Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 (No. 3736).

MILK AREAS PROCLAIMED.—TOWN OF ARARAT AND BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 (No. 3736)* it is enacted that, on the recommendation of the Minister, any portion of the State of Victoria may be proclaimed a Milk Area by the Governor in Council: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is also enacted that the said Act shall have effect as regards any Milk Area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the Milk Areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine, and Port Fairy on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Honorable Edmond John Hogan, Minister of Agriculture, do by this my Proclamation declare that the municipal districts of the Town of Ararat and the Borough of Stawell, together with the whole of the premises of each and every dairy farm or dairy outside such municipal districts, wherever situated, from which milk is sold within such municipal districts, shall constitute Milk Areas to be called the Ararat Milk Area and the Stawell Milk Area respectively: And I do further declare that the 1st day of July, 1937, shall be the day on which the Act and all Regulations and Orders now in force, or which may from time to time be made under the said Act, shall come into operation and be of full force and effect in such Milk Areas.

In Day Time.—A ball suspended from the yardarm of the Dockhead Flagstaff 57 feet above high water.

In Night Time.—An occulting red light exhibited on the Dockhead Flagstaff 50 feet above high water.

(c) SIGNAL FOR VESSELS MOORED IN VICTORIA DOCK AND IN THE RIVER YARRA.

In Day Time.—A ball suspended above a cone from the yardarm of the Dockhead Flagstaff 57 feet above high water.

In Night Time.—Three occulting red lights 5 feet apart in a vertical line on the Dockhead Flagstaff, the lowest being 50 feet above high water.

Characteristics of Lights.—Light, 5 secs.

(2) No vessel moored in Maribyrnong River shall leave its berth without the permission of the officer in charge of the Control Station at Dockhead.

3. After Regulation 51 of the Principal Regulations, the following Regulation is inserted:—

In Day Time.—The word WHISTLE shown in red letters on a white ground on No. 12 beacon on the starboard hand downstream from the Ferry, and on No. 19 beacon on the port hand upstream from the Ferry.

In Night Time.—An occulting red Neon light illuminating No. 12 beacon, and an occulting green Neon light illuminating No. 19 beacon above referred to.

REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 46 of the *Vermis and Noxious Weeds Act 1928*, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the thirtieth day of June, 1932 (published in the *Government Gazette* on the sixth day of July, 1932, page 1513) so far as they relate to "Travelling Expenses," clauses (6) and (7), and direct that the following Regulations for Travelling Allowances, to take effect as and from the first day of July, 1937, be substituted therefor:—

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

(6) Officers and witnesses shall travel by railway whenever practicable, and claim the actual cost of fares. Whenever travelling by railway is not practicable officers and witnesses shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary and most economical means of conveyance upon furnishing receipts for such payment.

(7) An inspector, foreman, or workman attending a Court or when employed outside his district using his own motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or horse-drawn conveyance, shall be paid a mileage rate as set out hereunder:—

	For the first 5,000 miles in a financial year.	Mileage over 5,000 miles in a financial year.
Motor cars over 9 h.p. . .	4½d. per mile. . .	4d. per mile.
Motor cars 9 h.p. or under . .	3½d. per mile. . .	3d. per mile.

Horse-drawn conveyances, 1 or 2 horses—4d. per mile.		

NOTE.—H.p. means horse-power as registered in accordance with Regulations under the Motor Car Act.

BY-LAW No. 106.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1928, to amend By-law No. 63 of the said city as amended by By-laws Nos. 64, 65, 69, 70, 71, 72, 75, 77, 78, 80, 82, 84, 85, 86, 91, 93, 97, 98, 99, 100, 102, 103, 104, and 105.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick, with the approval of the Governor in Council, do hereby order as follow:—

(1) This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 63 of the City of Brunswick, and any By-law amending the same, all of which By-laws and this By-law may be cited together as the residential area By-laws.

(2) After the words "and all lands lying within a distance of 100 yards of Melville-road" appearing in sub-clause "g" of clause 1 of By-law No. 63, there shall be added the following—except as to all that piece of land commencing at the building line at the north-west corner of Daly-street and Smith-street; thence westerly along the northern building line of Smith-street for a distance of 120 feet; thence northerly for a distance of 550 feet; thence easterly 10 feet; thence northerly 268 feet; thence easterly 110 feet to western building line of Daly-street; thence southerly 818 feet along the western building line of Daly-street to the point of commencement.

(3) After sub-clause 46 of By-law No. 105, there shall be added the following sub-clauses 47 and 48:—

No. 47. All that piece of land commencing at a point on the north side of Weston-street 262 feet east of the east building line of Charles-street; thence northerly a distance of 135 feet; thence easterly 75 feet; thence southerly 135 feet to the northern building line of Weston-street; thence westerly along the northern building line of Weston-street to the point of commencement.

No. 48. A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made under the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 116, for repealing By-laws Nos. 103 and 104, and for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of any such residential area the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in this By-law.

Clause 3.—Prohibits the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements within such residential areas, but not precluding the use of any dwelling-house or part thereof for the purposes of certain professions specified, nor the use of any dwelling-house by any single worker carrying on his or her profession or occupation without any employee or assistant.

Clause 4.—Permits the continuance of usage of any land or building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law and the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose.

Clause 5.—Makes provision as to pulling down and removal of buildings erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to the By-law, and the sale and application of the proceeds of sale of the materials of such buildings.

Clause 6.—Provides penalties in addition to those provided for in the *Local Government Act 1928* and this By-law for continuing offences.

The said By-law was approved by the Governor in Council on the fifteenth day of June, 1937.

SHIRE OF MILDURA.
BY-LAW No. 76.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Mildura made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1923* and under Part XXV. of the said Act, and numbered 76, for the following purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) For regulating the market-place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto.
- (b) For fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held.
- (c) For licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, and for fixing (subject to the limitation mentioned in the *Local Government Acts*) the dues to be paid for such licences.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Cattle market" or "market" means and includes the cattle market situated at the intersection of Etiwanda and Dow avenues, and known as the "Mildura Shire Abattoir Sale Yards."

"Council" means and includes the Council of the Shire of Mildura.

"Inspector" means and includes the officer appointed by the Council of the Shire of Mildura to act as Market Inspector at the cattle market, and every officer appointed by the said Council as his assistant.

"Stock" means and includes any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, foal, bull, bullock, cow, heifer, steer, calf, ass, mule, sheep, ewe, wether, ram, lamb, goat, or pig.

"Summer months" mean and include the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March in every year.

"Winter months" mean and include the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September in every year.

When Open.

2. The cattle market shall be open for the reception and delivery of stock on every second Tuesday (except Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day) from sunrise to sunset from Tuesday, 1st June, 1937.

Duties of Inspector.

3. The Inspector's duties shall be as follows:—

- (a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of all Acts and Regulations relating to markets are duly observed.
- (b) To demand and receive, sue for, and recover, all market tolls and dues, fines, and penalties.
- (c) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing stock to the cattle market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Inspector to be most convenient.
- (d) To preserve order and cleanliness within the cattle market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or being guilty of indecent conduct therein.

Removing or Releasing Stock.

4. No person shall release any stock from the cattle market, or remove the same from one part thereof to another, without the authority of the Inspector.

Payment of Dues before Removal.

5. Every person placing stock in the cattle market for sale shall be responsible for all market dues, tolls, and charges accruing thereon; and in no case shall any stock be taken out of such market until all market dues, tolls, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid, or unless the Inspector has first granted reasonable time (not exceeding one month) for such payment.

Food to be Provided.

6. If any stock brought to the cattle market for sale be not removed within 24 hours after the close of such market, such stock shall be provided with proper and sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in such market for sale if such stock be unsold, but if sold then by the purchaser thereof. The Inspector shall have full power to purchase feed for the stock should same be not supplied and to charge the owner the full cost of supplying same.

Notifying the Inspector.

7. The owner of or agent for stock intended to be brought to the cattle market for sale on a Tuesday shall notify the number in writing to the Inspector before 11 a.m. on the previous Monday, and shall be responsible for the stallages, tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect of the number of stock so notified. If from accident or some other good and sufficient cause a delay should arise in bringing such stock to such market, the Inspector shall have power to forego payment thereof.

Lots for Priority of Sale, &c.

8. All owners of or agents for stock intended for sale desiring to have the privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale shall notify the number in writing to the Inspector by 11 a.m. on every previous Monday, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in respect of the number of stock so notified. If from accident or some other good and sufficient cause a delay should arise in bringing such stock to the market the Inspector shall have the power to forego payment thereof.

Order of Sale.

9. The Inspector shall at the cattle market give out publicly the order of auction sales at the hour appointed for the arrival of stock therein.

Late Arrivals at Draw.

10. Any agent arriving after his allotted time of starting may enter his sheep, lambs, and cattle, and shall then take last place in the order of sale, and shall pay to the Inspector a fine of £2 2s.

11. The Inspector's decision shall be final as to which cattle and calves are to be offered in the store cattle and calf sales respectively.

Sale of Fat Sheep.

12. The sale by auction of fat sheep shall commence at 1 p.m. all the year round.

Sale of Lambs.

13. The sale by auction of lambs shall commence immediately upon the conclusion of the fat sheep, and lambs shall be penned and sold separately from fat sheep.

Sale of Pigs.

14. Time to be allotted at the rate of 100 to the hour. No auctioneer to sell for more than half-an-hour at a time. Failing completion of his sales in the time allotted, he shall be allotted half-time for the balance remaining unsold. *Store Pigs.*—Time allotted at the rate of 200 to the hour.

Sale of Store Sheep and Lambs.

15. Sheep and store lambs entered for store sale shall be penned in the yards set apart for the sale of stores, and the sale of such stores shall commence immediately after the sale of lambs or late arrivals of fat sheep and lambs as provided for in clause 19.

Sale of Fat Cattle, Cattle, and Calves.

16. The sale by auction of fat cattle, cattle, and calves shall commence immediately following the sale of all sheep, lambs, and pigs.

17. Time to be allotted at the rate of 60 to the hour, no auctioneer to sell for more than half-an-hour at a time. Any auctioneer having been allotted his full time, and failing to complete, shall be further allotted half-time for the balance remaining unsold.

Rotation of Sales, &c.

18. Any owner or agent withdrawing his fat sheep or lambs from auction sales or not being present by his auctioneer punctually to commence his auction sale, shall not be allowed to sell by auction until the remaining auction sales of fat sheep or lambs shall be completed. A corresponding rotation shall be observed with regard to calves, to cattle, or to any other stock to be auctioned.

Late Arrivals.

19. Any fat sheep or lambs which have been drawn for arriving by road or rail too late to be sold in the sale drawn by the auctioneer shall be allowed to be sold after fat sheep and lamb sales are completed.

Time.

20. Every auctioneer shall be allowed time at the rate of three minutes per pen of fat sheep and lambs (such pen not to contain less than 20 sheep or lambs) and two minutes per pen of store sheep and lambs, and should any auctioneer not complete his sale within such time allowance the stock remaining unsold shall not again be offered until the completion of all other auction sales of sheep and lambs of the same class and in the same order of drawing. The Inspector or his assistant shall blow a whistle when the auctioneer's time expires, and the auctioneer shall at once cease selling and the next auctioneer shall at once begin selling, provided that if upon his last pen the auctioneer whose time is expired may complete the sale of such pen. In any event, the next auctioneer shall commence selling immediately he is notified by the said Inspector or his assistant to do so.

21. The auctioneer drawing first sale shall be allowed five minutes starting time and two minutes shall be allowed between the last sale of fat sheep and the first sale of lambs, also between the last sale of lambs and the first sale of store sheep.

22. Every auctioneer shall be allowed time at the rate of 60 seconds per head of cattle and calves, and should any auctioneer not complete his sale within such time allowance the stock unsold shall not again be offered by auction until the completion of all other auction sales of the day of cattle. The Inspector or his assistant shall blow a whistle when the auctioneer's time expires, and such auctioneer shall at once cease selling except as provided in clause 20, and the next auctioneer shall at once begin selling.

Lists.

23. (a) Each agent or auctioneer shall hand in writing to the Inspector prior to starting the sale a list showing the number of fat sheep and lambs penned by him for sale by auction that day.

(b) Each agent or auctioneer shall supply to the Inspector fortnightly a list of stock drawn for and not penned or submitted for sale, together with the reason for same not being so penned or offered.

Store Stock.

24. No store stock is to be offered for sale in the fat stock sales; and the Inspector is to have full power to decide whether stock is to be offered in fat or store class. His decision is to be final.

Stock, &c., at Risk of Owner.

25. All stock placed in the yards or pens by the owner thereof or the agent shall be at the risk of such owner or agent, and the Council shall not under any circumstances incur any liability or responsibility in connexion therewith.

Centre Rails.

26. The centre rails between the sheep and lamb pens shall be reserved exclusively for the selling auctioneer and clerks, and the Inspector shall be empowered to order off any person trespassing thereon.

Fat Sheep and Lamb Sales.

27. The opening sales of fat sheep and lambs shall commence at the first pen allotted to the auctioneer, and continue in succession to the last pen. The pens shall be allotted to the auctioneer in accordance with the number of fat sheep and lambs drawn for respectively and in the order of sale.

Timekeeper and Arbitrator.

28. The Inspector shall act as timekeeper and arbitrator in respect of all disputes, and his decision thereon shall be absolutely binding on all parties concerned. He shall count the fat cattle penned for or by each auctioneer and promptly notify the auctioneer concerned of any deficiency under clauses 8 and 10. He shall collect the dues and fines referred to in clauses 8 and 10 for such numbers as are short, and the dues and fines so collected shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.

Guarantee.

29. Each agent is required to undertake that he will upon demand pay to the Inspector such sum, not exceeding £2, as the Inspector may demand, for every breach or non-observance of the By-law, and the Inspector shall be the sole and final judge as to whether such breach has taken place.

30. Any agent refusing to abide by and carry out the directions regarding the decision of the Inspector shall be fined the sum of £2 for each offence.

Penning Fat and Store Sheep Separately.

31. Each agent shall set out on lists for draw on Tuesday morning fat and store sheep and lambs separately, and same shall be penned separately and sold separately, and in cases of doubt the Inspector's decision shall be final.

Cattle, Horses, &c., Exposed for Sale.

32. No cattle, horses, or other animal shall be publicly sold or exposed for sale in the auction yards or premises of auctioneers or cattle salesmen situate within the Shire except on the following conditions:—

(a) That the consent and authority of the Council of the said Shire be first had and obtained for such purpose.

(b) That an undertaking be given by the auctioneer or salesman obtaining such permission as aforesaid to pay tolls and dues as prescribed for the said cattle market to the said Council, or to such person or persons as the said Council may authorize to receive the same, and also to observe all the By-laws, Rules, and Regulations now made or hereafter to be made by the said Council in respect to such sales in the auction yards or premises of such auctioneers or cattle salesmen as aforesaid.

Resisting the Inspector.

33. Any person who may resist the Inspector or Inspectors in the discharge of their duty shall independently of any other penalty which he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, upon conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

34. No person shall resist or obstruct the Market Inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, or remove any cattle from one part of the said market to any other part of the said market without the consent of the Market Inspector; nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

Penalty.

35. If any person by wilful act or default contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law he shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law, and liable on conviction for a first offence to a penalty not exceeding £10, and for any second or subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.

- (f) Premises at or in any part of which eggs for sale are received or stored for the purpose of being chilled—One pound (£1).
- (g) Cattle sale yards—One pound (£1).
- (h) For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

3. By-law No. 7 is hereby repealed.
