IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of preparing horsehair for trade or sale," has made the following Determination, namely:—

Note.—On the 16th June, 1913, the powers of the Horsehair Board were extended to enable it to deal with rates for cowhair or pighair.

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799). SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-widths of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purposes to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbor or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the Council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbor or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin.

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE MELBOURNE CRICKET GROUND.

MELBOURNE CRICKET GROUND.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1933, the trustees appointed thereunder have power from time to time, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Regulations as therein provided, and with like approval to repeal or amend such Regulations relating to the Metropolitan Cricket Ground in force immediately before the commencement of the said Act shall be deemed to have been made pursuant to the said Act and shall remain in force until repealed under the said Act: And whereas Regulations relating to the Metropolitan Cricket Ground were made on the 8th day of February, 1907, and were approved by the Governor in Council published in the Government Hazette of the State of Victoria on the 27th day of March, 1907, and the said Regulations and other Regulations relating to the said ground were in force immediately before the com-1907, and the said Regulations and other Regulations relating to the said ground were in force immediately before the commencement of the said Act: And whereas it is in the opinion of the Trustees necessary or expedient to make the Regulations hereinafter set forth: Now therefore we, the Honorable Henry Stephen Bailey, Norman Bayles, Esquire. Arthur Augustus Calwell, Esquire, Edmund John Cotter, Esquire, the Honorable Albert Arthur Dunstan. Sir George Fairbairn, K.B., Thomas Hayes, Esquire, the Honorable Sir Harry Sutherland Wightman Lawson, K.C.M.G., Stanley Radcliffe Lewis, Esquire, Frank Livesly Mauger, Esquire, the Honorable Robert Gordon Menzies, K.C., William Mellroy, Esquire, Sir Edward Fancourt Mitchell, K.C.M.G., K.C., the Honorable Sir Arthur Robinson, K.C.M.G., the Honorable William Slater, and the Right Honorable William Alexander Watt, P.C., the trustees for the time being of the land described in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act, together with all improvements thereon, do by virtue of all the powers thereunto us enabling, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. (1) These Regulations shall be read and construed as

- 1. (1) These Regulations shall be read and construed as in aid of and not in derogation from the Regulations aforesaid made on the 8th day of February, 1997, and all other Regulations relating to the said Ground which were in force immediately before the commencement of the Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1933.
- (2) In these Regulations the expression "the ground" shall mean all the land described in the Fifth Schedule to the Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1933 together with all the improvements thereon.
- 2. When seats are reserved in any part of the ground during any particular day or days or throughout any particular match or series of matches, any person occupying any seat so reserved—

(a) not being the holder of a ticket authorizing him to occupy such seat; or

(b) failing to produce such ticket when required to do so by any officer or servant of the trustees or of the Mclbourne Cricket Club—

shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall also be liable to be removed from the seat so occupied

by him by any member of the Police Force or by any officer or servant of the trustees or of the Melbourne Cricket Club.

- Any person who—
 (a) stands or remains in or on or obstructs any gangway, stairway, passage, or aisle; or
- (b) adopts any standing position in, on, or in front of any scating accommodation in such a way as to obscure or prejudice the view of the playing ground of any person who is sitting on any scat provided as such scating accommodation: or

 (c) trespasses upon the playing ground at any time during a day fixed for the holding of any cricket or football match or any athletic sports or any display parade or function whatsoever—

 shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

- 4. Any person who commits any offence against these Regulations—
 - (a) may be removed from the ground by any member of the Police Force or by any officer or servant of the trustees or of the Melbourne Cricket Club; and
 - (b) shall on conviction before a Court of Petty Sessions be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
- 5. Any person who commits any offence against any of the Regulations referred to in section 9 (2) of the Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1933 may be removed from the ground by any member of the Police Force or by any officer or servant of the trustees or of the Melbourne Cricket Club.
- 6. In Regulation No. 20 of the Regulations dated the 8th day of February, 1907-
 - (a) the expression "five shillings (5s.)" is hereby repealed and there is substituted in lieu thereof the expression "seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.)"; and
 (b) the expression "two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)" is hereby repealed and there is substituted in lieu thereof the expression "three shillings (3s.)."
- 7. These Regulations and all the Regulations referred to in section # (2) of the Melbourne Cricket (fround Act 1933 shall extend and apply to the ground: and the word "reserve" wherever appearing in any of such Regulations shall be deemed and taken to mean the ground as herein

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ELLAM RECREATION RESERVE.

W HEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 24th October, 1932, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Hindmarsh at Ellam, and known as the "Ellam Recreation Reserve."

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise till sunset except on such days (not exceding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for

cricket, tennis or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding two shillings (2s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, notwithstanding that he has paid admission to the Reserve.

3. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs or fittings in the Reserve, nor light fires therein except at such sites

as may be set aside for the purpose by the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, nor in any way damage, injure or destroy any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish therein.

5. No person shall put any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or any other animals in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

- 6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle or other animals found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of any cattle or other animals.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.
- 9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 11. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be en-closed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 12. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- of the Committee of Management first obtained.

 13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of fêtes, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure; and such Committee may, in its absolute discretion, make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

 14. The Committee of Management may set apart any por-
- 14. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, fêtes, amusements, shows, or sport, and from time to time grant to any club, society or association of clubs, the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations
- 15. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve, or any portion thereof, for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of £3 3s. per day.

The Reserve has been placed under the Control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such hailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
