the River Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

**The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.**

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No advertisement or objectionable device will be permitted to be shown on any boat.

No fireworks or firearms will be allowed to be discharged from any boat, except where permission of the River Officer or his Deputy has been given.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the River Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

All motor boats on south bank must moor bow up stream, and all motor boats on north bank must moor bow down stream.

An applicant for permit must apply at the office of the River Officer, 110 Spencer-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet over all, unless the River Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

A permit shall not be transferable by the holder or in respect of motor boats.

A limited number of moorings will be available along the Henley Reserve, and early application to the River Officer for same is invited. An applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Acceptance of a permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

**Mooring or holding on to the booms or buoys will be strictly forbidden.**

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats and canoes shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

MAFFRA-SALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.—DISTRICT EXTENDED.—PORTION EXCISED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928* and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

1. That the Maffra-Sale Irrigation and Water Supply District be extended by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the First Schedule hereto, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1936, such district shall be deemed to be so extended.

2. That there shall be excised from the Maffra-Sale Irrigation and Water Supply District that portion of the same set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto, which portion, as on and from the 1st day of July, 1936, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Resolution for Declaration of a Deviation under the Country

REGULATIONS RELATING TO PLUMBERS AND  
GASFITTERS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Plumbers and Gasfitters Regulations 1936," shall apply to all cities and towns, and to all areas and districts under the control of any sewerage authority, and to any other part of Victoria to which the provisions of section 2 (6) of the *Health Act* 1935 are extended by Order of the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*, shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and are divided into parts as follows:—

- Part I.—Introductory.
- Part II.—Constitution of Board and appointment and duties of the Registrar.
- Part III.—Training.
- Part IV.—Examination.
- Part V.—Registration.
- Part VI.—Fees.
- Part VII.—Penalties.
- Part VIII.—Schedules.

## PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

2. All Regulations heretofore made relating to matters herein provided are hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not affect any liability incurred, or any right accrued, or any matter or thing done under the said repealed Regulations.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Apprentice" means any person bound by indenture of apprenticeship under the provisions of the *Apprenticeship Act* 1928, or the *Factories and Shops Act* 1928, or any amendment thereof, to an employer carrying on the trade or occupation of plumber and gasfitter, or either of them.

"Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria as defined in the *Apprenticeship Act* 1928.

"Board" means the Plumbers and Gasfitters Board constituted under the provisions of section 2, *Health Act* 1935.

"Commission" means the Commission of Public Health constituted under the *Health Act* 1928.

"Gasfitting" means work in connexion with the installation of pipes, fittings, or apparatus in or on premises for lighting, cooking, domestic hot-water supply, heating, industrial uses, or motive power by means of coal gas, air gas, oil gas, or similar agencies; and "gasfitter" has a corresponding interpretation.

"Improver" means any person who is not an apprentice, but who is employed as an improver in the trade or occupation of plumbing and gasfitting, or either of them, in accordance with the provisions of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928*, or of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*, or any amendment thereof.

"Minister" means the Minister of Public Health.

"National Gas Association" means the National Gas Association of Australia (Victorian Branch), previously known as the Gas Companies Association of Australia (Victorian Section).

"Plumber" means a person engaging in or undertaking plumbing work.

"Plumbing work" means plumbing work of any prescribed class or classes.

"Plumber, Class I," means a person competent to do or undertake gasfitting and all classes of plumbing work.

"Plumber, Class II," means a person competent to do or undertake plumbing, Class II. only.

"Plumber, Class III," means a person competent to do or undertake plumbing, Class III. only.

"Plumbing, Class I," means all classes of plumbing and gasfitting work.

"Plumbing, Class II," means that class of plumbing work carried out under the By-laws and Regulations of any sewerage authority, and in connexion with any septic tank or other similar installation in a sewerage district.

"Plumbing, Class III," means that class of plumbing work in connexion with the provision of water supply, the covering of roofs, the fixing of roof gutters, of flashing and of rain-water piping, the installation of domestic hot-water supplies, of heating and ventilation, and of septic tank or similar systems other than in a sewerage district.

"Sewerage authority" means any sewerage authority within the meaning of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust.

"Sanitary Plumbers Examination Board of Victoria" means the examining Board established by agreement between the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust, and the several sewerage authorities, constituted under the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*.

"Water Supply Authority" has the like meaning as the expression "Waterworks Authority" has in section 3 of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, and (subject to the provisions of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts) includes the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

#### PART II.—CONSTITUTION OF THE BOARD AND APPOINTMENT AND DUTIES OF THE REGISTRAR.

4. (1) The Plumbers and Gasfitters Board, provided for by section 2 (1) (d) *Health Act 1935*, shall be appointed by the Minister.

(2) The members of the Board shall be nominated as hereunder prescribed:—

(a) The members representing the bodies respectively known as the Master Plumbers Association, Plumbers and Gasfitters Union, and the National Gas Association shall be elected for nomination by the respective bodies in such manner as each body deems fit.

(b) Of the two members appointed as representing sewerage authorities one shall be nominated by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works and one shall be elected for nomination by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust and the several sewerage authorities constituted under the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928* in such manner as may be agreed upon by a majority of these bodies.

(c) The member representing the Department of Public Health shall be nominated by the Chief Health Officer.

(d) The member representing the technical schools shall be nominated by the Director of Education.

(3) (a) The names of the persons nominated shall be forwarded by the nominating bodies or persons concerned to the Minister for appointment and publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) If any of the bodies or group of bodies or persons aforesaid does not within one month after the receipt of a request in writing from the Minister nominate a person or persons (as the case may require) the Minister may without such nomination make the necessary appointments.

(4) No person shall be appointed a member of the Board for more than three years, but any person appointed a member of the Board shall, upon the expiration of the period for which he is so appointed, be eligible for re-appointment.

5. (1) The Board at the first meeting in each year shall elect one of their number to be Chairman of the Board.

(2) The Chairman shall hold office until the first meeting in the following year, but shall be eligible for re-election.

(3) At any meeting of the Board the Chairman, or in his absence any member elected by the members present to act as Chairman at such meeting, shall preside, and in case of equality of votes shall have a second or casting vote.

(4) If at any election of a Chairman there is equality of votes it shall be decided by lot which of the members obtaining an equal number of votes shall be elected.

(5) If any member of the Board is absent without permission of the Board from four consecutive meetings his seat shall become vacant.

(6) On the occurrence of any vacancy in the Board the Minister may appoint a person nominated in the same way as the original member was nominated to fill the vacancy, and any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office only for the remainder of the term for which his predecessor was appointed.

(7) The Board shall meet at such times and places as the Board decides, and all meetings shall be convened by the Registrar by giving to each member at least seven clear days' notice, in writing, of the time and place of meeting.

(8) The powers and duties of the Board may be exercised and performed by a quorum of not less than five members.

(9) The proceedings of the Board shall be regulated by the provisions of Part XI. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928* in so far as such Part is applicable.

6. (1) The Minister may appoint an officer of the Department of Public Health to be the Registrar.

(2) The duties of the Registrar shall be—

(a) to act as secretary to the Board and to carry out the directions of the Board and all such duties as pertain to that office;

(b) to receive all moneys due to the Board and pay same into an account known as the Plumbers and Gasfitters' Account kept with the State Savings Bank of Victoria, and to submit to the Board half-yearly statements of accounts;

(c) to keep a register, in the form set out in Schedule "A" hereto, of such persons as may be approved by the Board for registration as plumbers and/or gasfitters, and to record the class or classes of plumbing work and/or gasfitting in which registration has been approved;

(d) to remove (subject to the provisions of clause 16) names from and restore names to the register at the direction of the Board;

(e) to issue certificates of registration for the appropriate class or classes of plumbing work and/or gasfitting as plumbers and/or gasfitters.

#### PART III.—TRAINING.

7. Every applicant for registration shall submit proof satisfactory to the Board either—

(a) that he has served an apprenticeship or has been employed as an improver for not less than five years in learning the handicraft of plumbing and/or gasfitting from a competent plumber and/or gasfitter; or

(b) that he has been employed for not less than three years in learning the handicraft of plumbing and/or gasfitting from a competent plumber and/or gasfitter, and that

in addition he has secured from the Education Department of Victoria the final certificate that he has completed the second, third, fourth, and fifth grades of the prescribed course of plumbing and gasfitting at a Technical School or has had other training considered by the Board to be equivalent thereto.

#### PART IV.—EXAMINATION.

8. For the purpose of satisfying itself as to the suitability of any applicant for registration the Board may—

- (a) arrange for the conducting of theoretical, practical, and/or oral examinations in any class or classes of plumbing and/or gasfitting;
- (b) appoint an examiner or examiners to conduct any such examination, and the name of the examiner or examiners so appointed shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and their appointment shall commence on the date of such publication;
- (c) terminate the appointment of any examiner or examiners by giving one month's notice, in writing, under the hand of the Registrar of the Board. The notice of termination of appointment shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and the appointment shall terminate on the date of such publication;
- (d) require any applicant to present himself for any such examination.

Provided, however, that any applicant—

- (i) who was registered as a plumber or as a gasfitter under the Principal Act or any corresponding previous enactment or as a plumber under the regulations made pursuant to the *Health Act 1931*;
- (ii) who was at the commencement of the *Health Act 1935* licensed as a plumber by any sewerage authority or by any water supply authority;
- (iii) who shall provide proof of having passed the final examination of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria; or
- (iv) who shall provide proof of having passed the theoretical and practical examination of the Sanitary Plumbers Examination Board of Victoria—

shall be eligible for registration for the appropriate class or classes of plumbing and/or gasfitting without examination.

#### PART V.—REGISTRATION.

9. (1) The Board shall register as plumbers for the appropriate class or classes of plumbing work and/or gasfitters such applicants as in its opinion are competent to engage in or to undertake the particular class or classes of plumbing work and/or gasfitting, and shall cause the names of such plumbers and/or gasfitters to be recorded in a register kept for that purpose.

(2) Every application for registration shall be made in the form of Schedule B hereto, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

(3) Every application for renewal of registration shall be made in the form of Schedule C hereto, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

10. The following persons only shall be entitled to registration as—

##### (a) Plumbers, Class I.—

- (i) Persons who hold the final certificate issued by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria, and who also hold the qualifications set out for Plumbers, Class II.
- (ii) Persons who are approved by the Board as being competent to engage in or undertake gasfitting and all classes of plumbing work and who hold the qualifications set out for Plumbers, Class II.

##### (b) Plumbers, Class II.—

- (i) Persons who hold the certificate of competency issued by the Sanitary Plumbers Examination Board of Victoria.
- (ii) Persons who have passed the practical examination of the Sanitary Plumbers Examination Board of Victoria and have been licensed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.
- (iii) Persons who before the 30th June, 1931, were licensed as second class plumbers by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

## (c) Plumbers, Class III., or Gasfitters:—

Persons who are approved by the Board as being competent to engage in or undertake plumbing, Class III., or gasfitting, as the case may be.

Provided, however, that—

- (a) any person registered as a plumber or a gasfitter under the Principal Act or any corresponding previous enactment, or as a plumber or as a gasfitter under the Regulations made pursuant to the *Health Act* 1931; or
- (b) any person who at the commencement of the *Health Act* 1935 was licensed as a plumber by any sewerage authority or by any water supply authority—

shall be registered as a plumber in respect of the appropriate class or classes of plumbing work, or as a gasfitter, as the case may be.

11. On receipt of the prescribed fee, a certificate of registration in the form of Schedule D hereto shall be issued to every person eligible for registration under the provisions of these Regulations, and every such certificate shall specify the class or classes of plumbing and/or gasfitting for which registration has been approved.

12. Unless previously cancelled by the Board in accordance with clause 16 of these Regulations, all registrations shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year, but shall be renewed on the payment of the prescribed fee therefor, and on returning the certificate of registration to the Registrar for endorsement.

13. Every registered plumber and/or gasfitter shall on notification of a change in his classification, return his certificate to the Registrar, who will cancel same, and issue a new certificate.

14. The Board may, as set out in clause 16 of these Regulations, cancel the registration of a plumber and/or gasfitter.

15. Every registered plumber and/or gasfitter shall notify the Registrar of any change of address.

16. (1) If, after inquiry, investigation, or other appropriate procedure, the Board is of the opinion that the name of any registered plumber and/or gasfitter should be removed from the register, it shall give to such registered plumber and/or gasfitter at least fourteen days' notice in writing of its opinion; and shall afford such plumber and/or gasfitter all reasonable opportunity of showing cause why his name should not be so removed. If, after considering such representations, at least five members of the Board agree by resolution that the name of such plumber and/or gasfitter should be removed from the register, the name shall forthwith be removed, and such person shall cease to be a registered plumber and/or gasfitter, and on notification thereof by registered letter by the Registrar shall forthwith return his certificate of registration.

(2) The Board may, if it think fit, restore to the register any name so removed.

17. (1) Notice of appeal against any decision of the Board under sub-section 2 of section 2 of the *Health Act* 1935, shall be in the form of Schedule E hereto, and shall be in duplicate. One copy shall be lodged with the Registrar, and the other copy with the police magistrate to whom the notice of appeal is addressed, not more than twenty-eight (28) days after the notification of the decision appealed against.

(2) Upon receipt of a notice of appeal, the police magistrate shall inform the appellant and the Registrar of the time when and place where the appeal shall be heard.

18. No person other than an apprentice, improver, or person employed to assist a plumber or gasfitter shall, on and after the date of gazettal of these Regulations, engage in or undertake any of the following classes of work, viz.:—

- (a) plumbing, Class I. or III., in any city or town;
- (b) plumbing, Class II., in any city or town, or in any area or district under the control of any sewerage authority;
- (c) gasfitting—

unless registered for such work under the provision of the *Health Acts* and of these Regulations.

19. An apprentice, improver, or person employed to assist a plumber or gasfitter shall not engage in or undertake any plumbing or gasfitting work except under the direct supervision or control of a person registered as a plumber in respect of the appropriate class or (as the case may be) as a gasfitter.

PART VI.—FEES.

20. Fees as set out hereunder shall be paid to the Registrar, who shall issue an official receipt therefor:—

- (a) For lodging an application by an applicant for registration—Five shillings, to be paid at the time of lodging the application.
- (b) For examination—Fifteen shillings, to be paid at the time of entering for the examination.
- (c) For registration—Two shillings and sixpence, to be paid prior to the issue of the certificate.
- (d) For the annual renewal of registration—Two shillings and sixpence, which shall be payable on or before the seventh day of January in each year, and shall be lodged with the application for renewal.

21. (1) All fees collected shall be applied to the payment of expenses connected with examinations and to the expenses of the Board.

(2) The account shall be operated under the joint signatures of the Registrar and any one of two members appointed by the Board for the purpose.

PART VII.—PENALTIES.

22. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done, by these Regulations, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

AMENDMENT OF THE PROVISIONAL WIRING REGULATIONS 1934.

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf conferred by the State Electricity Commission Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, make the following Regulations amending the Provisional Wiring Regulations 1934, that is to say:—

Citation and Date of Operation.

1. These Regulations may be cited together with the Provisional Wiring Regulations 1934 as the Provisional Wiring Regulations 1934, and shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Earth-leakage Protection.—Amendment of Regulation 521.

2. For clause (b) of Regulation 521 there shall be substituted the following clause, namely:—

"(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of clause (a) hereof, an earth-leakage safety switch shall not be required—

- (i) in any installation in which no part is required under the provisions of section 5 of these Regulations to be earthed; or
- (ii) in any installation in which the parts required under section 5 of these Regulations to be earthed are and continue to be connected in accordance with the provisions of the said section 5 to a metal water pipe which is electrically continuous with the piping of an underground public water supply reticulation system in which the metallic and electrical continuity of such piping is unbroken throughout the whole area supplied with water by such reticulation system. The Commission shall from time to time, but not more frequently than at intervals of six months, publish in the *Government Gazette* lists of the areas and districts in which installations are under this sub-clause exempted from the provisions of clause (a) hereof.
- (iii) in any installation or installations specified or described in a notice forwarded in writing by the Commission to the supply authority and stating that such installation or installations are exempted from the application of clause (a) hereof, but the Commission may by like notice at any time revoke the exemption of any or all such installations which have not then been installed."
