LEVEE AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE, MELBOURNE.

IN honour of the Coronation of Their Majesties King George VI. and Queen Elizabeth, His Excellency the Governor (Lord Huntingfield) will hold a Levée at Parliament House, Spring-street, Melbourne, at 10.15 a.m. on Thursday, the 13th May, 1937.*

Private entrée cards will admit recipients to the south door of the Spring-street entrance at Parliament House at 10 a.m. All others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at 10.15 a.m.

In accordance with the custom followed at Levées held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the Service and all public bodies group themselves together as far as possible.

PROCLAMATION

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Factories and Shops Acts.
MUSICIANS TRADE TRIBUNAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that section 40 of the said Act shall extend and apply to and in respect of any trade specified in such Proclamation other than the trade of making or baking bread, or in the trade of delivering bread: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council, by such Proclamation, may appoint a trade tribunal, of the name, style, or designation stated therein, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade specified as aforesaid, the powers and duties conferred upon the Bread Trade Tribunal by section 40 of the said Act: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this Proclamation, hereby declare that section 40 of the said Act shall, from the date hereof, extend and apply to and in respect of the trade of a person employed as a player of any musical instrument: And doth, by this Proclamation, appoint a trade tribunal, styled the Musicians Trade Tribunal, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade above specified, the powers and duties conferred by section 40 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, upon the Bread Trade Tribunal.

BY-LAW NO. 3623.—RATES.—CARRUM WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 20th April, 1937, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 21st April, 1937, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements within the respective Divisions of the Waterworks District of the Carrum Waterworks Trust, as the same are respectively set out and described in the said Order in Council bearing date the 20th April, 1937, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 21st April, 1937, that is to say:—

That the respective rates in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands and tenements in the said several Divisions shall be—

RECISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN A RADIUS OF FIVE MILES OF THE BEECH FOREST POST OFFICE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the seventeenth day of February, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Otway, within a radius of 5 miles of the Beech Forest Post Office shall be exempted from the provisions of section 100 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1912* as amended by section 4 of the *Factories and Shops Acts Amendment Act 1914*, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Thursdays.

APPOINTMENT OF AN IRON AND STEEL ROLLING BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of iron or steel rolling.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board consisting of four members and a chairman, two of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and two as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of iron or steel rolling.

Also that such Wages Board may, in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding, be described for all purposes as the Iron and Steel Rolling Board, and the area or locality within which the Determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS BOARD: NUMBER OF MEMBERS INCREASED.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO MARGARINE.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Margarine Regulations 1937, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. The Margarine Regulations 1936 are hereby repealed.
3. For the purposes of section 236 of the *Health Act* 1928, as amended by section 13 of the *Health Act* 1935—
 - (a) "Colouring" means any of the colouring named or indicated in Regulation 10 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1935;
 - (b) "Prescribed colour" means any shade of colour between the colour named "saffron" (B.C.C.—54) in the *British Colour Council Dictionary of Colour Standards* and the colour named "tangerine" (B.C.C.—55) in the said Dictionary; and
 - (c) "Prescribed person or class of persons" includes all persons who manufacture biscuits, cake, or pastry for sale.
4. Every person who manufactures margarine otherwise than for the purpose of sale to any prescribed person or class of persons shall add (where such addition is necessary to obtain the prescribed colour) such suitable colouring or colourings to such margarine as will cause the prepared product to be of the prescribed colour.
5. Every person guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

SHIRE OF KOWREE.

BY-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Kowree regulating and preventing the leaving of vehicles in Wallace-street, Apsley.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and Act No. 4279, section 26, sub-section (3), and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kowree do hereby order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, "vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power, and includes a motor car, bicycle, or motor bicycle, and "driver" means any person in charge of vehicle.

2. No person shall leave any vehicle in Wallace-street, Apsley, between Splatt-street and Townsend-street, unless same is parked parallel with the kerb, and not more than one foot from the kerb line.
