Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ANIMAL MANURE BOARD.]

NOTE.—This Determination on the 6th March, 1937, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of the manufacture of manure from animal matter," has made the following Determination, namely:—

NOTE.—On 25th May, 1914, the powers of the Animal Manure Board were extended to enable it to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of the extraction of tallow.

(1) That on the 6th March, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed by the Board was approved on 29.5.24.								
Improvers.								
One improver to every four workers receiving not less than 89s. per week of 48 hours.								

(3) HOURS OF WORK.—The maximum number of hours to be worked on any day, without payment for overtime, shall be—
Day work—8½ hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

4½ hours on Saturday.

Shift work—8 hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

(4) OVERTIME.—All time worked in excess of the number of hours fixed as a day's work shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(5) HOLIDAYS.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays and Holidays specified in clause (5).
