Fungicides Acts 1928 and 1935.

ALTERING STANDARD PRESCRIBED FOR LIME SULPHUR SOLUTIONS AS FUNGICIDES AND INSECTICIDES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Fungicides Acts 1928 and 1935, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby alter the Proclamation made on the third day of March, 1936, declaring certain substances to be Fungicides, Insecticides, Vermin Destroyers, and Weed Destroyers, and prescribing standards therefor, in so far as it relates to the standard prescribed for Lime Sulphur Solutions in the second column of the First and Second Schedules, by substituting in lieu thereof the following standard:—

“ Shall not contain any sludge.

Shall contain not less than 27 and not more than 29 per cent. of total soluble sulphur, not less than 19 and not more than 21 per cent. of polysulphide sulphur, and not more than 2.5 per cent. of thiosulphate sulphur, all calculated as percentage by weight in volume.”

CONSTITUTION OF A MEAT AREA.

Land Act 1928.**AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.****PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE PLUMBERS AND
GASFITTERS REGULATIONS 1936.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby amend the Plumbers and Gasfitters Regulations 1936, as follows:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Plumbers and Gasfitters Regulations 1938, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Regulation 6 (2) (b) is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

(b) To receive all moneys due to the Board, and bank same in accordance with the Board's directions; to make disbursements from the Board's funds as directed by the Board (subject to the provisions of Regulation 21); and to submit to the Board half-yearly statements of accounts.

3. Regulation 6 (2) (c) is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

(c) To register such persons as have been approved by the Board for registration and have paid the prescribed fees, and to keep a register in the form set out in Schedule "A" hereto.

4. Regulation 9 (1) is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

(1) The Board shall approve for registration as plumbers for the appropriate class or classes of plumbing work and/or as gasfitters such applicants as, in its opinion, are competent to engage in or undertake the particular class or classes of plumbing work and/or gasfitting, and persons so approved shall, on payment of the prescribed fee within twenty-eight days of notification of approval by the Registrar, be duly registered.

5. In the proviso to Regulation 10, immediately following the word "shall," the words "on payment of the prescribed fees" shall be inserted.

6. Regulation 18 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

18. No person other than an apprentice, improver, or person employed to assist a plumber or gasfitter shall engage in or undertake plumbing work of any class and/or gasfitting in any city or town, or in any area or district under the control of any Sewerage Authority, or in any other part of Victoria to which the provisions of section 2 (6) of the *Health Act* 1935, are extended, unless he is registered as a plumber of the appropriate class and/or as a gasfitter (as the case may require) under the provisions of the Health Acts and these Regulations.

And the Honorable Sir John Richards Harris, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN A RADIUS OF ONE MILE OF THE COBRAM POST OFFICE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Tungamah within a radius of one mile of the Cobram Post Office doth hereby revoke the Regulation made on the third day of March, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Tungamah within a radius of one mile of the Cobram Post Office shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-Holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Tungamah within a radius of one mile of the Cobram Post Office of the particular classes to be affected doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the third day of March, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1912 as amended by the Factories and Shops Acts Amendment Act 1914) within the portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Tungamah within a radius of one mile of the Cobram Post Office shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-Holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

A CONDENSERIES BOARD, A BUTTER FACTORIES BOARD, AND A RETAIL DAIRY BOARD TO BE APPOINTED AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF THE SAID BOARDS AND OF THE BUTTER BOARD.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council did by Order dated the eleventh day of December, 1912, appoint a Wages Board described as the Butter Board and did by subsequent Orders extend and vary the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to appoint a Condenseries Board, a Butter Factories Board, and a Retail Dairy Board and to adjust the powers of such Boards and of the Butter Board in the manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby—

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Butter Factories Board and the Retail Dairy Board) wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business or occupation of manufacturing or preparing for trade or sale condensed milk, sterilized milk, dried milk, milk sugar, sterilized cream or any other milk product.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Butter Factories Board and the Retail Dairy Board) wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business or occupation of manufacturing or preparing for trade or sale condensed milk, sterilized milk, dried milk, milk sugar, sterilized cream or any other milk product: Also, that such Wages Board may in

any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Condenseries Board, and that the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

- (3) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of manufacturing or preparing for trade or sale—
 - (a) butter, cheese or casein;
 - (b) cream for wholesale trade other than sterilized cream.
- (4) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of eight members and a chairman, four of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and four as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of manufacturing or preparing for trade or sale—
 - (a) butter, cheese, or casein;
 - (b) cream for wholesale trade other than sterilized cream.

Also, that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Butter Factories Board and that the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

- (5) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of preparing milk or cream for trade or sale by retail.
- (6) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business or occupation of preparing milk or cream for trade or sale by retail. Also, that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Retail Dairy Board, and that the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.
- (7) For the purpose of adjusting the powers which the said Condenseries Board, the Butter Factories Board, and the Retail Dairy Board and the said Butter Board may lawfully exercise—

- (i) deprive the said Butter Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Butter Factories Board and the Retail Dairy Board) wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of manufacturing or preparing for trade or sale condensed milk, sterilized milk, dried milk, milk sugar, sterilized cream, or any other milk product and confer such power exclusively on the Condenseries Board.
- (ii) deprive the said Butter Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of manufacturing or preparing for trade or sale—
 - (a) butter, cheese, or casein;
 - (b) cream for wholesale trade other than sterilized cream;
 and confer such power exclusively on the Butter Factories Board.
- (iii) deprive the said Butter Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of preparing milk or cream for trade or sale by retail and confer such power exclusively on the Retail Dairy Board.

APPOINTMENT OF A SAUSAGE CASINGS BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of preparing or cleaning casings for sausages or similar products.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of preparing or cleaning casings for sausages or similar products.

Also that such Wages Board may, in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Sausage Casings Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

CHAFFCUTTERS BOARD—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board styled the Chaffcutters Board, and did by Order extend the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to vary the said powers in the manner hereafter appearing:

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Orders accordingly, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred the said Chaffcutters Board shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the process, trade or business of chaff-cutting, corn crushing, or compressing fodder; or in the trade of corn cleaning or corn grading;
- (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the trade or business of chaffcutting, corn crushing, or compressing fodder;
- (c) employed in the process, trade, or business of threshing when such process, trade or business is carried on in a stationary mill.

MEAT PRESERVERS BOARD—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board described as the Meat Preservers Board and did by subsequent Order extend the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to vary the powers of the said Board in the manner hereafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Orders above-mentioned, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred the said Meat Preservers Board shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the process, trade, or business of—
 - (i) preserving meat;
 - (ii) preparing food products from animal fat or from edible oils;
 - (iii) putting up preserved meat or food products prepared from animal fat or from edible oils.
- (b) employed as a storeman, packer, or sorter in connexion with the trade or business of—
 - (i) preserving meat;
 - (ii) preparing food products from animal fat or from edible oils.

SHOPS BOARD No. 13 (FUEL AND FODDER—COUNTRY)—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board styled the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, and did by subsequent Orders alter the short title of the said Board to Shops Board No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder—Country) and extend the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to further vary the said powers in the manner hereafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Orders above-mentioned, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred the said Shops Board No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder—Country) shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (b) employed carting, cutting, or otherwise preparing firewood for sale or for use in some process, trade, business, or occupation;
- (c) employed in connexion with the sale or distribution of wood, coal, or coke;
- (d) employed in the trade of charcoal burning.

SLAUGHTERING FOR EXPORT BOARD—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board styled the Slaughtering for Export Board: And whereas it is expedient to vary the powers of the said Board in the manner hereafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Order, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred the said Slaughtering for Export Board shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the meat export trade at the following classes of work—

- (a) slaughtering or dressing sheep, lambs, cattle, pigs, or calves;
- (b) boning, trimming, or labouring;
- (c) skin store work.

RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE MOTOR DRIVERS BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the Order made on the tenth day of April, 1922, re-defining the area or locality within which the Determination of the Motor Drivers Board shall be operative, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Order, re-defining such area or locality, that is to say:—

The area or locality within which the Determination of the Motor Drivers Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE SLAUGHTERING FOR EXPORT BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Order, that is to say:—

The area or locality within which the Determination of the Slaughtering for Export Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

EXTENSION OF POWERS OF THE GROCERS SUNDRIES BOARD.

WHEREAS, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, the Governor in Council did by Order dated the twenty-third day of March, 1937, specify the trade of manufacturing or preparing honey as a trade to which section 6 of the Factories and Shops Act 1936 shall apply: And whereas the Governor in Council did by further Order made on the seventh day of April, 1937, appoint

a Wages Board (to be known as the General Board) to determine the lowest rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in such trade specified as aforesaid: And whereas the Minister of Labour is satisfied that a majority of employees in the said specified trade desire that the powers of the Grocers Sundries Board be extended thereto under section one hundred and thirty-nine of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the powers of the Grocers Sundries Board be extended so that in addition to the powers conferred by Orders heretofore made the said Board may determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing or preparing honey, such trade being, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, of the same or similar character to the trade for which the Grocers Sundries Board was appointed.

GARDEN EMPLOYEES BOARD—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order dated the 31st October, 1929, appointed the Garden Employees Board and did by subsequent Order vary the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to further vary the said powers in the manner hereafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, doth hereby vary the said Orders, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred the said Garden Employees Board shall be given the following powers (that is to say):—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed as gardeners or gardeners' labourers—

- (a) by a master gardener other than a market gardener;
- (b) in connexion with the laying out, cultivation, or keeping in order of gardens in connexion with private houses, guest houses, flats, or factories;
- (c) in the laying out, cultivation, or keeping in order of a garden or lawn in connexion with a race-course;
- (d) in the laying out, cultivation, or keeping in order of a garden, lawn, fairway, or green in connexion with any golf links or putting green.

GENERAL BOARD.—ORDER SPECIFYING CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TRADES AND BRANCHES OF TRADES.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1936*, the Governor in Council did, by Order made on the 23rd day of March, 1937, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th day of March, 1937, specify certain trades and branches of trades to be trades or branches of trades for the purposes of section 6 of the said Act:

And whereas, subsequent to the making of such Order the Minister has recommended that the trades or branches of trades set out hereunder and in respect of which no Determination of any Wages Board is operative be specified in accordance with and pursuant to the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby specify the following additional trades and branches of trades to be trades or branches of trades for the purposes of the said section 6 of the said Act, that is to say:—

- Gold beating.
- Ornamenting cakes, where such work is not subject to the Determination of the Pastrycooks Board.
- Manufacturing or preparing—
 - Designs for paper patterns or for other paper articles whatsoever.
 - Paper crackers or bon-bons.
 - Lampshades of all types other than those made of silk, parchment, glass, metal, porcelain, earthenware, synthetic resin, casein, or other substance of a nature similar to synthetic resin or casein.
 - Abrasive articles (other than abrasive paper or cloth), including carborundum wheels, emery wheels, and sharpening stones.
 - Articles made of feathers, including dress ornaments and boas.
 - Vinegar and yeast.

And the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AMENDING AN ORDER IN COUNCIL APPROVED ON 19TH MAY, 1936, CONSENTING TO THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN TRAMWAYS BOARD USING MOTOR OMNIBUSES TO PLY FOR HIRE ON ROUTE SPECIFIED HEREUNDER.

HIS Excellency, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 15, 19, 5, and 11 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1923* (No. 3742), doth by this Order consent to the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board using motor omnibuses to ply for hire within the metropolitan area along the route prescribed in the schedule hereunder, and subject to the conditions that the sections, stopping places, time tables, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses to be used on the route as set out in the said schedule are observed by the Board.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO ABOVE.

Description of Route, including Commencing and Terminal Points.

Commencing from Sunshine Railway Station and proceeding via Durham-road, Anderson-road, Ridley-street, Sydney-street, and Ballarat-road to the Deer Park Post Office, such route being an extension of the existing route from Footscray to Sunshine Railway Station. The extension and the existing route together shall be regarded as one route from the corner of Paisley and Nicholson streets, Footscray, to the Deer Park Post Office.

General Conditions.

The time tables, fares, and sections in respect of the existing route from Footscray to Sunshine Railway Station shall remain unchanged.

The conditions in respect of the extension of route from Sunshine Railway Station to Deer Park Post Office shall be as follows:—

Sections on Route.

1. Between Sunshine Railway Station and the corner of Ballarat-road and Sydney-street.
2. Between the corner of Ballarat-road and Sydney-street and a point approximately midway between Sydney-road and the Deer Park Post Office.
3. Between such point and the Deer Park Post Office.

Stopping Places on Route.

Near side of intersecting streets and roads.

Time Tables to be Observed.

The minimum service shall be as follows (departures *ex* Deer Park Post Office):—

Week days.—6.20 a.m., 2.00 p.m., 3.10 p.m., 6.30 p.m., 12.10 a.m.

Saturdays.—7.50 a.m., 2.00 p.m., 6.30 p.m.

Sundays.—2.00 p.m., 6.30 p.m.

The Board may, however, operate such more frequent service if, and as, it so desires.

Fares to be Charged.

First section travelled ... 2d.
Each additional section travelled ... 1d.

The through fare from Footscray to Deer Park Post Office shall be 9d.

The fare to be charged for children under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under three (3) years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest lower penny.

Maximum Number of Motor Omnibuses to be Used on Route from Footscray to Deer Park Post Office.

Six (6).

Developmental Route.

ORDER AMENDING ORDERS IN COUNCIL PRESCRIBING ROUTES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN AREA ALONG WHICH MOTOR OMNIBUSES FOR WHICH "REGULAR SERVICE" LICENCES ARE GRANTED MAY PLY FOR HIRE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred under the provisions of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), doth by this Order provide that the Orders in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 18th December, 1934, 5th May, 1936, and 24th May, 1938, prescribing routes within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted may ply for hire under the provisions of the said Act shall be amended in the manner following:—

Amending Zoning By-law.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and particularly under and with reference to sections 197 (5a), 197 (6), and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 120, for altering and amending By-laws Nos. 74 and 119, which prescribe areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibit or regulate within the whole or any part of such residential areas the erection (including the adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trade, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in the By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. That all those areas of land or allotments prescribed in By-law 119, clause 4, as part of residential area number three (factory area), the frontages of which are set out in Schedule D hereto, be excised from the said residential area number three, and added to residential area number one (the residential area) prescribed in By-law 74.

2. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purposes for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

3. Should a business or trade, &c., established in a building prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and contrary to its provisions, be removed, become defunct or closed down, the Council may, on receipt of an application in writing, grant permission for the building to be used for such other purposes as the Council think reasonable in the circumstances.

SHIRE OF MILDURA.

By-Law No. 78.

A By-law of the Shire of Mildura, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and section 6 of Part 1 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, and numbered 78, for regulating traffic and processions, appointing standing places for motor cars, and regulating the use of standing places for motor cars and the manner in which motor cars may be placed or left thereon or removed therefrom.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of the aforesaid Acts of Parliament and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura, doth order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context requires otherwise—
“Shire” shall mean the Shire of Mildura.
“Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Mildura.
“Commercial vehicle” means any vehicle which is used for carrying goods for sale, hire, or reward, or in the course of trade.
“Driver” shall mean the person in charge of a vehicle or a horse.
“Footway” shall include every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Shire of Mildura habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles.
“Horse” shall include any draught animal or beast of burden.
“Intersection” means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which join at an angle, whether or not such streets cross.
“Licensed” shall mean licensed by the Council.
“Motor car” shall include any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and shall include a motor cycle.
“Public place” shall include and apply to every public highway, road, street, footway, alley, court, passage, or thoroughfare, notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed on private property, and also any public park, garden, or reserve.
“Safety zone” means a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the Council in any street.
“Street” shall include every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Shire other than a footway.
“Vehicle” shall include any cycle, and any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power.
“Writing” shall mean and include printing, lithography, and other means of representing or reproducing in a visible form.

2. Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Shire of Mildura.

DIVISION A.—REGULATION OF TRAFFIC GENERALLY.

1. It shall be lawful for the Council by resolution from time to time as may be convenient or necessary to fix or appoint in any street—

- (a) One or more safety zones.
- (b) One or more stopping places for picking up or setting down passengers by licensed omnibuses.
- (c) One or more parking areas for motor cars.
- (d) One or more public stands for licensed motor cars plying for hire, which said stands may be in addition to or in substitution for all or any of the public stands for licensed motor cars heretofore fixed or appointed by the Council by or under any By-law.
- (e) One-way traffic on either side of a central reserve or plantation.

2. Any safety zone, stopping place, parking area, public stand or prohibited parking area as aforesaid heretofore fixed or appointed under this Division may be indicated by such notice as aforesaid, and shall thereupon be deemed to have been duly fixed or appointed under this Division.

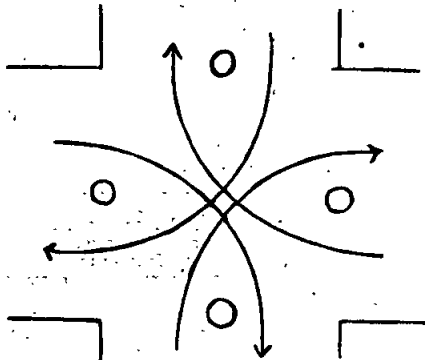
3. Any such safety zone, stopping place, parking area, public stand or prohibited parking area as aforesaid, whether fixed or appointed under this Division, may be discontinued or abolished at any time by the discontinuance or removal by the Council of the notice relating thereto.

4. The driver of a vehicle upon any street or the rider of a horse upon any street shall, except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

- (a) Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.
- (b) When meeting a vehicle, horse, or pedestrian, keep on the left or near side of the street.
- (c) When passing any vehicle, horse, or pedestrian going in the same direction, go on the right or off side of such vehicle, horse, or pedestrian.

(d) Before stopping or turning round in any street or turning from one street into another, give notice of his intention, so to do by holding up or out his whip, or hand so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle) upon stopping so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic and, if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle he shall, upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic, he shall remove his vehicle so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

(e) Before turning to the right or off side from one street or into another, drive or ride around the traffic buttons, as shown in the subjoined diagram:—



(f) When approaching the intersection of part of any street where a police officer or an officer of the Council is stationed for the purpose of controlling traffic, observe and comply with the signal of such police officer or officer of the Council to stop or proceed, as the case may be.

(g) When drawing up at any street intersection to await the signal of the police officer or officer of the Council directing the traffic to proceed, if desirous of turning to the left into an intersecting street, stand as near as practicable to the kerb.

(h) When approaching an intersection which he intends to cross, grant the right of way to a vehicle approaching from his right, with the exception of at intersections where a traffic officer is stationed.

(i) Not enter any safety zone with his vehicle or horse, or any part thereof respectively.

(j) Not stop on any licensed motor omnibus stopping place fixed or appointed by the Council unless (being the driver of a licensed motor omnibus) for the purpose of duly taking up or setting down passengers.

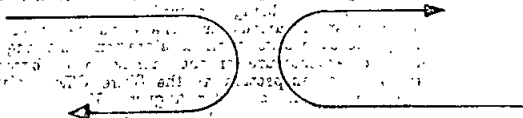
(k) Not stop on any licensed motor car stand fixed or appointed by the Council under this or any other Division unless (being the driver of a licensed motor car and such stand being vacant) for the purpose of duly taking up his authorized position thereon.

(l) Not leave such vehicle stationary at the kerb within a distance of 25 feet of an intersection.

(m) Not leave his motor car or vehicle unattended except for a reasonable time only (such reasonable time may be determined by the police officer or officer of the Council), and except it is left in such a position as not to interfere with or obstruct traffic, and if the vehicle is not mechanically propelled shall have the wheels properly secured.

(n) Cause the same to be drawn as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side of the street and parallel thereto, and brought to a standstill on the approach of and during the passing of any fire-engine or other vehicle apparently proceeding in charge of a fireman to the scene of any fire.

(o) When crossing from one side to the other side of such street, make the complete turn so that when stationary at the kerb his vehicle shall be headed in the same direction as the traffic is proceeding, as shown in the subjoined diagram:—



5. The driver of a vehicle upon any street shall—

(a) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passengers or goods, do so as near as may be to the footway, on his left or near side.

(b) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annoyance of any other person so as to block or immediately and closely precede or follow, or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle.

6. Every driver of a motor vehicle or bicycle upon any street shall within reasonable distance and before passing any other vehicle, horse, or pedestrian, or when approaching any intersection, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell, or other instrument.

7. No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, drive any vehicle upon any street or permit any vehicle to be upon any street unless a good and serviceable lamp, suitable to such vehicle, is securely fixed at the right or off side of the front of such vehicle, and is lighted and is so placed that the light therefrom is distinctly visible to persons in front of such vehicle as a white light, and to persons at the rear of such vehicle as a red light. Provided that in any case where a red tail light is used it shall not be necessary that the lights fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear. Provided further that where any part of a vehicle or any load on a vehicle projects more than three feet behind the rear wheels of such vehicle a lighted lamp shall be kept attached to the rearward extremity of such part or load respectively in such a position and manner as to show a red light clearly visible to any person approaching such vehicle from the rear or passing such vehicle from the front.

8. No person shall drive any vehicle upon any street or permit any vehicle to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle, and no person while driving any vehicle upon any street shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

9. No person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal, or drive any horse or cattle, or drive or impel any vehicle upon any footway. Provided, however, that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from premises abutting thereon.

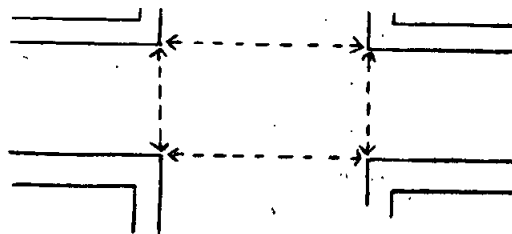
DIVISION B.—ONE-WAY TRAFFIC.

1. The driver of a vehicle upon any street or avenue, set out in Schedule 1 to this By-law, or the rider of a horse on any street or avenue set out in Schedule 1 to this By-law, shall keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side: the reserve or plantation in the roadway defining the centre, and all traffic to proceed uniformly in the one direction on each side of such reserve or plantation.

DIVISION C.—PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC.

1. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his left-hand side of the footway and shall, when meeting or overtaking any persons, pass on the right-hand side of such person.

2. No person shall cross from the footway at one street intersection to the footway of any other street at the intersection other than by proceeding at right angles to the line of kerb of the intersecting streets in manner shown in the subjoined diagram:—



3. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon, whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise.

DIVISION D.—STREET PROCESSIONS.

1. No processions of persons, or of vehicles, or of any combination of persons and/or vehicles shall, except for military or funeral purposes, parade or pass through any street unless the following conditions have been complied with, that is to say:—

(a) One calendar month's notice, in writing, shall be previously given to the Shire Secretary of the intention to hold such procession, specifying the proposed duration of such procession, the time and the place of starting, the route proposed to be followed, and the time and place of completion thereof.

(b) Twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, at least shall be given, with such particulars as aforesaid, to the officer in charge of police at Merbein or Redcliffs, and in which township it is proposed to hold such procession.

2. Not more than one procession shall parade or pass through either township on any one day.

3. Should two or more notices be given to the Shire Secretary of intention to hold processions on the same day, only the notice first received by the Shire Secretary shall be deemed to be validly given.

DIVISION E.—LAWFUL DIRECTIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH.

1. Every person within the Shire of Mildura shall at all times obey and conform to any notice, in writing, under the hand or by direction of the President or, in his absence or in the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Shire Secretary, or of the officer in charge of Police, Merbein or Redcliffs, in respect to all or any of the following, that is to say:—

(a) Approaching or departing from any footway or street;

(b) The manner of the taking up or setting down of passengers, or the loading or unloading of goods in any footway or street; or

(c) The regulation of traffic in any street or footway.

2. At all times, both in respect of the matters aforesaid and as hereinafter mentioned, observe and comply with any order or direction of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council in the due observance of the provisions of this By-law.

DIVISION F.—TRAFFIC IN LANES.

1. Motor car and vehicular traffic in all lanes and rights-of-way shall not turn round in any lane or right-of-way.

2. Motor cars and vehicles when being driven in lanes shall be driven straight through from one street or avenue to the next street or avenue, but will be permitted to be reversed or backed out of a lane, provided such reversing or backing does not interfere with traffic approaching from the rear.

DIVISION G.—PARKING OF VEHICLES.

1. A driver may park a vehicle in any of the streets or avenues of the townships of Merbein or Redcliffs subject to the observance of any conditions relating thereto previously expressed in this By-law:—

(a) In streets of 99 feet width or less vehicles must be drawn up parallel to the kerb, with the left or near wheels of such vehicle not more than 10 inches from the edge of the kerb of the footway on the left or near side of such street, and so that such vehicle is not less than 3 feet from any other vehicle, excepting—

(b) In Commercial-street, Merbein, between Main and Railway avenues, and in Jacaranda-street, Redcliffs, between Fitzroy and Kiewa avenues, vehicles shall be parked at an angle of 45 degrees to the kerb, and in such position that the left or near front wheel is touching the kerb and so that no part of such vehicle is nearer than 2 feet to any other vehicle.

(c) In streets in the Township of Redcliffs, in which there is a central reserve or plantation, vehicles may be drawn up parallel to the kerb of the plantation with the right or offside wheels of such vehicle not more than 10 inches from the edge of the kerb of the footway on the left or near side of such street, and so that such vehicle is not less than 3 feet from any other vehicle, and on the near or building side of such streets, vehicles shall be parked at an angle of 45 degrees to the kerb, and in such position that the left or near front wheel is touching the kerb, and so that no part of such vehicle is nearer than 2 feet to any other vehicle.

(d) In Railway-avenue, Merbein, vehicles must be drawn up parallel to the kerb with the left or near wheels of such vehicle not more than 10 inches from the edge of the kerb of the footway on the left or near side of such street or drawn up parallel to the kerb of the central plantation, with the right or offside wheels of such vehicle not more than 10 inches from the edge of the kerb of the footway on the right or offside of such plantation, and so that such vehicle is not less than 3 feet from any other vehicle.

(e) No commercial vehicle, excepting a utility truck, shall park in Commercial-street between Main and Railway avenues in the Township of Merbein, or in Jacaranda-street between Fitzroy and Kiewa avenues in the Township of Redcliffs.

(f) A vehicle must be parked in such a manner as will enable the driver to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other vehicles already parked, and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty and not otherwise.

(g) Vehicles may be parked in any lane in the Townships of Merbein and Redcliffs.

2. No vehicle shall be parked in any street or parking area in such manner that the wheels or any portion of such vehicle project over or beyond any line or other mark placed in or on the street, defining the boundary of such parking area in such street.

3. No vehicle shall be parked in any street or lane in such a position as to deny free and uninterrupted access to any private crossing or entrance of any kind leading to any property.

4. No vehicle shall be parked on any street for the primary purpose of displaying an advertisement.

DIVISION H.—GENERAL.

1. Any contravention of any of the foregoing Divisions A to G, both inclusive, by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

2. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any provision of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council.
