HASTINGS-STREET AND HANN-STREET.

Amendment of Proclamation.

WHEREAS it is provided under section 518 of the *Local Government Act 1928* that when in regard to any Proclamation made by the Governor in Council, pursuant to this section or any corresponding previous enactment, the Minister is satisfied that an error or misdescription has been made, the Governor in Council may rescind, revoke, amend or vary such Proclamation in whole or in part as the case requires: And whereas in a Proclamation dated the seventh day of September One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighth day of September One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, at page 2739, the lands comprised in the above-mentioned streets were incorrectly described: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation amend such Proclamation by deleting the descriptions of the said streets contained therein, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

Hastings-street.—All that piece or parcel of land commencing at a point on a line bearing S. 0 deg. 0 min. 0 $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. E. 2.125 links from the most north-westerly corner of Crown allotment 94, Parish of Langwarrin, County of Mornington; thence bounded by lines bearing east 3.901.7 links, north 100 links, west 3.878 links, S. 13 deg. 20 min, W. 102.9 links to the commencing point.

Hann-street.—All that piece or parcel of land commencing at a point on a line bearing east 2.424.2 links from the most north-westerly corner of Crown allotment 94, Parish of Langwarrin, County of Mornington; thence bounded by lines bearing south 2.025 links, west 100 links, north 2.000 links, N. 75 deg. 58 min. E. 103.1 links to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION RESCINDED AS TO PART.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do hereby rescind the Proclamation dated the 26th February, 1872, whereby certain lands in the Parishes of Glenburnie and Bylands were defined as the Town of Duffytown (the name of which was altered to Gavan Duffy by Proclamation dated the 11th March, 1872, *Gazette 1872*, page 557), revoked as to part by Order in Council of the 12th September, 1922, so far as regards the portion thereof hereinafter described, viz.:—

Ninety-two acres, Parish of Glenburnie, County of Dalhousie: Commencing at a point bearing S. 34 deg. 15 min. E. 100 links and S. 55 deg. 45 min. W. 100 links from the south angle of allotment 1 of section 20, Town of Gavan Duffy; bounded thence by allotments B5, 61b, and 61i, Parish of Bylands, bearing S. 55 deg. 45 min. W. 2,300 links; by said allotment 61i, a road, and allotment 13r, bearing N. 34 deg. 15 min. W. 4,000 links; by allotment 13p bearing N. 55 deg. 45 min. E. 2,000 links; by allotment 13r2, Parish of Bylands, bearing N. 63 deg. 3 min. E. 299 links; and thence by a road, Town of Gavan Duffy, bearing S. 34 deg. 15 min. Land Act 1928.**AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.****PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

EXTENT OF SEWERAGE DISTRICT INCREASED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

That the extent of the Sewerage District of the Ballarat Sewerage Authority be increased by adding to the same the lands comprised within the boundaries described in the schedule hereto, and as on and from the date hereof, the extent of such district shall be deemed to be increased accordingly.

SCHEDULE.
