PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 4558. "An Act to provide for the Dismantling of Certain Sections of the Outer Circle Railway and for other purposes."  
No. 4559. "An Act to amend Section Fifty-seven of the *Explosives Act 1928*."

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district, or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be), that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire districts respectively specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire districts: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly:—

NORTH-EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Rutherglen, Township of Rutherglen and Parishes of Carlyle and Lilliput, County of Bogong: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 19A of section 41, Parish of Carlyle; bounded thence by that allotment bearing southerly to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 18 of section 19; thence easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of allotment 18 aforesaid and allotments 35, 3, and 6, of section 42, to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence easterly by a line to the north-western angle of allotment 23A; thence easterly and southerly by allotment 23A and easterly by the south boundary of allotment 24A to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 26, no section, Parish of Carlyle; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and allotments 27, 28, 29, 30, and a line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 22 of section 45;

thence westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment to the north-western angle thereof; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 21A, 21, 24, 25, 26, 30, 31, and 32 of section 45 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a direct line through allotment 28 of section 45 and allotment 9 of section 44 bearing southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 5 of section 45A; thence by the last-mentioned allotment bearing southerly and westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 6A; thence by the western boundaries of that allotment and allotments 6 and 7 to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a line bearing westerly to the most easterly angle of allotment 10A; thence south-easterly by a line to the eastern angle of allotment held under Licence No. 6295/86; thence by the southern boundary of the said allotment to the north-east corner of allotment 12; thence by eastern boundary to the south-east corner thereof, Parish of Carlyle; thence by a line bearing southerly to the north-west angle of allotment 8 of section 3, Parish of Lilliput; thence by that allotment bearing south-westerly and south-easterly to the south angle thereof; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 23; thence by the north-eastern and southern boundaries of that allotment to a road; thence by that road bearing south-easterly to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 26; thence by a line bearing west to the north-east angle of said allotment 26; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line through allotment 9A bearing westerly to the township boundary; thence by that boundary bearing south and westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 14A of section 12; thence by a direct line through allotments 11 and 10 bearing westerly to the south-eastern angle of the Manure Depot, Township of Rutherglen; thence by that depot bearing westerly to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 37 of section 2; thence by that allotment bearing westerly to the south-west angle thereof, Township of Rutherglen; thence by a direct line through allotment 1A of section 11, Parish of Lilliput, bearing westerly to the most eastern angle of allotment 18D of section 1; thence by that allotment bearing westerly and northerly, and by the east boundary of the Public Park Reserve bearing northerly to the south-east angle of allotment 9A of section 1; thence by that allotment and allotments 4A and 10 bearing west to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by said allotment 10, allotment 4, and a line, Parish of Lilliput, bearing north to the south boundary of allotment 3 of section 21, Parish of Carlyle; thence by a direct line through that allotment and allotment 2, a line, allotments 3 and 2 of section 18, a line, allotments 6 and 2 of section 17 bearing north to a road; thence by that road bearing east to the north-eastern angle of allotment 3; thence by that allotment bearing south-easterly to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 48 of section 41; thence by a line, that boundary, a line, and allotment 37 bearing east to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 33; thence by that allotment bearing easterly to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 21; and thence by that allotment and said allotment 19A bearing east to the commencing point.

Shire of Wodonga, Town and Parish of Wodonga, County of Bogong: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment B43B, no section, Town of Wodonga; bounded thence by a line bearing easterly to the left bank of the Murray River; thence by that river bearing generally southerly to the town boundary; thence by that boundary bearing southerly to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 9 of section 11, Parish of Wodonga; thence by a line and that boundary bearing west to a point in line with the west boundary of allotment 4 of section 5; thence by a line, that boundary, and allotment 5 bearing south to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a road bearing west to House Creek; thence by that creek bearing generally northerly, westerly, and again northerly to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section 13; thence by that allotment bearing west to the north-west angle thereof, Parish of Wodonga; thence by a road bearing northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section A11, Town of Wodonga; thence by a road bearing easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 3 of section C2; thence by the north boundary of that allotment, a line, and the south boundary of allotment 16 of section D2 bearing easterly to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a road bearing northerly, easterly, and north-easterly to the most easterly angle of allotment 17 of section 13; thence by a line bearing easterly to the southern angle of allotment 8; and thence by a 3-chain road bearing generally northerly and easterly to the commencing point.

#### EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Frankston and Hastings, Parishes of Lyndhurst and Frankston, County of Mornington: Commencing on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay at the south-western angle of

the Carrum Recreation Reserve, in the Parish of Lyndhurst; thence north-easterly by the southern boundary of that reserve and a line to the east side of Point Nepean-road; thence generally in a northerly direction along the eastern side of that road to its intersection with the western boundary of the railway reserve; thence south-easterly along the western boundary of the railway reserve to the Kananook Creek; thence generally in a southerly and south-easterly direction by the Kananook Creek to the south boundary of Seaford-road; thence easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly, and again easterly by the south boundary of Seaford-road across Wells-road to the east side of Dandenong-road; thence south-westerly along the east side of Dandenong-road to the south-west corner of the timber reserve in the Parish of Frankston; thence easterly along the south boundary of the timber reserve to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 38, section A, Parish of Frankston; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of allotment 38 to Skye-road; thence north-westerly along the south side of Skye-road to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 1, Section VI., Parish of Frankston; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 1 and 2, section VI., across Cranbourne-road to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 32j, section VI.; thence southerly along the western boundaries of Crown allotments 32j and 32k to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly along the south boundary of the aforesaid allotment to the north-western angle of allotment 32f; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of allotment 32f to the south-eastern angle of allotment 6r; thence westerly and south-westerly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 31A and a line to the west side of Hastings-road; thence south-easterly along the western boundary of Hastings-road to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 3, section IV.; thence north-westerly along the southern boundary of Crown allotment 3 to Footestreet; thence southerly along the east side of Footestreet to its junction with the Sweetwater Creek; thence south-easterly along the Sweetwater Creek to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 8, section IV.; thence south-westerly by the boundary between Crown allotments 7 and 8, section IV., to Humphries-road; thence north-westerly along the south-west side of Humphries-road to Point Nepean-road; thence southerly along the east side of Point Nepean-road to the Kackeraboite Creek; thence generally in a north-westerly direction along that creek to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally in a north-easterly and northerly direction by the foreshore to the point of commencement.

Shire of Warragul, Town of Warragul, and Parish of Drouin East, County of Buln Buln: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section A, Parish of Drouin East; bounded thence by a road bearing southerly to a point about 8 chains from the north-east angle of allotment 23; thence by a line through said allotment 23 and allotments 24, 25, and 26 bearing westerly to the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by that boundary, a line, and allotments 103A and 103 bearing southerly to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a road bearing westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 23 of section 9, Town of Warragul; thence by a road, Parish of Drouin East, bearing south-easterly about 10 chains; thence by a line through portions of allotment 102 aforesaid bearing westerly to the eastern boundary of allotment 99; thence by that allotment bearing northerly to the north-east angle thereof; thence by roads forming the boundaries of the Town of Warragul bearing westerly, generally northerly, and easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 86, Parish of Drouin East; thence by a road bearing generally northerly about 20 chains; thence by a line through said allotment 86 bearing easterly to the western boundary of allotment 75; thence by said allotment 75 bearing southerly to the south-west angle thereof; and thence by a road bearing easterly to the commencing point.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 3812.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, hereinafter referred to as "the Commission," in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Commission within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks:—

1. During the period commencing with the 1st day of October, 1938, and ending with the 31st day of March, 1939, no person shall use or permit to be used or allowed to run on any premises any water for other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, mining, or fire-fighting purposes. The use of hoses, other than for fire-fighting purposes, is prohibited.

2. Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Commission.

3. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 3813.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

(1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual municipal valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d.—Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) Of any such tenement the annual municipal valuation whereof exceeds £13 6s. 8d.—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation not exceeding £300; Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation exceeding £300 and not exceeding £700; and Five pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation exceeding £700.

(3) Of lands on which there is no building—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1938, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1939, and shall be payable on the 1st day of October, 1938, at the office of the said Commission at Bendigo or Castlemaine.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

**MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.**

In pursuance of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Regulations (hereinafter called "the principal Regulations") made by the Commissioners on the 12th day of November, 1930, approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of December, 1930, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 22nd day of December, 1930, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. The following Regulation is hereby substituted for Regulation 51A of the principal Regulations:—

51A. When approaching the Williamstown-road Ferry, the Master of every vessel shall, at a distance of about 2,000 feet therefrom, sound a prolonged blast on the whistle of 6 seconds' duration. The points at which this signal shall be given are indicated in the following manner, viz.:—

*In Day Time.*—The word WHISTLE shown in red letters on a white ground on No. 12 beacon on the star-board hand downstream from the ferry, and on No. 19 beacon on the port hand upstream from the ferry.

*In Night Time.*—An occulting red Neon light illuminating No. 12 beacon, and an occulting green Neon light illuminating No. 19 beacon above referred to.

Characteristics of lights—Light, 5 secs.; eclipse, 1 sec.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the Master or person in charge of a vessel engaged towing a vessel equipped with an efficient sound signal when such vessel is under the control of a Pilot or Master holding a Pilotage Exemption Certificate for the Port of Melbourne. In such case the responsibility for sounding the signal shall rest with the Pilot or Master of the vessel being towed, who shall sound the signal when the bow of the leading vessel is abreast of the beacons referred to.

When the foregoing signal has been sounded by a vessel approaching the Williamstown-road Ferry, the person in charge of the ferry shall not permit the ferry to leave her berth until the vessel has passed clear of such ferry.

3. Regulation 168 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

1. By deleting the words "by flushing with water, and shall be kept full of water" in paragraph 2 (c) of Section III.

4. Regulation 286, paragraph (24), of the principal Regulations is repealed.

5. Regulation 309 of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting the words "or part thereof" where appearing after the word "feet".

6. The following Regulation is hereby substituted for Regulation 322 of the principal Regulations:—

322. The master, owner, or agent of a vessel occupying any of the berths mentioned hereunder shall, unless otherwise provided or agreed upon, in addition to any other tolls, rates, or charges whatsoever, for the time being payable under the Act, or Regulations in respect of such user, or of such vessel, pay to the Commissioners the charge set forth hereunder for each quarter of a day, or part thereof, during which the vessel occupies such berth, but subject to a minimum charge equal to the charge for one day.

Should the charges paid under this Regulation in relation to a vessel occupying a berth at a wharf or part of a wharf which is not appropriated for vessels carrying passengers exceed a sum equal to 3d. per ton on the cargo unshipped from and/or shipped into the vessel, the Commissioners may, if they are satisfied that such shipping and/or unshipping of cargo has proceeded continuously, on application being made to them in writing, refund the amount by which the charges paid under this Regulation shall exceed such last-mentioned sum.

**SHEET METAL TRADE REGULATIONS (No. 3).**

**WHEREAS** by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make Regulations following, that is to say:—

*Short Title.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as "Sheet Metal Trade Regulations (No. 3)."

*Interpretation.*

2. In these Regulations—  
 "Acts" mean Apprenticeship Acts.  
 "Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.  
 "Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.  
 "Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.  
 "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

*Application of Regulations.*

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trade, viz:—  
 Sheet Metal—First Class Bench Work.

*Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.*

4. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trade shall be as set out in the schedule hereto, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

*Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.*

(b) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in each year of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year; and  
 (ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final Certificate" of the Commission—

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

*Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.*

(c) The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission, in the following processes (as the case may be):—

All classes of sheet metal work on sheet metal commonly used in the trade where the completed work involves working to scaled prints or drawings or applying general trade experience or knowledge to the making of such completed articles and/or the erection and installation thereof and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of all tools commonly used in the trade.

And the employer shall by the best means in his power teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the apprentice in the said processes:

*Attendance at Classes for Instruction.*

5. (a) Every apprentice and applicant in the said trade shall attend the classes for instruction prescribed for his apprenticeship course at such times and at such place or places

and on such occasions while the classes are open for instruction as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts, provided that the number of evenings on which such apprentice or applicant shall be required to attend shall not exceed two in any one week.

*Employer to Permit Apprentice or Applicant to Attend Classes.*

(b) Every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by the said General Regulations (No. 1), shall, while the classes are open for instruction, permit his apprentices and applicants to attend for instruction at the school or schools and class or classes at the hours and on the occasions specified in such notice.

*Apprentice or Applicant Shall Submit Himself for Examination.*

(c) Every apprentice or applicant attending the aforesaid class or classes shall submit himself for examination in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at the places and times determined by the Commission.

*Penalties for Non-attendance, Misbehaviour, &c.*

(d) Any apprentice or applicant who—

- (i) fails to attend any technical school or class at which he is required to attend, punctually at the time appointed for the commencement thereof, or, without the permission of the instructor, leaves the same before the time appointed for leaving; or  
 (ii) fails to be diligent or behaves in an indecorous manner while in such school or class; or  
 (iii) destroys or fails to take care of any material or equipment provided for his use in such school or class; or  
 (iv) without good and satisfactory reason, in the opinion of the Commission, fails to secure in each year a record of 80 per cent. of attendances in the day classes and in the evening classes prescribed for his apprenticeship course—

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, or, alternatively, to cancellation of his indentures by the Commission.

*Apprentice or Applicant to Provide Books, Materials, &c.*

(e) Every apprentice or applicant shall, at his own cost and expense, provide himself with the necessary books, drawing instruments, and materials required at the classes for instruction, unless otherwise provided by the school authorities or other bodies.

*Payment of School Fees.*

6. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants; but, on receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

*Incorporation of General Regulations.*

7. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trade:—

General Regulations (No. 1), approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2), approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3), approved by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4), approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1931.

## AMENDMENT OF PAINTING, DECORATING, AND SIGNWRITING REGULATIONS (No. 2).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Regulation 8 of the Painting, Decorating, and Signwriting Trades Regulations (No. 2) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from 27th day of September, 1938.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation, substitute the following:—

8. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall commence on the 27th day of September, 1938, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

- 1st year—at the rate of 17s. 0d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 22s. 8d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 31s. 5d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 43s. 9d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 54s. 9d. per week.

And the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

In Regulation 20, at the end of paragraph (a), add the words "and any package containing 100 lb. or more of potatoes shall be legibly branded with the grower's name and address."

In Regulation 21, in place of the word "three," appearing in the fifth line, substitute in lieu thereof the word "four," and in place of the words "or 'Picklers'" where occurring, substitute in lieu thereof the words "Picklers or Stock Food Onions," and at the end of paragraph (a) add the words "and any package containing 100 lb. or more of onions shall be legibly branded with the grower's name and address."

After paragraph (c) of Regulation 21, insert the following additional paragraph:—

"(f) Onions described as 'Stock Food' shall be contained in packages legibly branded with the words 'Stock Food' in letters of not less than 3 inches in height. No person shall sell such onions for table use or for any other purpose, except for use as food for stock."

#### REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION PURPOSES. KNOWN RESPECTIVELY AS THE "FRANKSTON PARK" AND "HASTINGS PARK," IN THE SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS.

**W**HEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations, and to rescind Rules and Regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind clause 2 of the Regulations made on 27th March, 1930, and doth hereby make the following additional Regulation in respect of Reserves set forth hereunder:—

Seventeen acres 3 roods 18 perches in the Township of Frankston, Parish of Frankston, permanently reserved as a site for a Public Park and other purposes of Public Recreation, and known as "Frankston Park."

Thirty-one acres 2 roods 27 perches, more or less, in the Town of Tyabb, temporarily reserved as a site for a Public Park and General Recreation purposes, and known as "Hastings Park."

#### REGULATION.

All persons shall be admitted to both divisions of the Reserves free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding twenty-six in any one year, as the Reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches, athletic, cycling, or other sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the second division of the Reserves.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly or wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
