COMMISSION PASSED UNDER THE ROYAL SIGN MANUAL AND SIGNET, APPOINTING THE HONOURABLE SIR FREDERICK WOLLASTON MANN, KNIGHT, CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA, TO BE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA AND ITS DEPENDENCIES, IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

Edward the Eighth by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To Our Trusty and Well-beloved The Honourable Sir Frederick Wollaston Mann, Knight, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Our State of Victoria, Greeting:

We do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the said Sir Frederick Wollaston Mann, to be during Our pleasure Our Lieutenant-Governor of Our State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

II. And further, in case of the death, incapacity, or removal of Our Governor of Our said State, or of his departure from Our said State, or of his assuming the administration of the Government of Our Commonwealth of Australia, We do hereby authorize and require you to administer the Government of Our said State, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal, bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-ninth day of October 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in and over Our said State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, and in certain other Letters Patent under the Great Seal, bearing date at Westminster the Thirtieth day of April 1913, amending the same, or in any other Letters Patent adding to, amending or substituted for the same, and according to such Instructions as Our said Governor for the time being hath already received, or may hereafter receive from Us, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in Our said State.

III. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in Our said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this Thirtieth day of March, 1936, in the First Year of Our Reign.
