Private entrée cards will admit recipients to the south door of the Spring-street entrance at Parliament House at 10 a.m. All others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at 10.15 a.m.

In accordance with the custom followed at Levées held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the Service and all public bodies group themselves together as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so.

On the occasion of the celebration of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levée should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting their names in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 1 of the *Goods (Sale of Wool) Act 1936* (No. 4408) it is provided that this Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Governor in Council is satisfied that there has been passed in each of the other States of the Common-

wealth of Australia an Act containing provisions substantially similar to those contained in section 2 of the above-mentioned Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this my Proclamation fix Friday the first day of July, 1938, as the day on which the said Act shall come into operation.

LICENSING ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in the *Licensing Act 1928* it is enacted that a vote of electors for the Legislative Assembly shall be taken once in every eighth year on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, not being a day within three months before or after the day for a general election: And whereas it is further enacted in the said Act that at the first of such votes and at any subsequent vote whenever licences exist the following Resolution only shall be submitted to the electors:—
Abolition—That licences shall be abolished: And whereas the first of such votes was taken in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty: And whereas at the date hereof licences authorized under the said Act do still exist: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation fix Saturday the eighth day of October as the day on which the above-mentioned vote of electors for the Legislative Assembly shall be taken in the year 1938.

SHIRE OF ROSEDALE.

PETITION UNDER THE DRAINAGE AREAS ACT 1923 (No. 3668).

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Drainage Areas Act* 1923 (No. 3668), section 6, the substance and prayer of the petition, in accordance with section 4 of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

SWAN HILL SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1938.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-LAW No. 3808.

Drainage Rates—Drainage Districts.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following drainage rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the respective Divisions of the Shepparton Drainage District and the Tongala-Stanhope Drainage District for the drainage of such lands:—

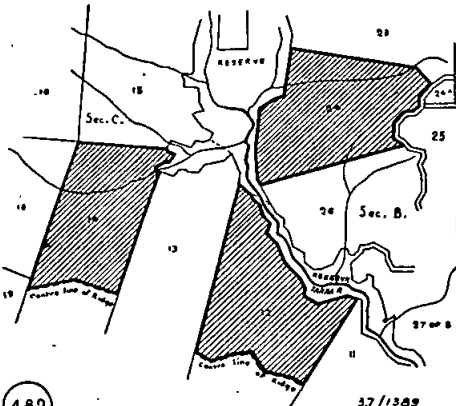

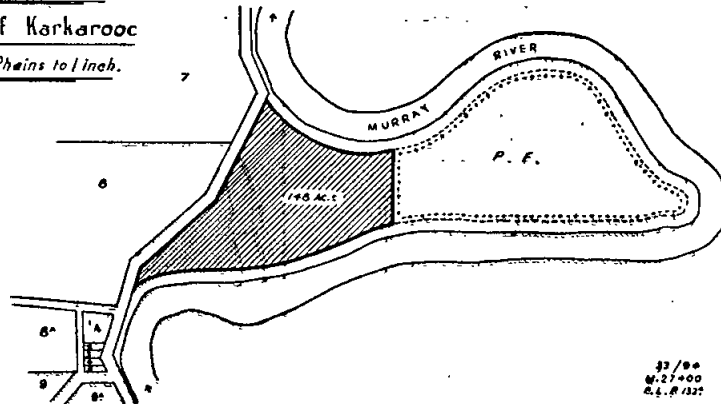

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CAMPING AND WATERING PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF TOORA.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 19th April, 1887, as a site for Camping and Watering purposes in the Parish of Toora, and known as the "Franklin River Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on the Reserve.
2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.
3. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose.
4. No person shall erect any building or structure on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Such permission may be granted subject to such terms, payments, fees, and conditions as may be deemed by the Committee of Management to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall cause to be used or use any bathing-box or boat-house for residential purposes.

5. All buildings to be erected on the Reserve, in pursuance of any consent given by the Committee of Management, must conform to plans and Regulations as to the position and design approved by the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall camp or erect any tent in or upon the Reserve except in such places (if any) as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as the Committee of Management shall determine.

7. No person shall erect any building or tent on the Reserve, nor any booth, nor any structure, nor offer for sale any articles therein without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. All persons using the conveniences (if any) provided by the Committee of Management on the Reserve shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall light fires except in places (if any) set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.

10. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.

11. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearms in or upon the Reserve, except by permission of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without permission of the Committee of Management.

13. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with the power incidental to that status), within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.

14. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Reserve.

15. All fees received from camping, agistment, or any other purposes shall be expended on the liquidation of any liability already incurred in the maintenance and improvement, and in the further maintenance and improvement, of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

16. The Council of the Shire of South Gippsland has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

17. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Rubbish, &c., on Land—Fencing Vacant Land.

A By-law of the City of Prahran made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 197, for—

- (i) Prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages.
- (ii) Prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land.
- (iii) Requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*).

- (iv) Requiring that vacant land within the area within the Municipal District hereinafter set forth in this By-law, and declare thereby to be a populous or residential area, shall be enclosed with a substantial fence constructed of such material and in such manner as is hereinafter described.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran order as follows:—

Part I.

1. No person shall deposit or leave or cause to be deposited or left—

- (a) on any street, road, lane, or passage, or
(b) on any land

within the Municipal District of Prahran, any refuse or rubbish.

2. The Council of the said City may, by notice in writing to be given to the owner or occupier of any land within the said Municipal District, require such owner or occupier to remove or destroy any refuse or rubbish (other than refuse or rubbish, the removal of which the Council of the said City has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*) on any such land within fourteen days from the date of the service of such notice.

Part II.

3. (a) The whole of the said Municipal District is hereby declared to be a populous area.

(b) All vacant land within such populous area shall be enclosed with a substantial fence.

(c) Any fence of any of the kinds mentioned and described in the schedule hereto shall be a substantial fence within the meaning of this By-law: Provided that modifications, to be first approved in writing by the City Surveyor, of the construction of any such fence may be allowed where in his opinion such modifications are reasonable in the circumstances.

(d) The Council of the said City may, by notice in writing to be given to the owner or occupier of any vacant land within such populous area, require such owner or occupier within fourteen days from the date of service of such notice to enclose such land with a substantial fence constructed as aforesaid.

Part III.—General.

4. If any owner or occupier of land fails to comply with the requirements of any notice given pursuant to the provisions of this By-law, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

5. When any such owner or occupier of any land cannot by reasonable diligence be found, any notice to be given under clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be deemed to be lawfully given if the same is posted on a conspicuous portion of such land.

6. Any person who fails to comply with, or is himself guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law, or who authorizes or directs any act contrary to the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £20 for each offence, and in case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of £5 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Prahran.

Schedule.

1. A properly constructed paling or picket fence at least 5 feet in height (including the height of any plinth), with no greater distance between the palings or pickets than 2 inches.
2. A properly constructed wire fence at least 4 feet in height having not less than six wires stretched with no greater distance between each of the three lowest wires or the bottom wire and the ground than 6 inches, and the posts or standards or binding wires or droppers of which are not more than 9 feet from each other, with straining posts not more than 8 feet apart.
3. A properly constructed masonry or concrete wall at least 4 feet in height, and not less than 9 inches thick, or 4½ inches thick where properly constructed piers are erected not more than 9 feet apart.
4. A properly constructed galvanized corrugated iron fence with iron of not less than 26-gauge, at least 5 feet in height.
5. A combination of any the above-named fences.

Volume 5903, folio 1180584, and
Volume 6132, folio 1226356,

the following provisions shall apply and take effect:—

- (i) No building shall be erected in the said portion of the said area in such manner that any part thereof is within 10 feet of the western boundary of Chapel-street.
- (ii) No building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, or business shall be erected in the said portion of the said area of more than two stories in height.
- (iii) The roof covering of such building shall be of such material other than iron as may be approved in any particular case by the Council.
- (iv) The use of any such building in the said portion of the said area for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, or business which requires the erection of any chimney or smoke stack or involves the production of any sound, smoke, or smell which may be heard, seen, or smelt beyond the exterior of any such building or in which power other than electric power is used to provide power and/or heat and/or light is hereby prohibited.

2. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building contrary to clause 1 (i), (ii), or (iii) of this By-law it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of such building a notice requiring him to pull down and remove such building within a time to be named in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with such notice the Council may pull down and remove such building and sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of such pulling down and removal and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after a notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect of such offence.
