W HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George V. intituled the Legislative God No. 217.—14028.—PRICE 6D.; Quarterly, 7s. 7d.; Half-Yearly, 15s. 2d.; Yearly, 30s. 4d.
