BANK HALF-HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder as special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

Bank Half-Holidays from the Hour of Twelve o'clock noon:—
WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF MARCH, 1936, at St. Arnaud and Somerville.

FRIDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF MARCH, 1936, at Wangaratta.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and in the first year of the reign of His Majesty King Edward VIII.
