PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE BACK CREEK AND PORTION OF THE BUNYIP RIVER.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I. THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the first day of December, 1931, and published in the Government Gazette of the ninth day of December, 1931, respecting fishing in portion of the Bunyip River, and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following streams during the periods mentioned:—

Back Creek and Bunyip River, above or upstream from the junction of such streams, together with all their tributaries above the said junction.

Bunyip River and its tributaries above, or upstream from the junction of such river with the Tarago River to the junction of the Back Creek with the Bunyip River.

From 1st May to 15th December (both days inclusive) in each year.
