MAIZE DECLARED A COMMODITY.

#### PROCLAMATION

\*\*Exc., &c., &c. \*\*C., &c. \*\*C., &c., &c. \*\*C., &c., &c. \*\*C., &c., &c. \*\*W HEREAS. by sub-section (1) of section 6 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, it is enacted that the Governor in Council when requested to do so by a petition signed (a) Where the number of producers of the product does not exceed Two hundred—by at least Fifty per centum of the total number of such producers; or (b) Where the number of producers plus Five per centum of the number by which the total number of such producers cannot be undered of such producers, plus Five per centum of the number by which the total number of such producers cannot be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act. And whereas the Governor in Council has been requested by a petition signed in accordance with the above-mentioned subsection to declare that Maize shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act. And whereas the said petition sets forth the particulars required by the provisions contained in sub-section (2) of section 6 of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by, and with the advice of the No. 91.—5335.—Price 6d.; Quarterly, 7s. 7d.; Half-Yearly, 15s. 2d.; Yearly, 30s. 4d.

#### MARKETING OF PRIMARY PRODUCTS ACT 1935.

PARTICULARS of a petition by producers of maize requesting the Governor in Council to declare by Proclamation that such product shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of the Marketing of Primary Products

- 1. That each of the petitioners is a producer of maize, which is a product within the meaning of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935.
- 2. That the petitioners, in pursuance of the said Act, by this petition request the Governor in Council to declare by Proclamation that maize shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of such Act.
- 3. That the petitioners request that the Marketing Board which may be constituted under the said Act in relation to the said commodity shall consist of five members.

The Minister of Agriculture is of the opinion that the following information with respect to the powers which will be exercisable by the said Marketing Board will sufficiently acquaint producers of the said commodity as to the nature of the said powers:—

Subject to the said Act and for the purposes thereof the

(a) may sell or arrange for the sale of the said commodity which is vested in or delivered or to be delivered to it and do all acts, matters, and things necessary or expedient in that behalf accordingly;

(b) may arrange for financial accommodation with the Government of the Commonwealth or with any bank or with any other institution or person approved by the Governor in Council, and give such securities for advances as are required by the said Government, bank, institution, or person;

(c) may do all acts, matters, and things necessary for or incidental to and may enter into contracts for or with respect to the transport, treatment, grading, processing, branding, labelling, storage, packing, or preparing for marketing of the commodity;

(d) may deduct from the net proceeds of the sale of the commodity an amount not exceeding One halfpenny in the pound of such proceeds for the purpose of establishing a reserve fund to be used for any purpose in connexion with the operations of the Board;

(e) may purchase, contract for the use of, or otherwise provide and hold any land required by the Board

(c) may purchase, contract for the use of, or otherwise provide and hold any land required by the Board and any personal property whatsoever;
(f) may contract for the use of or otherwise provide any huildings or structures and repair, equip, furnish, and maintain the same;
(g) (i) The Board shall out of the proceeds of the commodity disposed of by the Board make payments to each producer of the commodity delivered by him to the Board. Such payments shall be on the basis of the net proceeds of the sale of all the commodity of the same quality or standard delivered to the Board during or covering the periods of time as prescribed by Regulations. #### Travelling Expenses and Charges of Members.

1. In addition to the attendance fees payable under the above-mentioned Act, every member of the Committee, including the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman, shall, when travelling in the performance of his duties, be entitled to receive the following travelling expenses exclusive of any charges for any conveyance paid by him when so travelling.

#### Powers of Committee ..

3. Not less than twenty-four hours' notice of the intention of the Committee, or of any person appointed by them to-prosecute an inquiry, to enter and inspect any land, building, or place, or inspect any material shall be given to the owner or occupiers of such land, building, or place, or to the owner or person in possession of such material.

#### CITY OF BOX HILL.

#### BY-LAW NO. 66.—RESIDENTIAL FLATS,

A By-law of the City of Box Hill made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 66, for regulating and restraining the crection and construction of buildings and crections and for altering By-law No. 43 of the said City of Box Hill, and for other purposes.

I'N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Box Hill erder as follows:

1. Part I. of By-law No. 43 of the said City of Box Hill shall be altered as follows:

(a) By inserting immediately after the definition of "Fire resisting" the following words and definitions:—
 "Flat" means a suite of rooms used or intended or

adapted for use as a separate habitation and comprised in a building containing more than one flat.

"Flat Building" means a building containing more than one flat.

(b) By inserting immediately after the definition of "Temporary building" the following words and defini-

tions:"Wall" includes cross wall, external wall, internal wall, party wall, and party structure.

2. Clause 251 of By-law No. 43 of the said City of Box Hill is hereby repealed and the following clause substituted there-

251. In addition to any other provisions of this By-law thereunto applying, the following provisions shall apply to Flats and Flat Buildings, namely:—

(a) The walls of every Flat Building shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, or other approved fire-resisting material.

material.
