No. 4535. "An Act to amend Section Thirty-five of the *Workers' Compensation Act 1928.*"

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT RHYLL KOALA AND WATER RESERVE, PHILLIP ISLAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS ACT 1936.

REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Zoological Gardens Act 1936*, the Zoological Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations shall take effect on the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All Regulations made pursuant to the *Zoological and Acclimatisation Society Incorporation Act 1884* are hereby revoked.

3. In these Regulations—

“Animal” includes mammal, bird, reptile, amphibian, fish, and insect.

“Board” means the Zoological Board of Victoria.

“Gardens” means the Zoological Gardens at Royal Park. Words importing the masculine gender shall include females, words in the singular shall include the plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular.

4. All parts of the Gardens other than the quarters of the staff, the hospital, the quarantine house, and killing pen shall be open for the admission of the public from Monday to Saturday of each week from half-past nine in the forenoon until a quarter-past Five in the afternoon, and on each Sunday from half-past One until a quarter-past Five in the afternoon. In addition the Board at its discretion may open the Gardens, or any part thereof, for the admission of the public at times not herein specified when it is considered advisable to hold special entertainments for educational purposes.

5. No person shall, without the authority of the Board, enter or attempt to enter the Gardens, or any part thereof, except through the entrances provided for the purpose, and no person shall, without the authority of the Board, enter the Gardens, or any part thereof, through such entrances unless he or some one on his behalf has paid the prescribed charge for admission.

6. No person shall remain in any part of the Gardens at any time when the Gardens are not open to the public in accordance with clause 4 of these Regulations.

7. No person other than members of the Board, or its officers and employees, shall without the consent of the Chairman of the Board, enter any part of the Gardens not open to the public.

8. The charges for admission to the Gardens shall be as follows:—

(a) On every day upon which a concert or other special entertainment is given in the Gardens—

(i) For each person over the age of twelve years—One shilling.

(ii) For each child over the age of three years, but not over the age of twelve years—Six pence.

(b) On every day other than specified in paragraph (a) of this clause—

(i) For each person over the age of twelve years—Six pence.

(ii) For each child over the age of three years, but not over the age of twelve years—Three pence.

Provided that, upon application to the Director of the Gardens, parties of children attending secondary schools or Sunday schools may (except on Sundays and public holidays) be admitted on payment of one-half of the foregoing charges, and parties of children attending State schools or other primary schools and classes in natural history, or children in the care of charitable institutions may (except on Sundays and public holidays) be admitted to the Gardens free of charge.

9. Every ticket furnished by the Board to a member of the Royal Zoological and Acclimatisation Society of Victoria under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 14 of the *Zoological Gardens Act 1936* shall be in the form or to the effect of the schedule hereto, and shall remain in force for a period of twelve months commencing on the first day of January of each year.

10. No person shall give or offer to any animal in the Gardens, or place in, or throw into any cage or enclosure in such Gardens any stick, glass, drug, perfume, match, tobacco in any form, metal, wood, earth, or any substance or thing likely to injure or cause harm to any animal.

11. No person shall throw any stick or other missile at any animal in the Gardens, or in any other way interfere with, bait, or tease any such animal, or fire or discharge any firearm or fireworks in the Gardens.

12. No person shall give or offer to any animal in the Gardens any food contrary to the provisions of any notice exhibited on the cage or enclosure of such animal.

13. No person shall leave in the Gardens (except in the receptacles provided for the purpose), bottles, broken glass or crockery, rubbish, refuse, paper, or litter of any kind, or light any fire in such Gardens, or do any act which may cause, or

be likely to cause, a fire in such Gardens, or post any bill or other matter on the fences of the Gardens or on the buildings, enclosures, structures, or trees therein, or play cricket, football, or any other game within such Gardens.

14. No person shall, while he is in the Gardens, obstruct, interfere with, or annoy any officer or employee of the Board in the performance of his duties.

15. No person shall, while he is in the Gardens, walk across the shrubberies or flower borders, cut, pluck, injure, or destroy any tree, bush, shrub, or flower growing therein, stand upon or climb over any of the fences, climb trees, or paint, write, cut, carve, or in any manner inscribe letters, figures, or marks upon, or otherwise disfigure any seat, cage, tree, fence, building, wall, or any structure or erection thereon.

16. No person shall cause or allow any dog to enter the Gardens, and any person who causes or allows any dog to enter such Gardens shall be responsible for any damage caused by such dog.

17. No person shall, without the authority of the Board, deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon, or address of any kind, or sing any song, or enter into any public discussion in the Gardens.

18. No person shall, without the authority of the Board, sell, or offer to sell, or let for hire, any article, or distribute hand-bills or advertisements in the Gardens, nor shall any person while he is in the Gardens solicit money from any other person.

19. No person shall play or make sounds on any musical instrument in the Gardens without the express permission of the Board.

20. No person shall injure, deface, interfere with, or remove any seat, notice, or notice-board, post, chair, railing, fence, barrier, or other thing which may be from time to time erected or placed in position in the Gardens by or by the authority of the Board.

21. No person shall, while he is in the Gardens, be in a state of intoxication, gamble, brawl, fight, or make use of any abusive, indecent, insulting, obscene, or threatening language or gesture, or act in an indecent, disorderly, or offensive manner, or obstruct, interfere with, or annoy any other person lawfully in the Gardens.

22. Every person found committing a wilful breach of these Regulations may be removed from the Gardens by any officer or employee of the Board, or by a member of the Police Force.

23. Any person who commits a wilful breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds.

24. Every person found committing a wilful breach of any of these Regulations shall on demand by any officer or employee of the Board give his name and place of residence, and every person who wilfully refuses to comply with such demand, or who wilfully gives a false name or false place of residence, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5, in addition to any other penalty to which he may have rendered himself liable for any other breach of these Regulations.

THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPER-ANNUATION FUND REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1928* (section 91), the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendment of the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations (that is to say):—

1. Short Title.—These Regulations may be cited as *The Pilot Superannuation Regulations 1938*.

2. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the *Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1929*, as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations"), and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st of July, 1937.

3. Pensions to Pilots.—Schedule I. to the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

5. Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.—Paragraph 8 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted:—

8. Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.—(a) Any pilot upon becoming entitled to a pension under these Regulations may, if he thinks fit, elect to receive payment thereof in the form of a lump sum instead of as a pension, whereupon he shall upon granting to the Board a release, under seal, from all actions, claims, and demands whatsoever against the Board or the Fund, be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £81 18s. for the first completed year of service, £83 3s. 2d. for the second completed year of service, and so on, such rate increasing by £1 5s. 2d. for each additional completed year of service thereafter up to and including 35 years' service.

(b) Where any pilot who has elected, under paragraph (a) hereof, to retire in any year prior to the anniversary of the date when his service as a pilot first commenced, he shall be entitled, in addition to the sum

referred to in the said paragraph, to an additional amount for each completed month's service in the incomplete year equal to one-twelfth of the lump sum to which he would have been entitled for that year had he not retired before the completion thereof.

6. Widows' Benefits.—Paragraph 9 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted:—

9. Widows' Benefits.—On the decease of a pilot in the exercise of his calling after having served ten years and upwards or subsequent to his being placed on the Superannuation list and leaving a widow him surviving, the said widow shall be entitled to receive a pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule II. hereto, subject to the proviso that the pension to the widow of any pilot shall in no case exceed £75 12s. per annum unless she shall have been married to him ten years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, and shall in no case exceed £100 16s. per annum unless she shall have been married to him at least fifteen years at the time of such decease or superannuation, whichever may first have happened.

7. Children's Benefits.—Paragraph 10 (a) of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted:—

10. Children's Benefits.—(a) If a duly licensed pilot, having served for at least ten years, dies leaving a widow and child or children him surviving, a capitation allowance of £63 per annum for each such child shall be made until the child attains the age of sixteen years. On the death of a pilot's widow leaving any child or children of the pilot under the age of eighteen years, the capitation allowance, if there is but one child, shall be increased to £75 12s. per annum, and shall continue to be paid until such child attains the age of eighteen years. If, however, the widow leaves more than one child under the age of eighteen years her surviving, the pension payable to the widow shall be divided into as many equal parts as there are children under the age of eighteen years, and each such part shall be added to the capitation allowance of each child payable as aforesaid, and shall likewise continue to be payable until each such child attains the age of eighteen years, but without the benefit of survivorship between the children, and provided that no child shall in any case receive a larger allowance (including the said capitation allowance) than £75 12s. per annum.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board held this first day of July, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE SEBASTOPOL PUBLIC GARDEN
AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act* 1928, it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act, and has vested such land in Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 182, *Land Act* 1928: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol and their successors in respect of the Public Garden and Recreation Reserve in the Borough of Sebastopol: Now therefore the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Sebastopol Public Garden and Recreation Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve, and a charge not exceeding One shilling may be made for all vehicles entering the Reserve to sports or such gatherings.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, seats, fences, trees, shrubs, flowers, or any other improvements in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the consent of the Trustees.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any other way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or break bottles or other glass, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
6. The Trustees shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.
7. The Trustees may debar any person from bringing into the Reserve any dog, unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public meeting, nor shall any band of music perform in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
10. No person shall preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any portion of the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
11. No assemblies for sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking, or for any purpose or meeting of the like character, shall take place in any portion of the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and then only subject to such terms and conditions as the Trustees may determine.
12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

13. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, chattels, articles, or provisions of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

14. No person shall play at cricket, golf, tennis, or any other similar game, or play football in the Reserve, except on such areas as may from time to time be set apart by the Trustees for such purposes, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as may be imposed by the Trustees.

15. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

16. No person, not being a player or official, shall trespass on any playing ground during any cricket or football match, or sports gathering, or show, or shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or on any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Trustees in the proper execution of his duty or work.

17. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosures on the occasions of any fêtes, matches, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Trustees may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosures, and such Trustees, in their absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosures, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees.

18. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs or plants, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds, or other property from the Reserve, or injuring any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, and to be prosecuted.

19. No delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, wagon, van, truck, or burrow shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

20. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Trustees for that purpose, and then only on such terms and conditions as the Trustees may determine.

21. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Trustees, shall ride or drive any horse or any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle on any path in the Reserve.

22. No vehicle, motor car, or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.

23. No horse with a rider shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for equestrians.

24. No horse shall be broken in or trained in the Reserve.

25. No bicycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for cyclists.

26. No person on foot shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the portions of the Reserve specially set apart for cyclists or equestrians, except to cross through the openings provided for access from one part of the Reserve to another part thereof, as indicated by notices in the Reserve.

27. No horse uncontrolled by rein or hand, and no cattle, sheep, or pigs, shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve.

28. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.

29. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations, or any notice fixed or set up by the Trustees in the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, or officer, or servant, of the Trustees, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
