Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CIGAR TRADE BOARD.

This Determination on the 21st July, 1937, applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of Cigar Making," has made the following Determination, viz.:—

(1) That on the 21st July, 1937, the last and all previous Determinations of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) OVERTIME.—That any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 44 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(6) WAITING TIME.—When the hours of daily employment, as posted in the factory as required by the Factories and Shops Act, are altered or departed from by the employer, and notice of such alteration or departure of at least 16 hours has not been given to all employees, such employees shall be paid for all time lost through such alteration or departure at the following rates, viz.:—Piece-workers, 2s. 6d. per hour; all other employees at ordinary rates.

(7) HOLIDAYS.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay, viz.—Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day and Melbourne Cup Day—when such holidays are observed on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.

Pieceworkers shall be granted the same holidays as are granted to weekly wage employees.

Adult pieceworkers shall be paid for such holidays at the "All Others" rate provided for weekly wage employees.

Juvenile pieceworkers shall be paid at the rates provided for such employees under the age scale in Clause 3.

Provided that an employee who is voluntarily absent on the working day immediately preceding and the day immediately succeeding any one of the above-mentioned holidays, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION REGULATIONS 1937
(No. 2).

THE Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Hairdressers Registration Act 1936* (No. 4396), doth hereby make the additional Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the “Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937 (No. 2),” and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

APPOINTMENT OF PRINCIPALS.

2. (1) Upon every premises in which a business of hairdressing of any prescribed class or classes is carried on there shall be present and in control of the hairdressing carried on in such premises during business hours at least one person who is registered in respect of the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing carried on in such premises, and who for the purposes of the Act shall be the principal of the business.

(2) Within one month of the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations the owner or proprietor of every hairdressing business shall nominate a principal or principals (as the case may require) in respect of each premises in which such owner or proprietor carries on business, and shall within the period aforesaid notify the Hairdressers Registration Board of such nomination in the form in the Schedule hereto, setting forth the full name and address of each principal so nominated.

(3) If a principal so nominated ceases to act as principal, such owner or proprietor shall within seven days notify the Board of the fact and furnish it with the particulars required by these Regulations in respect of the principal appointed in his place.

(4) These Regulations shall not apply in the case of a business—

(a) of which the owner or proprietor thereof or one of the owners or proprietors thereof is during business hours in direct personal control as a principal and as a principal is registered in respect of the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing practised in connexion with the said business; or

(b) wherein only one registered hairdresser is practising on the premises.

Masseurs Registration Act 1928 (No. 3728).—Victoria.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE TRAINING AND EXAMINATION OF MASSEURS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Masseurs Registration Act 1928* (No. 3728) and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Masseurs Registration Board of Victoria doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Masseurs Regulations 1937, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. All Regulations heretofore made relating to matters herein are hereby repealed.
3. The curriculum prescribed by the Masseurs Regulations 1932 is hereby amended by the addition of the following:—

EDUCATIONAL GYMNASTICS.

A course of at least 20 lectures and demonstrations of one hour each, including particularly posture work.

FIRST AID.

A course of training in First Aid to be taught in conjunction with Bandaging.

4. The prescribed special course of training for blind persons shall be the course of training for blind persons of St. Dunstan's Hostel for Blinded Soldiers and Sailors and the National Institute for the Blind, England, and/or the Chartered Society of Massage and Medical Gymnastics, England, and/or the Australasian Massage Association.

5. The prescribed special examinations for blind persons shall be the examinations of the authorities prescribed in the immediately preceding regulation.

6. Every blind person who is an applicant for registration under the Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board of having completed such prescribed special course of training and passed the prescribed special examinations.

7. The fees to be paid to the Board by any person who is a candidate for examination shall be as follows:—

Examination in one subject—£1 1s.;

Examination in two subjects—£1 11s. 6d.;

with a further fee of 10s. 6d. for each extra subject: Provided that the total fees for examination at any one time shall not exceed the sum of £3 3s.

CLAUSES 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 36 (A), 37, AND 39 (A) AND
(B) OF REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS RE-
SCINDED AND REMADE.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clauses 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 36 (A), 37, and 39 (A) and (B) of Regulation XXI.—Scholarships, and in lieu thereof doth substitute the following, viz.:—

REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

Junior Technical Scholarships.

17. (a) There shall be awarded annually, on competitive examination, fifty Junior Technical scholarships, or any less number, amongst qualified candidates in attendance at State elementary schools and registered schools, in such proportions between and within the aforesaid groups of schools as the Director, with the approval of the Minister, may from time to time determine.

(b) Provided, however, that notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation, ten of the Junior Technical scholarships under clause 17 (a) may be awarded in 1938 only, to qualified applicants in attendance at State elementary schools, central classes, central schools, higher elementary schools, district high schools, junior technical schools, and registered schools, in such proportion as the Director, with the approval of the Minister, may determine.

18. (a) No Junior Technical scholarship under clause 17 (a) above shall be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will exceed twelve years and six months on the first day of January immediately succeeding the examination, and who has been a pupil of Grade VI. for more than twelve months immediately prior to the first day of January in the year in which the award is to be made.

(b) No Junior Technical scholarship under clause 17 (b) shall be awarded to any candidate whose age, as attested by a certificate of birth, will exceed fourteen years on the first day of January immediately succeeding the examination.

19. (a) Candidates for Junior Technical scholarships under clause 17 (a) shall be examined by means of a general intelligence test and by means of a written examination in the following subjects as prescribed for Grade VI. in State elementary schools, namely:—English (grammar, literature, composition, writing); arithmetic (written and mental), and such other subjects as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the Director, and announced in the *Education Gazette* and *Teachers' Aid*.

(b) Candidates from State elementary schools for Junior Technical scholarships under clause 17 (b) above shall be examined by means of a general intelligence test and by means of a written examination, in the following subjects, at a standard not higher than that prescribed for Grade VII. in State elementary schools, namely:—English, arithmetic, drawing, or such other subjects as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director and published in the *Education Gazette* and *Teachers' Aid*.

(c) Candidates from State central classes, central schools, higher elementary schools, and district high schools for Junior Technical scholarships under clause 17 (b) above shall be examined by means of a general intelligence test and by means of a written examination, in the following subjects, at a standard not higher than that prescribed for the first year of the course in district high schools, namely:—English, arithmetic, drawing, or such other subjects as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director and published in the *Education Gazette* and *Teachers' Aid*.

(d) Candidates from junior technical schools for Junior Technical scholarships under clause 17 (b) above shall be examined by means of a general intelligence test and by means of a written examination, in the following subjects, at a standard not higher than that prescribed for the first year of the course in junior technical schools, namely:—English, arithmetic, drawing, or such other subjects as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director and published in the *Education Gazette* and *Teachers' Aid*.

(e) Candidates from registered schools for Junior Technical scholarships under clause 17 (b) above shall be examined in the subjects prescribed in sub-clause (b) or (c) or (d) of this clause.

(f) Each candidate for a Junior Technical scholarship under clause 17 (a) above shall forward, with his application, a certificate from his head teacher showing that he has, during the year of the competitive examination, followed the full course of study prescribed for Grade VI.

(g) Each candidate for a Junior Technical scholarship under clause 17 (b) above shall forward, with his application, a certificate from his head teacher showing that he has, during the year of the competitive examination, followed the full course of study prescribed for Grade VII. in State elementary schools, or for the first year of the course in district high schools, or for the first year of the course in junior technical schools, or some higher approved course.

20. The Junior Technical scholarships under clause 17 (a) and (b) above shall be tenable up to three years under the following conditions, namely:—

(a) That the holder, at the commencement of the term immediately following the award of the scholarship, shall become, and thereafter during the currency of his scholarship shall remain, a student in a junior technical school or in the industrial course at an approved higher elementary school or district high school, or in an approved registered secondary school;

(b) That the holder shall obtain satisfactory reports as to his attendance, conduct, and progress from the head teacher of the school he is attending; and

(c) That the course of study followed by the holder shall be approved by the Director.

21. (a) Where the holder of a scholarship under clause 17 (a) or (b) above attends a junior technical school, or an approved higher elementary school, or a district high school, he shall receive free tuition thereat; and, in addition, there shall be granted to his head teacher an allowance of £4 per annum towards the holder's expenses for school requisites.

(b) Where the holder of a scholarship under clause 17 (a) or (b) above attends an approved registered secondary school, he shall be granted an allowance of £12 per annum towards expenses of tuition and of school requisites.

36. (a) Except in special cases approved by the Minister, no scholarship or free place under clauses 1, 12, 17 (a), 17 (b), 22, or 23, above, and no free place under clause 31 (a) and (b) above shall be awarded to any candidate or applicant who, during the two years immediately preceding the first day of January in the year in which the scholarship or free place is to be awarded, has not been in continuous and regular attendance at a school in Victoria.

37. No scholarship or free place shall be awarded to any candidate who, at the competitive examination, does not obtain a satisfactory percentage of the possible marks. If, however, the number of candidates in any division or subdivision of scholarships under clauses 1, 12, 17 (a) and 17 (b) above, who obtain a satisfactory percentage of the possible marks, be less than the number of scholarships or free places allotted to such division or subdivision, the scholarships or free places unallotted may be awarded to candidates in any other division or subdivision.

39. (a) Where the holder of a scholarship or free place under clauses 1, 12, 17 (a) or 17 (b) above does not reside less than four miles from a school at which his scholarship or free place is tenable, the Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, allow him such sum (not exceeding £5 per annum) as will cover the cost of transit to and from school.

(b) Where it is necessary that the holder of a scholarship or free place under clauses 1, 12, 17 (a) or 17 (b) above shall reside apart from his parents or guardians, the Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, grant, in lieu of the cost of transit of such holder, an allowance for maintenance up to £26 per annum. If, however, the parents or guardians are in necessitous circumstances, the Minister may grant this allowance to holders not residing apart from their parents or guardians.

And the Honorable Sir John Harris, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF PRINCES PARK.

WHEREAS by Crown grant entered in the register-book, volume 600, folio 119908, and issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of the land therein described, and known as Princes Park, it is provided and declared that the said land (hereinafter called the said Park) and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be at all times thereafter maintained and used as and for a Public Park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas the Governor in Council did on the ninth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, in pursuance of section 183 of the *Land Act* 1915, appoint the Council of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Trustees) to be a Committee of Management of (*inter alia*) the said Gardens: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Trustees do hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of such portion of the said Park as is set apart for and hereinafter designated the Children's Wading Pool, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Park:—

PRINCES PARK CHILDREN'S WADING POOL.

Rules and Regulations for the Management of the Wading Pool.

1. The Children's Wading Pool shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Wading Pool, provided, however, that parents or other attendants shall be at liberty to enter the Wading Pool to watch over children who are in their charge.
3. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Wading Pool.
4. The Children's Wading Pool shall only be used for the purpose for which it is provided.
5. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose, and such paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall not be deposited in the Wading Pool.
6. Every person in the Children's Wading Pool shall obey the direction of any officer of the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.
7. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the Children's Wading Pool.
8. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, or any scooter in any part of the Children's Wading Pool, or bring any animal into the same.
9. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Wading Pool any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations or who wilfully damages the Wading Pool, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.
10. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act* 1928, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or Crown lands officer or servant of the Council or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

BY-LAW No. 81.

A By-law of the City of Northcote, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 81, for repealing By-law No. 40, and for controlling and managing and preserving public reserves of which the management is vested in the Council, and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and of all other powers in that behalf it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Northcote order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, the words "The Park" include each and every pleasure ground and place of public resort or public recreation mentioned and set out in clause 24 of this By-law: "Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Northcote; and "Cattle" shall have the meaning assigned thereto by the *Local Government Act* 1928.

2. No person shall pluck any flowers in or walk on any bed, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any fence or gate of the Park, or cut or in any way remove or damage any such fence or gate or any building or seat in the Park, or stick any bill, advertisement, or writing on any such fence, gate, building, or seat, or roll or throw any stone or missile in or upon, or remove any soil from, or enter any plot which may be enclosed for any plantation of young trees, shrubs, or plants in, or commit any nuisance in the Park.

3. No person shall throw or deposit any filth, rubbish, or refuse, or cause or allow any filth, rubbish, or refuse to fall or to be thrown or deposited upon or in the Park.

4. No person shall throw, distribute, deposit, or cause or allow to be thrown, distributed, or deposited upon or in the Park, any handbill or other printed matter.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the Park while in a state of intoxication.

6. No person in the Park shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency whether in dress, language, conduct, or otherwise.

7. Every person using or being in the Park for any purpose shall, prior to leaving the same, collect and remove or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, scraps, or litter of any kind left or placed therein or thereon by him.

8. No person shall ride or drive any vehicle, bicycle, or tricycle in, upon, over, or through the Park.

9. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless led by a leash, chain, or cord.

10. No person shall bet or gamble within the Park.

11. No person shall in the Park obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person, or obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any servant of or any person acting under the authority of the Council in the proper execution of his duty or work.

12. No person shall remain in the Park after having been lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the Park.

13. No person shall take or place or permit or suffer to be taken or placed over or in, or permit or suffer to graze or wander in or upon the Park any cattle.

14. No person shall camp in the Park or erect in the Park any tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure.

15. No person shall hawk or sell or offer or expose for sale any goods or chattels in the Park.

16. No person shall use the Park for any fête, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or for any meeting of a like character.

17. No person shall play or cause to be played any musical instrument, or take part in any public entertainment whatever in the Park.

18. No person shall play or practise cricket or football or any other game, or engage in any sport in the Park.

19. When the Council sees fit it may by a permit under the hand of the Town Clerk permit the doing of such acts or things as are prohibited by clauses numbered respectively 8, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18, but a permit shall not be given authorizing the playing of any game or sport under clause 18 hereof on a Sunday.

20. The Council may, before issuing any permit under clause 19 to any club or association to use the Park or any part thereof for the purpose of playing or practising cricket or football or any other game or any sport during any season, charge such club or association a fee of £1 1s.

21. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the Council from closing the Park or any portion thereof and excluding the public therefrom whenever it thinks fit, or prevent the Council from holding or permitting entertainments in the Park or any portion thereof.

22. No person over the age of 14 years shall use any portion of the Park set aside by the Council as a children's playground, or use any equipment thereon.

23. By-law No. 40 of the City of Northcote is hereby repealed.

24. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in—

3. This By-law shall apply to and have application to the portions of the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne specified in the schedule to this By-law.

(a) Albert-road, between Cecil-street and Eastern-road.

(b) Clarendon-street, between Albert-road and Raglan-street.
