#### The Fisheries Acts.

ALTERATIONS OF CONDITIONS REGARDING THE USE OF LONG LINES IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the Fisheries Act 1928 (No. 3683), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for

the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the aforementioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Programation so made may be varied revoked aforementioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the Fisheries Act 1928, do hereby repeal the Proclamation made the seventeenth day of June, 1935, and published in the Government Gazette of the nine-teenth day of June, 1935, respecting the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay, and prohibit in the waters of Port Phillip Bay or of any river or creek flowing into such bay at any time during the period from the first day of September in each year to the thirtieth day of April next following, inclusive, any person from having in his possession any long line in or upon the said waters or within two hundred yards thereof, or doing any or all of the following things:—

(a) Using long lines and the method of fishing known as

- (a) Using long lines and the method of fishing known as "long lining";
- (b) Taking a boat with a long line on board or attached thereto on to any of the said waters; permitting a long line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing a long line to be in or upon such waters or within two hundred yards thereof.

I do further prohibit during the period in any year from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August, any person from using more than one line with any more than 500 hooks attached for each boat engaged in long lining.

And I do hereby provide that the foregoing provisions affecting Port Phillip Bay shall apply to that particular part of Port Phillip Bay known as Swan Bay during the whole of

CLOSE SEASON FOR WILD DUCKS, TEAL, ETC.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-wealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the twelfth day of January, 1932, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirteenth day of January, 1932, respecting the close season for wild ducks, teal, &c., and prescribe that the "Close Season" for—

Land Rail, and all other members of the Rail family, Porphyrio, Coots, &c.;

Maned Geese or Wood Ducks; and

cWild Ducks and Teal of all Kinds (except the Mountain Duck or Chestnut-breasted Shelduck),

shall be from the first day of May in each year to the last day of February next following (both days inclusive), and I hereby direct that such period shall be set opposite the names of such birds in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928, in lieu of the period set opposite such names in the said Schedule.

I do further direct that this Proclamation shall come into operation after the expiration of a period of one week from the date of its publication in the Government Gazette.

DECLARATION THAT A BOARD SHALL BE CONSTITUTED IN RELATION TO EGGS AND EGG PULP.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS in accordance with sub-section (5) of section 6 and section 17 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, more than sixty per centum of the producers of eggs and egg pulp entitled to vote at a poll taken on the question whether a Marketing Board shall be constituted in relation to eggs and egg pulp, voted thereat, and more than sixty per centum of the votes polled are in favour of the constitution of a Board: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, by this my Proclamation hereby declare that a Marketing Board shall be constituted in relation to eggs and egg pulp and that the provisions of the said Act shall apply to eggs and egg pulp.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA—CHAPTER III., PROBATE AND ADMINISTRATION PURPOSE PROPERTY OF THE STATE OF T TRATION RULES

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by section 79 of the Administration and Probate Act 1928 and of any other powers hereunto enabling, the Probate and Administration Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria as on and from the first day of January, 1937, are hereby added to as

#### PROBATE AND ADMINISTRATION RULE 19A.

Pursuant to clause III. of a Convention between the United Kingdom and the United States of America relative to the disposal of real and personal property signed at Washington on 2nd March, 1899, and acceded to by the Commonwealth on 3rd April, 1902: Upon any application to the Court or Registrar for the administration of the estate of a deceased person, if it shall appear that such deceased person was a citizen of the United States of America and that he died in Victoria without leaving any executor or known next of kin in Victoria, the applicant shall give notice of the application to the Chief Consular Officer of the United States of America in Victoria. The said Chief Consular Officer shall have the right to appear personally or by delegate in any proceedings relating to the said application and to be heard in the interests of any next of kin or creditors who may be in the United States of America or be citizens of that country until they are otherwise represented.

- (b) a sanatorium for the treatment of persons suffering from any form of tuberculosis;
- (c) a hospital or home for the treatment of the mentally afflicted doing any kind of work connected with the carrying on of such a hospital or home.

#### APPOINTMENT OF A HOSPITAL NURSES' BOARD.

U NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

## REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE EDENHOPE TOWN COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commissis made by the Governor in Council on the 5th August, 1930, the managers of the Edenhöße Towii Colimon, having dratted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Gounell in lieu of the Regulations herebofore in force in respect of such colimon.

The following Regulations will came into operation as from the 1st day of October, 1936:—

#### REGULATIONS:

1. In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations, "cattle" shall include horses.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miner's rights, business licences or carriers' licences, and farmers may respectively depasture on a conjumon within a distance of five miles or, at the option of the Minister, ten miles from their places of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole of a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such a common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by, him.

a common one additional nead of marge cauch, or one square lent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. No person shall be allowed to depasture stock on the Common of which he is not the bona fide owner. If the management doubt the ownership of any cattle; the person wishing to register same must make a statutory declaration as to the ownership of any cattle if asked to do so by the Managers of the Common.

4. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly in advance on the first day of Jahuary, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year; and the owners of stock registered during the currency of any quarter shall pay the agistment fees for the whole of the quarter:

(a) For every horse; mare, gelding; colt; filly; ass or mule ...—98. 6d. per quarter;

(b) for every cow or heifer—2s. per quarter;

(c) for every steer—4s. 0d. per quarter;

(d) fillies, colts, and calves shall run free on the Common until six months old, provided the mother is registered on the Common:

tered on the Common:

5. No entire horse over the age of six months shall be allowed on the Common, nor any bull over the age of six, (6) months, nor any animal which, in the opinion of the Managers, is likely to prove a nuisance.

6. All stock depastured on the Common and registered the previous quarter on which the fees shall remain unpaid for a period of seven (7) days after the commencement of the next quarter, shall be liable to be theated as tresplassers, and all stock not registered the previous quarter shall forthwith be treated as trespassers:

7. No pullocks or horses belonging to carriers inness entitled

7. No bullocks or horses belonging to carriers unless entitled to commonage shall remain more than twelve (12) hours on the Cöhmön uhless detailed by accident of stress of weather. S. No person shall remove registered stock from the Confinon without the consent in writing of the herdsman or the

Managers.

Managers.

9. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be depastured on the Common and, if any animal so being depastured develops any contagious disease during the six months for which it is registered, it shall immediately be removed by the owner, and failing such removal, the Herdsman shall have the power to effect such removal. Any cost connected therewith must be borne by the owner thereof.

10: All cattle not registered on the Common shall be treated as trespassers, and will be liable to be impounded by the Herdsman or the Managers.

11. The Manager's shall release from the pound any regis-tered stock which may be impounded; unless such stock shall have been considered a nuisance and has been registered at

have been considered a nuisance and has been registered at the risk of the owner.

12: Registration of dry stock will only be accepted by the Managers on condition that they be depastured in the enclosed area at the west end of the Common, and that the onus of placing the said cattle in the approved area be on the owners and that the owners and that the owners of milking cows be privileged to use either part of the Common.

13. All travelling stock must travel through the Common by the route which will be indicated by notice boards, and any drover in charge entering on the Common without giving due notice to the Herdsman will be prosecuted.

14. The registration of any animal regarded by the Managers to be a public nuisance may be refused by the Herdsman.

2. Every camp shall be provided with closet accommodation at the rate of one closet for the first 15 persons and thereafter at the rate of one closet for every additional 25 persons or portion of 25 persons after the first 15 persons. And, in addition, in the case of closets for males, there shall be provided one additional vinal for every subsequent 25 males or portion of 25 males, provided that, where a trough or similar urinal is in use, every complete 18 inches of available length of such trough shall be deemed to be one urinal.

3. The construction of all closets in camps within a pan service area shall be similar in every respect to that provided in the General Sanitary Regulations of the Department of Public Health. In the case of urinals, every urinal shall be so arranged as to discharge into a pit or trench situated at its lowest point, and filled with scoria of loose rubble to within 4 inches of clean earth. The interior of all closets and urinals shall be effectively screened from public view.

4. Where a camp is situated outside a pan service area, a properly-constructed trench may be substituted for a pan, and such trench shall not be more than 3 feet in length and 1 foot in width. All deposits of nights of the rein or thereon shall be covered at once with clean earth. Closets in such areas shall have suitable overhead protection from the weather, and shall also be suitably screened from pu

shall have suitable overhead protection from the weather, and shall also be suitably screened from public view to secure privacy and decency.

5. Where the site of a camp is within an area provided with a house refuse service, all refuse and garbage shall be stored temporarily in covered receptacles, and the owner or occupier shall arrange for such to be cleared as often as required. All refuse and garbage produced at a camp site which is not situated within a house refuse service area shall be buried or burnt daily. Upon the termination of any camp, the occupier or owner of the site shall cover nightsoil and refuse trenches with at least 9 inches of clean earth.

6. No person shall camp upon any street or road within the municipality, nor upon any reserve excepting those specially reserved for camping purposes.

7. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by this By-law shall be liable for each such oftence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and, in the case or a continuing oftence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penaltics shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Portland.

#### DETERMINATION OF THE GROCERS' SUNDRIES BOARD.

Norm.—This Determination, on the 26th November, 1936, applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which, since the 23rd July, 1934, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) manufacturing cereal foods (except in flour mills), spices, condiments, coffee, chicory, cocca, or any kind of goods commonly known as Grocers' Sundries;
- (b) making, tinning, putting up, bottling, wrapping, labelling, or otherwise preparing for sale moulders' blacking, moulders' plumbago preparations, blacklead, boot blacking, boot paste, boot polish, washing blue, harness dressing, harness compounds, ebonite shine, stove polish, knife polish, metal polish;
- (c) grinding, tinning, putting up, bottling, wrapping, labelling, or otherwise preparing for sale charcoal or coal dust; and
- (d) making soap, washing soda, candles, or starch—

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 26th November, 1936, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) EMPLOYMENT.—WEEKLY WAGES.—(a) Employees may be engaged by the week, and when so engaged must be available, ready, and willing to perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employees affected.
  - (b) Employment for the first two weeks of service shall be from day to day at the weekly rate fixed.
- (c) Any weekly employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless he or she produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence satisfactory evidence to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year commencing from the 21st December.
- (d) An employee is not to be entitled to more than six days' payment in any year for such non-attendance; notwithstanding that he or she may be employed during the year by more than one employer.
  - (4) Hours of Work.—The number of hours to be worked on any day shall be as follows:---

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Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday
Saturday ... ... 8½ hours \ except where shift work is carried on as
1 hours \ provided for.
```

The starting and finishing times shall be fixed by the employer in each establishment. Two weeks' notice shall be given of any change in such fixed times.

- (5) OVERTIME.—All work performed outside the starting and finishing times as fixed shall be paid for at the rate of half time in addition to the ordinary rate, but when an employee works more than one shift in 24 hours no overtime shall be payable for duty on Saturday until he has worked eight and three-quarter hours on that day. Overtime rates shall be paid on the basis of a quarter of an hour. A fraction of a quarter of an hour shall be paid for as a quarter of an hour. Piece-work done outside the starting and finishing times shall be paid for with the addition of a half rate to the ordinary rate.
- (6) SPECIAL RATES.—(a) Employees shall receive payment at double time rate for work done on Sunday, and shall receive payment at ordinary rate in addition to the full weekly rate for work done on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (b) When Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or New Year's Day, or a proclaimed substitute therefor falls on a day other than Sundays and payment of wages is not included in the weekly wage in consequence of the Christmas holidays having been taken as provided for in sub-clause (f) hereunder, then employees shall receive payment for each of such days calculated as eight hours.
- (c) All employees on time work off duty on any of the above-mentioned holidays, other than Sunday, shall be paid for such days at ordinary rate. Piece-workers shall be paid for such holidays and Sundays at the rate payable to employees on time work doing the same class of work.
- (d) Where an employee is absent from his or her work on the day before or the day after a public holiday without rescens excuse, or without the consent of the employer, the employee shall not be entitled to payment for such holidays.
- (e) Where the majority of the employees of any establishment or of any department agree with the employer to work part time for any period, or to close down for any period on the days other than the prescribed holidays, the weekly rate shall not apply.

CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS.—(f) On or before the 14th December in each year the employer shall be given or may obtain notice of the number and names of his adult employees who do not elect to work on the working days between Christmas Day and New Year's Day. If more than 33 per cent. of such of the adult employees in any particular establishment as come within the classification in this Determination indicate to the employer their election not to work on such days, then the employer may, if he chooses, close down his establishment on such days, provided that on or before the 21st December he gives notice to his employees of his intention to do so. Where such number is 33 per cent. or under, then the employer shall keep his establishment open for work on such days, or, if he closes it, he shall pay the ordinary wage to those employees who have declared themselves ready and willing to work on such days and who have not been dismissed in conformity with this Determination.

- (g) Where the business is kept open for work, the employer may require the employees presenting themselves for work to work in any capacity he may appoint, provided the employees shall be paid at their ordinary rates for such work as they are called on to do.
- (h) If any employee has not indicated to the employer on or before the 14th December that he does not intend to work on the days in question, and absents himself from work when the business is open for work on such days, then such employee shall receive no pay therefor.
- (7) Termination of Employment.—(a) Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given on any day of the week by either employer or employee provided that such notice given to an employee solely for the purpose of avoiding payment for prescribed holidays shall not deprive such employee of payment for holidays occurring between such notice and re-engagement, if any.
- (b) Nothing contained in this Determination shall affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct, or to deduct payment for any day on which the employee cannot usefully be employed because of a strike, or stoppage of work for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.
- (c) In the event of such dismissal, wages shall be paid up to the time of such dismissal. If an employee's services be terminated during the course of a week he shall be paid all money due to him at the termination of his services, or such money shall be forwarded to him by post within 24 hours thereafter.
  - (8) PAYMENT OF WAGES .- Wages shall be paid weekly on a week day other than Saturday.
- (9) Meal Times.—A lunch period of at least one half-hour for each employee shall be fixed in each factory between 12 noon and 2 p.m. for other than shift workers. No employee shall be required to work more than five hours from the starting of work in the morning without a break for lunch.
- (b) Work performed during the usual meal hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, but where the total hours worked (including time worked during such meal time) do not exceed the prescribed daily number of hours then such time shall be deemed to mean an additional payment at half ordinary rate only for such meal time. Such employee shall be allowed time for a meal.
- (10) REST PERIOD.—Women workers on time work shall be allowed an interval of ten minutes between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. for rest, and such interval shall be observed at times convenient to the employer. Such intervals shall count as time worked.
  - (11) SHIFT WORKERS.—(a) Shift workers shall have a break for meals without deduction of pay.
- (b) Shift workers engaged on a second or third shift daily, other than overtime, shall receive payment at ordinary time plus 5 per cent.
- (c) Shift workers on a second or third shift who are unable to travel to and from work on workmen's tickets shall be paid is. 6d. per week in addition to their ordinary rate of pay.
  - (12) Supply of Materials.—The undermentioned materials shall be provided free of charge by every employer—
    - (a) All necessary tools of trade, which shall be kept in good repair by the employer.
    - (b) Uniforms and caps required by the employer to be worn by the employees.
    - (c) Goggles for employees engaged in work injurious to the eyes.
- (13) Tea Money.—Any employee required to work overtime for any period in excess of one hour after the usual hour of ceasing duty shall either be supplied with a meal at the employer's expense, or be allowed 2s. for each meal required if the expense is incurred. Provided that this clause shall not apply where the employee was notified the previous day of the intention to work overtime. Provided further that where the employee was notified the previous day of the intention to work overtime and such overtime was not worked he shall be entitled to the meal allowance herein provided.

The provisions of this clause shall not apply in the case of boys under sixteen years of age or women or girls employed in factories whose conditions regarding overtime are governed by section 38 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

- (14) PIECEWORK.—The Board determines under Section 150 of the Factories and Shope Act 1928 (No. 3677) that the employer may fix his or her own piecework rates, provided such prices enable an employee of average capacity working under like conditions to earn at least 10 per cent. above the minimum weekly wage in their respective classes. The same piecework prices shall be paid to all pieceworkers doing the same operation in the factory, whether they be improvers or juveniles on piecework or otherwise.
- (b) Pieceworkers who are requested to wait on or about the employer's premises for work on any one day for more than half an hour shall be paid for such waiting time at the rate based on the minimum weekly wage.
- (c) A weekly pieceworker shall be allowed in each week sufficient piecework to enable such employee to earn at least the prescribed rate fixed in this Determination for the class of work performed. If such work is not provided, and the employee is ready and willing to perform all work provided, then such employee shall be paid the minimum wage applicable to the employee so employed.
- (d) Pieceworkers working overtime for less than 15 minutes, or any fraction of 15 minutes, shall have their payment computed on the basis of an average amount of work done in 15 minutes.
- (15) DESTRUCTION OF CLOTHING.—Where satisfactory evidence is produced by an employee that, when dissolving caustic soda, using solutions of caustic soda or mineral acids, his or her clothing has been destroyed through no fault of such employee, reparation shall be made by the employer.
- (16) Weight Carrying.—No woman worker over the age of 18 years shall be required to carry a greater weight than 30 pounds. Section 207 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) provides that no person employing any girl under the age of 18 years in a factory shall permit such girl while so employed to lift or carry a greater weight than 25 pounds.
- (17) TEMPORARY WORK.—A temporary employee shall mean a person employed for 24 hours or less in any one week, but no employee shall be deemed to be a temporary worker where after employment for at least one week he is dismissed before he has worked 24 hours in the succeeding week, or where his non-employment for more than 24 hours is wholly attributable to causes over which the employer has no control.

Temporary workers unless dismissed for misconduct shall be paid at the rate of time and a third for all work performed.

(18) Davinition.—For the purpose of this Determination, year shall mean a period of twelve calendar months commencing on the 21st December in each year.
