Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE OPTICIANS BOARD.

This Determination on the 4th December, 1936 applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebestopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in manufacturing or mounting optical lenses or their frames," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 4th December, 1936, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this

... 6.0 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

(4) OVERTIME. That the following rate shall be paid for all work done-

(a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause (3) (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause (3) in excess of 44 hours in any week Time and a half.

- (5) TIME RATE.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 22 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum.

 (6) PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.—Employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day within the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, this provision shall only apply to the day so substituted.
- (7) Annual Holidays.—An employe who has completed twelve months continuous or cumulative employment shall receive seven days annual leave on full pay to be given at a time to be arranged by the employer, provided that such leave shall be given within sixty days of its becoming due and that an employe having applied for such leave shall be given at least fourteen days' notice of the date from which leave is to commence.
- (8) Special Rates.—That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day; but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
