On the occasion of the celebration of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levée should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting their names in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a licence bearing date the first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and numbered 501, the then Governor, pursuant to the provisions of the *Land Act 1890*, as amended by the *Land Act 1891*, granted to one William Arthur Mulliner the right to reside on or to cultivate the land described in the Schedule hereto, subject (*inter alia*) to the condition that if, in the opinion of the responsible Minister administering the *Land Act 1890* or any other Act then or thereafter in force relating to the sale of Crown lands in Victoria (hereinafter called "the Minister"), the land in respect of which the said licence was issued or any part thereof should be required for (*inter alia*) water supply purposes, the Governor, upon payment to the licensee of such compensation, if any, as the Minister might think fit, might at any time during the currency of the said licence resume the whole or any part of such land, and thereupon the licence should cease as to such land or the part resumed. And whereas the land described in the said Schedule being portion of the land comprised in the aforesaid licence is in the opinion of the Minister required for water supply purposes. Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby resume the land described in the said Schedule as being required for water supply purposes.

THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

All that piece of land in the State of Victoria, containing by admeasurement an area of 8 acres 2 roods 21 perches, being the western portion of allotment 68A of section 18, Parish of Sandhurst, County of Bendigo:—Commencing at the western angle of said allotment 68A: bounded thence by a line bearing S. 29 deg. 28 min. E. 1,220 links, more or less, to the Specimen Hill Race Reserve; by said race bearing northerly to allotment 68B; and thence by that allotment and a line bearing S. 60 deg. 32 min. W. 1,240 links, more or less, to the commencing point.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CERTAIN PLANT DECLARED TO BE A NOXIOUS WEED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act within the Shire of Numurkah, viz:—

Teucrium racemosum, R.Br., "Grey Germander."

PROCLAMATION OF A MENTAL HOSPITAL.

PROCLAMATION

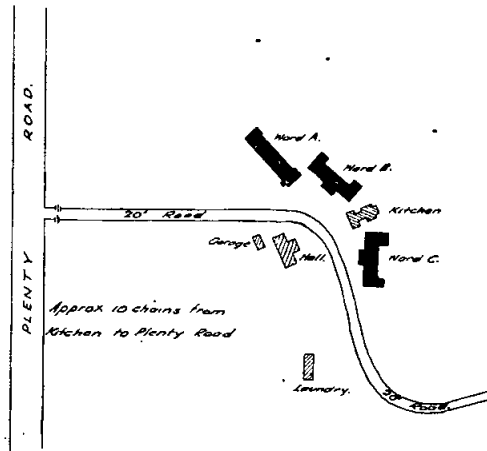
By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the *Lunacy Act 1928*, as amended by the *Mental Hygiene Act 1933*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time by Order published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any house or building in Victoria provided by the State for the reception of insane persons a mental hospital: And whereas on the nineteenth day of October, 1937, a Proclamation was issued proclaiming the following buildings a mental hospital as from the said date:—

Ward B and Ward C of Janefield Colony, situate at Janefield, in the Parishes of Nillumbik and Keelbundora, Counties of Evelyn and Bourke.

And whereas it is now desired that Ward A of the said Janefield Colony shall also be portion of the said mental hospital: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby, as from the date of this Proclamation, revoke the said Proclamation issued on the nineteenth day of October, 1937, and proclaim the following buildings a mental hospital, viz.:—

Ward A, Ward B, and Ward C of Janefield Colony, situate at Janefield, in the Parishes of Nillumbik and Keelbundora, Counties of Evelyn and Bourke, as shown in the plan annexed, hereto.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT EASTERN VIEW.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

ELECTRICAL APPROVALS BOARD.
 APPLIANCES TO BE SUBMITTED FOR APPROVAL.

Electric Razors, not including electric razors which can be operated only by a battery having a terminal pressure not exceeding 30 volts.

And further orders and prescribes that the fees for examining, testing and reporting to be paid to the State Electricity Commission of Victoria on application for approval of an electric razor, and on a demand by the said Commission that any approved electric razor be submitted for re-inspection, shall be the amounts shown below; and, moreover, that any person applying for approval of an electric razor shall deliver to the State Electricity Commission of Victoria with his application for approval, for the purpose of examining and testing, two samples thereof which samples shall be labelled in compliance with the Electrical Approvals Regulations (Approval of Equipment) 1935:—

SHOPS BOARD No. 2 (BOOT REPAIRERS)—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board styled the Boot Repairers Board, and did by subsequent Order alter the short title of the said Board to Shops Board No. 2 (Boot Repairers): And whereas it is expedient to vary the said powers in the manner hereafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Order first mentioned, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred the said Shops Board No. 2 (Boot Repairers) shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed—

- (a) in the process, trade, business, or occupation of a boot repairer;
- (b) in a boot repair shop selling grindery or other goods usually sold in such shops.

VARIATION OF A REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF TRARALGON.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Traralgon, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Traralgon, doth hereby vary the Regulation made on the fourteenth day of August, 1923, so that the hour of closing such shops on the evening of Friday in each and every week during the whole of each year shall be fixed at Nine o'clock in lieu of Six o'clock.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY, AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF WODONGA WITHIN THE SHIRE OF WODONGA.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the fifth day of October, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Wodonga, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Wodonga, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 100 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1912*, as amended by section 4 of the *Factories and Shops Amendment Act 1914*, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY, AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DONALD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Township of Donald, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Donald, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the twenty-eighth day of August, 1923, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule

to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*), within the Township of Donald, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Donald, shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-Holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Donald, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Donald, doth hereby revoke the Regulation made on the twenty-third day of November, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Donald, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Donald, shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-Holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF LAND TEMPORARILY RESERVED IN THE PARISH OF CABANANDRA, AND KNOWN AS "DELEGATE RIVER PUBLIC HALL SITE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land

and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 19th October, 1937, as a site for a Public Hall in the Parish of Cabanandra, and known as "Delegate River Public Hall."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year), as the Reserve may be set apart for public meetings, dances, entertainments, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings (2s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gate or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserves.

12. No person shall play in any competition, tournament, or inter-club game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any waste paper, bottles, tins, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve.
3. No fires shall be lighted on the Reserve except where directed by the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained—
 1. Gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession while in the Reserve or take away therefrom any live or dead timber, or the whole or any part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, ferns, or other vegetation.
 2. Ring-bark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub.
5. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences, shall together with any horses, cattle, sheep, dogs, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry or any carriages, vehicles, machinery, goods, or chattels in his possession or care be liable to be removed therefrom:—
 - (a) Assaulting any other person.
 - (b) Being in an intoxicated condition.
 - (c) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 - (d) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting language.
 - (e) Behaving improperly or riotously.
 - (f) Wilfully interfering with or disturbing any entertainment, performance, sport, game, pastime, or amusement to the annoyance, detriment, or discomfort of any person or persons engaged in such entertainment, performance, sport, game, matches, pastime, or amusement.

The Council of the Shire of Lillydale has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.
