W HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the First year of the reign of His present Majesty King George VI., intituled the Superannuation Act 1937, it is enacted by section 1 thereof that save as otherwise expressly provided therein the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 1, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the seventeenth day of February, 1938, as the day upon which the said Act, other than section 5 thereof, shall come into operation.

WHEREAS by sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (d) of the Schedule to the Income Tax (Rates) Act 1937, it is enacted that in the circumstances in such sub-paragraph is enacted that in the circumstances in such sub-paragraph set out the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the Government Inzette declare a State of the Commonwealth to be a reciprocating State: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby declare the State of New South Wales to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the Income Tax Acts (so far only as the same relate to the special tax). H IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Public Scruics Act 1928, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby rescind clauses 14 and 16 of Regulation XII.—The Training of Teachers. Part I. Studentships at Teachers College, and in lieu thereof doth substitute the following clauses 14 and 16, and doth also add the new clauses 22 (c) and (f) hereunder to such Regulation, viz.:—

Clause 14.—The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate shall be—

(a) Applicants shall be at least eighteen years of age.
 (b) They shall have passed the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne (including a pass in the subject of Arithmetic at the School Intermediate

or approved equivalent examination) or hold an approved equivalent qualification.

(c) They shall have had at least one year's experience as teachers in approved schools, and be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

Provided, however, that if there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, students not possessing all the qualifications set out above may be admitted to this course.

Provided also that applicants holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second or the third year of the course for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate may be admitted by the Director to the year for which they are qualified.

REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Dried Fruits*Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

CLASSING OF DRIED FRUITS PRIOR TO RECEPTION INTO PACKING SHEDS.

- (1) These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Dried Fruits Regulations.
- (2) "Classer" means a person licensed by the Victorian Dried Fruits Board to classify dried fruits.
- "Grader" means a grader appointed by the Victorian Dried Fruits Board for the purposes of these Regulations.
- (3) The Victorian Dried Fruits Board may issue a licence to any person who, in the opinion of the Board, is sufficiently qualified and experienced to class dried fruits in a manner prescribed by the Dried Fruits Regulations. Any licence issued by the Board under these Regulations shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule 8 of these Regulations, and such licence shall remain in force for the calendar year in respect of which it is issued. If the Board is satisfied at any time that the holder of any such licence is unfitted for any reason to continue to hold such licence, it may at any time revoke such licence.
- (4) The owner of a packing shed shall not receive any dried fruits into his packing shed unless such dried fruits have been classified by a classer or a grader into a grade prescribed by these Regulations.
- (5) No owner of any packing shed shall employ any person who is not the holder of a licence issued by the Victorian Dried Fruits Board to class dried fruits before such dried fruits are received into a packing shed.
- (6) Every classer who classifies fruits in accordance with these Regulations shall affix to the top box of each set of sweat boxes containing the same grade of fruit a ticket showing the grade of fruit in such set.
- (7) If the grower, or any other person delivering dried fruits to a packing shed, notifies the classer at the time of delivery that he is dissatisfied with the classification made by such classer, the classer shall cause such fruit to be stored in a suitable place for inspection by a grader duly appointed under these Regulations.
- (8) Every owner of a packing shed shall keep all unprocessed dried fruits received into his packing shed in distinct and separate lots according to the grade into which such dried fruit was classed by the classer.
- (9) The owner of a packing shed shall not process or pack any dried fruits which have not been classified by a classer or grader in accordance with these Regulations.
- (10) The Board may appoint persons to be graders for the purposes of these Regulations.
 - (11) The duties of a grader shall be-
 - (a) to supervise the classification of dried fruits made by a classer appointed under these Regulations.
 - (b) to assist the classers in their classification.
 - (c) to inspect and classify dried fruits which may be the subject of dissatisfaction as expressed by the grower in accordance with Regulation 5.
 - (d) to report to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board upon the ability of any classer appointed under these Regulations.
- (12) Any determination regarding the classification of dried fruits made by a grader under these Regulations shall be final and conclusive.
