RELEASE OF PRISONERS ON RECOGNIZANCES TO PROSECUTE APPEALS TO GENERAL SESSIONS.

Complaints have been made by the Chief Commissioner of Police that much trouble and expense is being occasioned to his Department in tracing and re-arresting convicted persons who have been released from custody upon appearing before a Justice of the Peace and entering into a recognizance, without a surety or sureties, pursuant to sub-section (6) of section 137 of the Justices Act 1928, as amended by section 4 of the Justices Act 1935, to prosecute an appeal before a Court of General Sessions, but who have failed to appear and try such appeal.

It is considered that this, to a great extent, would be avoided if Justices of the Peace, before whom such recognizances are entered into, required, in all cases where the appellant has a past criminal record, that a surety or sureties be provided, and such Justices are therefore hereby enjoined to make appropriate inquiries from the police or gaol authorities concerning the appellant and to insist upon a surety or sureties being found in cases of the kind referred to.

Future cases in which such appellants are released on their own recognizances only, will be treated as an unreasonable exercise of the discretion conferred by the above-mentioned provisions and reported to the Attorney-General for his directions.

The Alexandra Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1928, dothereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Alexandra Urban District. Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, be less than Twenty shillings.

#### VOTING BY POST.

Obtaining of Forms of Application for Postal Rallot-papers.

274. (1) Any ratepayer for any municipality in which an election is about to be held whose name appears on the voters' roll for such muncipality who satisfies the returning officer—

- (a) that he resides at least 5 miles from the nearest poling place at which he is entitled to vote; or
- (b) that he has reason to believe that on the polling day during the hours of polling he will not be within 5 miles of the nearest polling place at which he is entitled to vote; or
- (c) that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally at any such polling place,

may before the polling day make application in the form B of the 25th Schedule or to the like effect to the returning officer for such municipality for a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers enabling him to vote through the post at such election instead of attending personally to tender his vote through thereat.

(2) In the case of an application on the ground that he has reason to believe that on the polling day, during the hours of polling, he will not be within 5 miles of the nearest polling place at which he is entitled to vote, the applicant shall state in his application the reason for such belief.

Application to be Signed in Presence of Authorized Witness. (3) With respect to applications for postal ballot-papers the following provisions shall have effect:—

- . (a) The following directions with respect to such applications shall be substantially observed:—
  - (i) When so much of the form of application as pre-cedes the places for the signatures has been filled in and otherwise completed, the ratepayer shall exhibit his form of application to an autho-

rized witness;
(ii) The ratepayer shall then, in the presence of the authorized witness, sign his name in his own handwriting on the form of application in the place provided for the signature of the rate-payer; and

(iii) The authorized witness shall then sign his name
in his own handwriting in the place provided
for the signature of the authorized witness, and
shall add the title under which he acts as an
authorized witness, his residence, and date;

- (b) An authorized witness shall not witness the signature of any ratepayer on any application for a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers unless the authorized
  - (i) has satisfied himself as to the identity of the

(i) has satisfied number ratepayer;
(ii) has seen the ratepayer sign the application in the ratepayer's own handwriting; and
(iii) knows that the statements contained in the application are true, or has satisfied himself, (whether by inquiry from the ratepayer or otherwise) that the said statements are true.

Authorized Wilness Not to Induce, &c., Persons to Apply for Postal Ballat-papers.

(c) An authorized witness shall not persuade or induce or associate himself with any person in persuading or inducing any person to make application for a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers.

Authorized Witness Not to Visit Ratepayer to Witness Signature to Application except on Account of Ill-health or Infirmity

- (d) An authorized witness shall not-
- (i) visit any ratepayer for the purpose of witnessing the signature of such ratepayer to his application for a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers,
- (ii) witness the signature of any ratepayer to any such application in any place other than the ordinary residence or place of business of the authorized witness:

Provided that if any ratepayer desires to make application for a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers and is unable on account of ill-health or infirmity to present himself before an authorized witness, any member of the Police Force or other authorized witness, when so requested by any such ratepayer in writing, may visit such ratepayer for the purpose of witnessing his signature to such application.

#### Penalty.

(e) Every authorized witness guilty of any contravention of or failure to observe any of the provisions of this sub-section as applied shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds, or to imprisonment for a term of not more than three months.

(f) A list containing the names of all applicants for postal ballot-papers and the respective addresses to which they have been requested to be sent, shall be posted for public inspection outside the office of the returning officer of the district for which they are issued.

On Application, Returning Officer to Supply Postal Ballot-paper or Postal Ballot-papers.

paper or Postal Ballot-papers.

276. (1) (a) On receiving from any ratepayer an application for a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers, the returning officer, having ascertained that the name of the applicant is upon the voters' roll to be used at the election for the nunicipality specified in the application, and that the applicant is not prohibited from voting, and if satisfied that the application is properly signed by the applicant and is properly witnessed, and that the applicant is entitled according to the statements contained in his application to a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers, shall deliver to the applicant or post to him at the postal address named in the application a postal ballot-paper (with a counterfoil attached), or if such applicant appears by the yoters' roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then

so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of so many panet-papers as may be equal to one member of votes not exceeding three which such applicant so appears to be entitled to give in the form or to the effect of the 26th Schedule, together with an envelope addressed to such returning officer at the polling place at which he intends to preside. Such envelope shall be marked "Postal Ballot paper".

(b) If the returning officer is not satisfied that the application is properly signed by the applicant, or that the application is properly witnessed, or that the applicant is entitled to vote by post, he shall forthwith post to the applicant a notice in the form of the 28th Schedule or to the like effect.

#### Folding of Ballot-paper.

(2) Each ballot-paper before being enclosed shall be folded to the counterfoil.

#### Effect of Immaterial Error.

277. No application for a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers shall, if properly signed by the applicant and properly witnessed, be deemed insufficient or invalid by reason only that in such application there is an omission or incorrect or insufficient description or misdescription in respect of any of the particulars required by law to be contained therein, if the returning officer is satisfied that the applicant is entitled to a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers.

#### Initialing and Numbering of Ballot-papers.

278. (1) The returning officer shall-

- (a) initial each postal ballot-paper issued;
  (b) write on the back thereof the number and (if the case so requires) the special mark required by section 141 of the Local Government Act 1928, and in the manner thereby respectively prescribed; and
  (c) keep and number the applications therefor in consecutive order, writing the corresponding number on the counterfoil of the ballot-paper.
- (2) On the counterfoil the returning officer shall also write the number on the voters' roll of the ratepayer to whom the postal ballot-paper is issued

# Record of Issue of Voting by Postal Ballot-paper or Postal Ballot-papers.

279. (1) 'The returning officer shall on the voters' roll to be used at the election for the municipality to which such postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers relate note opposite the applicant's name wherever it appears the fact that such postal ballot-paper has or postal ballot-papers have been issued to such applicant, and the date of such issue.

#### Notification to Presiding Officers.

(2) In case there is not time to note the fact of the issue of any postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers on every such roll on which such applicant's name appears which is to be used at the election, the returning officer shall in such manner as he thinks fit immediately notify such issue to the deputy returning officer at every polling place for such municipality at which a roll is to be used on which such applicant's name appears.

#### Mode of Voting by Means of Postal Ballot-papers.

280. The following directions for regulating voting by means of postal ballot-papers shall be substantially observed:—

- (i) The voter shall exhibit his postal ballot-paper (in blank) to an authorized witness;
- (2) The voter shall, in the presence of the authorized witness, (2) The voter shall, in the presence of the authorized witness, but so that the witness cannot see the vote, write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance, and write the figure 1 against such surname, and also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates and the figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite the respective names of all such remaining candidates so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference for each such candidate;

Provided that at any election where there are only two candidates a ballot-paper shall be deemed to be sufficiently marked if marked so as to indicate the voters' first preference

- (3) In the case of more candidates than one having the same surname, the voter shall also insert in the ballot-paper the christian or other names of the candidate for whom he votes, and if the surname and christian or other names of two or more candidates are the same they shall be distinguished by the addition of their residence and occupation;
- (4) If the voter's sight is so impaired that he is unable to vote without assistance, the authorized witness, at the request of the voter shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper and shall (if the voter so desires) mark the same in the presence of another person;
- (5) The voter shall then refold the ballot-paper and fasten
- (6) The voter shall then sign his name in his own hand-writing on the counterfoil in the place provided for the signature of the voter;

- (7) The authorized witness shall then sign his name in his own handwriting in the place provided for the signature of the witness, and shall add the title under which he acts as an authorized witness, his residence, and the date;
- (8) The voter shall then place the ballot-paper with the counterfoil attached, or ballot-papers each with counterfoil attached, into the envelope addressed to the returning officer. fasten the envelope in the presence of the authorized witness, and post it.

#### Duty of Authorized Witness.

- 281. (1) The authorized witness shall-
- (a) see that the foregoing directions are substantially complied with;
- (b) refrain from looking at the vote given by the voter except where the voter cannot vote without assistance and the voter requests his assistance;
- (c) not disclose any knowledge officially acquired by him touching the vote of the voter save in answer to some question which he is legally bound to answer, or in compliance with the express provisions of the law relating to elections of councillors for municipalities. cipalities.

Witnessing Signature to Postal Ballot-paper or Counterfoil.

- (2) An authorized witness shall not-
- (a) visit any voter for the purpose of witnessing the signature of such voter to his postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers;
- (b) witness the signature of any voter to his postal ballotpaper or postal ballot-papers at any place other than the ordinary residence or place of business of the authorized witness; or
- (c) witness the signature of any voter to his postal ballotthress the signature of any voter to his postal bandi-paper or postal ballot-papers imbess the authorized witness has satisfied himself as to the identity of the voter and has seen the voter sign the counter-foil or counterfoils in the voter's own handwriting:

Provided that if any voter has received a postal ballot-papers or postal ballot-papers, and is unable, on account of ill-health or infirmity, to present himself before an authorized witness, any member of the Police Force or other authorized witness, when so requested by any such voter, in writing, may visit such voter for the purpose of witnessing his signature to such postal ballot-papers.

#### Penalty.

(3) Every authorized witness guilty of any contravention of any of the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds, or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term of not more than three months.

#### Mistakes in Spelling Immaterial.

282. No postal ballot-paper shall be rejected because of any mistake in spelling the name of a candidate if the intention is clear.

Ratepayer who has Received Postal Ballot-paper or Postal Ballot-papers Not to Vote Personally Without Giving up

- 283. (1) Except as provided in the next succeeding section, no ratepayer to whom a postal ballot-paper for any election has or postal ballot-papers have been sent shall be entitled to vote personally at any poll unless he previously gives up such postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers in blank form to the returning officer or deputy at the polling place at which he is entitled to vote.
- (2) Such officer shall immediately cancel any such postal ballot-paper and retain it.

Provision when Ratepayer claims to vote, although Postal Ballot-paper already issued.

- Ballot-paper atready issued.

  284. (1) If a ratepayer to whom a postal ballot-paper appears to have been sent states that he has not received such postal ballot-paper and claims to vote personally at any polling place within the municipality to which such postal ballot-paper relates, the returning officer or deputy at such booth may take from such ratepayer a declaration in the form of the Twenty-ninth Schedule or to the like effect. Thereupon such ratepayer shall be entitled to vote personally at such poll and his vote shall be taken in the ordinary way.
- (2) If such vote is received by the deputy returning officer (2) If such vote is received by the deputy returning officer of the fact of such ratepayer having voted personally and shall forward the declaration to the returning officer with the ballot-papers, and if any postal ballot-paper purports to have been received from the same ratepayer such postal ballot-paper shall be rejected at the counting of the votes and the returning officer shall state thereon the reason of such rejection.

Additional Question to be put on Tender of Vote Personally.

285. (1) The returning officer or deputy shall before any person personally tendering his vote at any election for any municipality receives a hallot-paper or hallot-papers (but not afterwards), put to such person the following question in addition to any others he may lawfully put:—

Have you received a postal ballot-puper or postal ballot-pupers enabling you to vote at the election for a councillor or councillors (as the case may be) for the Ward (or Riding) of the to-day (In the case of an adjourned pull the day from which the pull was adjourned should also be named in the question.)

#### Refusat, &c., to Answer.

(2) Every person having tendered his vote when such question is put as aforesaid who refuses or omits distinctly to answer the same, and every person who answers the question in the affirmative but does not deliver up his postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers, in blank form, shall b-and be deemed prohibited from voting then and afterwards at such election, and shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term of not more than one month.

#### Penalty for False Answer.

(3) Every person who wilfully makes a false answer to such question put as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term of not more than three mouths.

Inclusion of Votes through the Post at close of Poll.

286. When immediately upon the close of any poll the returning officer is proceeding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate, the returning officer shall produce unopened all envelopes containing postal ballot-papers received by him through the post up to the close of the poll, and such envelope shall be opened in the presence of the scrutineers present and poll clerk (if any) but of no other person, and shall be dealt with as follows, namely:—

(a) The returning officer shall produce all applications

- h as follows, namely:—

  (a) The returning officer shall produce all applications for postal ballot-papers;

  (b) The returning officer, without unfolding each postal ballot-paper or allowing it to be inspected, shall compare the signature of the voter on the counterfoil with the signature to the application and allow the scrutineers to inspect the same, and the returning officer shall determine whether or not the signature on the postal ballot-paper is that of the applicant.

  (c) If the postal ballot-paper is allowed by the returning officer he shall tear off the counterfoil without seeing the names of the candidate or candidates voted for.
- the names of the candidate or candidates voted for, and shall insert the folded postal ballot-paper in a ballot-hox separate from that used during the polling; and when all such postal ballot-papers have been so inserted the counting of the votes recorded therein shall commence:
- (d) Any postal hallot-paper not witnessed as required by these provisions as applied shall be disallowed by the returning officer:
  (c) The returning officer shall attach all the counterfoils
- together;

  (f) The list of the number of votes received by each candidate shall show separately the votes tendered personally and the votes given by postal ballot-
- papers:

  (g) If the returning officer disallows a postal ballot-paper then such ballot-paper shall be included in a sealed parcel of ballot-papers which shall be set aside for separate custody and transmitted to the clerk of the municipality.

Applications and Counterfoils to be forwarded to The Clerk of the Municipality after Declaration of Poll and to be Open for Inspection.

288. Notwithstanding anything in the Local Government Act

(a) All applications for postal ballot-papers and all counterfoils of postal ballot-papers received by a returning

  - (ii) that the same, if an application was received by the returning officer (at the election to which endorsement and writing relate), and that the postal ballot-paper the counterfoil of which bears the application number corresponding with the

    (iii) that the same, if a counterfoil, was the counterfoil of the postal ballot-paper used at the said election and bearing the roll number corresponding with the roll number written on the counterfoil.

#### Certain Offences to be Bribery.

289. The following persons shall be deemed guilty of

(a) Every person who directly or indirectly makes overtures to any person for the acquiring by gift or purchase or who acquires by gift or purchase from any person any postal ballot-paper; and
(b) every ratepayer who directly or indirectly makes overtures to any person for the giving away or parting with the possession of or selling any postal ballot-paper or who gives away any such paper or who sells or (except as in this Division as applied provided) parts with the possession of any postal ballot-paper.

#### Making False Application a Misdemeanour.

290. If in any application for a postal ballot-paper person makes any false statement or if any person applies for a postal ballot-paper to which some other person is entitled he shall be guitty of a misdemeanour and shall be liable to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term of not more than two years.

#### False Declaration Periuru.

291. Every person who wilfully makes and subscribes any declaration for the purposes of this Division as applied, the same being untrue or false in any particular, shall be liable to the penalties of perjury.

Inducing Disclosure of Vote by Post, &c., an Offence.

- 292. Every person who—

  (a) directly or indirectly requires, induces, or attempts to induce any person to show by producing his postal hallot-paper for whom he intends to vote at any election; or
  - (b) unless authorized by this Division as applied writes the name or names of any candidate or candidates in any postal bullot-paper not issued to such person; or
     (c) opens any envelope addressed to a returning officer not being duly authorized so to do by such returning officer—

shall be quilty of an offence, and shall be liable to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term of not more than one year.

Inducing Persons to Vote for any Particular Candidate by Bribery or Intimidation.

- 293. (1) Every person who requires, induces, or attempts to induce any person in his employment to obtain a postal ballot-paper with the intention of influencing such person by bribery or intimidation to record his vote in favour of any particular candidate shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a ponalty of not more than Fifty pounds, to be recovered in a summary way before a court of petty sessions by any person who sues for the same.
- (2) Bribery or intimidation shall for the purposes of this section include any promise or threat either expressed, implied, or understood of any benefit or disadvantage to accrue directly or indirectly to such person from such first-mentioned person

#### Authorized Witnesses.

294. The following persons being resident in Victoria shall be authorized witnesses in and for Victoria within the meaning of this Division as applied:—

- a) All returning officers and electoral registrars appointed under any Act relating to elections for the Legislative Council or the Legislative Assembly; all postmasters or postmistresses or persons in charge of post offices; all police magistrates; all justices; all commissioners for taking declarations and affidavits; all head teachers of State schools; all members of the Police Force; all clerks of petty sessions; all railway stationmasters; all councillors of and the clerk or secretary of any city, town, borough, or shire; all barristors and solicitors; and all legally qualified medical practitioners.
  (b) All persons or classes of persons employed in the
- (b) All persons or classes of persons employed in the Public Service of Victoria who are appointed by the Governor in Council to be authorized witnesses within the meaning of this Division as applied.

No person who is a candidate for any election shall be an authorized witness at or in connexion with that election.

REGULATION FOR THE ELECTION OF A MEMBER TO FILL A CASUAL VACANCY IN THE COUNCIL OF AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

WHEREAS by section 17 of the Agricultural Colleges 1ct 1928, it is provided that the election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education to fill any casual vacancies shall be conducted under Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council: And whereas a vacancy has occurred in the said Council by the death of Thomas Parkin: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

2. The Regulations governing the election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education made by the Governor in Council on 16th May, 1928, shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to the election to fill the casual vacancy as aforesaid.

## REGULATIONS AMENDING THE FOOD AND DRUG STANDARDS REGULATIONS 1935.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1936 and shall come into operation on publication in the Government Gazette.

2. Regulation 6 (2) (b) is hereby amended by the addition of the following provise:—

Provided that where a company is incorporated in accordance with the appropriate law of any State or the Commonwealth of Australia the inclusion in the label of the registered name of the corporation shall be deemed to comply with the requirements of this paragraph.

3. Regulation 18 (1) is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph (c):—

(c) Every package of flour containing any of the additions permitted by paragraph (b) of this sub-clause shall bear a label in which shall be written in letters of not less than twelve points the words "This flour contains improver."

4. Regulation 25 (3) is hereby amended by repealing the words "Its diastasic power shall comply with the requirements as prescribed for malt extract by sub-clause (2) of this Regulation."

5. Regulation 28 (9) is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

Egg Pulp.

- (9) Egg pulp shall be prepared and packed as prescribed hereunder:—
  - (a) All eggs shall be individually submitted to the candling test and every egg found to be unsound or abnormal in appearance shall be rejected.

(b) Every egg shall be broken singly by hand into a small vessel capable of being easily cleansed and effectively sterilized by heat.

(c) Whenever an unsound or abnormal egg is broken into any vessel such vessel shall not be used again until it has been cleansed and sterilized.

(d) The pulp shall be blended and strained and packed in new containers and such containers shall be removed forthwith after being packed to the refrigerator and reduced to a temperature of five (5) degrees below zero Centigrade (23 degrees Fahrenheit) as soon as possible and maintained at that temperature until removed for use.

6. Regulation 33 (1)(d) is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

(d) (i) Where the percentage of fatty solids as determined by the Babcock or Gerber test is above the prescribed standard it shall not be necessary to determine the proportion of fatty solids by the method properlied by Baryleion 89 (1)

solids by the method prescribed by Regulation 89 (1).

(ii) Where a sample complies with the requirements of paragraph (b) of sub-clause (1) of this Regulation in respect of solids not fat the determination of the freezing point shall not be mandatory.

7. Regulation 43 (17) (d) is hereby amended by the repeal of the words "three-tenths of".

8. Regulation 51 (4) is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

MILK TOE BLOCKS AND CREAM TOE BLOCKS.

(4) (a) Milk ice blocks are preparations of milk or milk and water with or without sugar glucose and fruit juice frozen in any shape and shall contain not less than fifty parts per centum of milk.

- (b) Cream ice blocks are preparations of cream or of cream and milk with or without water sugar glucose and fruit juice and shall contain not less than ten parts per centum of milk fat.
- 9. Regulation 51 (5) is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:-

HEATING OF MILK, MILK, CREAM, AND MILK PRODUCTS.

- (5) All milk cream or milk products used for the manufacture of ice-cream flavoured ices or ice-blocks shall be pasteurized or boiled immediately prior to such manufacture.
- 10. Regulation 51 (6) (b) is hereby amended by inserting the word "and" before the word "raspberry" and deleting the words "and flavoured cordials."
- 11. Regulation 51 (7) is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:-

PERMITTED ADDITIONS TO ICE CREAM AND FLAVOURED ICES.

- (7) (a) Colouring and/or flavouring may be aded to ice-cream or flavoured ices without declaration.
- (b) Ice-cream and flavoured ices may contain gelatine in proportion not exceeding one part per centum.
- 12. Regulation 56 (3) is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:
  - (3) (a) Dried fruits may be bleached wth sulphur dioxide gas and treated with glycerine or an emulsion of liquid paraffin of a standard not lower than that prescribed by the British Pharmacopoeia 1914 or with olive oil emulsified with triethanolamine.
  - (b) The presence in or on dried fruit of not more than fourteen grains of sulphur dioxide per pound and not more than twenty grains of liquid paraffin or one-eighth of one grain of triethanolamine per pound shall not be deemed to be a contravention of the Regulations.
  - (c) Declaration of the presence of sulphur dioxide liquid paraffin or triethanolamine (if present in not greater proportion than prescribed in paragraph (b)) is not required.

  - 13. Regulation 75 is hereby amended by the addition of—

    (a) the words "or medicinal preparations" after the word

    "Drugs" in sub-clause (2);

    (b) the words "or medicinal preparation" after the word

    "drug" wherever occurring in sub-clause (3); and

(c) a new sub-clause (10) as follows:-

- (10) (a) Emulsio olei Morrhuae eum Hypophosphitibus A.P.F. (Emulsion of Cold Liver Oil with Hypophosphites) when ordered without further specification shall be deemed to comply with the standard prescribed by the A.P.F. if the product contains at least fifty parts per centum by volume of Cod Liver Oil and four grains each of calcium and sodium hypophosphites in each fluid ounce.
- (b) The product may be flavoured and emulsified in any desired manner.
- 14. Immediately following Regulation 98 the following Regulation is hereby inserted:
- 98A. DETERMINATION OF ALCOHOL OR PROOF SPIRIT IN SPIRITS, WINES, AND ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS.
  - A known volume of the sample at some convenient temperature shall be suitably distilled, the distillate being brought to a volume of the sample at the temperature at which it was measured by the addition of distilled water. The specific gravity of the distillate shall be determined by means of a pycnometer or specific gravity bottle at 60°/60° Fahrenheit. The proportion per centum of alcohol or of proof spirit shall then be determined by Thorpe's Alcoholometric Tables and subsequent calculation. Alternatively, the specific gravity of the distillate may be determined at 80°/80° Fahrenheit. when the proportion of alcohol or proof spirit shall be determined by reference to Specific Gravity of Spirits Tables at 80°/80° Fahrenheit of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise. REGULATIONS BY TRUSTEES OF LAND UNDER SECTION 182 OF LAND ACT 1928.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SHRINE OF REMEMBRANCE SITE IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

W HEREAS by a Crown grant issued in favour of Shrine of Remembrance Trustees (incorporated by the Shrine of Remembrance Site Act 1933) in respect of the reserve for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance in the City of Melbourne it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted shall be maintained and used as and for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance and offices and conveniences connected therewith and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 182 of the Land Act 1928 it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved permanently any Crown land for any public purposes whatsoever and has vested such land in trustees it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such landwith the approval of the Governor in Council to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section: Now therefore the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve in the City of Melbourne:—

- I. No person being in the Reserve shall at any time, unless he is authorized in writing so to do by the Trustees, sell or offer for sale, or advertise for sale, any article, whether in being or not in being, or earry on any trade or business or offer any services for remuneration.
- 2. No person shall do anything likely to damage, deface, or impair any property of the Trustees being a building, structure, erection, decoration, or other improvement or fixture, or part of any building, structure, erection, decoration improvement or fixture on the Reserve. The meaning of this regulation shall not be restricted by any more particular provision or provisions in these Regulations expressed or contained.
- 3. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, flower, fish or bird in the Reserve, or throw any stone or other missile, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottle, orange peel, paper, or litter of any kind, or light fire anywhere in the Reserve, or engage therein in any sport or game.
- 4. No vehicle, motor car, motor cycle, or cycle other than perambulators, go-carts, and children's cycles shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.
- 5. No person shall cause or allow any horse to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, or be ridden or exercised in any part thereof, except on some road (if any) expressly made available by the Trustees for horse traffic.
- 6. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct; and no person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Reserve. No person shall create or take part in any disturbance in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve after he has been lawfully ordered to keep off or to leave the Reserve by any member of the Police Force, or by any person generally or specially authorized by the Trustees to order or keep persons off the Reserve.
- 8. No public meetine, assembly for a fête, picnic, or concert. or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, and no public meeting shall take place in the Reserve except within the hours and for the purpose and under the charge of the persons which the Trustees have consented to in writing.
- 9. No person shall stand on or jump on or over any seat, gate, fence, or other structures, or climb any tree in the Reserve, or lie on any seat, or lie on the grass in an objectionable attitude, or stick bills on anything in the Reserve, or cut names, letters, or marks on any tree, seat, gate, post, or fence, or write thereon or otherwise deface the same or any property of the Trustees.
- 10. No person shall depasture any cattle, sheep, horse, or other animal in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees, and then only in such portions thereof and at such times as may be specified in such permission. All goats and poultry found in the Reserve may be destroyed by the Trustees.
- 11. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve by or with the authority of the Trustees, shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs, or for other purposes, without the consent of the person having charge thereof.
- 12. Children under the age of 12 years shall not be allowed to the Reserve unless accompanied by and in the direct charge of an adult.

- 13. No person shall offer any chair or seat for hire in the Reserve, or solicit or collect money or other valuable thing therein without permission, in writing, of the Trustees first had and obtained.
- 14. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of such Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION SITUATED BETWEEN KIEWA AVENUE AND CHANNEL RESERVE, AND BEING CROWN ALLOTMENT 226B, SECTION B, AT REDCLIFFS, PARISH OF MILDURA, COUNTY OF KARKAROOC, CONTAINING AN AREA OF 2 ACRES AND 19 PERCHES.

W HEREAS by the section 127 of the Closer Settlement Act 1928, power is given to the Closer Settlement Commission to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Closer Settlement Commission, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Mildura.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall onter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on. or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainment of any sort in the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall bet publicly, or carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management.

11. Persons hiring or renting any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, on the occasions of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make wead now demonster private systemed by such stand. ciosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such damage or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by those Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any parts therein which may be en-losed for plantations of young shrubs and trees.

13. The Committee of Management may let the Reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the maximum fee shall not exceed the sum of Three guineas per day, and such days shall be included in the twenty for which charge may be made for admission as set out in clause 1.

14. The Committee of Management may set apart any por-tion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or associa-

tion of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds

mittee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds so set apart.

15. The Committee of Management shall at no time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars and vehicles, and for the tethering of horses.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 127 of the Gloser Settlement Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and any person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he had been warned by any ballift of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, or any officer appointed by the trustees, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such balliff or member of the Police Force, or any officer appointed by the trustees, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Mildura as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

#### Midwives Act 1928.

#### NURSES BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Midwives Act, the following copy of the Supplement to the Midwives Register as at 31st December, 1935, is hereby published.

Sections 14 (a) and 15 (1) (a) indicate that the midwife holds a certificate in midwifery from the Women's Hospital, Melbourne, or such other certificate as is approved by the Board.

Section 14 (b) indicates that the midwife had been in bona fide practice, in Australia or New Zealand, for at least two years prior to December, 1915.

Section 14 (b) (ii) indicates that the midwife has been in bona fide midwifery practice, in some part of His Majesty's Dominions, for at least one year prior to December, 1915, and had passed such examinations as the Board requires.

Sections 14 (c) and 15 (1) (c) indicate that the midwife had completed the prescribed course of training and passed the prescribed examination.

Sections 15 and 16 (1) indicate that the midwife has been trained and registered in some part of His Majesty's Dominions in which there is in force an Act for the registration of midwives, or that she is enrolled or certificated by any Institution or Association in existence where the training and examination is in the opinion of the Board substantially equivalent to that prescribed under the Midwives Act, Victoria.

Section 16 (2) indicates that the midwife had passed an examination required by the Board or undergone supplementary training.

Section 3, Nurses Registration Act, and Section 4, Nurses Acts, indicate that in a locality where a hospital approved by the Nurses Board under the Midwives Act for the training of midwives was not available, a woman, being a registered nurse, had, under the direction of a medical practitioner, attended in childbirth not less than 50 women, and had, in the presence of a medical practitioner, personally conducted not less than twenty cases of childbirth, and had passed the prescribed examination.
