PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF BOX HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Box Hill has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public

highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State. with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State. do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Box Hill aforceaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

 - "Provided that a contributor shall on retirement through ill health, after he has contributed for more than 20 years or has more than 25 years' continuous service, he allowed the pension for which he was contributing."
- 6. Regulation 32 of the Principal Regulations is amended by the deletion of sub-clause 1 (i) and (ii) and the substitution therefor of the following:
 - the event of the retrenchment of a contributor he shall be entitled to a pension which is the actuarial equivalent of the pension which would have been payable to the contributor upon attaining the maximum age for retirement, had he remained in the service, and within one month after the date of his retrenchment he may elect in lieu of such pension to receive payment of the then present value thereof in a lump sum. in a lump sum.
 - 2. By the insertion in Regulation 32 (3) between the words "pension" and "re-enters" the following words "or has received payment in the form of a lump sum under this clause."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SEBASTOPOL PUBLIC GARDEN AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the Land Act 1928, it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsover, or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act, and has vested such land in Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 182, Land Act 1928: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol, and their successors, in respect of the Public Garden and Recreation Reserve in the Borough of Sebastopol: Now, therefore, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sebastopol do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Sebastopol Public Garden and Recreation Reserve.

· . REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements; on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve, and a charge not exceeding One shilling may be made for all vehicles entering the Reserve to sports or such gatherings.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

- 3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, seats, fences, trees, shrubs, flowers. or any other improvements in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the consent of the Trustees.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any other way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or break bottles or other glass, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission. in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 6. The Trustees shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "Cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.
- 7. The Trustees may debar any person from bringing into the Reserve any dog, unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.
- 8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 9. No person shall take part in any public meeting, nor shall any band of music perform in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 10. No person shall preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 11. No assemblies for sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking, or for any purpose or meeting of the like character, shall take place in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and then only subject to such terms and conditions as the Trustees may determine.
- 12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
- 13. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, chattels, articles, or provisions of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 14. No person shall play at cricket, golf, tennis, or any other similar game, or play football in the Reserve, except on such areas as may from time to time be set apart by the Trustees for such purposes, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as may be imposed by the Trustees.

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, crection. or enclosures on the occasions of any fêtes, matches, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Trustees may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosures, and such Trustees, in their absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosures, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Trustees.
- 18. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, or plants, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds, or other property from the Reserve, or injuring any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, and to be prosecuted.
- 19. No delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, truck, or barrow shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

- 20. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve, excepting at such places as are set apart by the Trustees for that purpose, and then only on such terms and conditions as the Trustees may determine.
- 21. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Trustees, shall ride or drive any horse, or any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle on any path in the Reserve.
- 22. No vehicle, motor car, or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.
- 23. No horse with a rider shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for equestrians.
- 24. No horse shall be broken in or trained in the Reserve.
- 25. No bicycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for cyclists.
- 26. No person on foot shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the portions of the Reserve specially set apart for cyclists or equestfians, except to cross through the openings provided for access from one part of the Reserve to another part thereof, as indicated by notices in the Reserve.
- 27. No horse uncontrolled by rein or hand, and no cattle, sheep, or pigs shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve.

- 28. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.
- 29. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations, or any notice fixed or set up by the Trustees in the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, or officer, or servant of the Trustees, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF ST. KILDA.

BY-LAW No. 119.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made and passed under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 119, for altering By-law No. 115 (Building By-law).

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and of every power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, with the approval of the Governor in Council, orders as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 115 of the City of St. Kilda (hereinafter referred to as the principal By-law).
- 2. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole municipality.
- 3. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council immediately after its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.
- 4. The definition of "Dividing Wall" in Part I. of the principal By-law is hereby repealed, and the following definition shall be substituted therefor:—
 - "Dividing Wall" means any internal wall in buildings of two or more storeys in height sustaining any portion of the whole dead load and the whole live load, or other load superimposed or bearing thereon and not being a party or cross wall.

5. Part II., clauses 1 to 7, of the principal By-law are hereby repealed, and the following clauses shall be substituted there

(1) Notice of Intention to Build and Lodgment of Plans.

1. No builder shall commence any building, erection, or structure, or any addition or alteration to any building, erection, or structure without first delivering at the office of the surveyor a written notice of intention so to do, and we will be the surveyor as written notice of intention so to do, and of the surveyor a written notice of intention so to do, and producing to the surveyor properly prepared plans, sections, and specifications of such building, erection, structure, addition, or alteration, and all stress and other calculations concerning same, together with a tracing or copy of the floor plans of such building, erection, structure, addition, or alteration, and also details of dimensions, sizes, and qualities of all materials, and enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in the construction of same. Such plans and details may be inspected on payment of the fee set forth in Schedule A to this By-law.

2. The original plans, sections, and specifications when approved shall be returned to the builder or his agent, but the tracing or copy of the plans and details of materials shall be retained by the surveyor.

(2) Duties of Surveyor.

(2) Duties of Surveyor.

3. The surveyor shall upon the receipt of any such notice and production of plans, sections, and specifications as aforesaid, and also upon any work being observed by or made known to him which is affected by the provisions of this By-law, but in respect of which no notice has been given from time to time during the progress of any work affected by such provisions as often as may be necessary for securing the due observance of such provisions, survey any such building, structure, erection, or work, and cause all such provisions to be duly observed.

4. The surveyor, at all reasonable times before or after the completion of any building structure, erection, or work

4. The surveyor, at all reasonable times before or after the completion of any building structure, erection, or work affected by any of the provisions of this By-law, or by any terms or conditions on which the observance of any such provisions may have been dispensed with, may enter and inspect such building, structure, or work:

5. The surveyor may, for the purpose of ascertaining whether any building, structure, or erection is in such a situation, or possesses such characteristics as are required in order to exempt it from the operation of any of the provisions of this By-law, at all reasonable times enter any premises, and may do therein all such things as are reasonably necessary for that purpose.

(3) Paument of Ecce and Parmits

(3) Payment of Fees and Permits.

6. No builder shall commence any building, erection, structure, or any addition or alteration to any building, erection, or structure, without having first obtained from the Council a written permit for the commencement of same, and without having first paid to the treasurer the fees in respect thereof set forth in Schedule A to this By-law, having regard to the class of building, erection, or structure, or any addition or alteration proposed to be built or erected. In the event of the sum so paid being found to exceed the total amount of fees finally payable at or before the completion of such building, erection, structure, addition or alteration, the amount paid in excess of such final sum shall be refunded to the person paying the same. Such permit shall only remain of force and effect for six months from date of issue of same.

7. All plans, sections, and specifications required to be

and effect for six months from date of issue of same.

7. All plans, sections, and specifications required to be produced as aforesaid shall be considered by the Council at the first available opportunity after the production thereof to the surveyor, and if—

(a) the building therein referred to (if erected in accordance with such plans, sections, and specifications) will comply with the provisions of this By-law, and of all other By-laws and Regulations (if any) applicable thereto; and

(b) such plans, sections, and specifications are otherwise in conformity with the provisions of this By-law,

the Council shall grant or cause to be granted to the builder a written permit (subject to the payment to the Trensurer of the tees as prescribed by the said Schedule A) for the commencement of the building referred to in

A) for the commencement of the building referred to in such plans, sections, and specifications.

8. No person shall bereafter erect any building or make any alteration to any building (for which a permit for the commencement thereof has been granted as aforesaid) contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or the plans, specifications, and other particulars in respect of which such permit was so granted.

6. Immediately after sub-clause (II) of clause 21 of Part III of the principal By-law the following sub-clause chall be

(111) Workshops and out-buildings (except stables and
living rooms) of not more than four squares in area,

provided the external walls thereof are constructed of brickwork of a thickness of 9 inches at least, and provided such external walls on the boundary are carried up to form a parapet 15 inches at least in height above the roof or above the highest part of any flat or gutter, as the case may be, except that such workshops and out-buildings may not be erected-

- (a) within a distance of 100 feet of the frontage to any road or street set out in Schedule B to the principal By-law; and
- (b) within a distance of 80 feet of the frontage to any other road or street.
- 7. Sub-clause (III) of clause 21 of Part III. of the principal By-law shall be numbered "(IV.)".
- 8. Immediately after clause 1 of Part VII. of the principal By-law, there shall be added the following clause:-
 - Dividing walls in buildings of Class A may be constructed of brick laid in cement mortar, and of not less thickness than as set forth in Schedule K, Table A (I), to the principal By-law for their several grades, which grades are determined according to the heights and lengths of such dividing walls, such lengths being measured from the centre of one return wall to another, or from the centre of a return wall to a cross wall."
- 9. In clause 39 of Part VIII. of the principal By-law, after the words "Every building used as a" appearing in the fifth line, there shall be inserted the following words "dwelling-house and also every building used as a".
- 10. Sub-clause (I) of clause 12 of Part XI. of the principal By-law is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be substituted therefor:
 - "Every building to which the Fire Prevention Regulations 1935 apply, and every building over three storeys in height."

TOWN OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BY-LAW No. 28

A By-law of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell made under the provisions of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928, and section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1928 for regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928 and section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell order as follows:—

- . In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter :-
 - "Driver" means the person in charge of a vehicle or horse.

 - "Footway" includes every footpath, lane, or other place habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles. "Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden. "Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which into the property lines of two or more streets. which join at an angle whether or not such streets
 - "Major Street" means any street along which tramcars
 - Minor Street" means any street along which tramcars do not travel.
 - "Motor Car" means any vehicles propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any mechanical power, and used or intended for use on any public highway, and includes motor-cycle, but does not include a railway locomotive, railway carriage, tram-motor, tramear, or traction engine as defined in Part XXIV. of the Local Government Act.
 - "Street" includes any highway, road, lane, or thorough-fare other than a footway.
 - Traffic Control Signal" includes any device using coloured lights or words or any combination thereof, whether operated mechanically, electrically, manually, or otherwise, by which traffic is directed to stop and proceed.
 - "Vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power, including a tram motor and tramcar, but does not include railway locomotive or railway carriage.

Proceeding Along Major Street.

- 2. The driver of a vehicle or horse proceeding along a major street shall-
 - (1) On approaching the intersection of another major street, stop before entering such intersection.
 - (2) On approaching the intersection of a minor street proceed at such rate of speed (not exceeding in the case of a motor car or tramcar twenty-five miles an hour, and in the case of any other vehicle or a horse, ten miles an hour) that he will be able to stop immediately such vehicle or horse in case of sudden danger. danger-

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply at an intersection where a member of the Police Force is controlling traffic, or a traffic control signal is installed and is operating.

Proceeding Along Minor Street.

- 3. The driver of a vehicle or horse proceeding along a minor street shall-
 - (1) On approaching the intersection of a major street stop before entering such intersection.
 - (2) On approaching the intersection of another minor street proceed at such rate of speed that he will be able to stop immediately such vehicle or horse in case of sudden danger—

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply at an intersection where a member of the Police Force is controlling traffic, or a traffic-control signal is installed and is operating.

Giving Right of Way to Vehicle Approaching from Right.


4. The driver of a vehicle or horse reaching the intersection of two minor streets at approximately the same time as another vehicle or horse shall give the right of way to the vehicle or horse approaching from his right: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply at an intersection where a member of the Police Force is controlling traffic, or a traffic-controlled signal is installed and is operating.

Keeping to the Left.

5. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tramcar) or a horse on any street shall keep such vehicle or horse as near as practicable to the edge of the carriage-way or to the kerb of the footway on the left or near side of such street.

Turning Corner.

6. The driver of any vehicle (other than a tramcar) or horse before turning to the right or off-side from one street intended along the left or near side of the street. amounts shall proceed along the left or near side of the street which he is leaving and parallel to the kerb alignment of the footway upon the left or near side of such street until he is as near as practicable to the kerb alignment of the footway on the left or near side of the street which he is entering, as shown in the diagram.



Crossing from One Side of the Street to the Other.

7. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tramear) on any street shall when crossing from one side of such street to the other side make the complete turn, so that when stationary at the kerb his vehicle shall be headed in the same direction as the traffic is proceeding, as shown in the diagram



Travelling Side by Side.

8. No person shall drive any vehicle (other than a tramear) or drive, ride, or lead any horse upon any street in such manner or in such order that more than two vehicles or horses are travelling side by side in the same direction: Provided this this Regulation shall not prevent three horses abreast being attached to one vehicle, or any vehicle from passing two bicycles travelling side by side in the same direction.

Signal when Stopping or Turning Right.

- 9. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tramcar)-
- (1) Before stopping such vehicle shall, at a distance of not less than twenty-five yards from the place at which he proposes so to stop, indicate his intention of so doing either by extending his arm beyond the vehicle and raising his hand with fingers extended and pointing upwards, or by means of a mechanical device approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police, so that such hand signal or device shall be clearly visible to the driver of any following vehicle.
 - (2) Before turning such vehicle to the right shall, at a distance of not less than twenty-five yards from the place at which he proposes so to turn, indicate his intention of so doing by extending his right arm beyond the vehicle with hand and fingers pointing horizontally in the direction in which he intends to turn.

Offences and Penalties.

10. Every person who by wilful act or default fails to comply with the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Operation of By-law.
