WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district on any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district. And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts set forth be added to and form part of the Fire Districts respectively specified. And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do. Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the portions of the Shires of Grenville. Avon. Bet Bet and Donald set forth hereunder shall be added to and form part of the Fire Districts respectively specified accordingly.
