LEVEE AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE, MELBOURNE.

IN honour of the Coronation of Their Majesties King George VI. and Queen Elizabeth, His Excellency the Governor (Lord Huntingfield) will hold a Levée at Parliament House, Spring-street, Melbourne, at 10.15 a.m. on Thursday, the 13th May, 1937.

Private entrée cards will admit recipients to the south door of the Spring-street entrance at Parliament House at 10 a.m. All others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at 10.15 a.m.

In accordance with the custom followed at Levées held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the Service and all public bodies group themselves together as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so.

On the occasion of the celebration of the Coronation, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levée should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting their names in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1928* (19 Geo. V. No. 3757), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

SANCTUARIES FOR NATIVE GAME NEAR CHETWYND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO:

Allotments 5, 6, 7, 8A, and 9, Parish of Koolomert, County of Dundas.

Allotment 9, Parish of Ganoo Ganoo, County of Dundas, together with the river frontage reserve abutting on the western boundary of the said allotment 9.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 3797).

FUNGUS AND DISEASE DECLARED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928* (No. 3797), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare to be a Fungus within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928* the fungus hereunder named: And I further declare every abnormal condition of or in any plant, or of or in the product or part of any of the same, whether consisting of the presence of or caused by or due to the operations, development, growth, or decay of the fungus hereunder named, shall be a disease within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928*:—

Pythium de Baryanum Hesse ("Leak" or "Watery Wound Rot" of Potatoes).

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Northcote has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a right-of-way by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a right-of-way hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Northcote aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

All that piece of land being part of Crown portion 106, at Northcote, Parish of Jilka, County of Bourke, and delineated and coloured red, blue, and green on plan No. A173A commencing at a point on the southern boundary of Lawry-street distant 107 feet easterly from the eastern boundary of High-street, and bounded by the said boundary of Lawry-street bearing easterly 9 feet; thence by lines bearing southerly 87 feet, south-easterly 4 ft. 3 in., easterly 426 feet, and northerly 90 feet; thence by the said boundary of Lawry-street bearing easterly 11 ft. 6 in.; thence by lines bearing southerly 99 feet, westerly 449 ft. 6 in., and northerly 99 feet to the commencing point.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Oakleigh has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Oakleigh aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

Edward-street.—Commencing at a point on the west side of John-street 837 feet distant from the south side of Burlington-street (formerly Tramway-road), such point being the north-east corner of allotment 306, lodged plan No. 1780; thence by a line bearing west a distance of 120 ft. 8 in.; thence by a line bearing south a distance of 50 ft. 11 in.; thence by a line bearing N. 89 deg. 41 min. E. a distance of 120 ft. 8 in.;

thence by a line bearing north a distance of 50 ft. 3 in. to the commencing point.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

DIMINUTION OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, whenever the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board certifies that it is necessary or desirable that any specified portion of the metropolitan fire district or of any country fire district (as the case may be) be excised therefrom, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that such portion shall be excised accordingly, and that thereupon such specified portion shall for the purposes of the said Act no longer be included in or be part of such metropolitan or country fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is necessary and desirable that the portions of the South Central, North Central, Northern, and North-Western Fire Districts set forth hereunder be excised from such fire districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (2) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1923*, do hereby declare that the portions of the said South Central, North Central, Northern, and North-Western Fire Districts set forth hereunder shall be excised from such fire districts, viz.:—

South Central Fire District.—The Township of Maldon.
North Central Fire District.—The Townships of Korong Vale, Wedderburn, and Pyramid Hill.
Northern Fire District.—The Township of Nyah West.
North-Western Fire District.—The Townships of Natimuk, Beulah, Woomelang, and Hopetoun.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district, outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts set forth be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the portions of the Shires of Maldon, Korong, Gordon, Swan Hill, Arapiles, Karkaroc, and Buln Buln set forth hereunder shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly.

SOUTH CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Maldon.—Parish of Maldon, Township in the Parish of Maldon and Town of Maldon, County of Talbot: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section A1, Parish of Maldon; bounded thence by the southern boundaries of that allotment and allotments 3, 2, and 1 to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 6; thence north-westerly by a line to the south-east angle of allotment 13B; thence westerly by the south boundaries of allotments 13B, 13, and an un-numbered allotment, and northerly by the west boundaries of an un-numbered allotment and allotment 13A to the north angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north-easterly by a line, the boundary between allotments 10 and 11, and a line to the north-west angle of allotment 31 of section 1A; thence by a road bearing south-easterly and easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 5 of section 2A; thence by the boundary of the township in the Parish of Maldon bearing north 1,800 links; thence by roads bearing west 2,750 links and north 1,090 links; thence by a road bearing easterly and south-easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 50 of section 6A; thence by a road bearing north-easterly, south-easterly, and again north-easterly to the north angle of allotment 20 of section 6A; thence by a road bearing south-easterly, easterly, and again south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 20 of section F; thence south-easterly by that allotment to the north-east angle of allotment 21; thence south-westerly by the northern boundaries of that allotment and allotment 26 to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 25; thence north-easterly by that allotment to the south-east angle thereof; thence south-easterly by allotment 22 to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a road bearing north-easterly to a road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 7 of section 4F; thence by a road and a line bearing south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 3 of section 1B; thence south by the west boundary of that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a road bearing south-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 1; thence south-easterly by that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence south-westerly by the northern boundary of allotment 16 to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a road bearing generally southerly to the road intersecting allotment 16 of section 11; thence by that road bearing south-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 18C; thence by a road bearing generally southerly to the Country Roads Board main road forming the northern boundary of allotment 15 of section G; thence by the said Country Roads Board road bearing north-westerly and westerly to the east angle of allotment 3 of section 4G; thence by a road bearing south-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 7 of section G; thence by a road bearing west to the south-east angle of allotment 3; thence north by that allotment to the north-east angle thereof; thence by roads bearing north-westerly, south-westerly, and south-easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 4; thence west by the township boundary to the road forming the south-western boundary of allotment 20 of section 1B; thence by that road bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 18; thence by

the township boundary bearing north-easterly, westerly, and north to the south-west angle of the boundary of the Town of Maldon; and thence north by the west boundary of that town to the point of commencement.

NORTH CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Korong.—Korong Vale: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 121, Parish of Kinypanial; thence east along its south boundary to the creek; thence northerly along the creek to the south-west angle of allotment 122; thence east by the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its south-east angle; thence northerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 124K; thence west by a road and a line to the east boundary of allotment 123; thence north and west by the east and north boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the west boundary of allotment 9A, section 5, Parish of Borung; thence north and west by the east and north boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and west by the north boundary of allotment 9 to its north-west angle; thence south by the west boundary of allotment 9, a line, the west boundary of allotment 9B, and a line to the north boundary of allotment 10; thence west and south by the north and west boundaries of allotment 10 to its south-west angle; thence east by the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to a point in line with the north-west angle of allotment 73; thence south by a line and the east boundaries of allotments 73, 78, 79, 80, 81, and 11B to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence east by the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line being the prolongation of that boundary, to the west boundary of allotment 121, Parish of Kinypanial; thence south by that boundary to the point of commencement.

Wedderburn: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 63, section U, Town of Wedderburn; bounded thence by a road bearing north to the south boundary of allotment 91B; bounded thence by the south and west boundary of that allotment to its north-west angle; thence by a direct line bearing north-westerly to the eastern angle of a gravel reserve in the Parish of Wedderburn; bounded thence by the east and north boundary of that reserve to the south-east angle of allotment 69, section 5; bounded thence by the east and north boundary of that allotment, the north and west boundary of allotment 11B, and a line to the north-west angle of allotment 9 of section 5; thence south-westward by that allotment and a line to the north angle of allotment 10B; thence south-westerly by that allotment and allotment 10B to the road forming the north boundary of allotment 13, section 12; thence north-westerly by that road to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south and east by that allotment and the west boundary of allotments 2B and 2 to the north boundary of allotment 3, west and south by that allotment, a line, and the west and south boundary of allotment 10 to the south-west angle of allotment 9, section 12; thence south to the south-east angle of the withholding for eucalyptus oil purposes; thence east by a road to the west boundary of the Town of Wedderburn; thence south and east by the town boundary to the south-east angle of allotment 4, section N2, in the town; thence south by a line to the north-west angle of allotment 16, section 8; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 13, east by a line and thence north by a road forming the west boundary of a gravel reserve in section 14 to the south-west angle of allotment 2, section 14; thence east and north by that allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 1; thence east and north by the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the south boundary of the town; thence east by that boundary to a point in line with the south-west angle of allotment 63 aforementioned; thence north by a line to the commencing point.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 20th day of April, 1937, approved, in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1928*, a plan showing the site of the weir and pipe line to be constructed by the Colac Waterworks Trust on the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of supplying water to the Township of Colac.

SCHEDULE.

Portion I.—Site of Weir.

The site of the weir shall be on the Gellibrand River near the northern boundary of Crown allotment 59A, Parish of Barramunga, County of Polwarth.

Portion II.—Pipe Line.

Commencing at a point in Crown allotment 73C, Parish of Barramunga, County of Polwarth, being a point on the existing pipe line; thence southerly by a strip of land 33 feet in width being 16½ feet on either side of the centre line of the pipe through the said Crown allotment 73C and along a road and through Crown allotments 73A, 71A, and 75A, and across a road and through Crown allotment 72 and across Crown lands and across a road to the site of the weir.

DROUIN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1937.

THE Drouin Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of One shilling and elevenpence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Drouin Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty-seven shillings and sixpence, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Nine shillings and fourpence.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the period commencing the 1st day of April, 1937, and ending the 31st day of December, 1937, and shall be payable on the 1st day of May, 1937, at the office of the said Trust.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at a rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1928 and every other power thereunto enabling, and numbered 127, for repealing By-law No. 124 and for altering By-law numbered 55, as amended by By-law numbered 101, and for the management and use of the Sports Ground, and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon the said Sports Ground.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928 and any power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. *Repeal:* The By-law numbered 124 made by the Council of the City of Hawthorn under sections 197, 228, and 767 of the *Local Government Act* 1928 passed by the Council on 4th March, 1936, and confirmed on the 1st April, 1936, is hereby repealed.

2. That the By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under section 197, sub-section (7), section 222, and section 604 of the *Local Government Act* 1903 and the *Municipal Grounds Act* 1905, and numbered 55, as amended by a By-law of the said city numbered 101, shall be altered as follows:—

In clause 1, at the end of the paragraph reading "On the occasion of football or cricket matches when a charge is made for admission to the grounds the revenue derived shall be dealt with in accordance with the Rules of the League, Association, or other organization under which the clubs in such matches play" there shall be added the following words:—"But this provision shall not apply to matches of the Hawthorn Football Club to be held at the Sports Ground during the year 1937 the revenue from which matches, after paying grounds management expenses and administration charges, shall be divided between the Hawthorn Football Club and the visiting clubs by paying to the visiting clubs the amounts to which such clubs would ordinarily be entitled, and paying to the Hawthorn Football Club the remainder of such revenue less an amount equal to 10 per cent. on the proportion which but for the provisions of this By-law would have been payable to the Council, the sum so deducted as representing 10 per cent. on the proportion payable under the Rules of the Victorian Football League to the Council as the Grounds Management Committee to be retained by the Council."

AMENDMENT OF ORDER PROCLAIMING THE SEWERAGE DISTRICT AND CONSTITUTING THE KERANG SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby repeal clause (a) of the Order in Council made on the 19th day of December, 1932, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 21st December, 1932, and in lieu thereof doth hereby order that the following shall be and deemed to be clause (a) of the said Order:—

(a) That the amount of loan moneys which may be borrowed by such sewerage authority shall be Seventy-five thousand pounds (£75,000), and the amount which may be borrowed by way of overdraft shall be Three thousand pounds (£3,000).

KERANG SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

CONSENT TO BORROWING £25,000.

Hairdressers Registration Act 1936 (No. 4396).

HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION REGULATIONS 1937.

THE Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Hairdressers Registration Act 1936* (No. 4396), doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be divided into Parts and Divisions as follow:—

- Part I.—Introductory.
- Part II.—Officers of the Board.
- Part III.—Training.
- Part IV.—Examinations.
- Part V.—Registration—
 - Division 1.—Registration of hairdressers.
 - Division 2.—Registration of schools.
 - Division 3.—Registration generally.
- Part VI.—Schools—
 - Division 1.—Schools not subject to the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 18 of the Act.
 - Division 2.—Provisions applicable to all schools.
- Part VII.—Hygiene, sanitation, and safety in hairdressers' shops and schools.
- Part VIII.—Fees.
- Part IX.—Supplementary.

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or Interpretation. subject-matter—

- "Act" means the *Hairdressers Registration Act 1936* (No. 4396).
- "Approved" means approved in writing by the Board.
- "Approval" has a corresponding interpretation.
- "Board" means the Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria.
- "Hairdresser's shop" means a hairdresser's shop within the meaning of the Factories and Shops Acts.
- "Inspector" means an authorized officer of the Board appointed for the purpose of inspecting the premises of a hairdresser's shop or of a school, and of enforcing the provisions of the Act and these Regulations.
- "Model" means a person who, whether for reward or otherwise, submits himself in a school to use by teachers or students engaged in imparting or acquiring knowledge in hairdressing.
- "Schedule" means schedule to these Regulations.
- "School" means any establishment registered under the Act for the training of persons in any prescribed class or classes of hairdressing.

3. Hairdressing for the purposes of the Act and these Regulations is divided into three classes as follow:—

- (1) *Men's Hairdressing*, which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, colouring, or other treatment of the hair or beard of any male person, and the massage and other similar stimulative treatment of the face, scalp, or neck of any male person, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation, or substance.

Three classes of Hairdressing.

- The expression "Men's Hairdresser" in these Regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

Men's Hairdresser.

- (2) *Ladies' Hairdressing (Inclusive)*, which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, colouring, or other treatment of the hair of the head of any female person, and the massage and other similar stimulative treatment of the face, scalp, or neck of any female person, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation, or substance.

The expression "Ladies' Hairdresser (Inclusive)" in these Regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

Ladies' Hairdresser (inclusive).

- (3) *Ladies' Hairdressing (Limited)*, which comprises dressing, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, or other treatment of the hair of the head of any female person, and the massage and other similar stimulative treatment of the face, scalp, or neck of any female person, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation, or substance.

Ladies'
Hairdresser
(limited).

The expression "Ladies' Hairdresser (Limited)" in these Regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

Proceedings of
the Board.

4. The proceedings of the Board shall be conducted as follows:—

- (1) *Meetings*.—The Board shall meet at such times and places as the Board decides, and the Registrar shall convene a meeting at any time when so directed by the Chairman.
- (2) *Notice*.—Not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to every member of the Board by letter directed to such address as he shall from time to time furnish to the Registrar.
- (3) *Order of Business*.—The order of business shall be as follows:—
 - (a) Minutes of last meeting.
 - (b) Correspondence.
 - (c) Consideration of applications for registration.
 - (d) Consideration of reports and recommendations of examiners of candidates for registration.
 - (e) Miscellaneous business.

Provided that the Board may at any time vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

- (4) *Conduct of Business*.—Except where otherwise expressly provided in these Regulations, the proceedings of the Board shall be regulated by the provisions of Part XI. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1928* in so far as such Part is applicable.
- (5) *Cheques*.—Cheques shall be signed by the Registrar and any one member of the Board.
- (6) *Documents*.—Documents requiring to be signed by the Board shall be signed, for and on behalf of the Board, by the Registrar, or as may be directed by the Board.

Fees to
members of
Board.

5. The fees to be paid to the members of the Board shall be as follows:—

The Chairman—£250 per annum, payable monthly.
Other members—£50 per annum, payable monthly.

PART II.—OFFICERS OF THE BOARD.

The Registrar.

6. The duties of the Registrar shall be—

- (a) to act as Secretary to the Board, and to carry out the directions of the Board and all such duties as pertain to that office;
- (b) to receive all moneys due to the Board and pay same into an account known as "The Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria Account," kept with such bank as the Board may from time to time determine, and to submit to the Board monthly statements showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month. He shall prepare the financial statement required by sub-section (7) of section 10 of the Act;
- (c) to keep registers, in the forms prescribed in the schedule, of such persons and schools as may be approved by the Board for registration, and to record the class or classes of hairdressing in which registration has been approved;
- (d) to issue certificates of registration in the prescribed forms and for the appropriate class or classes.

Inspectors.

7. For the purpose of enforcing the Act and these Regulations, the Board may appoint one or more inspectors.

The Board may terminate the appointment of any inspector by giving one month's notice, in writing, under the hand of the Registrar of the Board, save in the case of misconduct or breach of his duties, when no period of notice shall be required.

8. In any area in which any of the provisions of the Act or these Regulations is in force any inspector may— Inspector's powers.

- (a) at any time when hairdressing is in progress or is usually carried on, enter into and upon the premises of a hairdresser's shop; or
- (b) at any time during the hours of teaching enter into and upon the premises of a school—

for the purpose of examining whether any of the provisions of the Act or these Regulations is being contravened.

For that purpose he may require any person on such premises who is performing any of the functions of a hairdresser (including the teaching of hairdressing) to produce his certificate of registration for inspection, or to establish to the satisfaction of the inspector that he is an improver, apprentice, or student.

Any person refusing or failing to comply with any such request shall be guilty of an offence.

PART III.—TRAINING.

9. (1) Every applicant for registration in respect of any prescribed class of hairdressing under sub-section (2) of section 8 of the Act shall, in addition to having passed the prescribed examination, submit proof satisfactory to the Board— Standard of training.

- (a) that he has for a period of not less than five years been employed as an improver in a hairdresser's shop or shops in which one or more registered hairdressers of the relevant class have during the said period been continuously employed; or
- (b) that he has served an apprenticeship during which he was taught hairdressing of the class in respect of which he applies for registration; or
- (c) that he has been a student in regular attendance for a period of not less than one year in a school or schools, and has during the said period undergone a course of training in the subjects prescribed for examination for the class of hairdressing in respect of which he applies for registration.

(2) The standard of training for students in schools shall be the average standard of ability as judged by the Board's examiners of the registered employees in the best hairdressers' shops in the city of Melbourne in the subjects prescribed for examination.

10. The qualification of a teacher in a school shall be the holding of a certificate of registration as a "Men's Hairdresser" or a certificate of registration as a "Ladies' Hairdresser (Inclusive)," and the satisfying of the Board's examiners of ability to teach. This shall not apply to teachers in employment as such at the passing of the Act. Teachers' qualifications.

PART IV.—EXAMINATIONS.

11. For the purpose of satisfying itself as to the qualifications of any applicant for registration the Board may— Examiners.

- (a) appoint an examiner or examiners to conduct theoretical, practical, and/or oral examination in any class or classes of hairdressing;
- (b) terminate the appointment of any examiner by giving one month's notice, in writing, under the hand of the Registrar of the Board, save in the case of misconduct or a breach of his duties, when no period of notice shall be required;
- (c) require any applicant for registration not subject to the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Act to present himself for any such examination.

12. Any person who wishes to present himself for examination shall make application therefor to the Board in the form prescribed in the schedule. Examinations—Form 1.

13. The subjects of examination shall be in the case of a candidate for— Subjects of examination.

- (a) A "Men's Hairdresser" Certificate.—Dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, or colouring of the hair or beard and the massage of the face, scalp, or neck, and the use for any of such purposes of any apparatus, appliance, preparation, or substance. PART V.—REGISTRATION.

DIVISION 1.—REGISTRATION OF HAIRDRESSERS.

DIVISION 2.—REGISTRATION OF SCHOOLS.

19. The owner or occupier of any school or establishment referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) of sub-section (5) of section 18 of the Act who is desirous of obtaining approval by the Board and registration of such school or establishment as a hairdressing school shall make application in the appropriate form in the Schedule.

Existing schools—
Form 6.

20. Such application shall set out—

- (a) under which paragraph of the sub-section registration is claimed;
- (b) in which class or classes of hairdressing registration is required;
- (c) the number of students enrolled at the date of application; and
- (d) the name and address of the owner or occupier under whose personal supervision the establishment is being conducted.

What application to include.

21. Such application shall be accompanied by a sketch plan of the premises setting out thereon—

- (a) the relative situation of all class-rooms, designating these by block letters;
- (b) the superficial floor space of each room as well as its cubic air space; and
- (c) the nature of the teaching being imparted in each room.

22. An applicant for the Board's approval and registration as a school of an establishment not subjected to the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 18 of the Act shall make application in the appropriate form in the Schedule.

New schools—
Form 7.

23. (1) Such application shall be accompanied by—

- (a) a block plan of the premises drawn to a scale of not less than 1 inch to 20 feet, and showing in figures the frontage and depth of the site, the positions on the latter relatively to the boundaries thereof, and to all thoroughfares upon which such site abuts, of all buildings or enclosures on such site or proposed to be erected or formed thereon, the class of premises adjoining such site, their present use, and the cardinal points;
- (b) a sketch plan of the premises setting out thereon—
 - (i) the relative situation of all class-rooms, designating these by block capital letters;
 - (ii) the superficial floor space of each room as well as its cubic air space; and
 - (iii) the nature of the teaching proposed to be imparted in each room.

Block plan.

Sketch plan.

(2) The applicant shall furnish such other or further plans and drawings or particulars of the premises as may be required by the Board.

Further plans.

24. Every such application shall set out the name, address, and qualifications of the owner or occupier under whose personal supervision the school is to be conducted.

Supervision.

DIVISION 3.—REGISTRATION GENERALLY.

25. There shall be paid to the Board in respect of each registration and certificate the fees set out in Part VIII. of these Regulations.

Fees for registration and certificate.

26. The Register of Hairdressers and the Register of Hairdressing Schools shall be in the forms respectively prescribed in the schedule.

Registers—
Forms 8 and 9.

27. (1) When the Board has granted registration, whether of a hairdresser or of a school, the Registrar shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, issue to the applicant a certificate of registration in the appropriate form in the schedule.

Certificates of Registration—
Forms 10 and 11.

(2) The certificate shall remain the property of the Board, and shall be given upon demand by the Registrar on loss of registration by the holder.

28. The owner or occupier of every hairdresser's shop, and of every school of hairdressing, shall exhibit and keep exhibited in such prominent position as will enable it to be read from the principal entrance of such shop or school, a placard stating (in the case of a shop) the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing in respect of which he and/or his then employees (if any) are registered, and (in the case of a school) the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing in respect of which the school is registered.

Hairdresser's shops and schools to have placard showing prescribed class.

Hairdresser to
notify change

29. Every hairdresser who—
 (a) being registered as a principal, becomes an employee; or
 (b) being registered as a teacher, becomes a principal or an employee; or
 (c) being registered as an employee, becomes a principal—
 shall immediately—
 (a) notify the Board of the fact;
 (b) apply for a certificate of registration in accordance with his altered status; and
 (c) forward to the Registrar his current certificate and the fee for the issue of a new certificate corresponding to his altered status.

Hairdresser to

30. Every hairdresser, whether a principal, teacher, or employee, who has obtained registration shall, upon changing his or her name or address, forthwith notify the Board of the fact, and furnish the new name and address for entry in the Register of Hairdressers.

PART VI.—SCHOOLS.

DIVISION 1.—SCHOOLS NOT SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUB-SECTION (5) OF SECTION 18 OF THE ACT.

New schools.

31. The Board may refuse to approve of any portion of a building as a school if, in the Board's opinion, the number, situation, construction, or dimensions of exits or stairways from any floor on which the proposed school is situate are inadequate to insure the safety of the students in case of fire or panic.

DIVISION 2.—PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL SCHOOLS.

Change of
ownership.

32. When any school is sold or transferred, or a change of ownership takes place, the former owner or occupier and the transferee shall immediately notify the Board, giving the name and particulars of the transferee and the date of the transfer.

Register of
students to
be kept—
Form 12.

33. (1) The owner or occupier of every school shall keep or cause to be kept at the school a register of students in the form prescribed in the schedule, and such register shall at all times be written fully up to date.

(2) Any inspector of the Board may, at any time during the ordinary teaching hours of a school, require production of such register for examination and for the purpose of making copies of entries therein.

(3) If the owner or occupier of the school refuses to produce such register or to submit it for examination, he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

Windows of
class-rooms.

34. The windows of every class-room shall contain glass of such quality, area, and position, and of such degree of cleanliness as shall insure the efficient illumination of the interior of such class-room by means of daylight.

Artificial
lighting.

35. In every class-room which is used at night, artificial lighting shall be provided by means of approved lamps so placed and so equipped as to secure as far as possible a uniform diffusion of light upon the subject-matter of study.

Lighting of
rooms, exits,
and passages.

36. In every school which is used for teaching purposes at night, every room which is used by the students, together with all exits, shall be properly lighted so as to render all exits, passages, or other ways therein and therefrom to the available public thoroughfare or thoroughfares at all times readily visible during the whole time the students are on the premises.

Ventilation.

37. Every room of the school shall be adequately ventilated to the satisfaction of the Board.

Windows to
be openable.

38. The sashes of all windows shall be so formed and arranged as to be openable, and shall be furnished with the necessary fittings for opening them and keeping them open to an extent equivalent to at least one-half of the glazed area of the windows in each case. The means for opening the said sashes shall in each case be conveniently accessible from the interior of the room to which the window pertains.

Internal
surfaces.

39. The internal surfaces of walls and partitions of every class-room shall be hard, smooth, impervious, and washable up to a height of at least 6 feet from the floor.

The ceiling of every class-room shall be white.

40. Cloakrooms of sufficient size and number adequately furnished with shelving and hooks for the reception of the students' hats and cloaks shall be provided on the premises of the school, and shall be subject to the conditions following, viz.:—

Cloakrooms.

- (a) They shall be situated conveniently near to the class-rooms, but shall be completely air-disconnected therefrom, and from all occupied rooms.
- (b) They shall be thoroughly cross-ventilated and (except with the special approval of the Board), shall not be located in basements.
- (c) Fittings for the reception of hats and cloaks shall be so arranged as to secure complete circulation of air around such clothing as far as practicable.

41. (1) There shall be provided on the premises closets and urinals conveniently situated, properly separated and designated for the sexes, and decently screened, and where connected with a public sewerage system, they shall be constructed, lighted, and ventilated in accordance with the by-laws of the sewerage authority for the locality.

Closets and urinals.

Provided that, whether so required by such by-laws or not, the whole of the floor of every air-lock closet and internal urinal compartment shall be constructed of or covered with durable impervious material.

(2) The number of such conveniences shall be at least—

- (a) one closet for every 15 or fraction of 15 female students up to 75, and one additional closet for every 35 or fraction of 35 female students in excess of 75; and
- (b) one closet and one urinal for every 25 or fraction of 25 male students up to 75, and one additional closet and one additional urinal for every 50 or fraction of 50 male students in excess of 75.

(3) Where, in the case of any building, the Board is satisfied that the provision of sanitary conveniences is insufficient under the actual conditions of use thereof, the Board may require the provision of additional conveniences over and above the numbers herein prescribed.

(4) The owner or occupier of every school shall cause all closets and urinal appointments thereto to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

42. All doors of passageways, lavatories, class-rooms, or other rooms occupied by students shall be fitted with such fastenings only as will enable them to be readily opened from the inside without a key.

Certain doors to be openable from inside.

43. No drapery or curtains, and no articles of decoration or material of a combustible, obstructive, or otherwise dangerous character shall be placed in any entrance or exit passage.

Use of drapery &c., in exits prohibited.

44. Every class-room shall have direct access to a public thoroughfare or to a passage, but no door opening into a passage shall be hung so as to be capable, when opened, of obstructing any passage. When such class-room opens to a passage, the latter shall have exits conforming to the standards required by Regulations 27 and 28 of the "Building (Schools) Regulations 1935."

Access from class-rooms to thoroughfares, &c.

45. (1) Fire hoses and/or chemical fire-extinguishers, fire buckets, or other means of preventing and extinguishing fires shall be provided in such number and position as the Board shall direct, but not less than one bucket shall be provided for each 600 square feet, or one chemical fire-extinguisher to each 1,800 square feet of floor area.

Fire-extinguishing appliances.

(2) Fire buckets shall be of 2 to 2½ gallons capacity with convex rimless bottoms, and shall be painted red and marked "FIRE" and placed in holed stands or suspended from strong brackets.

(3) Chemical fire-extinguishers shall be of at least 2 Imperial gallons' capacity, and be approved by the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, and shall be placed on brackets or suspended from strong hooks.

Chemical fire-extinguishers.

46. (1) Drinking taps shall be provided in the proportion of not less than one such tap to every 30 or portion of 30 students.

Drinking water.

(2) Where the water supply is under pressure and does not require filtration to render it potable, the drinking taps shall be bubble taps projecting a jet of water diagonally upward and fitted with a guard to prevent application of the lips to the tap.

Interpretation.

47. (1) There shall be complete air-disconnexion between every pipe or cistern from which water is drawn for human consumption and every sanitary convenience or other source of unwholesome effluvium.

(2) The Board may require filtration of water for drinking, and where filtration is required, every filter shall be readily accessible and capable of being effectually cleaned, and shall be so cleaned as often as may be necessary for maintaining a sufficient and wholesome output of water.

(3) Use for drinking water supply purposes of pipes made of lead or other unwholesome or poisonous material is hereby prohibited.

48. The owner or occupier of any school shall not suffer or permit to be used for any of the purposes of his school any other or further buildings, rooms, or premises than those approved by the Board until such other or further buildings, rooms, or premises have received the approval of the Board.

Such buildings, rooms, or premises shall be used only for purposes approved by the Board.

49. The Board may refuse to approve of the use or continued use of any portion of a building as a class-room if its occupation as such is rendered unsafe, unhealthy, or otherwise undesirable by reason of the entrance of dust, grit, smoke, fumes, or effluvium, or by noise or vibration produced by any trade process carried on in the vicinity.

50. (1) In class-rooms in which instruction is being given with the aid of models, there shall be provided not less than 27 square feet of floor area for each student, and an air space of not less than 180 cubic feet for each teacher student and model.

(2) In class-rooms, while being used as lecture rooms, there shall be provided a floor area of not less than 15 square feet, and an air space of not less than 180 cubic feet for each student.

51. The owner or occupier shall not suffer or permit a greater number of students to be assembled in any class-room for the purpose of instruction than the maximum permitted by the Board and stated in the certificate of registration.

52. The owner or occupier shall not suffer or permit any student, unless under the supervision of a qualified teacher, to apply heat by electrical appliance to the hair of a model. This regulation shall not apply to the process known as hair drying by means of an electric blower.

53. The owner or occupier shall not suffer or permit any student, unless under the supervision of a qualified teacher, to perform any of the operations of bleaching, tinting, or colouring.

54. The seat of every chair occupied by a model shall be at such an elevation, and the chair so shaped, as to enable a student, without stooping or otherwise being obliged to assume an uncomfortable position, to attend to the model seated therein.

55. Means and appliances for efficiently warming class-rooms shall be provided when such means and appliances are considered necessary by the Board.

56. (1) Every student shall be afforded a clear hour for luncheon between 11.45 a.m. and 2 p.m.

(2) The owner or occupier shall not suffer or permit students to partake of meals in any room of a school which has not been approved for the purpose by the Board.

PART VII.—HYGIENE SANITATION AND SAFETY IN HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS AND SCHOOLS.

57. In this part, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Customer" means a person who is in a hairdresser's shop for the purpose of receiving treatment from a hairdresser.

"Disinfecting fumes" means fumes which, when used as prescribed in these Regulations, will kill the germs of all infectious diseases.

"Disinfecting solution" means a solution which, when used as prescribed by these Regulations, will kill the germs of all infectious diseases.

"Hairdresser" includes a student, an apprentice, and an improver who is learning the practice of hairdressing, and also a teacher of hairdressing.

"Operator" means a hairdresser attending to a customer.

58. The following provisions shall apply in every hairdresser's shop, and in every school:—

(1) The owner or occupier shall—

(a) provide therein suitable and sufficient wash-basins with an adequate hot and cold water supply, and all such basins shall have fitted and in good order, an efficient waste-pipe suitably trapped and vented; Wash basins.

(b) cause a sufficient supply of towels, nail brushes, and disinfecting soap to be at all times available in his shop or school for the exclusive personal use of hairdressers. Towels, brushes, &c.

(2) Every hairdresser shall—

(a) at all times, when attending to a customer or model, have thoroughly clean hands; Hairdressers to have clean hands.

(b) in every case cleanse his hands immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience; and

(c) for the purpose of giving effect to this regulation, use a nail brush, disinfecting soap, and water.

(3) Every hairdresser shall, while attending to a customer or model, wear a clean and properly-fitting coat or overall of washable white or light-coloured material. Hairdressers to wear overalls.

(4) The owner or occupier shall cause all shelves, benches, and tables on which tools of trade are to be placed to be made of, or to be finished with, a durable smooth and impervious material, and shall not permit covers to be used on any such shelves, benches, or tables unless such covers can be thoroughly cleansed by washing or otherwise effectually disinfected. Furnishings to be of smooth impervious material.

(5) The owner or occupier shall cause a sufficient number of suitable receptacles constructed of smooth impervious material with tightly-fitting lids to be provided in his shop or school for the reception of— Receptacles for soiled linen and waste.

(a) soiled linen; and

(b) hair, paper, and other trade wastes.

Every such receptacle shall have marked thereon in permanent and prominent letters of not less than 1 inch in length the words or word "soiled linen" or "waste" (as the case may be), and such receptacles shall be used only for the purposes for which they are so labelled.

(6) The owner or occupier shall cause—

(a) all hair clippings and other waste, including shaving lather and paper, to be swept up as soon as practicable after each operation of hairdressing and placed in the proper receptacle; and Litter to be collected after each operation.

(b) all linen, immediately it becomes soiled, to be at once placed in the proper receptacle.

(7) The owner or occupier shall cause all walls, floors, floor coverings, shelves, fittings, and furniture on the premises and in any way connected with the business of his shop or school, to be maintained in good order and in a thoroughly clean condition. Furnishings, &c., to be kept clean.

(8) No person shall spit on the floor or walls or any other part of the premises, and immediately any sputum is noticed in or upon the premises, it shall be cleaned up and the spot from which such sputum was removed shall be at once disinfected. Prohibition of spitting.

(9) The owner or occupier shall cause the floor of his shop or school to be sprinkled with a disinfecting solution and completely swept at least once a day. Floors to be kept clean.

(10) The owner or occupier shall cause the appliances specified below to be sterilized in the manner described:— Appliances to be sterilized.

(a) Razor blades, scissors, and combs—by immersion for three minutes in steam, boiling water, or in any disinfecting solution, or by exposure in a closed receptacle to disinfecting fumes for not less than twenty minutes.

(b) Clippers—by immersion in boiling water for three minutes or by immersion in any disinfecting solution for three minutes, or by flaming or by exposure to any form of dry heat exceeding 212 degrees (Fahrenheit) for ten minutes, or by exposure in a closed receptacle to disinfecting fumes for not less than twenty minutes.

(c) Hair-brushes—by immersion for three minutes in any disinfecting solution, or by exposure in a closed receptacle to disinfecting fumes for not less than twenty minutes.

- (d) Shaving-brushes—by immersion of the hair or bristle portion in a disinfecting solution or in boiling water for five minutes.
- (e) New shaving-brushes—by boiling for twenty minutes before use.
- (f) Towels, wrappers, and other washable fabrics—by immersion in a disinfecting solution or in boiling water for ten minutes.
- (g) Strops—by wiping with a cloth or sponge saturated with a disinfecting solution.
- Appliances to be kept clean. (11) All hairdressing appliances shall be kept clean, and shall be sterilized before use each day and immediately after use on each customer or model. When not in use, all razors, scissors, clippers, and combs shall be kept in sterilizers provided for the purpose.
- Protection of head rest. (12) The head-rest of the operating chair shall, in the case of a person being shaved, be provided with a fresh cover of linen or paper for each customer or model. Paper so used shall immediately be put in the receptacle for "waste"; its further use for any purpose whatsoever is hereby prohibited.
- Provision of clean towels and neck cloths. (13) A fresh, clean face towel, neck protector, or neck cloth, and every similar appliance which comes in contact with the skin of a customer or model shall be provided for each customer or model.
- Method of lathering. (14) The owner or occupier shall cause all lathering and soaping to be done by wetting the shaving-brush with boiling water and sprinkling it with soap, powder, cream, or fluid before applying it to the face or neck of a customer or model. The brush shall not be rubbed on or dipped in soap or soap preparation, nor shall soap be applied direct to the face, head, or neck of a customer or model except by means of a sterile article.
- Prohibition of use of articles liable to convey infection. (15) No sponge, rotary hair-brush, shaving stick, lathering bowl, powder puff, alum stick, bloc hyaline, or other article liable to convey infection shall be used in hairdressing.
- Remedies for bleeding. (16) Bleeding shall be stopped only by some suitable styptic in powder or liquid form, on a fresh clean pad, which shall be destroyed immediately after use.
- Disposal of blood-stained linen. (17) Blood-stained towels and linen shall, immediately on completion of the service, be disinfected in the manner prescribed in this regulation.
- Application of powder. (18) Powder shall be applied only by means of a mechanical blower or a clean fresh pad.
- Vaseline and ointments—application of. (19) Vaseline, ointment, or any similar substance shall not be taken for use from any container other than a collapsible tube.
- Safety of electrical appliances. (20) The owner or occupier shall cause every electrical apparatus and appliance used on the premises in connexion with the practice or teaching of hairdressing to be maintained in a safe condition.

59. The following provisions shall apply only in hairdressers' shops:—

- Procedure where customer is suffering from infectious disease, &c. (1) Every customer suffering from an infectious disease (including venereal disease) or infectious skin rash shall notify the hairdresser of the existence of such disease or rash before taking or attempting to take his seat in the operating chair.
- Hairdresser's duty on noticing infectious disease. (2) (a) Every hairdresser, upon being so notified or without notification if he observes or suspects the presence of any infectious skin rash in any customer, shall place all appliances intended to be used and while in use in the service of that customer on a towel moistened with disinfecting solution or on a stout piece of paper.
- Treatment of appliances, &c., used upon customers suffering from infectious disease, &c. (b) All paper pads, towels, linen, and appliances used in the service of such customer, as well as the coat or overall worn by the operator, shall, immediately on completion of the service, be destroyed or disinfected in the manner prescribed in these Regulations.
- Hairdresser to cleanse his hands. (c) Such hairdresser shall then cleanse his hands by scrubbing with a nail brush, soap and water, and immersing them in disinfecting solution for at least three minutes before drying.
- Infected hairdresser not to attend a customer. (3) No hairdresser suffering from any infectious disease (including venereal disease), or skin rash, shall attend to any customer.

60. The following provisions shall apply only in schools:—

- (a) No person suffering from an infectious disease (including venereal disease), or infectious skin rash, shall act as a model; and Hairdressers and models to be free from infectious diseases.
- (b) No teacher or student suffering from an infectious disease (including venereal disease), or skin rash, shall practise hair-dressing on a model.

PART VIII.—FEES.

61. There shall be paid to the Board—

- (a) by every candidate for examination (this fee covers examination at one time in any number of prescribed classes of hair-dressing), £1 1s. Fees. For examinations.
- (b) for registration as a hairdresser, £1 1s. For registration. Certificate.
- (c) for any certificate (other than a certificate of registration of an employee under sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Act), 10s. 6d.
- (d) for registration of a school, £5. Registration—schools.

PART IX.—SUPPLEMENTARY.

62. A printed copy of these Regulations shall be conspicuously displayed in every school and in every hairdresser's premises to which they or any of their provisions apply. Copy of Regulations.

No procession of persons or vehicles, or both, shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads of the said Town Riding of the said Shire, unless the previous consent of the President for the time being of the said Shire, or, in his absence, of the Secretary, for the time being, of the said Shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four (24) hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, of the officer in charge of the police at Traralgon.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 10 (FISH AND POULTRY).

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 15th April, 1937, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council made thereunder, and such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since the 24th April, 1933, has had power to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons wheresoever employed in the business of—

- (a) killing, plucking, dressing poultry or game;
- (b) preparing fish for sale uncooked or for canning, drying, or smoking;
- (c) selling by wholesale or retail (except for consumption on the premises) poultry, game, fish, or oysters;
- (d) marketing (in fish and poultry markets) poultry, game, or fish”—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (1) That on the 15th April, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) **SPECIAL RATES.**—(a) Double time shall be the special rate for all work done by time workers on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, 21st April (Labour Day), and Christmas Day; and time and a half for all work done on Australia Day (26th January), Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Boxing Day, and Fishmongers' Picnic Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(b) For all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, 21st April (Labour Day), and Christmas Day piece-workers shall be paid double the rates mentioned in clause (13); and for all work done by such workers on Australia Day, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Boxing Day, and Fishmongers' Picnic Day the ordinary rates, plus 50 per cent.

(6) **TIME RATES.**—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for a week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours per week fixed in this Determination be paid the ordinary wage, with an addition of 33½ per cent., and for each hour worked beyond the one-half aforesaid the rate of wages payable shall be the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

(7) **WAITING TIME.**—Employees (piece workers included) who are required to wait for a longer period than an aggregate of 1½ hours (exclusive of meal hours) per day shall be paid for such excess at the wage rate provided for the class of work done.

(8) **TIME RECORD.**—All employees (including piece workers) shall indelibly record their daily times of beginning and ending work in a book, or on time cards, or by a mechanical contrivance: Any one of such means of recording shall be provided and maintained by the employer.

(9) **UNION INSPECTION.**—An Accredited Representative of the Federated Cold Storage, and Meat Preserving Employees Union of Australia shall have access to the records of times recorded by employees provided that such inspection is made between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on a working day.

(10) **DINING AND CHANGING ROOM.**—A dining-room, changing-room, adequate washing facilities, and in addition (where facilities are available) hot water for the making of tea shall be provided.

(11) **PREMISES TO BE KEPT CLEAN.**—The employer shall cause all rooms used by employees to be kept reasonably clean, and free from debris.

(12) **MEAL HOUR.**—A period of one hour shall be allowed for breakfast between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., and also a period of one hour for dinner between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m.

(13) **PIECE-WORK PRICES.**—The lowest piece-work prices payable to any person engaged in the following kinds of work shall be—

(15) **EMPLOYEES IN FREEZING CHAMBER.**—Notwithstanding the rates provided in Clause (14), any employee who is required to work in a freezing chamber, the temperature of which does not exceed 40° F., for an aggregate of time exceeding one hour on any day, shall be paid for all work (whether inside or outside the chamber) done on such day at the rate of 2s. 3½d. per hour.

(16) **OVERTIME.**—

(1) Any employee (other than a piece-worker) who works in excess of—

(a) 9 hours on any one day (employees in retail shops excepted)

(b) 48 hours in any week (excluding any overtime already provided for in sub-clause (a))

Shall be paid for such excess at the rate of time and a half.

(2) Piece-workers shall be entitled to ordinary piece-work prices, plus 50 per cent. for work done after 1 p.m. on Saturday.

(17) **SPECIAL RATES.**—(a) Double time shall be the rate for all work done by time workers on Sunday; and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Labour Day), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Fishmongers' Picnic Day, and after 12.30 p.m. on Show Day (in localities mentioned in the twelfth schedule to the *Public Service Act 1928*; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(b) For all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and 21st April (Labour Day) piece-workers shall be paid double the rates mentioned in clause (24); and for all work done by such workers on Australia Day, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Boxing Day, and Fishmongers' Picnic Day the ordinary rates, plus 50 per cent.

(18) TIME RATES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for a week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours per week fixed in this Determination be paid the ordinary wage, with an addition of 33½ per cent., and for each hour worked beyond the one-half aforesaid the rate of wages payable shall be the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

(19) MEAL ALLOWANCE.—Any employee (whether on time wages or piece-work) who is required to work for more than one hour after the usual closing time of the factory, shop, or place shall be paid 1s. 6d. as a meal allowance for each day that such extra time is worked.

(20) CLOTHING ALLOWANCE.—Where, in conformity with the custom of the trade or required by law, an employee wears, when at work, a washable outer garment, the laundering of which is not paid for by the employer, such employee shall be paid 1s. 9d. per week in addition to the ordinary rate.

(21) TIME RECORD.—All employees (including piece-workers) shall indelibly record their daily times of beginning and ending work in a book, or on time cards, or by a mechanical contrivance. Any one of such means of recording shall be provided and maintained by the employer.

(22) UNION INSPECTION.—An accredited representative of the Federated Cold Storage and Meat Preserving Employees Union of Australia shall have access to the records of times recorded by employees provided such inspection is made between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on a working day.

(23) DINING AND CHANGING ROOM.—A dining-room, and changing-room, together with adequate washing facilities shall be provided in all places (other than retail shops) in which two or more persons are employed preparing fish or poultry for trade or sale.
