PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PROHIBITION OF TRANSFER OF POTATOES FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF VICTORIA INTO OTHER PORTIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928* (No. 3797), the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any Regulations, prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree, plant or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council

likely to spread any disease or insect in Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation order that on and after the date of this Proclamation no potatoes shall, except subject to Regulations made on the 9th October, 1916, as amended on the 30th September, 1935, and 7th April, 1936, be taken or conveyed into any other portion of Victoria from that portion of Victoria contained within the boundaries of the Shire of Otway, which shall constitute and be known as "the Otway Potato Inspection District".

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT "NIAWANDA," BEAUFORT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

Parish of Moallaack, County of Ripon: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 3a of section 6, Parish of Moallaack; thence north-easterly by the eastern boundary of the main Streatham to Beaufort road to the north-west angle of the eastern portion of allotment 2 of section 4; thence south-easterly by the southern boundary of the Ararat to Geelong road to the eastern boundary of the reserve fronting the eastern bank of Bullen Gheran Creek; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the said reserve to the north boundary of allotment 3a of section 4; thence east by the north boundary of the said allotment 3a to the north-east angle thereof; thence south by the east boundary of the said allotment 3a and a direct line in continuation thereof across allotment 7 of section 4 to the north-east angle of allotment 5 of section 4; thence south by the east boundaries of the said allotment 5, a direct line across a road and the east boundary of allotment 1 of section 5 to the south-east angle thereof; thence west by the south boundary of the said allotment 1 to the north-east angle of allotment 3A of section 5; thence south by the east boundary of the said allotment 3A and a direct line across a road to the north-east angle of allotment 7a of section 7; thence west by the north boundaries of allotments 7a and 7a of section 7 to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north by a direct line across a road and the west boundary of allotment 3A of section 5 to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 4b of section 6; thence west by a direct line across a road and the south boundaries of allotments 4b, 4a and 3b of section 6 to the point of commencement; including all roads and creek frontage reserves within the above-described area.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

AWARD No. 51 OF 17TH SEPTEMBER, 1937

Relating to Hours of Duty and Rates of Pay of Certain Employees.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the Railways Act 1928 (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. Award No. 8—Division 2—Ordinary Hours of Duty.

Clause (1) of this Division shall be amended by including in the exceptions the following:—

“Leading Hand Plumber—88 hours per fortnight”

2. The following shall be the rates to be paid to the employees hereinafter specified:—

Tradesman (Leading Hand)—

- (a) Whose hours of duty are 96 per fortnight—For the first year 1s. 6d. per day, and thereafter 2s. per day, in excess of the wage paid for eight hours' work to the tradesmen under his control.
- (b) Whose hours of duty are 88 per fortnight—For the first year 1s. 6d. per day, and thereafter 2s. per day, in excess of the wage of the tradesmen under his control.

SHIRE OF BASS.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A QUARRY IN THE PARISH OF WOOLAMAI.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 27th April, 1937, as a site for a Quarry in the Parish of Woolamai.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in such places as are set apart for same by the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in maintenance and improvements of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The owner of any horse, cattle, or other animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition such horse, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.
7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall take part in any entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve.
12. No person shall play, practise, or take part in any organized sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for any young trees or shrubs.
14. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the said Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of One shilling per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.
15. All gravel to be removed from the said Reserve, in accordance with the permission of the Committee of Management, shall be removed therefrom subject to and in accordance with the directions of the Engineer of the Council of the Shire of Bass, provided that and subject to such direction all gravel shall be removed in a face and for the full depth of the deposit. No overburden shall be allowed to remain on the floor of the pit, but all such overburden shall be removed and deposited as directed by the Committee of Management. All trees, stumps, logs, roots, branches, and other debris shall be removed from the pit as they are reached and fall, and shall not be left standing on "islands."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 27th December, 1901, as a site for Public Recreation, and of such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes as is indicated by blue colour on plan marked J.21/1/37 with Lands Department, Correspondence Rs.3459, both areas being situated in the Township of Jamieson, and are hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, improvements, trees, or other vegetation in the Reserve.
3. No person shall climb over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any dwelling or any booth, or other structure, or offer for sale any articles in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, or grass.
7. No person shall play any game in the Reserve with a hard or solid ball.
8. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to such portion of the Reserve as is set apart for a camping place shall be as follows:—
Each party, per day—One shilling.
Each party, per week or part of week—Five shillings.

The Council of the Shire of Mansfield has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
