REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE CAMPING AND FRONTAGE
RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF BOLGA.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 9th March, 1937, as a site for Camping purposes in the Parish of Bolga, together with that portion of the Mitta Mitta River Fontage Reserve as is indicated in yellow colour on plan marked A-23.3.1937 attached to Lands Department correspondence No. Ra. 4658.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.

2. No person shall take pigs, sheep, cattle, or horses on to the Reserve to camp or graze them thereon, and no owner of any such mentioned animals shall allow them to graze thereon except that a bona fide traveller may enter with his saddle or harness horse, but shall keep such animal under control.

3. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, flowers, or shrubs in the Reserve.

5. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

6. No fires shall be lighted, except where directed by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve, or erect therein, any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. Every person camping shall take special precautions against the risk of fire. Where a fireplace is provided, fire for camp purposes must be lighted in such fireplaces only. Where no fireplaces have been constructed, the camper shall before lighting a fire select an open position, clear the surface from inflammable material, and form a protecting bank of earth or stone. No fire shall be lighted against any tree, log, or stump. No fire shall be left burning or unattended. Before lighting a fire provision must be made for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth.

9. Camp sites, whilst being occupied by a camp party, must be kept in a clean and sanitary condition, and all refuse, litter, and garbage produced at a camp or camp site must be collected and burnt before the camp party vacates the Reserve.

10. No person shall damage, deface, write, or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, seats, tables, or other structures in the Reserve.

11. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-guns in the Reserve.

12. No person, except workmen and labourers employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots thereon which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

13. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice, fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

14. This Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Towong as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

15. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ELWOOD RESERVES.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands reserved by Orders in Council as set out hereunder, and known as the "Elwood Reserves," hereinafter referred to as "the Reserves":—

1. The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 20th November, 1882, for Public Recreation, containing 49 acres, more or less, in the municipal district of St. Kilda, at Elwood, as is indicated by red colour on plan marked E.22/4/1937 with Lands Department correspondence numbered Rs.444, but exclusive of that portion permissively occupied by the Elwood Life Saving Club.

2. The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 30th November, 1915, as a site for Public Recreation, containing 3 acres 3 roods, more or less, in the City of St. Kilda, at Elwood, as is indicated by blue colour on plan marked E.22/4/1937 aforesaid.

3. The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 7th July, 1911, as a site for Public Recreation, containing 10 acres 0 roods 38 3-10 perches, in the City of St. Kilda, at Elwood, as is indicated by yellow colour on plan marked E.22/4/1937 aforesaid, but exclusive of that portion permissively occupied by the Elwood Life Saving Club.

4. The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 7th April, 1937, as a site for Public Recreation, in the City of St. Kilda, at Elwood, as is indicated by green colour on plan marked E.22/4/1937 aforesaid, but exclusive of—

(a) that portion permissively occupied by the Elwood Life Saving Club; and

(b) that portion occupied by the Point Ormond Jetty, together with a strip of land 20 feet wide at either side thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserves or any of them may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserves or any of them.

2. No delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, wagon, van, truck, or barrow, or vehicle plying for hire shall enter or pass over or through the Reserves, or any of them, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. This section shall not apply to the electric tramway cars of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board's system.

3. Every person bathing in the open sea from any part of the foreshore abutting on the Reserves, or any of them, shall be effectively and decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume, kilted or similar to that known as the Canadian costume.

4. No person clad in bathing costume only shall loiter or remain upon or walk about on or in the vicinity of the beach.

5. No person over the age of six (6) years shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in the Reserves, or any of them, except in the bathing pavilions or other structures provided for the purpose.

6. No person shall break any bottle or any article of glass or chinaware or earthenware of any kind in or upon any part of the beach foreshore or water used by the public for bathing purposes, or within the Reserves, or any of them, nor throw any bottle or glass of any kind of chinaware or earthenware in the waters on the foreshore, nor leave therein or thereon anything which might or be likely to injure any person.

7. If any person break any bottle or any article of glass or chinaware or earthenware of any kind in or upon any part of the beach, foreshore, or water used by the public for bathing purposes, or within the Reserves, or any of them, he or she shall forthwith collect all portions of such bottle or article and deposit them in a receptacle provided by the Committee of Management on the beach for that purpose.

8. No person shall, in or upon any part of the beach, foreshore, dressing shed, or water used by the public for bathing purposes, or within the Reserves, or any of them, do any act which would be likely to injure, endanger, obstruct, inconvenience, or annoy any person.

No. 226.—11466.—3

9. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall use, displace, play with, injure, or destroy any life-saving appliance or signal bell provided by the Committee of Management or by any life-saving club, unless such use or displacement shall be necessary for the purpose of saving life.

10. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is behaving in a disorderly manner or not decorously dressed, or who may offend against decency as regards language or conduct, shall enter or remain in the Reserves, or any of them, and no person shall commit any nuisance therein.

11. No person shall interfere with, damage, or destroy the seats, swings, see-saws, fences, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, or any other property of the Committee of Management whatsoever in the Reserves, or any of them, or throw stones or other missiles, or leave in the Reserves, or any of them, any bottles, cast-off clothing, or dead animals, and no person shall leave or deposit in the Reserves, or any of them, any fruit skins, paper, or other rubbish except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

12. No person shall light any fires within the Reserves, or any of them, without the special permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, or officer appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, first obtained.

13. No person shall camp in any portion of the Reserves, or any of them.

14. No person shall stick or affix bills on the fences in or around the Reserves, or any of them, or on the buildings, posts, seats, or trees therein, or plant or write or cut names, letters, or marks on, or otherwise damage, deface, or injure the fences, gates, buildings, posts, seats, notices, notice boards, or other property or trees in the Reserves, or any of them.

15. (a) No person, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management shall (1) cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or her or in his or her charge to enter or remain in any of the Reserves unless such dog be under the effective control of some person by means of a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property under the control of the Committee of Management; or (2) bring into the Reserves, or any of them, any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.

(b) The Committee of Management may at any time, by notice set up, prohibit the taking of a dog or dogs into any particular portion or portions of the Reserves, or any of them.

(c) Any dog found in the Reserves, or any of them, except as provided herein, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the officers and/or servants of the Committee of Management, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation, and shall make compensation for any damage done to the property under the control of the Committee of Management by such dog.

16. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserves, or any of them, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of trees, shrubs, or flowers, or enclosed for other purposes, except the tea-tree plantations abutting on the Ormond-esplanade, and no person shall trespass on any flower bed.

17. No person shall assemble for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purposes of public worship, preaching, or any of public speaking of any kind, or for meetings of a like character in the Reserves, or any of them, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

18. No person shall preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public or of any organization in the Reserves, or any of them, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

19. Any person creating or taking part in any disturbance in the Reserves, or any of them, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, and to be prosecuted.

20. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserves, or any of them, any goods or articles of any description, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

21. Any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds, or other property from the Reserves, or any of them, or injuring or destroying any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserves, and to be prosecuted.

22. No motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle, and no horse, shall be driven or ridden over any portion of the Reserves, or any of them, except the main carriage road between the Marine-parade and the Ormond-esplanade, and known as Bluff-road, and the carriage road laid down through the Reserves on the line of Barkly-street produced from Ormond-esplanade to Bluff-road, and the macadamized area in that portion of the Reserve between the Elwood Bowling Green and St. Kilda-street.

23. No person shall engage or take part in any motor car or motor cycle race within the Reserves, or any of them.

24. No horse shall be broken in or trained in the Reserves, or any of them.

25. No person shall put, lead, or drive any cattle or horses (except horses controlled by rein or halter, and then only as by this Regulation permitted), sheep, goats, or pigs into, over, or through the Reserves, or any of them.

26. The Committee of Management may from time to time set apart certain portions of the Reserves, or of any of them, for the playing of any particular game or sport, and may grant the use thereof to any individual, club, or association of clubs on such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may decide.

27. No person shall play or practise cricket or football, or engage or practise in any athletic sport, within the Reserves, or any of them, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such places as the Committee of Management may set apart for the particular purpose.

28. No person shall play or practise cricket or football, or engage or practise in any athletic sport, within the Reserves, or any of them, on Sundays.

29. No person shall play any musical instrument, or sing or recite, or perform in any athletic sport within the Reserves, or any of them, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such places as the Committee of Management may set apart for the particular purpose.

30. No person shall, in the Reserves, or any of them, obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the execution of his work or duty, or annoy any other person in the Reserves, or any of them.

31. No person shall erect any building or tent in the Reserves, or any of them, or any booth or other structure, or offer for sale or hire any article, or occupy any site therefor, or enjoy any special privileges in connexion thereunder, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

32. Permits for the temporary occupation of sites for the purposes referred to in the last preceding clause within the Reserves, or any of them, or for any special privileges in connexion therewith, shall, if issued, be subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be approved by the Committee of Management.

The Council of the City of St. Kilda has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

No person, excepting the driver of the mail car operating between Orbost and Bairnsdale, while loading or unloading mails, shall place, park, or leave any motor car on that portion of the eastern side of Nicholson-street commencing at the corner of Nicholson-street and Ruskin-street, and extending northerly 60 feet, and having a depth of 12 feet from the street kerb line between the hours of 45 minutes past Ten of the forenoon and 15 minutes past Eleven of the forenoon, and between the hours of 40 minutes past Four of the afternoon and 15 minutes past Five of the afternoon on any week day: Provided, however, that the area herein defined shall, except during the time herein specified, be available for parking as hereinafter provided.

5. No person shall place, park, or leave any motor car on that portion of Nicholson-street situate between Raymond-street and Salisbury-street on the eastern side thereof, and between Clarke-street and Salisbury-street on the western side thereof, unless such motor car shall be drawn up, placed, or parked not more than 3 feet from the street kerb line at an angle of approximately 35 degrees, and so that no part of the car be more than 12 feet from the kerb line.

6. No person, excepting a bona fide carrier while engaged in the delivery of goods, shall place, park, or leave in Nicholson-street any motor truck with a tray or trailer of a length exceeding 8 feet, or any licensed motor passenger vehicle of a total length exceeding 18 feet.

7. No person shall place, park, or leave any motor car in any other street, or part of a street, within the Township of Orbost than those hereinbefore mentioned, whereby any part of such motor car shall be placed, parked, or left further than 17 ft. 6 in. from the kerb line of such street.

Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
