Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 2 (BOOT REPAIRERS).

Note.—This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said district; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of a Boot Repairer" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 7th January, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.—All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Eight Hours Day, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(6) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day: but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Provided that outside the Metropolitan District another holiday may be substituted for Melbourne Cup Day in Clauses 5 and 6.
