Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BAG MAKERS BOARD.

Norz.—This Determination on the 24th April, 1936, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included within the said district; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since the 18th December, 1934, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to persons employed in making or repairing jute, hessian, or cotton bags, or in making or preparing wool packs, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 24th April, 1936, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
