PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation declare that Monday, the twenty-sixth day of April, 1937 (a day by section 13 of the said Act appointed for a bank holiday throughout the said State) shall not be a bank holiday throughout Victoria, and appoint Monday, the fifteenth day of March, 1937, to be a bank holiday throughout the said State.

*The Fisheries Acts.*PROHIBITION OF BOATS WITH LONG LINES ON BOARD
IN WESTERN PORT BAY FROM 1st NOVEMBER IN
EACH YEAR TO 31st MARCH NEXT FOLLOWING.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His
Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its
Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Fisheries Act 1928* (No. 3683), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the aforementioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1928*, do hereby prohibit in the waters of Western Port Bay within or inside imaginary lines running from Shoreham to the Nobbies, and from Newhaven to San Remo, or of any river or creek flowing into such bay, at any time during the period from the first day of November in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive), any person doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Having in possession any long line in or upon the said waters or within two hundred yards thereof;
- (b) Taking a boat with a long line on board or attached thereto on to any of the said waters; permitting a long line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing a long line to be in or upon such waters or within two hundred yards thereof.

*The Game Acts.*SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT "STRATHFIELD-
SAYE," PERRY BRIDGE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His
Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its
Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

Parish of Meerlieu, County of Tanjil—Commencing on the northern shore of Lake Wellington at the south-eastern corner of allotment 1b of section 63, Parish of Meerlieu; thence generally easterly by the northern shore of Lake Wellington to a point in line with the east boundary of allotment 1A of section 55; thence north by a direct line across a Public purposes reserve, the east boundary of allotment 1A of section 55, a direct line across a road and the east boundaries of allotments 2b and 1b of section 54 to the north-east corner of the said allotment 1b; thence west by the north boundaries of allotments 1b and 1A of section 54, a direct line across a road, the north boundaries of allotments 2 and 1 of section 53, the north boundaries of allotments 4b, 4A, 3b, 3A, 1b, and 1A of section 52, a direct line across a road, the north boundaries of allotments 1 and 4 of section 51, and direct line across a road to the north-east angle of allotment 3, section 51; thence north-westerly by the north-eastern boundary of allotment 5 of section 51, a direct line across a road, the north-eastern and northern boundaries of allotment 7 of section 51 to the most north-western corner thereof; thence by east and south boundaries of allotment 7A of section 51 to the intersection of the west boundary of said allotment 7; thence by a line bearing south 47 deg. west of the eastern bank of Perry River; thence generally southerly by the said eastern bank of the Perry River to its junction with the Avon River; thence south-easterly by the eastern bank of the Avon River to the northern shore of Lake Wellington; thence north-easterly and south-easterly by the shore of Lake Wellington to the point of commencement.

UNEMPLOYED (SUSTENANCE) REGULATIONS AMENDED.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Acts Interpretation Acts and the *Unemployment Relief (Administration) Act 1932*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendment to the Unemployed (Sustenance) Regulations 1933, as amended on the 13th day of June, 1933, the 21st day of August, 1933, the 17th day of June, 1935, and the 17th day of August, 1936, that is to say:—Regulation 17, paragraph (2), is hereby repealed, and the following paragraph is substituted therefor:—

Persons eligible to receive sustenance in accordance with the above-mentioned Act may on and from the 1st day of March, 1937, be granted sustenance as set out in the following scales, but so that the total amount of the income received by a family unit and the value of the sustenance granted shall in no case exceed £3 9s. in any one week.

ENGINEERING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 3).

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make Regulations following, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Engineering Trades Regulations (No. 3)."

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—
"Act" means *Apprenticeship Act 1928*.
"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.
"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.
"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.
"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

- (a) Mechanical Engineering—
(i) Patternmaking.
(ii) Fitting and/or Turning.
(iii) Machinist.
(b) Brassfinishing (except the making of parts by specialized processes and the assembling thereof).
(c) Smithing—
(i) Blacksmithing (engineering).
(ii) Copper and/or brass smithing.

Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.

4. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship courses for the said trades shall be as set out in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, and Fifth Schedules hereto (as the case may be), but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

(b) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in each year of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and
(ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission—

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.

(c) The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes (as the case may be):—

Patternmaking.—All classes of patternmaking and all things incidental thereto for the reproduction of metal castings, including the correct methods of use of tools commonly used in the trade.

Fitting.—All classes of mechanical fitting and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of hand tools commonly used in the trade.

Turning.—All classes of turning and all things incidental thereto, including methods of setting up and of operating lathes.

Machinist.—All classes of machining and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of setting up and operating the following machines:—Boring machine, milling machine, planing machine, shaping machine, slotting machine, grinding machine.

Fitting and Turning.—All classes of such trades as above described.

Fitting and Machinist.—All classes of such trades as above described.

Turning and Machinist.—All classes of such trades as above described.

Brassfinishing.—All classes of fitting and of machining in non-ferrous metals and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of hand tools commonly used in the trade and the correct methods of setting up and operating all types of machines used in the trade.

Blacksmithing.—All classes of smithing and forging in iron, steel, and metals common to the engineering trades and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of all tools commonly used in the trade.

Copper and/or Brass-smithing.—All classes of smithing in non-ferrous metals and metals common to the trade and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of all tools used in the trade—

and the employer shall by the best means in his power teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the apprentice in the said processes.

Attendance at Classes for Instruction.

5. (a) Every apprentice and applicant in the said trades shall attend the classes for instruction prescribed for his apprenticeship course at such times and at such place or places and on such occasions while the classes are open for instruction as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Act, provided that the number of evenings on which such apprentice or applicant shall be required to attend shall not exceed two in any one week.

Employer to Permit Apprentice or Applicant to Attend Classes.

(b) Every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by the said General Regulations (No. 1) shall, while the classes are open for instruction, permit his apprentices and applicants to attend for instruction at the school or schools and class or classes at the hours and on the occasions specified in such notice.

Apprentice or Applicant shall Submit Himself for Examination.

(c) Every apprentice or applicant attending the aforesaid class or classes shall submit himself for examination in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at the places and times determined by the Commission.

Penalties for Non-Attendance, Misbehaviour, &c.

(d) Any apprentice or applicant who—

- (i) fails to attend any technical school or class at which he is required to attend, punctually at the time appointed for the commencement thereof, or, without the permission of the instructor, leaves the same before the time appointed for leaving; or
(ii) fails to be diligent or behaves in an indecorous manner while in such school or class; or
(iii) destroys or fails to take care of any material or equipment provided for his use in such school or class; or
(iv) without good and satisfactory reason, in the opinion of the Commission, fails to secure in each year a record of 80 per cent. of attendances in the day classes and in the evening courses prescribed for his apprenticeship course—

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, or, alternatively, to cancellation of his indentures by the Commission.

Apprentice or Applicant to Provide Books, Materials, &c.

(e) Every apprentice or applicant shall, at his own cost and expense, provide himself with the necessary books, drawing instruments, and materials required at the classes for instruction, unless otherwise provided by the school authorities or other bodies.

Payment of School Fees.

6. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the

possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

Incorporation of General Regulations.

7. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Act shall apply in the said trades:—

General Regulations (No. 1) approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3) approved by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4) approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1931.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE, NORTH CRESWICK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 8th October, 1901, as a site for Public Recreation, situate in section Q in the municipal district of Creswick:—

REGULATIONS.

(1) The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(3) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(4) No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(6) The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

(7) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(8) No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(9) No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(10) No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

(11) No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

(12) No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without written permission of the Council.

(13) Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

(14) No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

(15) No person shall disturb the surface of or remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

(16) No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other game, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the

Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

(17) No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

(18) No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

(19) No assemblies for concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

(20) No person, other than the players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey, or golf), and than any competitor and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.

(21) The Council of the Shire of Creswick has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
