REVOCATION OF ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER NO. 34 OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

EXPLOSIVES ACT 1928.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE MANUFACTURE OF EXPLOSIVES.

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 5 of the Explosives Act 1928, doth hereby repeal the Regulations made on the 12th day of October, 1909, respecting the manufacture of explosives, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

- 1. Application for a licence for the manufacture of explosives shall be made to the Chief Inspector of Explosives.
- 2. There shall be specified in the application the situation, character and construction of all buildings, mounds and works existing or proposed on the site of or connected with the factory, and such of the following matters as are applicable:—
 - (a) The nature of and the place at which each process of manufacture and each description of work is to be carried on,
 - (b) The places at which explosives and ingredients of explosives and any articles which are inflammable or otherwise dangerous are to be kept,
 - (c) The amount of explosives and ingredients thereof, wholly or partially mixed, to be allowed at any one time in any building or machine or in any process of manufacture,
 - (d) The maximum number of persons to be employed in each building or room, and
 - (e) Any special conditions.
- 3. The application shall be accompanied by a plan, drawn to scale, of the proposed factory.
- 4. After examination of the application, and having regard to the nature of the operations, the locality and the situation and construction of buildings or works, the conditions of the proposed licence shall be prepared by an Inspector of Explosives and submitted to the Minister.
- 5. The Minister may refuse the application or may approve of it with or without modification of or addition to the conditions.
- 6. On the approval of an application for a licence the applicant shall complete the factory and the arrangement thereof in accordance with the conditions of the proposed licence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Explosives before the licence is actually issued.
- 7. Neither the factory nor any part thereof shall be used for any purpose whatever not in accordance with the licence.
- 8. The conditions of the licence shall be duly observed, and any breach of or non-compliance with any of such conditions shall be deemed to be a breach of these Regulations.
- 9: The factory and every part thereof shall be kept and maintained strictly in accordance with the licence, and no material alteration whatsoever in the factory shall be made without the written approval of an Inspector of Explosives.
- 10. The quantity of any explosive or ingredients that may be placed or stored at any one time in any factory or in any part thereof shall not exceed such quantity as may be prescribed in the licence.
- 11. Every factory magazine shall be used only for the keeping of such explosives and of such ingredients thereof as may be specified in that behalf in the licence, and tools or implements for work connected with the keeping of such explosives and ingredients.
- 12. The manufacture or keeping or any process in or work connected with the manufacture or keeping of explosives shall not be carried on except under conditions approved of by an Inspector of Explosives.

- 13. Every building in which explosive, or any ingredient thereof which by itself is possessed of explosive properties or which when mixed with any other ingredient or article also present in such building is capable of forming an explosive mixture or an explosive compound, is kept or present, or in the course of manufacture is liable to be, shall, unless specially exempted by the licence or by an order of an Inspector of Explosives, be deemed to be a danger building, and the interior of every such building and the fittings and equipment in such building shall be so constructed as to avoid unnecessary risks and shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean.
- 14. Before any repairs are effected to any part of a danger building, that part shall, so far as practicable, be cleaned under skilled supervision by the removal of all explosive and ingredients thereof and by the thorough washing of such part or by any other suitable process; and such part of the building, after being so cleaned, shall not be deemed to be a danger building within the meaning of these Regulations until explosive or any ingredient thereof is again taken into it.
- 15. There shall be constantly affixed to every danger building, in such manner as to be easily read, a statement showing the maximum number of persons and the maximum quantities of explosive or ingredients allowed to be in the building at any one time, the distinguishing number of the building as shown in the licence, and a copy of such conditions, rules or regulations as may be required by an Inspector of Explosives to be so affixed.
- 16. If required by an Inspector of Explosives, suitable and efficient lightning conductors shall be erected and maintained on the factory or any part thereof.
- 17. All tools and other implements used in a danger building shall be made only of wood or copper or brass, or some soft metal or material, or shall be covered with some safe and suitable material, and shall be limited to the actual working requirements of the room.
- 18. The outer clothing of all workpersons engaged in any danger building shall be of woollen or other uninflammable material and due provision shall be made, by the use of suitable working clothes without pockets, suitable shoes, searching, and otherwise or by some of such means, for preventing the introduction into any danger building of any iron, steel, or grit, or other article likely to cause explosion or fire.
- 19. Wherever danger may arise from foreign matter being present with the explosive or any ingredient thereof, all ingredients to be made or mixed into explosive shall, before being so made or mixed, be carefully examined, sifted, and otherwise treated for the purpose of removing therefrom, or excluding, so far as practicable, all such dangerous foreign matter.
- 20. No person shall smoke in any part of the factory except in such part as may be allowed by the Special Rules.
- 21. All persons before entering the factory shall examine their clothes to see that they have no matches or other dangerous articles in their pockets or about their persons, and the occupier shall satisfy himself that such examination is carefully carried out and that all persons employed in the factory are duly searched from time to time.
- 22. No person under the age of sixteen years shall be employed in or enter any danger building except in the presence or under the supervision of some responsible person.
- 23. Any carriage, boat or other receptacle in which explosive, or any ingredient thereof which by itself is possessed of explosive properties or which when mixed with any other ingredient or article also present in such carriage, boat or receptacle is capable of forming an explosive mixture or an explosive compound, is conveyed from one part of a factory to any other part or to a place outside of such factory, shall, unless specially exempted by the licence or by an order of an Inspector of Explosives, be constructed without any exposed iron or steel in the interior thereof, and shall be closed or otherwise properly evered over; and the explosive and ingredients shall be so conveyed with all due diligence and with such precaution and in such manner as will sufficiently guard against any accidental ignition or explosion: Provided that so much of this Regulation as applies to the exclusion of iron and steel shall not be obligatory in the case of a carriage, boat, or other receptacle in which no explosive other than explosive of the First Division of the Sixth (Ammunition) Class is conveyed.
- 24. Every ingredient in course of manufacture into explosive, which by itself is possessed of explosive properties or which when mixed with any other ingredient or article also present in any working building is capable of forming an explosive mixture or an explosive compound, shall

be removed with all due diligence from such working building so soon as the process connected with those ingredients which is carried on in such building is completed, and all finished explosive shall with all due diligence be either removed to a factory magazine or conveyed from the factory.

- 25. All explosives intended for conveyance from a factory shall be packed and marked in accordance with the rules in the schedule hereto.
- 26. No broken or defective cases or boxes containing explosives shall be admitted into a factory magazine.
- 27. The doors of every magazine shall be kept securely locked except at such time as explosives are being placed into such magazine or are being removed therefrom.
- 28. The keys of all danger buildings in connexion with the factory shall remain in charge of a person duly authorized in writing by the occupier, and shall be at any time available if required by an Inspector of Explosives.
- 29. On the approach of a thunderstorm the magazines and other danger buildings shall be closed and every person engaged in and about them shall be withdrawn therefrom.
- 30. The occupier of and every person employed in and about the factory shall take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion in or about such factory, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the factory or any part thereof or to the explosives therein, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work in such factory.
- 31. The person who applies for and to whom a factory licence is issued shall be deemed the occupier.
- 32. The expression "factory magazine" means a building for keeping the finished explosive made in the factory, and includes, if such explosive is not gunpowder, any building for keeping the partly manufactured explosive or the ingredients of such explosive which is mentioned in that behalf in the licence.
- 33. Wherever in these Regulations an explosive is distinguished as belonging to a particular class or division of a class, reference is made to the classification of explosives contained in an Order in Council made in pursuance of section 53 of the Explosives Act 1928

SCHEDULE.

1. In this schedule, unless the context otherwise requires—

The expression "Outer package" means a box, barrel, case, or cylinder of wood, metal, or other solid material of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened, nor become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape.

will not allow any explosive to escape.

The expression "Inner package" means a substantial case, bag, canister or other receptacle, made and closed so as to prevent any

explosive from escaping.

The expression "Authorized Explosive" means exclusively an explosive enumerated in the classification of explosives contained in an Order in Council made in pursuance of section 53 of the Explosives Act 1928.

The expression "Propellant" means an authorized explosive of Class III. adapted and intended exclusively for use as a propelling charge in cannon or small arms.

charge in cannon or small arms.

The expression "Special Authority" means a written authority granted by an Inspector of Explosives to which may be attached such conditions as may in the opinion of the Inspector be necessary to meet the special requirements of the case.

- 2. The interior of every package shall be free from grit and otherwise clean.
- 3. Save as hereinafter provided there shall not be any iron or steel in the construction of any package unless the same is covered with suitable material so as effectually to prevent the exposure of such iron or steel.
- 4. Every package when actually used for the packing of one explosive shall not be used for the packing of any other explosive or of any other article or substance.

Provided that this rule shall not prohibit the packing of inner packages containing a propellant in an outer package with inner packages containing gunpowder or another propellant.

Provided also that this rule shall not prohibit the packing of any article which is not of an inflammable or explosive nature, or liable to cause fire or explosion, in the same package as explosive of the First Division of the Sixth (Ammunition) Class.

5. Subject to the foregoing provisions, the following shall be the method of packing Authorized Explosives of the various classes respectively and the maximum amounts which may be in any one package:—

- 6. Nothing in this schedule shall be deemed to prohibit the use of an additional package whether inner or outer, provided that such additional package shall not be of such character as shall have been prohibited in writing by an Inspector of Explosives.
- 7. An explosive which is not an authorized explosive shall be packed and marked in such manner as may be directed by a Special Authority with reference to such explosive.
- 8. On the outermost package there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters by means of a brand or securely attached label or other mark the word "Explosive," the name of the explosive, the number of the Class and Division to which it belongs, and the name of the manufacturer or sender.

In the case of explosives of Classes III. and IV., there shall be added the date of manufacture or issue from the factory, or such sign indicating such date as may be approved by an Inspector of Explosives.

Provided that in the case of cartridges or charges for cannon, shells, mines, blasting or other like purpose which do not contain their own means of ignition, the marking shall be as for the explosive when not so made up.

Provided also that in the case of explosives of Class VI., Division 1, there shall be added the words "Not liable to explode in bulk."

.. Provided also that in the case of Pin Fire Cartridges for pistols there shall be added the words "Pin Fire Cartridges."

Provided also that in the case of Gunpowder the word "Explosive" and the number of the Class and Division may be omitted.

Provided also that where an outer package contains more than one explosive, the marking above required shall be affixed separately in respect of each explosive so contained.

9. To meet special cases exemption may be granted by Special Authority from the observance of any one or more of the conditions imposed by these rules.

And the Honorable M. W. J. Bourchier, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SEEDS ACTS 1928 AND 1935.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of February, 1936.

REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Seeds Acts 1928 and 1935, to make Regulations as to any matters whatsoever not being contrary to the provisions of the said Acts, necessary to give effect to the said Acts, the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby repeal the Regulations made on the 17th July, 1916, and in lieu thereof doth order as follows:—

Foreign Ingredients shall be substances of the character following:
 — Weeds or seeds of weeds.

Non-germinable seeds.

Seeds other than those specified in the invoice.

Inert Matter as defined hereunder :-

- (a) (i) All seeds of the kind under examination (except clovers and grasses) undeveloped or so severely damaged as in the opinion of a botanist of the Department of Agriculture or his deputy examining the seed to be incapable of germination.
 - (ii) In the case of clovers. A seed in which the germ is absent or in which the germ part is broken or seeds perceptibly broken or split through to the germ or otherwise damaged only so far as in the opinion of a botanist of the Department of Agriculture or his deputy examining the seed they are incapable of germination.

Provided that undeveloped seeds with the germ intact shall not be considered inert matter and pieces of the cotyledons greater than one half with the germ intact shall not be considered inert matter.

- (iii) In the case of grasses (except Paspalum dilatatum, Danthonia spp. Chloris gayana, and Alopecurus pratensis) sterile flowers and glumes not containing a caryopsis.
- (b) Portions of seeds or fruits, stones, chaff, sand, grit, soil, fragments of roots, stems of flowers, empty glumes, single pales, sterile flowers of grasses, seeds without a germ, decorticated seeds of legumes, sprouted seed, parts of insects, dead insects, scales, clusters of beet and mangel seeds, wholly devoid of seeds, which pass through a sieve having holes of 2-mm. diameter, and any other matter not seeds.
- (c) Seeds containing harmless parasites or diseases.
- 2. The weights of seeds to be taken as samples, for the purpose of examination, shall be not less than as mentioned and set forth in the second column of Schedule 3 hereto.
 - 3. The seeds of weeds named in Schedule 1 hereto are totally prohibited.
- 4. The proportion or amount of "Foreign Ingredients" which may be contained in any kind of seeds shall not exceed the proportion or amount set forth opposite the name of each kind of seed in Schedule 4 hereto.
- 5. In respect of seeds included in Schedule 2 hereto, the number of weed seeds which may be contained in any kind of seeds shall not exceed that prescribed opposite each weed named in the said schedule, subject to the conditions (a) and (b) set out at the head of the said schedule.
- 6. The fee for examination of each sample of seed made under the Act shall be two shillings and sixpence.

PENALTIES.

7. The penalty for any contravention of these Regulations shall be a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

ELECTRICAL APPROVALS BOARD.

APPLIANCES TO BE SUBMITTED FOR APPROVAL.

PURSUANT to Section 7 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1934 the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission hereby prescribes the following classes and types of electrical appliances fittings wire apparatus and material intended suggested or designed for use in or for the purposes of or for

connexion to any electrical installation and that electrical appliances fittings wire apparatus or material of any of the said classes or types shall not after the 30th day of September 1936 be sold or exposed for sale or advertised for sale unless the appliance fitting wire apparatus or material has been approved by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, that is to say:—

Firstly-

Kettles and Saucepans, a kettle or saucepan being a portable vessel in which is incorporated an electric heating element—including double cookers, coffee percolators, teapots and gluepots, but not including electric urns or urn type percolators of a capacity of one gallon or more, or equipment designed and/or manufactured specifically for sterilizing purposes, or electric jugs.

Secondly-

Decorative Lighting Outfits, a decorative lighting outfit being a set of miniature type lampholders (with or without lamps) together with conductors, such lampholders and conductors being either unassembled or assembled for connexion to an outlet in an electrical installation.

And further orders and prescribes that the fees for examining testing and reporting to be paid to the State Electricity Commission of Victoria on application for approval of any article and on a demand by the Commission that any approved article be submitted for re-inspection shall be ascertained in accordance with the scale in the following table, and, moreover, that any person applying for approval of any article shall deliver to the State Electricity Commission of Victoria with his application for approval for the purposes of examining and testing such number of samples of each article for which approval is sought as is respectively set out in the final column of the said table, which samples (or their containers) shall be labelled in compliance with the Electrical Approvals Regulations—Approval of Equipment 1935.
